USAID ANNOUNCES PUBLIC SERVICE CAMPAIGN TO HELP VICTIMS OF KOSOVO

Washington, DC – The U.S. Agency for International (USAID) has produced a 30-second television and radio Public Service Announcement featuring First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton to encourage those who want to help the refugees of Kosovo to call 1-800-USAID-RELIEF. President Clinton announced the special toll-free phone number on April 6. The PSA highlights the tragic humanitarian situation in the Balkans and underscores the need for financial contributions to non-governmental organizations working in the region.

In the PSA Mrs. Clinton says, "Thousands of Americans are reaching out to help the refugees of Kosovo. Relief workers, members of our armed forces, and concerned citizens everywhere are helping innocent people who have been driven from their homes and are in desperate need of food, shelter and care. The best way to help is through financial contributions. Help give life and hope to the Kosovo refugees. Please call 1-800-USAID-RELIEF. Thank you very much."

A phone bank has been established to handle the enormous number of phone calls received through the 1-800 number, almost 42,000 since the president's announcement on April 5, 1999. Up to 100 operators have been trained and are ready 24 hours a day to take calls from concerned Americans and help them direct their cash donations to support the humanitarian relief operation on the ground.

The PSA has been endorsed by Ruth Wooden, President of the Ad Council, who is encouraging stations to run it.

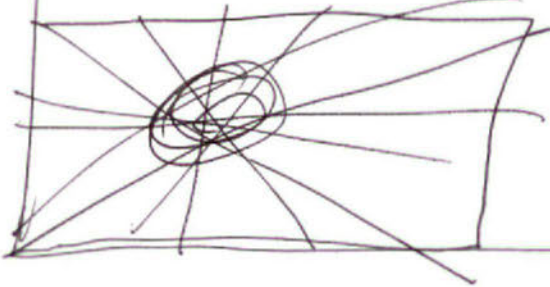

DOVER AIR FORCE BASE, Del. – Hillary Rodham Clinton will visit Dover Air Force Base ^{on} Friday to observe the continuing humanitarian relief operations to provide daily food rations to hundreds of thousands of displaced Kosovo refugees.

The First Lady will focus on thanking the men and women of the Dover Team who are currently involved in this NATO led humanitarian relief effort.

Dover AFB has moved more than 800,000 pounds of humanitarian daily rations since April 2. This equates to more than 340,000 individual meals, which have reached the hands of the Kosovo refugees.

The event is open to Dover AFB personnel and family members, as well as representatives of the media. Those media wishing to cover the event must be at the Dover AFB Main Gate no later than _____ a.m.

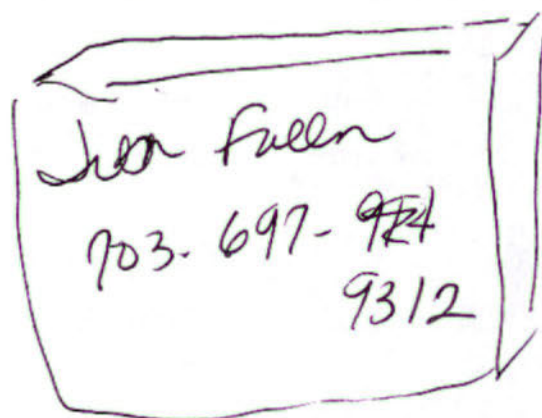
