In limited circumstances, she will attend events in New York in this official role. It is in her official role in support of the President only that she is participating in the Naval Review. As always occurs with such events, all relevant White House offices, including the White House Counsel's Office, reviewed all the facts and circumstances surrounding this event before determining that the First Lady's role in the event was in her official capacity.

WASHINGTON James Dale proved resourceful and diligent as he worked his way through the ranks of the Boy Scouts of America. He showed the same qualities when he turned his energies against the organization.
Expelled as a scout leader for being gay, Dale waged a 10-year fight against the organization's policy that considers homosexuality contrary to the oath requiring scouts to be "morally straight." The fight landed at the U.S. Supreme Court and culminated Wednesday with the high court's 5-4 decision that the Scouts can bar homosexuals from serving as troop leaders a loss for Dale.

NEW YORK On his first day on the lam from prison, Jamal Hightower managed to steal some clothes and score some drugs. On his second day out of jail, Hightower was found dead of an apparent drug overdose in the Bronx, wearing a Rite Aid vest he had stolen.
In his 24 years, Hightower has managed to elude law enforcement authorities, at least for awhile. In April, he held police at bay, shooting at them and using a woman as a human shield, during a terror-filled afternoon in the Bronx. On Sunday night, he apparently faked seizures and was taken to a Bronx hospital. Early Monday morning, he managed to walk calmly out of the emergency room eluding three corrections officers assigned to guard him.

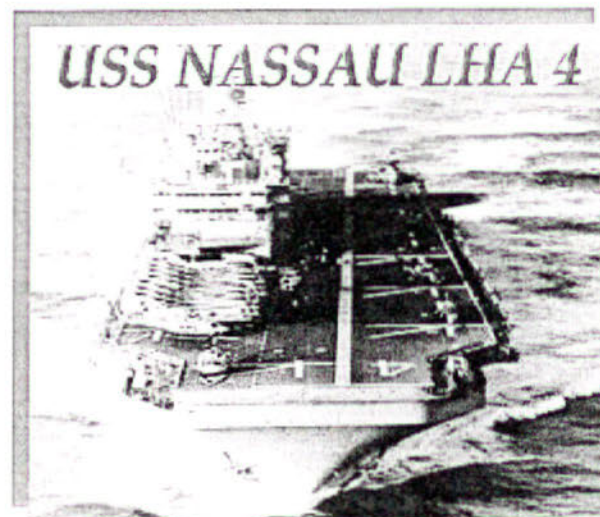

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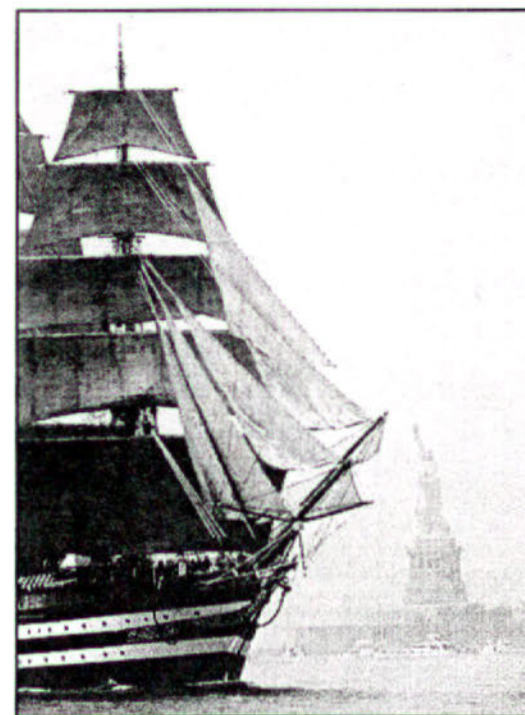

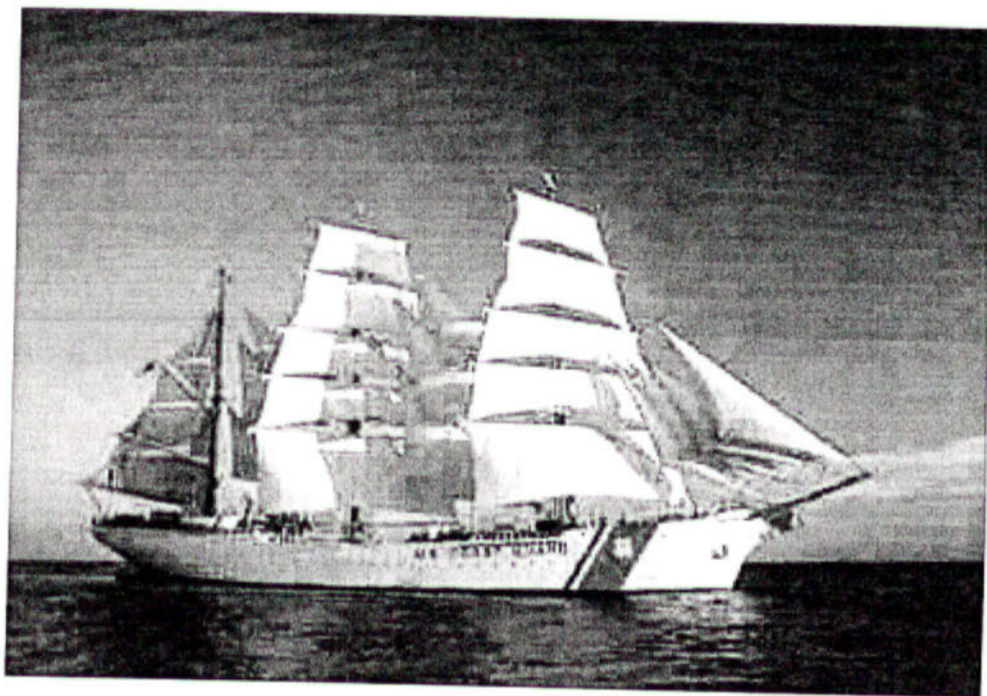
