We haven't met, but we have a mutual friend, Bob Neuman, who speaks very highly of you. I met Bob through my work as an advisor to the Commission on Presidential Debates. I also read an article about you in the *Kansas City Star* last spring.

By way of introduction, I am on the faculty at the University of Kansas in political communication. My husband is the former governor of Kansas. He and the President were elected to their first terms the same year. Through my husband, I have met both the President and First Lady on several occasions and had the good fortune to be their guests at the White House last summer.

When I saw the First Lady last June, I mentioned the fact that the high schools would be debating health care reform this year. As a former high school and college debater and high school coach, I have maintained contacts in the forensic community. As a result, I was asked by James Copeland, Executive Director of the National Forensic League, to write a cover letter to accompany the enclosed letter to the First Lady.

I want to urge you to give serious consideration to Mr. Copeland's offer to make Hillary an honorary member of the National Forensic League at the national tournament in Kansas City in June. The national tournament attracts approximately 4000 contestants in debate and several individual speaking events plus hundreds of coaches, sponsors, and judges. Many of the contestants will go on to careers in public service. Attorney General Janet Reno, for instance, is a past member as are dozens of members of Congress.

Mr. Copeland understands the complexities of the First Lady's schedule and is willing to work with you to find a time during the week of June 19 - 24 which is convenient. Given the First Lady's work on health care reform and her representation of the

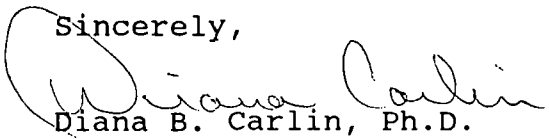
principles of the National Forensic League through her public speaking, I can think of no one more deserving of an honorary NFL membership.

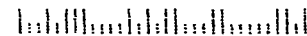

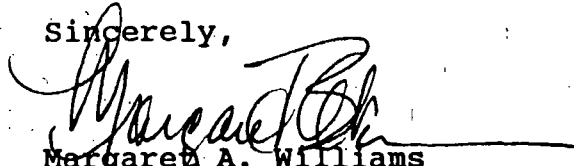

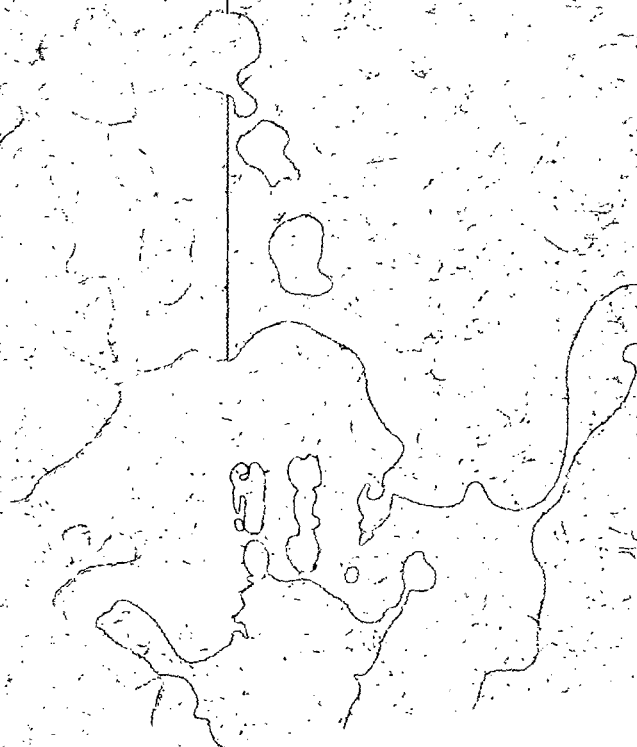

CASA makes the difference.

CASA is a non-profit organization that recruits and trains volunteers who serve as advocates in court for children who have been abused, neglected, or sexually molested.

CASA Volunteers are appointed by the Vanderburgh County Juvenile Court. Their ultimate responsibility is to recommend a course of action that is in the child's best interest.

TYPICAL RESPONSIBILITIES:

- To research each child's case and conduct an independent assessment of the child's needs and interests.
- To communicate the child's needs at the court hearing and assure that the child's legal rights are protected.
- Monitor parent's and the Department of Family and Children's Services' compliance to the court order and initiate proceedings when orders need to be changed.

One of the most traumatic experiences a child can endure is being uprooted from the home. Displaced children are frequently frightened, insecure, anxious, and suffer from feelings of inadequacy and depression.

The CASA volunteer offers children the hope of a safe, permanent home as soon as possible.

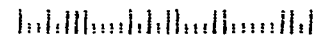

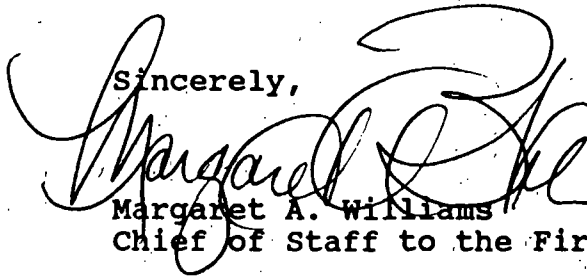

Dear Maggie Williams:

On November 14th, 1992, our client, Arnold Michaelis, upon learning that Mrs. Clinton's role model was Eleanor Roosevelt, wrote a letter to her (copy of which is enclosed), sending with it an LP-record of his conversation with Mrs. Roosevelt, which took place at her cottage at Hyde Park, New York, in July of 1957. A copy of Mrs. Clinton's reply to Arnold is also enclosed.

Arnold then wrote a subsequent letter to Mrs. Clinton on April 14th, 1993, the enclosed copy of which is fully explanatory. He received a reply from Lisa Caputo on May 12th, 1993, a copy of which is also enclosed.

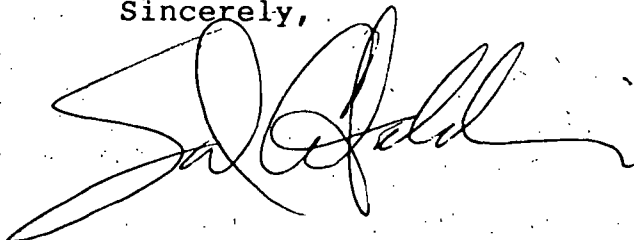
Tuesday, October 11th of this year marks the one hundred and tenth anniversary of Eleanor Roosevelt's birth. In commemoration of that event, a video-taped conversation with Mrs. Clinton, (interspersed with selected excerpts from Arnold's album with Mrs. Roosevelt, and Mrs. Clinton's reaction to and expansion upon them), would be of particular contemporary and historical significance

In reviewing Arnold's albums with Mrs. Roosevelt, Martin Luther King, Jr., Oscar Hammerstein II and Maurice Chevalier, the Christian Science Monitor stated: "Arnold Michaelis is a gracious, witty and perceptive conversationalist. His subjects respond to his gifts with obvious candor and good humor. The talk never bogs down into the superficial, but is always lively and meaningful, so that the listener (or viewer) cannot help but feel like a third silent guest in a very privileged living room."

The Des Moines Register wrote: "Repeated playing of the Eleanor Roosevelt recording only serves to emphasize what an impressive and perceptive piece of thought it is. Like Bach, it has some new discovery, some new nuance each time around."

Assuming the First Lady's interest, Arnold and I would welcome the opportunity to further discuss this proposal with you, and toward that end, look forward to hearing from you at your early convenience.
