"On the House with the Carey Brothers" will be here tomorrow evening through Saturday when their show goes live from the White House. Dale Haney is booked for 6:00 tomorrow (Wednesday) evening, and Betty Monkman will be interviewed Thursday at 4:15. Each interview will take about 15 minutes, but the Carey Brothers were hoping to get some background info on Betty and Dale before the interviews (e.g. bios, job responsibilities, areas of expertise, questions they would like to be asked, etc.).

Dale has suggested that the Carey Brothers follow him as he prepares for the state dinner, or as he works on Friday. Would Gary allow this, or would it be too disruptive? The Carey Brothers are free to follow him any time until Friday afternoon when they will be editing their tapes.

Since the focus of their program is restoration, they are eager to see some of the preserved areas of the White House. Betty is unable to take them on a tour, but Julianne was hoping that someone in our office might show them a few restored areas (maybe the State Dining Room?).

Another suggestion was that they talk to Gary briefly about maintenance of the House. I told them this was unlikely, but that I would check.

They are interested in interviewing Nancy Clarke as well to ask how ideas for decorating come about and who helps with decorating for state dinners, etc.

Lastly, they want to know if anyone is available for live interviews on Saturday. Again, I told them this is unlikely. I think that if they get enough pre-taped material, they won't have a need for live interviews.

One more thing. Julianne suggested the Carey Brothers preview the Spring Garden Tours on their show. Sharon mentioned last week that we should start looking at press opportunities around the garden tour, so this might be a nice place to start. Do you think Dale would be able to talk about this?

Betty C. Monkman was appointed Curator, the White House in 1997. She began her museum career as Registrar in the Office of the Curator and in 1980 was named Associate Curator. Her current responsibilities include the planning and supervision of curatorial and historical projects, working with the Committee for the Preservation of the White House and the White House Historical Association, interpreting the White House and its collections through lectures, publications, and exhibits, and conducting oral history interviews with the Executive Residence staff.

Ms. Monkman planned and curated the first exhibition on the White House "The White House 1792-1992: Image in Architecture" in 1992 and worked closely with the National Park Service in planning exhibits for the White House Visitor Center which opened in 1995. She has contributed articles on the White House to several publications including an essay in the book Art in the White House: A Nation's Pride (1992) and articles in Our Changing White House (1995) and White House History (1997, 1998).

She has delivered papers and lectures throughout the country on White House subjects - its history, architecture, changing interiors, decorative and fine arts collections, holiday traditions, and the documentation of historic properties.

Ms. Monkman received a B.A. in history from the University of North Dakota and a M.A. in American Studies from George Washington University. In 1995 she attended the Attingham Summer School for the Study of British Country Houses.

She serves as a member of the Committee for the Preservation of the White House and the Octagon Committee of the American Institute of Architects Foundation and is a member of the American Association of Museums, the Mid-Atlantic Association of Museums and the Society for History in the Federal Government where she is on the Executive Council. She has served on the board of directors of the Museum of the City of Washington (1980-1992), the board of managers of the Historical Society of Washington, D. C. (1980-1992), the District of Columbia Bicentennial Commission (1987-1992).
