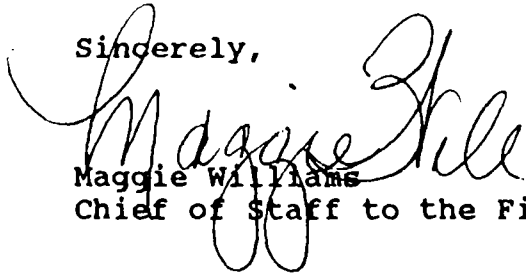

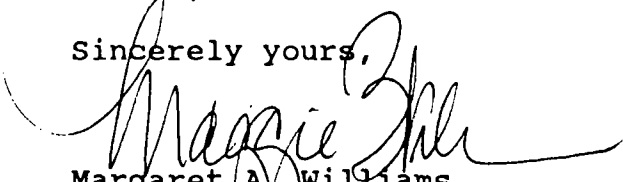

Regarding : TRAINING TEENAGE MOTHERS TO BE CERTIFIED
CHILD CARE WORKERS

Dear President and Mrs. Clinton:

The recent controversy surrounding the Zoë Baird nomination for Attorney General focused national attention on child care issues, couched mainly in terms of payment to and obligation for immigrant household help. The debate ignored the obvious: there are thousands of young, unemployed women who are U.S. citizens, and for whom child care training would provide needed parenting skills as well as professional qualifications for existing employment opportunities.

It is amazing that we debate the legal fine points of using illegal immigrants for child care in America when we have young women -- and especially, young mothers -- on welfare who would profit doubly from child care training. And it is curious that these two issues: the need for child care workers and the requirement for job training to end welfare dependence both played prominently in the media at the same time, and yet were never joined.

We may speculate on the reasons for this remarkable oversight. But more importantly, we may propose a practical and workable means of training young American women to be competent child care providers.

This is not a proposal for training baby-sitters. Rather, it is intended as one component of a serious national effort to give young children of *all* socio-economic backgrounds high quality physical care, emotional support and

intellectual stimulation. Our idea, and the confidence that it is feasible, stem from experience working with teenage mothers of America's inner cities.

In proposing this initiative, we concede that there is an element of fear inhibiting contact between suburban and inner city residents. We acknowledge that there are racial and cultural barriers that must be overcome by careful planning and diligent action.

Accordingly, we propose adhering to the following principles:

- * Start small, at one or two sites -- perhaps in Washington, DC. and Baltimore -- and develop a rigorous residential training model.
- * Establish a comprehensive curriculum, paying close attention to detail, including training in basic health and safety, early childhood development, professional dress, manners, and work attitudes.
- * Select highly-motivated individuals, use a clear system of incentives and penalties, monitor trainees closely, and provide needed long-term follow-up.
- * Place graduates in an apprentice program, guaranteeing them an adequate wage with appropriate benefits, and subsequent opportunities for continuing educational and career advancement.
- * Structure the program as a public-private partnership, through economic incentives for small businesses and local governments.

We urge you to offer leadership in addressing the real issues of child care in America by establishing a training program which will demonstrate concretely the need for a comprehensive approach, the rigorous training it demands, and the potential role of young mothers as child care professionals. This is clearly an investment in the nation's future deserving of collaboration between government and private enterprise.

If this concept interests you, we should be pleased to discuss our ideas in greater detail with whomever you may designate.

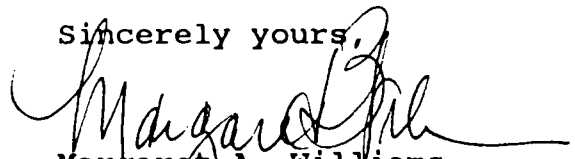

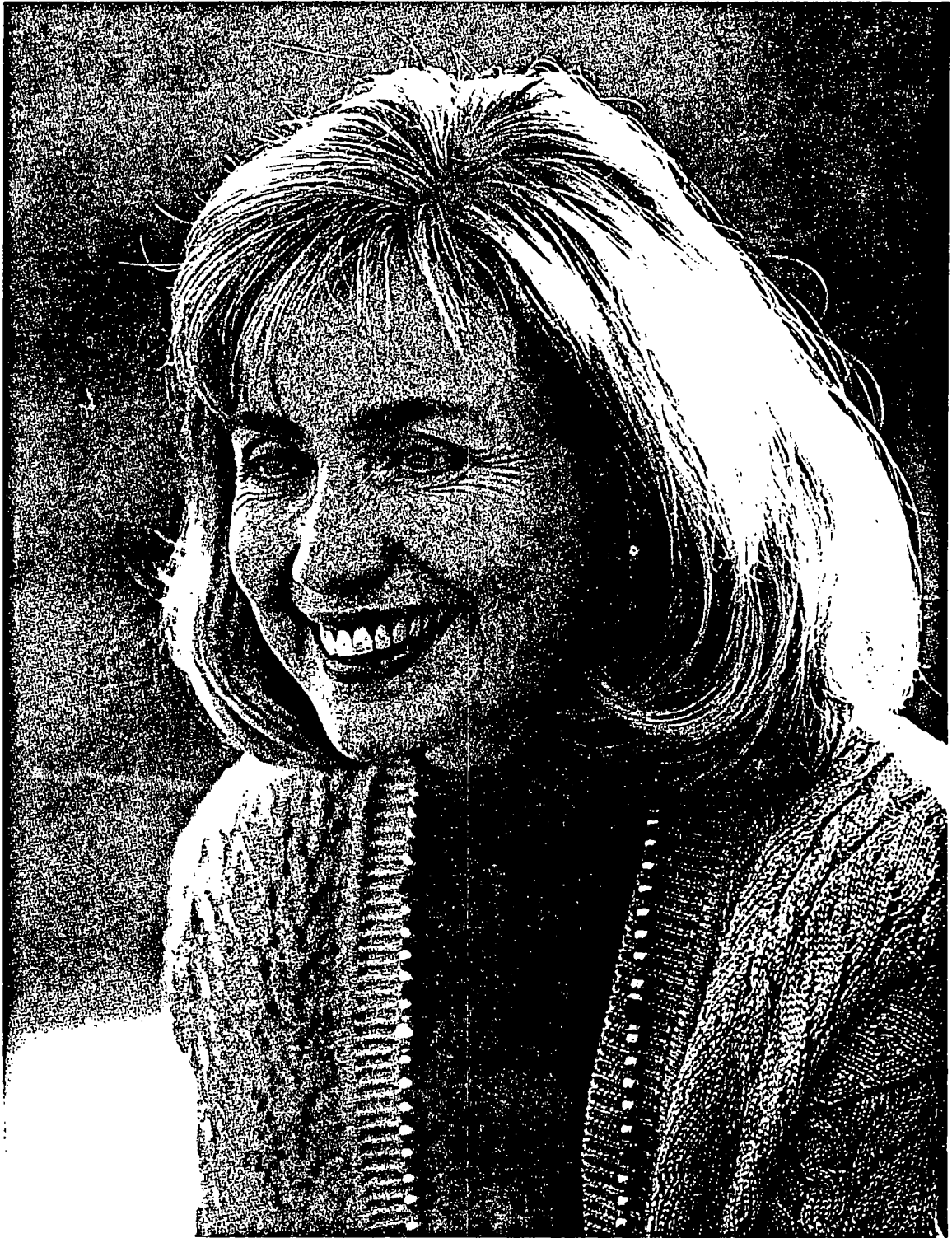

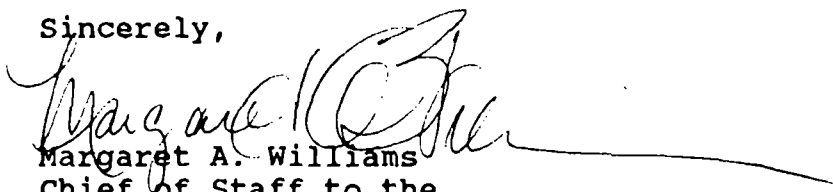

Dear Mrs. Clinton,

I am writing you because I have seen and read about your efforts to revamp Health-care in America. This issue is very personal to me because I have a very good friend, who is dying of Multiple Sclerosis. She would benefit from universal health-care because she would have access to the new drug Beta Interferon which slows down the progress of this horrible disease. This drug was recently approved by FDA, however the company producing it made a limited supply, dispensed through a lottery. I believe to ensure high profits. As you know, demand drives profits.

I believe this is so unfair and although my friend, (b)(6) (b)(6) will have access eventually through a lottery system, she may not be alive to benefit from it. I understand all names of patients with MS were entered in a lottery system. Her lucky number is 30,000. I cannot understand why in this country we would be drawing numbers for a life saving drug. Should drug companies have this type of control of live saving, life enhancing drugs? It's insane to be playing games with peoples' life. Life and death is not a game, and health care should not be left to business as usual, on deciding how it should be dispensed. It cost \$9,000 for a treatment. Gloria may have insurance to cover it, if she is still alive, but how many people with MS might not have it.

We dispense health care in a haphazard system. In Rwanda, I saw people being carried to hospitals by their friends, the length of the line told how far they had traveled. In America, the length of the lines would be short as everything is controlled for profit.

I believe that you are doing this because you are truly interested in the plight of the average American and you believe that all Americans should have equal access to good health-care. You have said in articles that the level of care an individual receives should not depend upon wealth or position. I believe that is true also and I support your efforts. We have got to make changes in this area because it is not right.

I am a little older than you, but we are from a generation that believed in what President Kennedy said, "Ask not what your country can do for you, but what can you do for your country." (b)(6) believed this also, as she has spent her entire adult life prior to being struck

with this devastating disease two years ago helping others. Let me tell you about this courageous woman, 45 years of age, who is now dying waiting for a drug that could help her because of our obscene health-care system.

She is an African American woman from a poor family in Mississippi. She was very bright and worked hard and graduated with a BS degree in Business from Alcorn State University in Normal, Mississippi. She came to University of Missouri and earned a Master degree. She then went on to Kansas State University in Manhattan, Kansas to earn a Doctorate degree. She started working at Lincoln University in Missouri as an Assistant professor in Cooperative Extension in early eighties.

She worked to build coalitions among international entities in cooperative extension all around the world to get assistance they needed in many areas. She worked in Rwanda, Africa, Jamaica, Grenada and in the West Indies. She worked to help poor people in these areas receive support from agencies in the United States. She always strived to help the "underserved." She also worked with the University of Minnesota on projects in coalition building. She cared about people. She was a leader of outstanding caliber. Does our country care about her? Not in my estimation.

I care enough to write you and ask you to continue in this battle, there are people dying because of our antiquated system of health-care. You are fighting for a just cause. When you fight for a just cause, you have an ally in God.

If you can help my friend (b)(6) I implore you to do so before it is too late. If I can help you to change this system, I would be glad to appear before any hearing or any other group to tell this very personal story. It is almost too sad to be true. Recently, I visited her at Trinity Lutheran Hospital in Kansas City, Missouri where she has been for three months. She is partially blind, completely bedridden, and has to have assistance breathing from a respirator. Since she can talk only by closing off the respirator, connected to a hole in her neck and her hands are too cripple to write, I owe it to her to do whatever I can to speak for her. It's the least I can do for a friend, who spent her life helping others. [0042]

Thanks for your commitment, my friend (b)(6) and I always admired and strived to be women who made a difference. I believe you have made a difference in America's perception of the First Lady and you will make a difference in health-care. "You go, Girl."

Dear Ms. Williams:

Enclosed please find a letter the I wrote to First Lady Clinton in May. To date I have not received a response regarding this matter. I truly believe that if Mrs. Clinton had received it I would have heard from her.

I am desperately in need of assistance in dealing with this issue. In May I was asked to fill out a CA-2 form by OWCP because they felt that my injury was a reoccurrence...even though my claim was at the time still open and I was under going treatment while I continued to work. I filled out the CA-2 beacause I wasn't given a choice they had already closed my claim, without ever letting me know, so I continued to receive treatment not knowing that they would refuse to pay any of the bills. I mailed the CA-2 form out to them right away and that was the last I ever heard of it.

It has now been two months and I am having to make monthly payments to Doctors that treated me because they won't pay the bills. I am unable to receive treatment because I cannot afford to pay for it.

Ms. Williams, I am a part time postal employee, I am 44 years old and my husband and I are raising are 3 1/2 yr. old granddaughter and our 4 1/2 yr. old grandson who has mild C.P. and ADHD. Needless to say we should be starting to reap the benifits of out middle age but we are not able to beacause we are caring for two small children. I am an honest person and I have done nothing wrong that I should have to go thru 9 months of red tape to get what I should have rightfully gotten right from the beginning. Please help me get this taken care of so that I can get on with my life. I would truly appreciate anything that you could do in my behalf.

Dear Mrs. Clinton:

I am writing to you in desperation to get your assistance in facilitating my Federal Claim.

I am a postal-sub for the U.S.P.O. and in April of 1991, I was working out of the Port Orchard, WA. branch. While lifting a tray of mail I injured my lower back. At the time of my injury I continued to work and I saw my medical doctor who said it was a low back strain. I was also seeing a chiropractor. After several months my chiropractor felt that the diagnosis was incorrect, as I was not improving, so she sent me to see a neurologist. During all of this I continued to work and took up to 12 advil a day along with a muscle relaxer.

The neurologists findings were lumbar radiculopathy, single level disc disease with muscle atrophy. Non surgical. I continued to work and I started to work three different routes which means I would be working 3-5 days per week, and sometimes more. I did not quit my job because my family was unable to meet our needs on only my husbands income.

In October of 1992, after working two days at 12 hours per day due to a very heavy mail load, I became unable to stand any longer without severe pain. I called my doctor from work and he saw me right away and gave me an injection for pain and a prescription for medication. He also took me off work for 5 days. At the end of the five days I saw him again and I was still unable to stand without severe pain for more than 10 minutes. Therefore, I was unable to return to work.

At this point I filed for compensation while I was out of work. Two months passed and I was sent to a surgeon. After more tests he felt that surgery was not the answer and he wanted me to go into physical therapy to build up the muscle mass so that I could better support the bad disc. I started physical therapy at the end of December 1992, and I was going 3 days a week, 15 miles one way.

At the end of January 1993, I returned to work. I had put

in for a transfer to a much smaller post office on the peninsula where I live and the work load has not been as heavy. I am very carefull when I work but I am in pain every single day it never goes away some days are real bad and others are tolerable. I stay with this work because I really love it and because I make \$12.41 per hr. and my husband and I are raising our granddaughter who is 3 and we have to pay daycare so I couldn't afford to make less as this point.

In regards to the claim, I have done everything that the Dept. of Labor has asked of me. Every letter or documentation they asked for was done. To date I have not received any compensation for the four months I was out of work.

Two weeks ago I received a bill for physical therapy for over \$2,000 it was from Dept. of Labor, and they said that the claim had been closed over 180 days ago and that they were denying payment. I have never been informed that the claim was closed, and I have no idea why it is closed. I was not given any information at all regarding this claim therefore I was denied my right to appeal.

I have a legitimate back injury that occurred while working for the post office. I am entitled to my compensation and to have all these medical bills paid.

If there is anything at all that you could do on my behalf that could turn this around so that I could get some results from them I would be very grateful. I myself have tried everything that I can and so far I've gotten no response.

Thank you for your consideration and time on this matter.

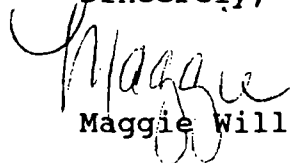

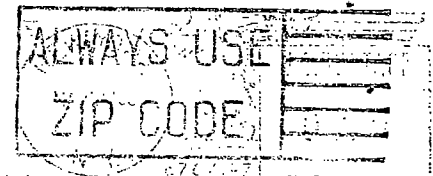
