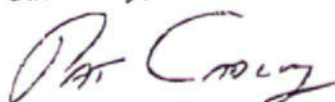

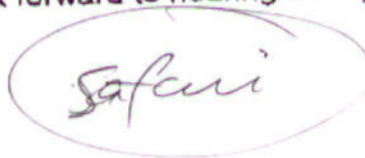

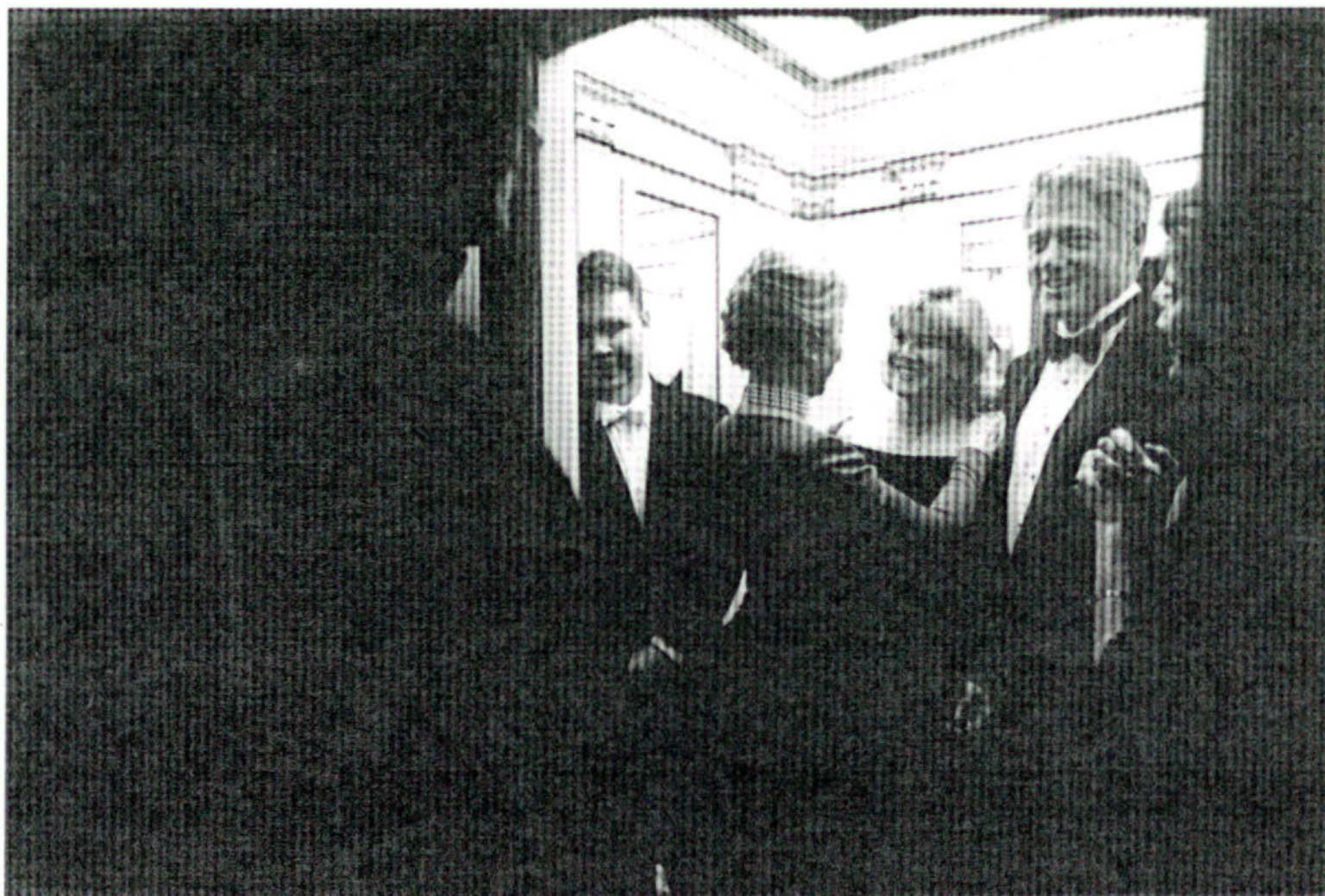

This is to correct a statement contained in the a review of the book "The First Partner: Hillary Rodham Clinton", appearing in your opinion section on May 26. It is stated as fact that the First Lady "accepted a \$40,000 prize from the World Health Organization...and when Cuba's Fidel Castro spoke at the same session" she sat "quietly in the audience".

The First Lady was awarded the United Arab Emirates Health Foundation Prize for her work with women, children and their families at the World Health Assembly meeting in Geneva in May of 1998. This is the annual meeting of the World Health Organization's member countries. She did not receive or decide the recipient of the \$40,000 prize. WHO received the money and it was used to help fund a WHO project in Tanzania that works to reduce death in childbirth.

The First Lady was not in the audience during Mr. Castro's speech to the Assembly. He, however, was in the audience during her speech.
