Recently you sent me a couple of notes concerning requests from television producers desiring an opportunity to develop some type of program about the White House. *Dear Neil.*

Further to our various conversations and correspondence, I have now received the go-ahead to progress the proposal of an exchange of chefs between the White House and Buckingham Palace.

My initial thoughts are that two chefs should travel to Washington and spend two weeks at the White House, working in the kitchens and learning from the chefs there what is done for the President, how the staff are fed, and so on. The visit should be focused on work experience, and I would hope that the chefs would be included in the day to day running of the operation (i.e. that they are not purely there to observe).

I would hope that there would not be a problem with security clearance, given that all our staff are cleared by the British security services before they are able to commence employment at Buckingham Palace. In addition, I would propose sending staff who have been employed here for some time.

My main concern is the question of publicity. There are two reasons for this. Firstly as this is partially experimental (i.e. this is the first exchange we have done of this nature, although we are exploring other opportunities with Royal Households elsewhere in Europe), we would certainly not want it to be publicised before it happened, although if it was successful then our respective press offices might wish to make some sort of media announcement thereafter. Secondly we have a strict policy covering all personnel at Buckingham Palace which is that they are not permitted to talk to the media. We would expect any member of White House staff coming to the Palace to comply with this policy and any information gained whilst at Buckingham Palace to be treated in the utmost confidence. This would include, for example, a ban on the publication of Royal recipes. I would be grateful for your assurance that this level of discretion would be observed by the visiting chefs, please.

I very much hope that we can continue to explore this project, and if you do require any further information, then of course please do not hesitate to let me know.

Last evening, Jan. 26, 2000, I called your office at 6 p.m. and left a detailed voice mail message seeking comment to a story we are considering for publication, in which two of America's foremost voice stress analysts discuss their findings after examining recorded interviews the First Lady recently gave during a campaign visit to western New York State.

These analysts, after studying voice stress charts of Mrs. Clinton's spoken words, concluded she lied on two occasions, specifically:

- When she denies ever having been sexually unfaithful to the President, or having had such an involvement with the late Vince Foster.

## Request for Comment—2

According to one analyst, "Mrs. Clinton's response is definitely deceptive, specifically on the word 'No!', which means she was not truthful in answering that question."

- When she tells an interviewer "There is love in our family." Said another voice stress expert: "That statement is so riddled with deception that I consider it "a bald-faced lie...Hillary she hates Bill Clinton's guts."

On the other hand, when Mrs. Clinton responds "No!" to a question about with her possible past use of pot or cocaine, her answer was found by both analysts to be totally truthful.

As background to our story, we refer to shocking allegations about Hillary's affair with Mr. Foster as detailed in author Christopher Anderson's book, "Bill and Hillary: The Marriage" (William Morrow & Co. Inc., 1999). Anderson cites eyewitnesses who told him Vince Foster was often seen fondling Hillary in public.

He also quotes an Arkansas state trooper who saw Hillary and Foster together and said they "were deeply in love. I saw them locked in each other's arms, deep-kissing, nuzzling."

We also plan to cite published reports that "Hillary's cheating dates as far back as the Clintons' days in Arkansas -- and it continued eve after they moved into the White House."

Request for Comment--3

"In true Clinton style," says one source, "Hillary is leaning toward her husband's favorite solution -- deny everything. But the fact is she's had two big affairs while married to Bill."

Her first affair, said the source, was with Foster, the longtime Clinton advisor whose 1993 death was ruled a suicide. It began before the Clintons made it to the White House, back in Arkansas.

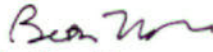

## Teenager Trusts Promiscuous Promiser

What happens when a citizen actually believes a campaigning politician's idle promises?

At a May 24 Democratic National Committee fund-raiser at the M.C.I. Center in Washington, D.C., Anita Drobny and her 16-year-old daughter, Jessica, found themselves sitting at a table next to Hillary Clinton's. Jessica Drobny, a high school sophomore from Highland Park, Ill., who had met Mrs. Clinton twice before, took the opportunity to tell the First Lady about a project she was working on for history class; the subject was female genital mutilation (F.G.M.) in Africa. Mrs. Clinton had given speeches about it in the past.

"They had a dialogue for several moments," Anita Drobny said.

"She was really interested," her daughter gushed. Following the exchange, Mrs. Clinton wrote down Jessica's name and address and promised to send her copies of her notes and speeches on the subject.

By Sunday, June 4, however, the promised material had not arrived. The project was due in three days. So Jessica's mother, who had contributed \$5,000 to Mrs. Clinton's Senate campaign, did what any slighted donor would do: She called up the campaign's Seventh Avenue headquarters to complain. Christopher Fickes, deputy finance director, took the call.

"She was really mad," Jessica later recalled of her mother.

"I can't imagine that Mrs. Clinton would promise you something and not deliver," Anita Drobny said.

Mr. Fickes passed the problem along to Huma Abedin, Mrs. Clinton's personal assistant at the White House. What followed, according to a source close to the campaign, was "an urgent and worried game of phone tag" between harried underlings.

The staff reacted swiftly to the mounting crisis. A search was ordered for the missing materials and for the staff member responsible for their disappearance. The task of mounting an attack against new Senate campaign opponent Rick Lazio was ever-so-briefly shelved so that Jessica

Drobny could get her project in on time.

Eventually, the speeches on F.G.M. were discovered. The campaign staff faxed them to Jessica Drobny. But it was too late. She had finished her project.

A source close to the campaign said that the delay in sending the copies of the speeches occurred because Mrs. Clinton "had told someone on the White House staff, but she thought she had told someone *else* on the White House staff. It just kept passing from one person to another."

Lissa Muscatine, the First Lady's press secretary said, "I have a hard time seeing the importance of this, other than that somebody didn't get information in a timely matter." (That sounds familiar.)

After Jessica had delivered her report, an envelope from the White House containing Mrs. Clinton's speeches arrived at the Drobny household. It was a poignant reminder of what might have been.

Without the First Lady's timely help on the project, Jessica failed to get an A. "It's very hard to get an A in that class," she said.

Leslie Gray Levin, her teacher in the class (World History Since 1500), explained, "The reason why her grade wasn't an A was she was missing some of the requirements on the requirement sheet." Besides, Mrs. Levin had seen this kind of thing before. "I had a student last year and a student this year who hosted the parties for the Clinton-Gore benefits."

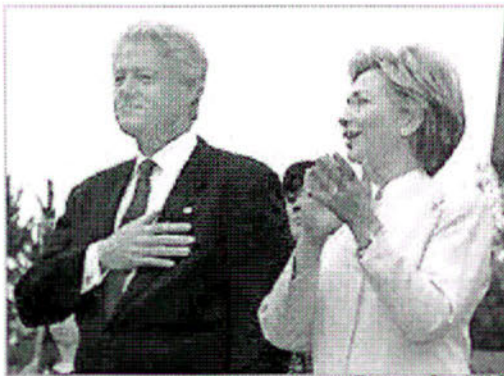

### Clintons Cleared in Filegate Scandal

President Clinton and his wife Hillary were officially cleared of wrongdoing in the FBI file controversy Friday.

900 FBI files on prominent Republicans.

The report, issued by Independent Counsel Robert Ray, is the final decision on the scandal known as "Filegate."

It concludes that certain White House personnel, including security chief Craig Livingstone, behaved inappropriately, but there is no evidence to back up claims that Hillary Rodham Clinton or the president ordered the acquisition of

Livingstone has been at the center of the scandal, as he is believed to have obtained the FBI files. In June, the former bar bouncer spoke out about his reputation: "I want to say something about me, Craig Livingstone. I have been described as a political operative, a beefy, former bar bouncer and henchman, who was supposedly engaged in all sorts of misconduct dating back almost 20 years. These are false and unfair caricatures of who I am."

"I am proud that I have personally participated in our democratic system of government," Livingstone added, "and I have worked hard for little or no pay in political campaigns for candidates who I felt would make this country a better place to live."

Ray also released a report clearing former White House counsel Bernard Nussbaum of allegations that he lied to Congress about his involvement in the FBI Files and White House travel office matters.

There was no credible evidence to support allegations that Nussbaum lied to the House Government Reform and Oversight Committee in June 1996 when he denied ever talking with Mrs. Clinton about the hiring of White House Office of Personnel Security Chief Craig Livingstone, according to the report.

"The evidence compiled by the OIC did not substantiate that Mrs. Clinton or Mr. Nussbaum were involved in or knew the details of

hiring Mr. Livingstone," the report states.

The report also finds no evidence of a relationship between Mrs. Clinton and Livingstone's mother, as suggested in testimony by FBI agents.

The allegation was that Livingstone was not qualified to hold such a position at the White House, and that he only could have gotten the job with the help of Mrs. Clinton.

The report says Mrs. Clinton was specifically asked in a January 14, 1998 interview with the OIC if she spoke with Nussbaum or other White House officials about hiring Livingstone. Mrs. Clinton said she had not, and added that she never met and did not know Livingstone's mother.

"The Independent Counsel has determined that no prosecution of Mr. Nussbaum was warranted because of insufficient evidence that he gave knowingly false testimony before the House Committee on June 26, 1996, and this matter is now closed," Ray's report states.

The conclusion that the Clintons are free of blame will no doubt be met with much resistance from groups such as Judicial Watch, which has accused the OIC of conducting an "incomplete" investigation.

Hillary had denied knowing Livingstone, but Judicial Watch claims that not only did Hillary Clinton hire Livingstone, the Clinton White House also withheld photographs of Livingstone with the Clintons.

Gary Aldrich, former FBI agent and author of *Unlimited Access: An FBI Agent Inside the Clinton White House*, also believes that Hillary hired Livingstone, he told the *Washington Times*. In his book, Aldrich wrote that Livingstone was "clearly unqualified" for the security post, "traveled on Air Force One with the first family" and was "selected by the first lady and the president to handle arrangements for Vince Foster's funeral."

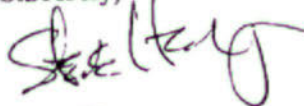
