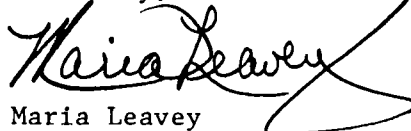
Dear Maggie:

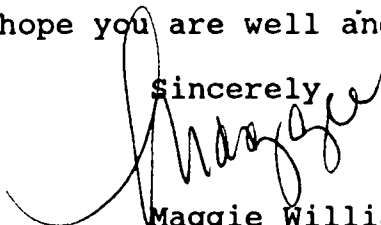

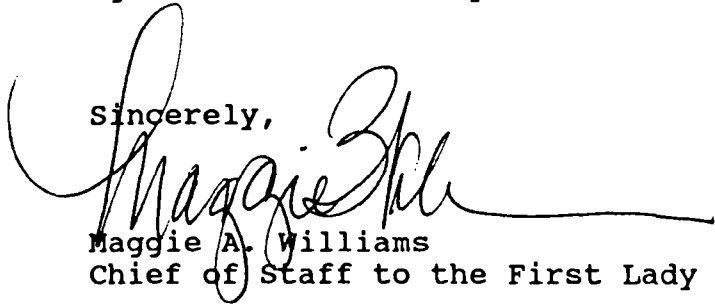

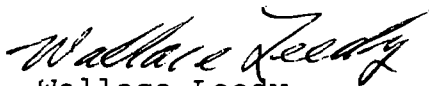

HOMOSEXUALITY
The Mystery is Solved
By Wallace Leedy

What is homosexuality? Is it a lifestyle? Is it a sexual preference? Is it a sexual orientation? Is it a unique genetic disorder? Of course not! All of the above are nonsense. Then what is it? It is sexual addiction, of a different kind, where the person is addicted sexually to others of the same gender--male to male and female to female.

With the application of logical thinking, and from studying the literature on addiction in general and sexual addiction in particular, along with human sexuality and family relationships, one must conclude that homosexuality is simply a different form of sexual addiction--male to male and female to female. Therefore, sexual addiction is not confined to heterosexuals, a fact heretofore unrecognized by society and its professionals (MD psychiatrists, PhD psychologists and other practitioners working in the area) or any others trying to determine what homosexuality is and its etiology.

The term homosexuality simply describes the activity--sexual contact between two or more people of the same gender. It offers nothing in the way of explaining what homosexuality is, or describing the conditions leading up to it. And herein lies the problem to understanding this mental-emotional, behavior-based illness. A person searching for a scientific explanation must first examine the behavior itself, and then ~~not~~ try to justify an illness, as is being done today by most professionals working in the area, by the media and entertainment industry, and by homosexuals. It is all too easy to fall into the trap of "I don't understand it, so it must be biological."

To recognize homosexual behavior as an illness, just think about what homosexuals do, with and to each other. Now that is not a good, clean, healthy, happy, wholesome activity. It is sick. Each participant is out of control, Emotions have taken over--the mind is not working. And in time, after a few more same gender sexual encounters, the behavior becomes an addiction, not just promiscuity. It was in 1982 when I came to the conclusion that homosexuals were sick.

For a meaningful explanation of homosexuality and its etiology, there is a common pattern among homosexuals in their relationships with their parents. Where a heterosexual sexual addict admires and emulates the

sexually addicted parent of the same gender, the homosexual is not on good terms with his or her parents, especially the parent of the same gender, and thusly rejects the relationship of the parents to each other and to him or her. Therefore, homosexuality can also be described as the "flip-side" of heterosexual sexual addiction.

In contrast to the destructive relationships found in families containing sexual addicts (both types), there is also a common pattern that good, clean, healthy, happy, wholesome, productive parents raise good, clean, healthy, happy, wholesome, productive children. The question then arises: Is the unsatisfactory relationship with parents a requirement for becoming a homosexual? And the answer is: probably not, as there is no doubt a myriad of reasons a person can become addicted sexually, either a heterosexual sexual addict or a homosexual, just as there is for any other addiction. Keep in mind the awesome power of addiction. Addictions have no limits; they are in every segment of society. If it's available, try it! Try it again, and again, . . . and one is "hooked" (addicted). A person just "has to have it," whatever it is!

For examples of the family dynamics involved for sexual addicts of both types, one only needs to look around among friends, neighbors, relatives, close associates, ministers and lay leaders, and public figures. There are excellent examples among well recognized sexually addicted public figures, and in the literature for heterosexual sexual addicts only of course since homosexuals up to now, have not been recognized as sexual addicts. The most obvious public figure examples of sexual addicts displaying the common family dynamics include President John Kennedy and Neuroscientist, Dr. Simon LeVay, recently with the Salk Institute in San Diego. The family dynamics of the Kennedy family is well documented in the literature and the family dynamics of Dr. LeVay, a homosexual, has been well documented, unintentionally, through recent interviews with him on CBS's 60 Minutes, ABC's 20/20 and Primetime Live, and on CNN's Larry King Live.

And now for the role of the professionals: psychiatrists, psychologists, neuroscientists, other licensed practitioners, and the public schools. Prior to 1973, the American Psychiatric Association defined homosexuality as a mental illness. Then in 1973, since they didn't really know what homosexuality was, they took it off their list of illnesses, thus declaring it a "non-illness." They did not say that it was healthy.

The psychologists have been in much the same state as the psychiatrists in the last few decades. Although much has been written, they too have not known what homosexuality is, therefore the growing belief that it must be biological. However, there are a few psychologists who still claim that ~~it is~~ behavioral based, including the connection with negative relationships with parent(s) but without really knowing what it is either. In 1979, there was a major breakthrough with the publication of Dr. Patrick Carnes' book "Out of the Shadows," the definitive work on heterosexual sexual addiction. Dr. Carnes is a psychologist in Minneapolis. From this beginning, much has been done in the understanding and treatment of heterosexual sexual addiction, but no "bridging" to homosexuality. Sexual addiction and gambling make up the two major nonsubstance abuse forms of addiction. What is common to all addictions is the emotional "high" (or thrill) that is ultimately achieved.

In our higher education system such as UCLA, in its course on human sexuality, homosexuality is taught as a sexual orientation and an acceptable and honorable "lifestyle." It is simply part of the "human condition." The reason I know this is because I audited the class in the Fall semester of 1991, along with other pertinent classes, shortly after I had made the connection of homosexuality with sexual addiction. Auditing pertinent classes at a reputable university is my way of doing a fast and thorough literature search.

As for our public school system, everyone should be aware of the ever growing general coverage of homosexuality as a sexual orientation and an approved lifestyle. It is presented in some cases as low as the first grade. Almost everyone by now is aware of the school programs where the child has "two mommies" or "two dads." This, along with the distribution of condoms, encourages sexual promiscuity which leads to sexual addiction (both types). I am sorry to say, but such mentality exhibited by our public schools is somewhat akin to giving a box of matches to a four year old child and telling him/her to go out in the forest and play. No wonder all the indicators of our behavioral ills are getting worse every year--alcohol, drugs, sexual addiction, teenage pregnancies, premature births, illegitimate births, divorce, crime--along with one of the most degrading of all conditions, that of poverty.

In the studies so far by scientists searching for a biological basis for homosexuality, all have recognized that an environmental influence is involved. It is

also interesting to note that none has been able to put together a valid sample of cadavers used in their research. A valid sample would consist of a sufficient number of cadavers for each of the following categories: ~~heterosexual~~ homosexual males and heterosexual females, homosexual males and homosexual females, and bisexual males and bisexual females. The bisexuals represent a third class of sexual addicts and are no doubt the most complex and confused of all. For the most part they are still in the "closet" and will probably stay there. From a logical analysis, bisexual males were no doubt responsible for most of the transmission of AIDS to the heterosexual population in the early 1980's from a previously homosexual disease in the United States.

The primary reason our professionals have failed to understand homosexuality as a mental-emotional behavior-based illness is, as stated above, that they have been looking for a justification, not an explanation. They have also been focusing on the subject from a much too narrow frame of reference. They need to take more of a systems view of the problem and consider all related factors: family relationships, sexuality, and addictive behaviors, especially sexual addiction. When our professionals make this change in their approach to the problem, I am sure they too will make the connection between homosexuality and sexual addition.

Understanding homosexuality is really quite simple when one has "solved the mystery," as described in this paper. Homosexuals themselves are the most confused of all in trying to understand why they are different. They too have not known what homosexuality is and how they got that way. So why shouldn't they begin to think that it is a natural way of life. They have only two choices ~~open~~ open to them: deny or justify. In recent decades, more and more of them have chosen to justify. And in their efforts to justify, most have settled on a few standard phrases, such as, "I was born to be gay," "one would not choose to be gay," "it's biological," "it's genetic," etc.. It is interesting to note that people with other types of mental-emotional illnesses also use similar phrases. For example, Jeffrey Dalmer, a serial killer, came to believe "it was meant to be." Dalmer's case was recently presented on television through ABC's "DayOne" program with Forrest Sawyer.

It is also fascinating to note that people (sexual addicts and others) often use the common phrase that they "fell in love" with a certain person. To understand what is really going on is to realize that the term "fell in love" really means that they "fell into sex" and then called the relationship "love" and

tried to make it meaningful. Love is best described as when another person's welfare is more important than your own. Sexual "bonding" is sexual addiction and is a temporary arrangement between any two people, whether it is a heterosexual couple or two homosexuals. It is not true love. It is sick. A true bonding can only take place after a commitment to love has been made, as in a heterosexual marriage, and is based first on that commitment. Sexual relations under marriage is a reward. Too many people continue to get this fact backwards. That is why our divorce rate continues to climb, along with other negative statistics, and sexual addiction in all three forms continue to thrive.

There are a few additional facts about addicts in general and sexual addicts in particular that are pertinent for the discussion here. One needs to realize that addictions typically run in multiples. Rarely does a person have just one addiction. Alcohol, drugs and sex are a standard combination. And all addicts will do anything to protect their addiction, whether they are "in or out of the closet." So what are the potential problems of sexual addicts (of all three types) in the military and in any work place? To answer these questions, it is necessary to know: (1) the working conditions, (2) the living conditions where applicable, and (3) the health hazards involved. With sexual addicts, all addictions and sexually transmitted diseases (STD's) are the most obvious.

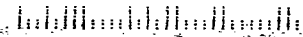
The study and treatment of homosexuals by the professionals, our public officials, and the general public at large, often display a compassion, a caring, a feeling of concern and fairness. In some cases there have been feelings of fear and hatred. But first a thorough factual understanding of homosexuality is required. The facts about homosexuality have now been presented for the first time anywhere in the world. It is now time for decisions to be made by our officials and the public at large that are based on these facts, not fiction.
