Crime hazard reporting

Did you know that you can prevent a crime before it even happens?

This can be done by using the AF form 1203 which is better known as the Crime Hazard Report. The crime hazard report is used in the crime identification program. All personnel are encouraged to use these reports to help identify, report and eliminate as many crime hazards as possible. The information on these reports will be used to reduce the opportunity for a crime.

The report should be typed or written legibly, folded in half and sent through distribution to: Chief, Security Police.

A crime hazard report can be used in an area where thefts are occurring due to poor locks or bad lighting.

Your Base Crime prevention section will then address your problem within 10 working days. For further questions about crime prevention contact me at Ext. 3400. By working together we can "take a bite out of crime!"

Ms. Muscatine:

We spoke about a month ago regarding an initiative to help find missing children in the New York City area that we thought Mrs. Clinton might be interested in helping with. The initiative employs the use of advanced Internet technologies to quickly distribute missing person bulletins to geographically targeted regions of the city, state, nation, and world. As a parent myself, I am very excited about this technology and its potential power to find abducted children.

In the last year, more than 120 people have been declared missing by the New York City Police Department, most of whom are children. We think we can help find them.

The Radiate proposal is detailed below.

RECRUITING THE COMMUNITY FOR HELP

Despite the most careful precautions, children sometimes fall into dangerous situations. As an anonymous outlet, the Internet can be easily manipulated by potential abductors to befriend and meet unsuspecting children. To prevent such situations and protect child welfare, Radiate Corporation shares Mrs. Clinton's vision of a community effort and hopes to play an active role by creating the **Missing Persons Initiative**. Radiate has one of the largest communities of active Internet users anywhere—it currently exceeds 30 million people with 100,000 new ones joining everyday.

MISSING PERSONS INITIATIVE: Using Internet Technology to Find Children

Radiate, the largest network of free, ad-supported software in the world, can offer invaluable aid in the search for missing persons.

- Ad-serving technology: Radiate ad-serving technology is the most advanced software of its kind and can send messages to users in any geographic location in

an instant, through the Internet. Radiate plans to donate a portion of its ad inventory to display missing persons bulletins.

- Conduit for Communication: Radiate ad-serving technology serves as a two-way conduit for customers to communicate with software providers and vice-versa. When consumers recognize a photograph of a missing person, they can click through those images to immediately send authorities information about that person's location, etc.

- Largest Network in the World: Radiate serves an audience of 30 million customers and acquires 100,000 new users each day. This immense network would be a powerful resource in the search for missing persons.

INVOLVEMENT

Radiate invites Mrs. Clinton, one of the best-known child advocates in the world, to endorse and participate in this campaign to help in the search for abducted children and adults. In conjunction with Radiate, she would announce the program at a press conference in New York, tentatively scheduled for October 11.
