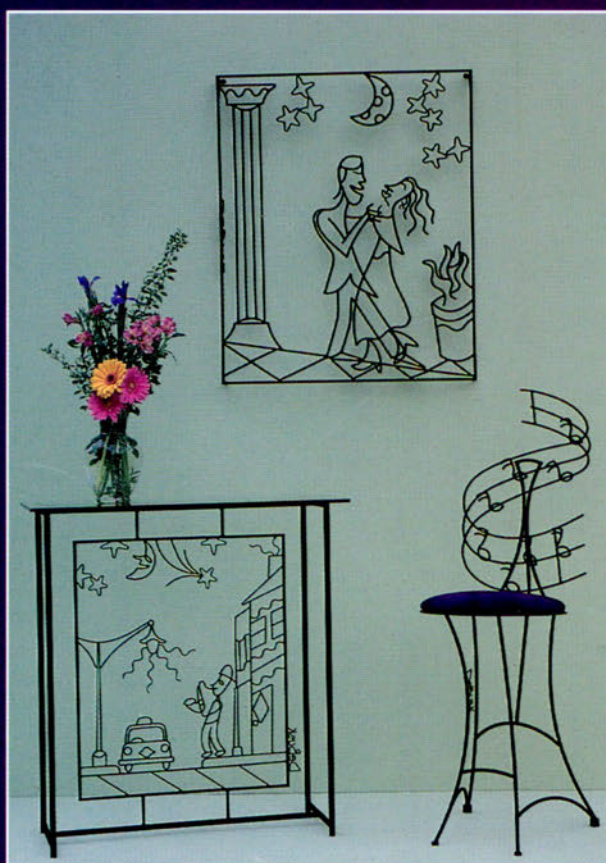
Among the special events will be glassblowing at Hot Soup studio, stone cutting and metal fabrication demonstrations at Heavy Metal jewelry studio and a craft and fine arts fair at Head House Square. Eyes Gallery will celebrate its 30th anniversary with a showing of 52 artists, while two new galleries, the GK Collection on Walnut Street and Odds-n-Blends Too on Pine Street, are planning open houses to welcome first-time visitors.

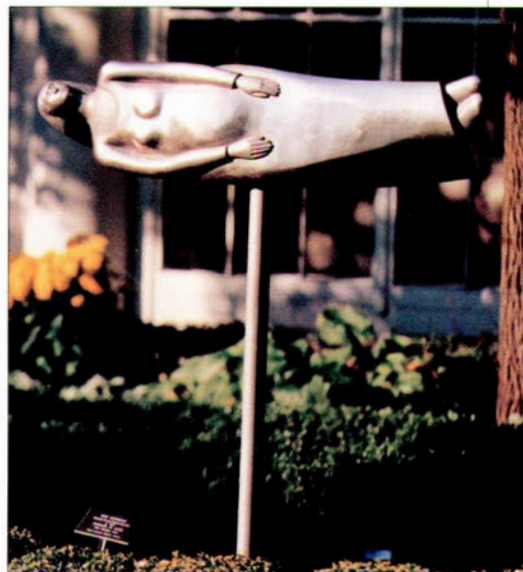

A Gathering of Tribes at the White House

GUARDIAN SPIRITS, BIRD EFFIGIES and seaweed people are hovering around the White House, thanks to Hillary Rodham Clinton's sixth annual sculpture exhibition. This year's show focuses on contemporary Native American sculpture—the most extensive showing ever of such work in the nation's capital—and the works are as diverse as the tribal backgrounds of the 12 artists represented.

Doug Coffin, a Potawatomi/Creek, evokes the totem tradition with "Earth Messenger Totem," a 28-foot-high con-

temporary painted steel structure. Willard Stone, a Cherokee, carved a sensuous nude, "Lady of Spring," in walnut. Winnebago Truman Lowe's "Bird Effigy" is the most abstract object in the show, constructed of welded aluminum poles.

The exhibition, which was organized by the Heard Museum in Phoenix, Ariz., will remain on view in the White House's Jacqueline Kennedy Garden through October.

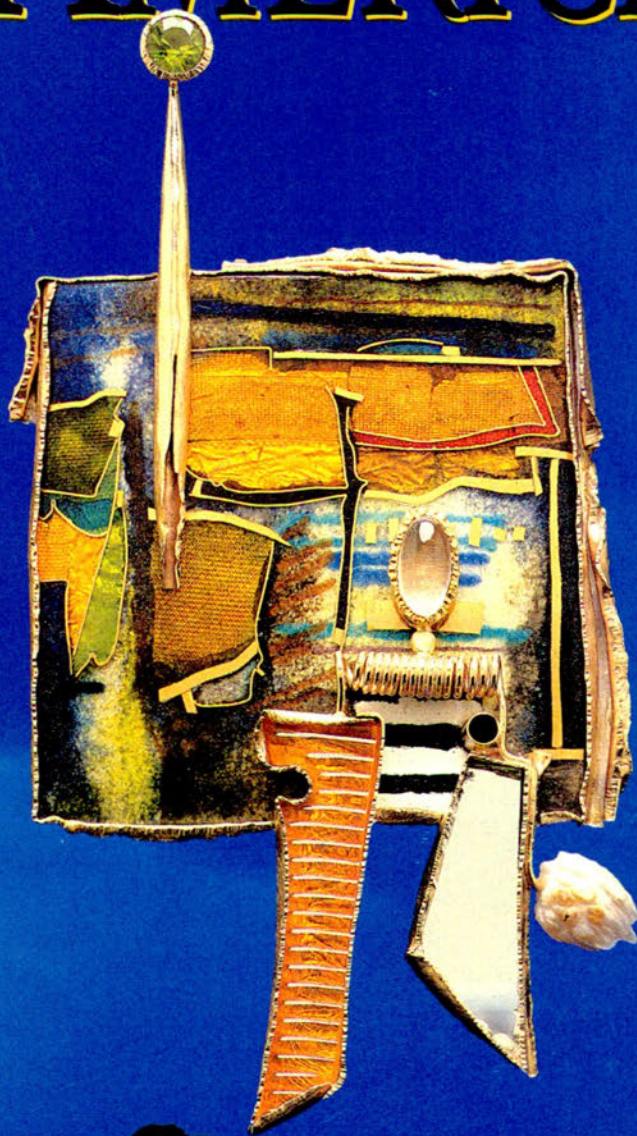
