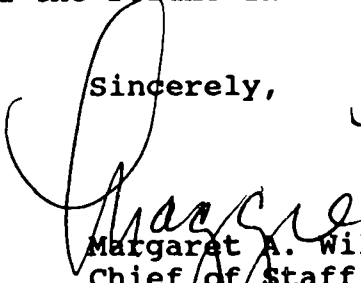

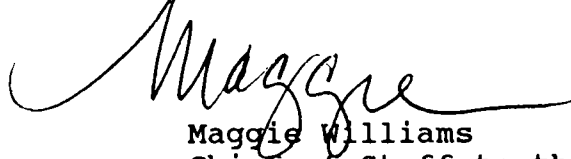

Dear Ms. Williams:

This letter is to follow up my telephone conversation with your assistant, Diane, during which she asked me to provide you with a copy of my resume. As you may recall, I was Chief Accountant in the Controller's office with Ursula Culver during your tenure with the Democratic National Committee. I was employed with the DNC for eleven years as Chief Accountant and as Director of Accounting. With the arrival of the new Chairman, I was let go, as well as approximately 85% of all staff. Since leaving the DNC last February, I served on numerous temporary assignments including Chief Financial Officer of an entrepreneurial environmental recycling corporation, Senior Financial Accountant of an investment mortgage corporation, and as CPA (Certified Public Accountant) of a medical association while exploring long-term opportunities. Dear Ms. Williams:

I am pleased to learn of the Clinton Administration's recent decision to increase United States aid to Northern Ireland and of the President's commitment to host a trade conference in Philadelphia in April. These actions are visible symbols and tangible results of the Administration's long-term commitment to advancing the peace process.

For the past 20 years, The Symphony for United Nations (SUN) has promoted the cause of peace between nations by producing and presenting major orchestral and choral events. For example, in 1993 SUN produced a benefit concert to aid Bosnian refugees which raised over \$100,000 for the International Rescue Committee for refugee children in Bosnia-Herzegovina. Another example of SUN's past work was our three-day Middle East Festival at Lincoln Center. SUN's concerts utilize the universal language of music to help people from war-torn regions of the world to overcome national, ethnic and racial divisions and to focus public attention on conflicts of international significance.

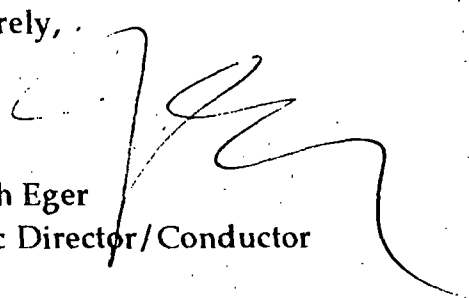
At this time, the Directors of SUN are planning a concert to honor those exceptional individuals who have overcome tremendous obstacles to bring Ireland to the brink of lasting peace.

This concert will be held at Carnegie Hall on Wednesday, April 5, 1995, and will include "Anatomy of Peace", a work for orchestra and children's choir by award-winning composer Marvin Hamlisch, and will feature the United States premiere of "Alpha Omega" by David Gordon. Leading Irish composer Michael O'Suilleabhain has been commissioned to compose a new work for the event.

The timing of the proposed Philadelphia conference in relation to SUN's concert suggests to me that we could work together to further our common goals. I would like to discuss with you the possibility of a tie-in of our April event with the Administration's April event.

I am traveling to South Africa and Ireland next week to conduct peace and reconciliation concerts and to meet with the leaders of the political and arts communities. I will call you after my return November 28. In the meantime, you may contact my assistant at (212) 873-2872 for additional information.

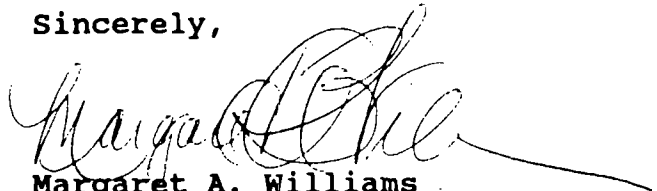

I want to personally thank you for doing an outstanding job representing the State of Az. in Washington, D. C. the State Capitol.

I want to bring to your attention a National health problem that exists in the dental profession. I know we always talk about everything but the dental profession when we are talking about health, but I see a need to include dentistry in the health reform because I have uncovered too much dental mal-practice in the state of Arizona. I also found this problem exists all over the United States through the American Association of Dental Victims Headquarters in Longbeach, California.

Because I filed five (5) complaints on Five (5) dentists at the State Dental board, I have come in contact with other members of the public who were treated the same as I have been treated, I formed a dental victims support group. Three cases were dismissed where my health, safety and welfare was endangered and one case was dismissed where a clinical evaluator for the dental board refused to report to the board an improper placement of the crown of #30 by the dentist who maliciously wounded me. (How can we make sure our dental visit will go well?) How safe is it in a dental clinic?

Karen, I am not pleased with the management of the Az. State Board of Dental Examiners by the state of Az. The dental profession seems to have more power than state Government, Atty. General and the lawmakers at the legislature who pass laws to govern the dental profession. Every time the legislature passes laws to protect the public, the Az. Dental Assoc. repeals the laws and the Attorney General's office overrules it. The Governor appoints the board members and goes along with what even the attorney Gen. wants to do about the cases at the board. I am very upset about the treatment I have received from the state of Az. for they did not protect my health, safety and welfare from unqualified practitioners. I have asked for help from the state with this problem and have not received any help regarding this matter. Others were treated

the same as I have been treated. Please help me with this problem. I am having to go out of state for dental treatment I have already paid for in this state. Russel Bowers is trying to help me but we can't get anyone to investigate this matter. My new dentist has told me it will cost \$25,000 to repair my damages. I don't have an attorney to take my case. The new dentist is asking for \$5000 up front for my temporaries and my funds have simply exhausted. Others in my dental victims in my group are in critical condition like myself and need emergency dental care. Their cases were dismissed and they were frauded also.

I am pleading with you Karen, please get some help for us back in Az. concerning the dental treatment from the dental profession and the dental board. I have one patient in my group dying. She never had a hear at the state board. The dentist lost his license in 4 states. Still, pra. Thanking you in advance for your consideration regarding this issue. I am very upset by the treatment from this state. This is an insult to my intelligence and character. Please talk with Mrs. Clinton about this issue.

Karen I have exhausted all means of getting any help from this state. Karen my husband Thomas received an honorable discharge from the Air Force and so did I. 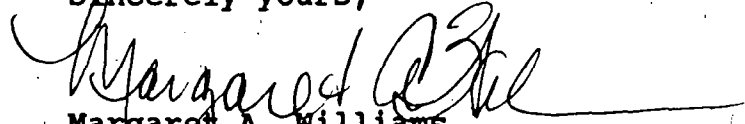

As a physician serving in a rural upstate New York shortage region (for health care providers), I have seen first hand the problems with our health care & welfare system over the past decade.

I feel the political leaders are all missing the boat on the most important elements of what the public needs and on the vital aspect of deficit reduction.

Even if a compromise bill passes, we need to pursue specific changes in our government funded health care systems. (Medicaid ^{Health} Medicare), and consider a universal catastrophic policy for all Americans.

Most polls regarding health care indicate that the most important element of reform is catastrophic coverage for all Americans. I believe this should be the first two step toward Universal coverage. Universal catastrophic coverage could be accomplished. If we take our present medical payroll tax and convert it to a 2.5% employee/employer (catastrophic payroll tax), we could cover all Americans.

2
for Catastrophic Illnesses. If a federal
blanket coverage existed it would trigger in
for any individual when an annual ceiling
expenditure had been reached regardless if
they have private insurance, medical or medicare.
Catastrophic insurance could be administered in
the same manner as medicare is administered.
A higher ceiling could be applied to Long Term
skilled care.

The results of a federal catastrophic policy would
ultimately result in cheaper private insurance.
premiums with an easier transition to
nationwide community ratings and in essence
a sensible approach to affordable private
insurance for all Americans.

Significant Savings can be reached in
medicare & medicare. If we do not do this
our federal deficit will never come down.

Medicare is perhaps the most wasteful
bureaucratic mess I have ever witnessed.
It has resulted in excessive & expensive
overuse of our nations emergency rooms. In most
states, medical recipients receive care at
clinics that get higher reimbursements than
private physicians.

I propose several reforms for Medicare.
First, let's make the states get more efficient.
We need to encourage enrollment into
private managed care providers, that would
essentially level the playing field between

Health care professionals, clinics & hospitals. 3
By introducing a national medicare fee schedule
which reimburses all providers at the same &
equal level we can encourage greater primary
& preventative care access. We can discourage
excessive Emergency Room use, by encouraging
hospitals to become more involved in less
expensive primary care. We need to change
the state-federal formula to an even 50-50
funding for all states. Medicaid is a
runaway train, doing significant damage
to our federal & state budgets. Let's get smart
about it and have some political will.

Finally, Medicare!, with an ever increasing
population over 65, the day of the 100 deductible
annually for all medicare recipients has to
end. The only answer I believe is to income
means test annual deductible (with a
range of \$100 to \$2,000 annually) depending
on income level. The trade off, would be
greater catastrophic coverage.

These Three Suggestions: (1) Universal Catastrophic
Coverage (2) Significant Medicare Administrative: Cost
& reimbursement reform and (3) Medicare
annual deductible reform should be
explored. I believe they hold significant
promise toward both universal coverage and
