On behalf of the Society of General Internal Medicine (SGIM), I wish to extend an invitation to Mrs. Hillary Rodham Clinton to deliver the Peterson Honor Lecture at our Annual National Meeting, April 27-29 1994 to be held in Washington, DC at the Ramada Renaissance Hotel. The lecture is the keynote address scheduled for Thursday, April 28, 1994, as an after dinner speech for approximately 30-45 minutes. Thus, we would be greatly honored to have Mrs. Clinton deliver the Peterson Lecture and share her views on health care reform with the membership of SGIM.

The Malcom L. Peterson lectureship is intended to bring a distinguished national leader to share his/her views with the Society on an important current issue. The lectureship has been endowed by the Sergei S. Zlinkoff Fund for Medical Education and Research to foster the membership's consideration of broad and significant themes that relate to the highest ideals of medicine and to the many ways in which physicians may serve. Dr. Peterson throughout his career exemplified aspects of such service: as a scientist and researcher, as a clinician, and as an educator; as well as through his community service and his deep commitment to social and public issues affecting the health and well-being of all persons.

The Society is composed of 2,300 members and represents the faculties of medical schools and teaching hospitals in primary care general internal medicine throughout the United States and Canada. These members, therefore, play key roles

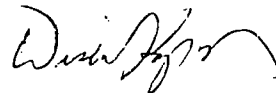

in medical student training, general medicine resident education, and research in the delivery of primary care. The Society has had a long-standing interest in the broad issues of health care reform and has supported the Administration's efforts to develop a health care system to provide universal access to care for all Americans and a system that increases our primary care workforce.

One of the highlights of the activities of SGIM is our national meeting. Because of the importance of primary care, the theme of this meeting is "Enhancing Generalism in Medicine". Several initiatives in promoting general medicine career choices will be featured, including a day-long course on revitalizing education, training, and practice of general medicine. The attendance is expected to be approximately 1,200, most of whom are primary care physicians.

We sincerely hope that Mrs. Clinton will accept our invitation. Her presence will clearly highlight the Administration's commitment to primary care. 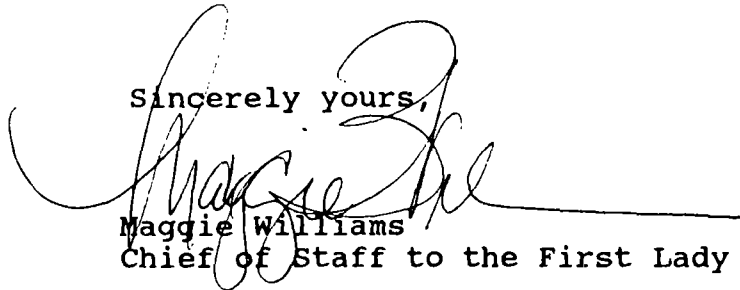

I am a twenty-nine year old housewife in Asheboro NC. I have come to a very up setting block in my life. My husband is on disability he is epileptic. He also takes medication to help control his Seizers. He receives 450.00 dollars each month. He gets a Social Security Check and SSI this is the total of the two checks. He also is on Medicaid. We were married December of ninty-two. His checks didnt go up any they stayed the same. We even had to go on Foodstamps which we only receive one hundred and four dollars each month. We pay house Rent of the Amount of Two hundred dollars each month. That don't leave a hole lot of money left to pay our other bills.

This is the problem i am writing you about. When we were married he received no more for his wife. I have no job and i can't get medical. If i try to work they will take my income or some of it out of my husbands Check (SSI). I was going to metal Health for depression and was put on a medication the medication was (Prozac). I filed for Medicaid to help with the Cost of the visits & the medication and i was turned down. I had to stop going. But my Problems are still here. I Couldn't Afford to keep going. All i want is to be able to work and pay my Doctor bills & buy my medication without hurting my husbands only income.

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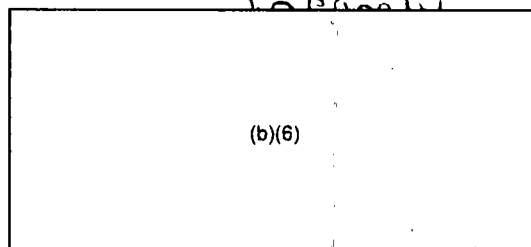

I was told ~~that~~ that if i received any money from this grant At the end of the Semester this would Cant as income and Could be took out of his Check. I don't know what to do. If my dreams hurt my husbands income then i Can't go on with my dreams. This is all he has. I know the economy is bad. I don't want the tax payers to keep me up. I just don't want to mess my husbands checks up. let me keep myself up & go to College without him having to lose.

Please here me out on this. I know there are plenty of people who have the same problems. But if i didn't Cant when we were married why Cant me & my income now. Please give me a Reply on this Situation.

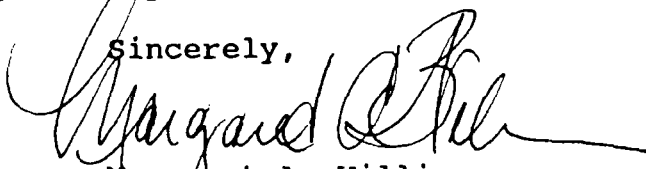

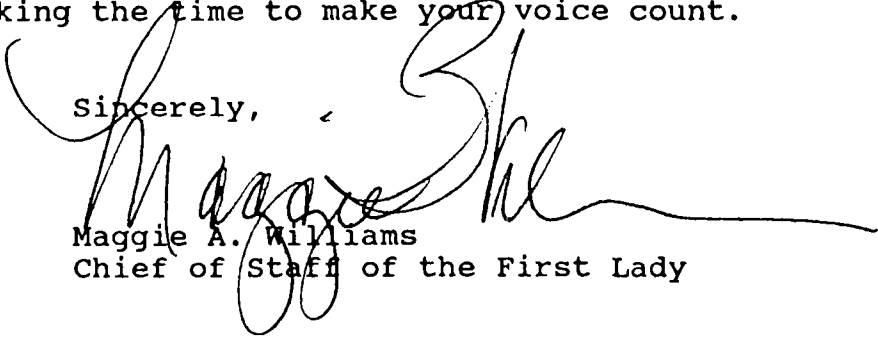

Hello. I am a friend of Alva Smith a former roommate of yours. I know her from the Federal Election Commission where I worked for over 10 years. I am also a friend of Marie Brookster having worked with her on Presidential Transition here in Washington, DC. I have worked on the Clinton-Gore Campaign full-time since March 1992 and now work with White House Correspondence reading the President's mail since February.

I have an idea for the First Lady given her background in working with children. Recent Congressional hearings have pointed to the problem of violence on television, particularly because of children watching. 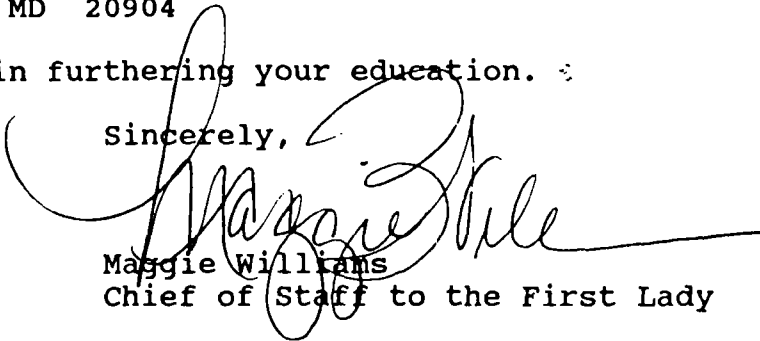

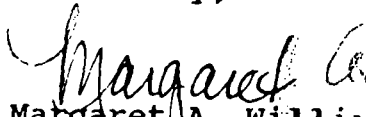

My dear mother:

I am kindly asking you to please help sponsor me at Valley View College to study in the field of Computer Science.

Valley View College is owned and operated by the Seventh-day Adventist Union Mission. It operates three quarters per year and has a yearly tuition fees of about \$480.00 (\$160.00 per quarter). However, enclosed is their financial information which has been written in the Ghanaian currency, but for your better understanding, I have calculated it into United States' Dollar at the rate of 400 Cedis to one United States' Dollar. This rate is based on the Ghanaian Financial Report given over their Number One Radio Station. Transportation fees from Danane, Cote d'Ivoire to Valley View College in Accra, Ghana is about \$75.00 by Car and about \$160.00 by air plane. School will start by September '93.

I got your name and address from Ebony magazine from U.S.A.
