USAID in the Latin America and the Caribbean Region: Combating Anti-Microbial Resistance to Improve Child Health

Summary: You will be announcing a new USAID initiative, in partnership with the Pan American Health Organization, to support more effective delivery of interventions for the control and prevention of antimicrobial resistance. Nearly 20% of disease in the region stems from infectious and parasitic diseases, and nearly 60% of this can be traced to two child health problems that plague children--diarrhea and respiratory infections. Combating resistance to the antibiotics used to treat children with these infections is key to protecting their health.

Anti-Microbial Resistance

The impact of infectious diseases on health in Latin America and the Caribbean is dramatic. Nearly 20% of the total burden of disease in the region stems from infectious and parasitic diseases. Nearly sixty percent of this can be traced to two child health problems--diarrhea and respiratory infections. Reducing diarrhea and respiratory infections in the LAC region to the levels in the US would save 9.3 million person-years of life annually, most of these among children.

Since 1997, USAID has been pursuing an ambitious program to cut deaths from infectious diseases worldwide by at least 10% in 10 years. Combating anti-microbial resistance is one of four pillars of this program that also emphasizes combating malaria, strengthening surveillance and response capacity and combating tuberculosis.

Antimicrobial resistance (AMR) occurs as disease-producing microbes evolve the ability to survive in the presence of the antimicrobials designed to kill them. Inappropriate use of antimicrobials makes it more and more likely that microbes will develop such resistance. As they become resistant, microbes pass on this trait to all their offspring. Thus a growing share of the microbes infecting humans become inured to the effects of antibiotics. When this happens, alternative treatment regimens or even new drugs must be developed and tested against these microbes. This process is expensive, time-consuming and not always successful. In the meantime, people carrying resistant microbes are at the mercy of the pathogens with only their natural immune systems to protect them and transmit these resistant organisms to others in the community. AMR leads to much higher treatment costs since patients need to be treated again for the same infection, often with second or third-generation drugs that are much more expensive. In low-income countries, these drugs often are prohibitively expensive.

Based on information available on AMR in the US and the presence of some of the same antibiotic use practices in LAC, we can surmise that AMR is a serious problem in LAC as well. Data on AMR in the region are scarce. The LAC region needs better information on AMR in order to gauge the true extent of the problem.

UNICEF already combats childhood diarrhea and respiratory infections through Child Survival Programs and through the Regional Integrated Management of Childhood Illnesses (IMCI) Initiative. To complement these ongoing efforts, infectious disease activities are focusing additional efforts on prolonging the effectiveness of currently available antibiotic treatments. The strategy emphasizes improving surveillance capacity in order to determine the magnitude and impact of AMR. It encourages the use of surveillance information to improve clinical management. It emphasizes developing and testing interventions to improve anti-microbial drug practices. The strategy seeks to strengthen program implementation capacity in order to carry out activities to address AMR, such as appropriate prescription practices.

Initiative

In partnership with the Pan American Health Organization, USAID has embarked on a \$2 million five-year effort to support more effective delivery of interventions for the control and prevention of antimicrobial resistance (AMR). This effort seeks to: (1) improve surveillance capacity in target countries to determine the magnitude and impact of AMR and; (2) improve capacity in target countries to implement approaches to address AMR.

The initial set of target countries are those where diarrheal diseases and respiratory infections are the greatest threat to child health and where effective treatment is most severely jeopardized by AMR-- Bolivia, Ecuador, Peru, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, El Salvador, the Dominican Republic and Paraguay. This initial set of target countries may change as surveillance information enables us to more accurately target AMR problems in the region.

As a result of this effort, we expect to generate within the next three years:

- More timely, complete, and accurate reporting of specified diseases and the existence of anti-microbial resistance within countries;
- Strengthened capacity of national programs to routinely monitor for pathogen resistance;
- Strengthened capacity of national programs in priority countries for monitoring and responding to the emergence of AMR in malaria and tuberculosis;
- Documentation of the local factors which promote drug resistance and development of explicit strategies for addressing these factors;
- Improved practices in rational selection and use of anti-microbial and regular provision of appropriate drug information;
- More rational country drug policies;
- Dissemination of effective approaches to reduce AMR; and
- Increased international understanding of, and attention to, issues related to anti-microbial resistance.

**FIRST LADY HILLARY RODHAM CLINTON
ANNOUNCES A \$2 MILLION USAID HEALTH INITIATIVE**

OTTAWA—Today, First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton announced a \$2 million grant from the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) to support an infectious disease initiative that will improve the health of children in Latin America and the Caribbean. Over the next three years, this new initiative will work towards combating antibiotic resistance.

In the Latin America and Caribbean region, diarrheal diseases and acute respiratory infections are the major cause of infant and child deaths and the use of antibiotics is extremely widespread. Inappropriate use of the antibiotic can lead to antibiotic resistance to those diseases.

Through this new initiative, USAID will collaborate with the Pan American Health Organization to improve the monitoring capacity to determine the magnitude and impact of antibiotic resistance in the region. USAID's program will also improve the capacity in these countries to train doctors and pharmacists in the correct way to administer prescription medicine.

The initial set of target countries include those where infectious diseases pose significant threats to child health and where effective treatment is most severely jeopardized by antibiotic resistance, including: Bolivia, Ecuador, Peru, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, El Salvador, the Dominican Republic, and Paraguay. These countries may change over the next three years as new information enables USAID to target additional problems in the region.

Ninth Conference of Spouses of Heads of State and Government of the Americas

"Women of the Americas: Agents of Change"

The Ninth Conference of Spouses of Heads of State and Government of the Americas will be held in Ottawa from September 29 to October 1, 1999. The Conference Chair, Mrs. Aline Chrétien — wife of Canadian Prime Minister Jean Chrétien, and the Conference Moderator, Mrs. Huguette Labelle — President of the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA), will welcome more than thirty influential women leaders to discuss the common challenges and shared social goals of the countries of the Americas.

The Conference originated in 1980 when the First Ladies of Central America decided to meet to exchange experiences and integrate goals, projects and mechanisms for action and cooperation amongst their nations. It became an annual event in 1991 and a hemispheric event in 1994, with the first time participation of Canada and the United States. The eight previous conferences were held in Chile (1998), Panama (1997), Bolivia (1996), Paraguay (1995), Saint Lucia (1994), Costa Rica (1993), Colombia (1992) and Venezuela (1991).

The Conference of Spouses traditionally focuses on social welfare themes, such as health, education, violence, and increased participation in society of women and children. This year, the themes selected are: *A Healthy Start: Investing in Children 0 - 6* and *Women's Health*. Both themes are of common relevance to all countries in the Americas and, at the same time, broad enough to accommodate important sub-themes, depending on the priorities and interests of participating nations.

In somewhat of a departure from previous Conferences, the Ninth Conference of Spouses will include a Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) Fair. NGOs active in and dedicated to improving conditions for early child development and the well-being of women throughout the Hemisphere have been invited to display their projects and exchange strategies and tangible solutions to women's health and early child development challenges in the Americas.

Telehealth, a technology which provides effective healthcare services to rural and remote communities, will be showcased during the Conference. Telehealth relies on basic computer and telecommunication equipment to relay critical information between clinics and hospitals, patients and doctors. Canada has formed partnerships with countries in the Caribbean and South America to deliver telehealth services. The Conference is an opportunity to increase awareness of this exciting, new technology.

Since officially joining the Organization of American States in 1990, Canada has been increasingly involved in the new Inter-American agenda. Canada's hosting of the Ninth Conference of Spouses is consistent with an increased participation in the Hemisphere. It is part of a broader inter-American vista which includes hosting, over the next two years, the Americas Business Forum (November 1-3, 1999), the FTAA Trade Ministerial (November 3-4, 1999), the Organization of American States General Assembly (June 4-6, 2000) and the 2001 Summit of the Americas.

**HILLARY RODHAM CLINTON DEDICATES MAGNIFICENT BRONZE
SCULPTURE BY JOEL SHAPIRO AT NEW UNITED STATES EMBASSY**

On Thursday, September 30 at 12:00 noon, Hillary Rodham Clinton will cut the ribbon on the Joel Shapiro bronze sculpture "Conjunction" in the outside courtyard of the new Embassy of the United States of America.

"We are extremely excited," remarked Gordon Giffin, United States Ambassador to Canada, "that an original sculpture created by a world renowned American artist will be on display at our new Embassy. Much like "The Spirit of Haida Gwaii" sculpture outside the Canadian Embassy in Washington, this significant artwork is a manifestation of our respect for the extraordinary relationship between our two countries."

The bronze sculpture, although the most visible, is only one of the noteworthy pieces of American art in the new Embassy collection. It has been donated to the U.S. Embassy by the Friends of Art and Preservation in Embassies (FAPE) in honor of the millennium, "Gift to the Nation" program.

"Conjunction," designed specifically for the new U.S. Embassy building, stands 40 feet high, complements the architecture and represents the close ties between the United States and Canada.

"I wanted it to be animate and human - about growth and conjunction. I wanted it to be accessible and moving: about the future, understood from common pasts. I am looking for the unexpected. I want the sculpture to take off, to soar, to be expansive, to be a symbol of optimism and possibility." Joel Shapiro - September 1999

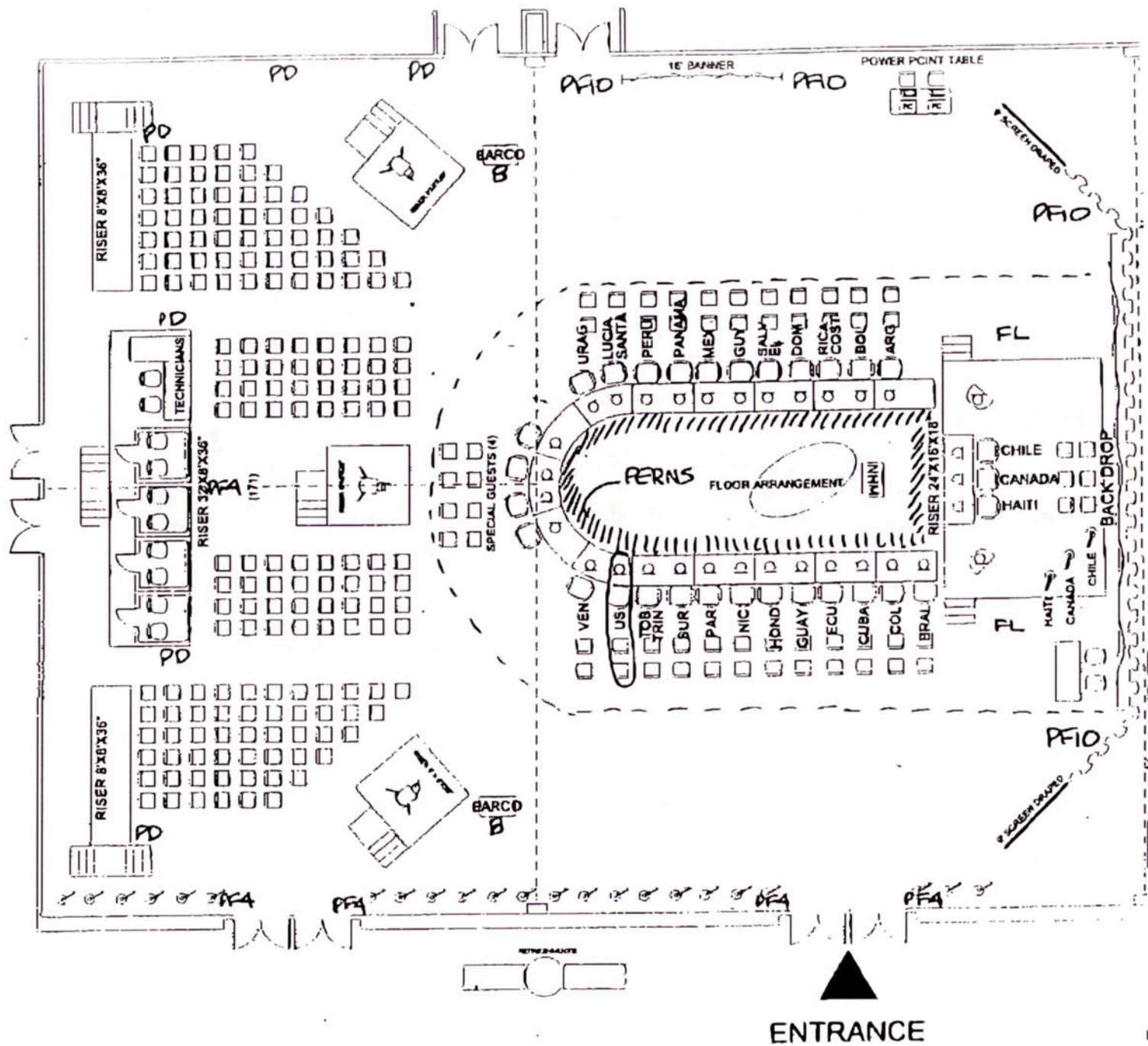

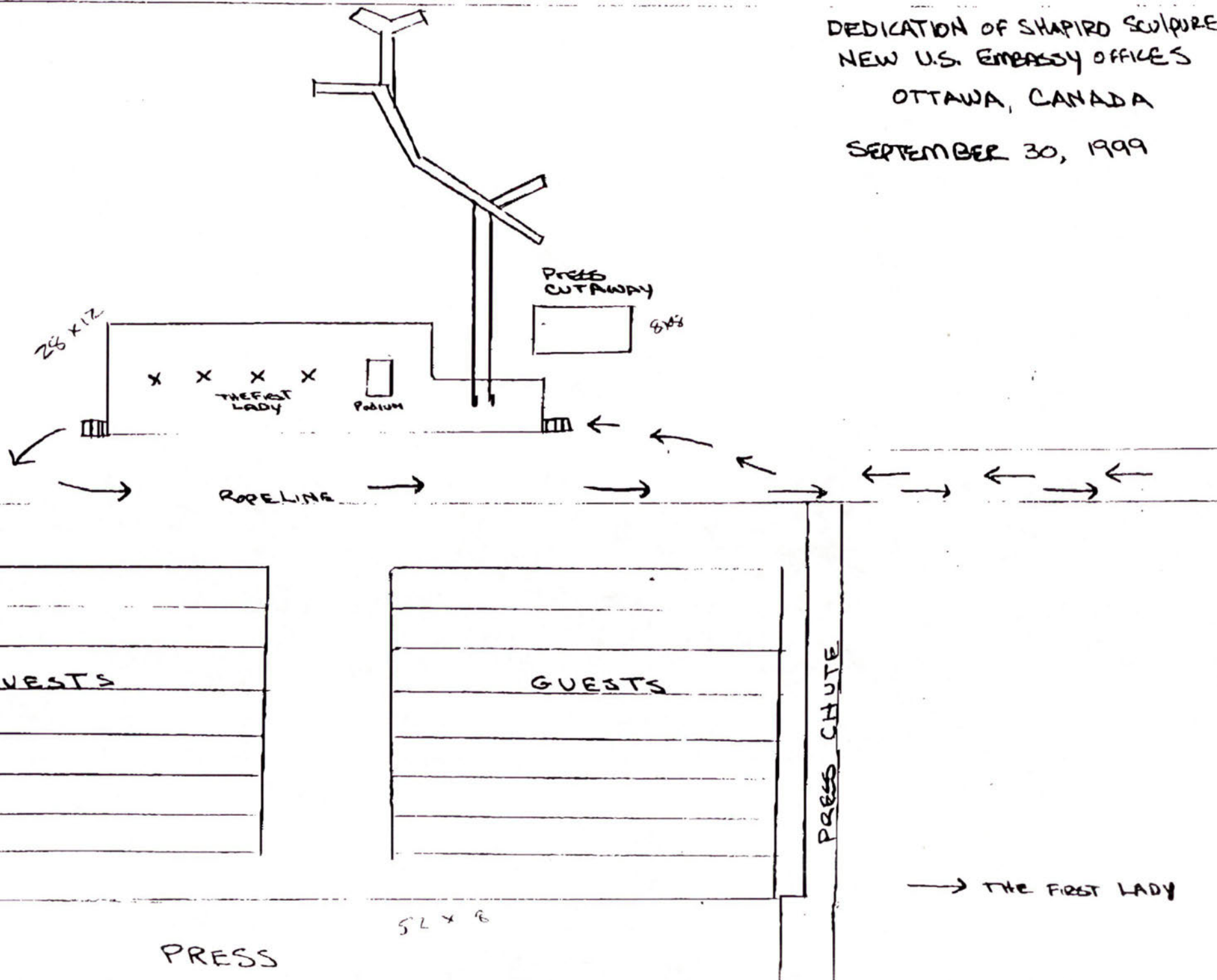
