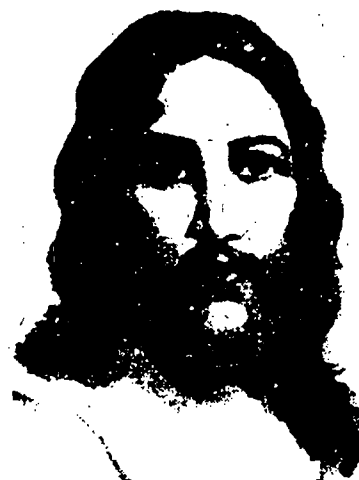

Jesus Our Savior

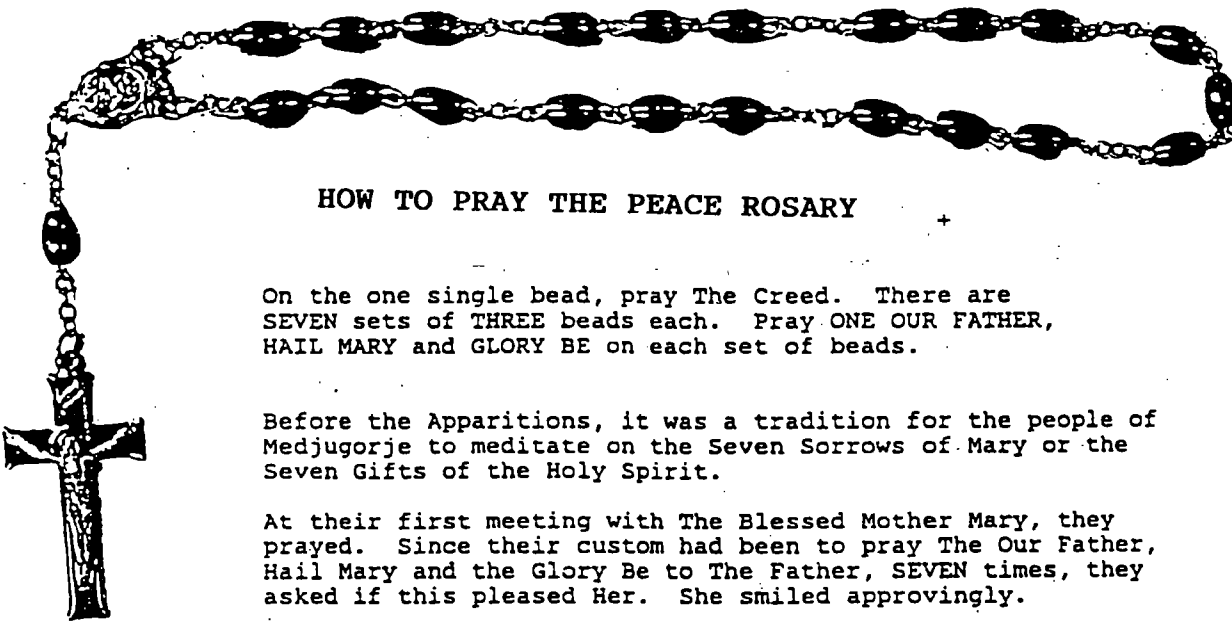


The picture above shows how to make a stand to mount the 4x5 picture of Jesus. Lumber came from a wood crate. The base is about 5/8 inches thick, 4 inches wide and 2 or 3 inches deep. The back is 1/8 inch wood. 5 3/4 high and 4 inches wide.

During one of Our Lady's apparitions at the church in Guijon, Asturias Spain on December 19, 1989 Our Lady was asked about the photo. She replied through visionary Maria del Rosario Frechoso: "My dear children, It is my wish that between all of you enough money is raised in order to multiply the photographs of my Son, as there are many other of my children that would like to have one and have yet to see one." Our Blessed Mother also requested, "On the smaller photograph endorse it with the words 'Gift made possible by our Lord so that all may know His True Image and His Immense love made known through His True Image.'" On the larger photos, Our Blessed Mother instructed Maria to have them write on the front the words "JESUS OUR SAVIOR". Many have since put it on the back so as not to destroy the full image when it has no border.

The original image, to the best of our research, surfaced in 1982. While on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land in mid-October of that year, Jackie Haas took various snapshots with her 110 Kodak Instamatic of numerous sights and people in the Mid East. Upon returning home to Scranton, Pennsylvania, she proceeded to have the rolls of film developed. To her amazement she discovered the photo of Jesus' face in the group of pictures. At first, she suspected someone had mixed up the picture order, but on further examination of the negatives she discovered this was truly from her camera.

HOW TO PRAY THE PEACE ROSARY

On the one single bead, pray The Creed. There are SEVEN sets of THREE beads each. Pray ONE OUR FATHER, HAIL MARY and GLORY BE on each set of beads.

Before the Apparitions, it was a tradition for the people of Medjugorje to meditate on the Seven Sorrows of Mary or the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit.

At their first meeting with The Blessed Mother Mary, they prayed. Since their custom had been to pray The Our Father, Hail Mary and the Glory Be to The Father, SEVEN times, they asked if this pleased Her. She smiled approvingly.

On June 27th 1981, the third day of the Apparitions, Blessed Mother replied in answer to the question from the Visionaries, "How must we pray?"

"CONTINUE TO RECITE THE LORD'S PRAYER, THE HAIL MARY AND THE GLORY BE SEVEN TIMES, BUT ALSO ADD THE CREED."

On April 24th 1982, concerning what needs to be done in order to have more cures, Blessed Mother said:

"PRAY! PRAY AND BELIEVE FIRMLY. SAY THE PRAYERS WHICH HAVE ALREADY BEEN REQUESTED."

She meant The Lord's Prayer, the Hail Mary and the Glory Be SEVEN times each, and The Creed. She added, "DO MORE PENANCE."

On July 21st 1982, Blessed Mother gave the following Message:

"THERE ARE MANY SOULS IN PURGATORY. THERE ARE ALSO PERSONS WHO HAVE BEEN CONSECRATED TO GOD,-- SOME PRIESTS, SOME RELIGIOUS. PRAY FOR THEIR INTENTIONS, AT LEAST THE LORD'S PRAYER, THE HAIL MARY, AND THE GLORY BE SEVEN TIMES EACH, AND THE CREED. I RECOMMEND IT TO YOU. THERE IS A LARGE NUMBER OF SOULS WHO HAVE BEEN IN PURGATORY FOR A LONG TIME BECAUSE NO ONE PRAYS FOR THEM."

By praying the peace rosary or the Apostles Creed plus seven sets of Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory be to the father each day, peace comes to your heart. Then it spreads to the family and beyond. Like the Bible says in Mathew Chapter 6 verse 25 and Chapter 7 verse 1 to 13.

NOTE: By taking the 1993 debt figure of \$4,734 and subtracting the debt as of 1977 at \$706 Billion we get a deficit of \$4,028 Billion for the period which is a more accurate figure than the \$3094 Billion.

Interest Payments are net.

SUGGESTION: The Federal Government needs to publish how much they borrow each fiscal year. This would be a better indicator than the deficit figures for balancing the budget.

THE BLESSED VIRGIN ECONOMIC PLAN

BALANCING THE BUDGET

The opportunity for a change to a balanced budget is here now.

The requirement is for Congress to adopt this plan both morally and financially. It changes nothing in our Constitution or Bible, and actually supports both 100%. It eliminates interest payments which were equal to the deficit for the past 15 years. This by itself balances the annual budget.

THE BLESSED VIRGIN ECONOMIC PLAN

Our country was dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary hence the name of the plan. Just as we are guided by the Ten Commandments, we also are guided by the Constitution. Article 1 section 8, quote "The Congress shall have Power To coin Money regulate the Value thereof, and of foreign Coin, and fix the Standard of Weights and Measures". With this authority Congress can create the Federal Government Blessed Virgin Dollars (FGBVD). Congress also controls the value by setting the exchange rate for the Federal Government Blessed Virgin dollar and the Federal Reserve dollar. The rate starts at 1 Virgin dollar to 10 Federal dollars. If inflation occurs the rate increases 1 to 11.

A LOW COST OPERATIONAL PLAN

The Postal Service sets up a separate corporation in the capitol city of each of the 50 states. A central office will be in Chicago. Computers, fax machines, computer terminals at Banks and at Post Offices will function for all transactions.

The one ounce silver dollar will be legal tender equal to 10 Federal Reserve dollars. One piece of currency, a 10 dollar bill, will be printed different than the Federal Reserve 10 dollar bill. Each Post Office becomes a service station to handle customers.

THE MAJOR BLESSED VIRGIN BENEFITS WILL BE AS FOLLOWS:

1. Citizens will secure mortgage loans at 3% interest rate.
2. The plan will produce \$80 to \$100 billion annual Federal Government income from the 3% mortgages.
3. The plan balances the budget and pays off the Federal debt at no additional cost to the taxpayers.
4. The Federal Reserve banks receive more money to make loans. Currently the supply of money is short to pay off debts.

HOME OWNERS MORTGAGES AT A 3% RATE

The Postal Service becomes an agent of the Treasury Department. It then sets up not-for-profit corporations in each state capitol city. Using the new Federal Government Blessed Virgin Dollars (FGBVD) created by Congress, the Postal Service supplies the funds to provide 3% mortgage money. This applies to home purchasers, apartments up to six units, condos, family farms, charitable groups with a 501 (C)(3) rating, as schools, churches, hospitals etc.

The Federal Reserve banks will, for a fee, prepare the mortgage documents for the purchasers of homes and the Postal Service. This leaves the simple part of the transactions to Postal clerks.

COST EFFICIENT METHOD OF OPERATION

Using computer terminals and fax machines in Post Offices and Banks, mortgage data is sent to State Capitol locations of the Postal Service. A back up central computer will be located in Chicago. Each State Postal Service issues checks in Federal Government Virgin Dollars (FGBVD) for the financing of mortgages. When these checks reach a Federal Reserve local bank they are credited to the purchasers of homes etc. in Federal Reserve dollars using the current exchange rate set by Congress based on inflation. The home owner makes monthly principal and interest payments to the local Post Office in regular Federal Reserve dollars.

Any citizen can open a checking account at the Post Office in Blessed Virgin dollars (FGBVD). These checking accounts do not earn interest. The money is not loaned out or used other than for transfer and safe keeping. If property owners experience a death, illness, lost job etc. a reserve fund will handle mortgage defaults up to 60 monthly payments. No foreclosures of any kind will be allowed during this hardship period.

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT INTEREST INCOME

The mortgages, in the category planned above, now amount to about \$3 Trillion. At a 3% interest rate the Federal Government through the Postal Service will have an income of \$80 to \$100 Billion dollars annually. Using computers, existing Postal buildings, Postal employees at the customer windows, profits will be good. The profits can be divided in a number of ways such as the Treasury Department, State governments, Postal Service and a reserve fund to handle mortgage defaults.

MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT LOANS AT 2% RATE

The local Municipal governments borrow the Federal Government Blessed Virgin Dollars (FGBVD) for capital expenditures from the Postal Service Corp. at the State Capitol City at a 2% interest rate. The result more improvements can be made and more jobs created.

STATE GOVERNMENT LOANS INTEREST FREE

The U.S. Treasury Department will make (FGBVD) loans directly to the 50 State Governments for capital expenditures only. A one time 2% operating charge will apply to each loan. The State Legislature will set up a monthly principal payment plan in Federal Reserve dollars to retire the debt. With no interest expense more improvements and more jobs will be created.

DEBT CONTROL

The Federal, State, and Municipal governments agree on a debt ceiling for each government taxing body. This will keep debt in line with taxpayers ability to pay off the debt.

If any government defaults on debt payments the program is halted until payments are resumed.

COST EFFICIENT METHOD OF OPERATION

Congress authorizes the Treasury Department to issue checks in Federal Government Blessed Virgin Dollars (FGBVD) direct to State governments and through the Postal Service for local governments capital expenditures. These checks are deposited in Federal Reserve banks and converted to Federal Reserve money at a ratio of 1 to 10. The local Federal Reserve banks get their credit, at the current exchange rate, when the checks are sent to the Regional Federal Reserve bank,

Our Federal Reserve current system can create money out of debt but cannot create the money to pay the interest on debt. This causes a shortage of money. The Federal Government Blessed Virgin Dollars (FGBVD) help cover this shortage by placing money into the economic system without going into debt to do it.

THE FEDERAL DEBT IS PAID OFF IN SEVEN YEARS

The Federal Government Blessed Virgin Dollar (FGBVD) Stock Certificates and checks are used to pay off the Federal debt and interest as the debts and interest come due. In the seventh year the U.S. Treasury Department buys up, in the open market, all debt instruments offered for sale. These stock certificates and checks can be cashed in at any Federal Reserve bank at the starting exchange rate of 1 for 10 Federal Reserve dollars. No more Federal Government bonds need to be issued so that in a short time no more interest expense is created.

The money supply does not increase when bonds are exchanged for stocks. It reduces interest costs. By not borrowing money to pay interest, debt is curtailed and the budget can be balanced.

PUBLIC TELEVISION FINANCING

The profit generated on the 2% loans to local governments can be divided as follows: 25% to the State Government, 25% to the Postal Service, and 50% to a separate Postal Service fund to support Public Television in each State. Public officials and candidates for office will be given free television time on public television stations in the amount the fund can afford.

FAILED SAVINGS AND LOANS ARE LIQUIDATED AT NO COST TO TAXPAYERS

The Postal Service as agent of the U.S. Treasury Department secures a list of depositors from the failed institutions and issues the depositors Blessed Virgin (FGBVD) checks to cover amounts due. The Postal Service takes over existing loans and reduces interest to 3%. Remaining assets of the institutions are sold and money received sent to the U.S. Treasury Department.

IMPLEMENTING THE BLESSED VIRGIN ECONOMIC PLAN

Laws created by Congress, regulations by the Executive Branch and decisions of the Supreme Court must be reviewed and measured against the Ten Commandments of God, the two commandments of our Lord, instructions for living in the Bible, and Catholic Catechism.

An example is abortion which is against the commandments and needs to be made illegal again, except if life is in danger.

The timing for adopting the Blessed Virgin Plan is critical. We already have strong predictions that our Federal Government and our money system will collapse. If a collapse takes place first, than the (FEMA) Federal Emergency Management Agency replaces our Congress and sets the plan in motion. If Congress adopts the plan, places new and old laws in line with the Bible, the collapse may be averted or be less severe on our people.

The predictions on the weather are for more disturbances like floods, hurricanes, earthquakes, famine, power interruptions plagues like aids, severe low temperatures etc.

In our Bible the Book of Jonah Chapter 3 fits our situation. Jonah went to Nineveh, an enormously large city, and told them that in 40 days their city of Nineveh shall be destroyed. The King proclaimed that all were to be covered with sackcloth, turn away from evil ways and violence. No one shall eat or drink water with the hope God will relent. God did relent and did not carry out the threat of destroying the city.

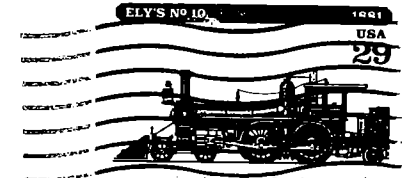

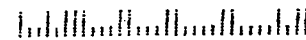

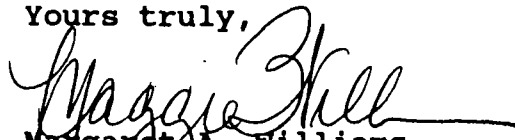

Today's New York Times picture of you and your nephew Max moved me to what I call "Happy Tears". And I'm not exactly a cry-baby, at now 83 and not over sentimental.

I enjoyed reading about your career and accomplishments, leading up to your present important assignment.

For the last 12 years of my retirement as a community organizer and Fund Raiser, I have been solely devoted to my concept, the Peace Sites International. Am happy to report that as of now, we have close to 800 Peace Sites in 38 States here and 25 Countries overseas. L. Kousin Started World Campaign For Negro's Life

ELIZABETH — The Talmud through the ages has told us he who saves one life is considered as if he had saved the world. Those were the sentiments that prompted Louis Kousin executive director of the Eastern Union County Jewish Community Council to send last month a check for \$1.95 to Governor James E. Folsom of Alabama appealing to the Governor to spare the life of Jimmy Wilson, 55 year old Negro who was sentenced to die on September 5 for a \$1.95 robbery.

Kousin, a public relations expert sent his check in an effort to dramatize his protest against what he called the "Uncivilized action" of the Alabama courts. He appealed to Folsom to commute the sentence "in the name of God, fair play and justice."

Kousin's initiative in sending the check may have been the spark that aroused the world for the news of his \$1.95 check was picked up by the AP wires and sent to the whole country and it was then picked up by Reuters, the Canad-

ian wire services and other services and sent all over the world.

As a result cables commenced to pour into the Governor of Alabama's office, he was deluged with telegrams, letters and long distance phone calls. Not only that, U. S. ambassadors throughout the world were asked questions as to what in the world was going on, and matters got so hot that Secretary Dulles personally intervened with Folsom.

The latest deluge that has

swamped Alabama's Governor as this paper goes to press, was the delivery to the Governor of an airmail-special delivery box from

Toronto, Canada. The box contained more than 3,000 letters from that city, all of which pleaded for clemency for the Negro farmhand.

The Governor called a special news conference to tell the press how he was snowed under by the

arrival of the 3,000 letters. One newsman who asked him if the thousands of Toronto air mail letters were Communist inspired was told by the Governor: "There aren't enough Communists in North America to inspire that amount of mail from one community. Even if this was Communist inspired, they couldn't do such a job as sending all these letters."

Wilson is now scheduled to die in the electric chair on Oct. 24. He was convicted of robbing an 82 year old white widow of two 50 cent pieces, three quarters and 20 pennies in July 1957.

Mr. Baker, the 82 year old widow also testified over objections of Wilson's court appointed attorney that Wilson tried to rape her. Wilson was not tried on the rape charge, he was found guilty of robbery which is a capital offense in Alabama.

The Supreme Court of Alabama affirmed the sentence. Folsom has hinted he would commute the death sentence to life imprisonment if a clemency hearing is requested.

Gov. Folsom Saves Negro From Chair

MONTGOMERY, Ala., Sept. 29 — Gov. James E. Folsom commuted to life imprisonment today the death sentence of a Negro convicted of robbing a woman of \$1.95 in her home after dark. Night-time burglary is a capital crime in Alabama.

Jimmy Wilson, 55-year-old illiterate handyman, was to die in the electric chair at Kilby Prison Oct. 24. He was convicted of robbing Mrs. Estelle Barker, 82, at her home in Marion July 27, 1957.

A Man Of Peace

In 1958, Louis Kousin gained recognition as a proponent for peace and justice when he sent a check for \$1.95 to Governor James F. Folsom of Alabama to spare the life of a man who had been sentenced to die for a burglary that had netted two 50 cent pieces, three quarters and 20 pennies. Kousin's actions set off a chain of protests, petitions, and letters from thousands of people who also believed that burglary should not be considered a capital crime, and as a result, the death sentence was commuted to a prison term.

Since then, Kousin, a former public relations professional and social worker, has worked toward bringing about understanding and peace through the establishment of an organization called Peace Sites International. The focus of the program is the elimination of the danger of nuclear weapons through the mass promotion of peace.

"I got the idea for Peace Sites in 1981, when my first granddaughter was born," says Kousin. "With the alarming proliferation of nuclear weapons, I was determined to help make the world safer for my grandchildren and for future generations."

A peace site is any place - or even an individual - that has been designated as a "safe haven" for peaceful discussion and sharing of information that promotes peace. There are now more

states and 11 countries, and they include churches, synagogues, schools, homes, businesses, towns, and cities. "They represent alternatives to the numerous military sites worldwide," says Kousin, who hopes to establish at least 1000 of the symbolic refuges by the year 2000.

Kousin's efforts have been lauded and endorsed by such dignitaries as Pope John Paul II; Senator Edward Kennedy; Nobel Prize winners Linus Pauling, Bishop Tutu, Dr. Bernard Lown, and Costa Rican President Arias, as well Mrs. Anwar Sadat and many religious and community leaders.

At 78, Kousin takes advantage of his "retirement" to spend tireless hours promoting Peace Sites International, but also finds time to study at Elderhostel programs with his wife, Cerise. "Cerise and I have attended some dozen Elderhostels in recent years, and have found them extremely stimulating and enjoyable," says Kousin. "Elderhostelers are a most valuable and sophisticated group, loaded with wisdom and experience," he adds, noting that his classmates, peers, and even the institutions hosting Elderhostel programs have been very receptive to the concept of peace sites.

"Elderhostelers have a natural response to the words of General Omar Bradley, 'The central problem of our time is how to employ human intelligence for the collection of

Kousin spreads peace message globally

Shortly after his granddaughter Leah was born, Louis Kousin began to think about what he could do in his retirement to make a lasting contribution to world peace for future generations.

Fearful of the potential for nuclear war, the former public relations professional and social worker asked himself, "With so many military sites located around the world, why not form an antithesis that carries with it a message of peace?"

And thus was the beginning of Peace Sites International, a Cranford-based organization that is dedicated to promoting world peace. "Any place where you pray, play, study, live and engage in peaceful pursuits, all of these are potential and natural peace sites," Mr. Kousin.

The idea spread quickly and Mr. Kousin soon found himself working as a full-time volunteer for N.J. SANE, a Montclair-based peace organization well-known for its vocal criticism of international nuclear proliferation. On March 23, 1983, Mr. Kousin moved his operation to his home at 435 N. Union Ave. in Cranford, where it remains today.

Now, after more than a decade, Mr. Kousin, 81, says there are 120 Peace Sites in New Jersey and approximately 150 sites internationally. In Cranford, St. Michael Church has designated a Peace Site and the state of Minnesota has begun to carry the torch with its World Citizens Peace Sites organization. More than 50 Peace Sites have been created in Minnesota, including the twin cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul.

The creation of Peace Sites International seems a logical extension of Mr. Kousin's life work. As executive director of the Eastern Union County Jewish Council and United Jewish Appeal, Mr. Kousin was known for a column he wrote, "Brotherhood Every Day."

In 1958, he was the subject of several national news stories when

he sent \$1.95 to the governor of Alabama to protest the death sentence of a black man who had been accused of robbing a white woman of the same amount.

Calling the sentence an "uncivilized action," Mr. Kousin asked Gov. James Folsom to commute the death sentence of Jimmy Wilson, the Alabama man convicted by an all-white jury of robbing an 82-year-old widow.

The severity of the sentence was brought to the attention of many national leaders and the governor eventually commuted the sentence to life imprisonment.

As he gets older, Mr. Kousin said

he has become worried about the future of Peace Sites.

"We have made a fairly good and receptive start to offer an attractive mechanism to deal with peace and social justice concerns," Mr. Kousin said. "Fortunately, a sound contact has been made with the future co-director Lynn Elling, of World Citizens Peace Sites in Minneapolis.

"With the aid and official endorsement of state and cities education directors, a new slogan has been adopted called 'To Make Every Public School in the area a Peace Site.' Hopefully it will be expanded to make every school in the U.S. a Peace

Site," Mr. Kousin said.

But his worries were quelled Tuesday afternoon after hearing from the executive director of Veterans for Peace of Belmont, Vt. With 800 work camps in 33 countries, the director told Mr. Kousin that the organization plans to make each camp a Peace Site.

"It's wonderful news," said Mr. Kousin. "I confirmed it with the director who told me that the Vermont location is the headquarters that makes policy. The declaration now doubles the number of sites that now exist. It has been a good week."

Mayor proclaims City Hall symbolic site for 'peace'

To provide real hope for future generations against the dangers of nuclear warfare, Mayor Sharpe James declared Newark City Hall an honorary "peace site" last Thursday, joining seven other municipalities in the state.

"We plan to lead the state and the nation in this call for peace," said James, hailing Louis Kousin, a Cranford resident who began the peace crusade in 1981.

As a result of the 77-year-old peace coordinator's crusade, there are 267 peace sites established at schools, churches, synagogues and nonprofit organizations, such as the YMWCA, across the world.

"He is a fascinating man who spends countless hours to convince people to dedicate buildings as peace sites," the mayor told a group of about 75 people who gathered on the steps of City Hall for the peace ceremony.

"This ceremony could not take place at a more appropriate time than in the wake of the recent disaster in the Middle East, where 37 Americans lost their lives."

Among the officials taking part in the event were City Council President Henry Martinez and Somerville Mayor Emanuel Luftglass, whom James commended for establishing the state's first peace site earlier this year.

"We are very honored to have another elected official who shares the same frustrations that I do," said the mayor, who dedicated the ceremony in remembrance of those who have lost their lives fighting to preserve peace.

"Today, we honor these people who have shared their visions of peace," he added. "If we save a life, we save a dream and save America. We must have peace in our world, so that today's youth can become tomorrow's seniors and leaders."

James said he hopes Newark's designation as a peace site will cause a "ripple effect" across the nation.

"The mere fact that New Jersey's largest city, Newark, has made this designation shows that we are making progress in the struggle for a peaceful place to live, work and grow," said

Mayor Luftglass, who thanked James for responding to his request to initiate the international peace campaign.

Asked how he became involved with the launching of the Newark peace site, the Somerville mayor explained that he contacted James after seeing the art work of Clarence Williams, an 11-year-old Newark youngster, who took part in an art exhibition entitled "Visions of World Peace." As part of the exhibition, sponsored by Partners In Peacemaking, the Miller Street School student's watercolor poster was one of 200 art works recently displayed at galleries throughout the state.

"Out of all the posters I saw, Clarence's hit me the hardest," recalled the Somerville mayor. "The whole idea of teenagers expressing positive views about world peace inspired me to write his mayor and request that Newark be declared a peace site."

"It was the only way to make this important message believable," said Luftglass, who has written to 350 mayors in New Jersey.

Speaking on behalf of the city council, Martinez said "We are glad to join the mayor in this peace venture because we believe that peace is the existing goal of everyone worldwide."

During the ceremony, Martinez and James presented Kousin and Williams with proclamations and resolutions for their outstanding work for peace.

"I saw Clarence's poster at the art exhibition and it was an exceptional expression of peace that captured the spirit," said Kousin, following the ceremony.

Explaining how he conceived the idea to coordinate peace sites to serve as a counterattack against military sites, Kousin said, "The dread of nuclear war and concern for future generations prompted the invention of an antonym for military sites."

"The municipal peace sites create a symbolic peace shield or peace umbrella over the entire community," he noted.

Kousin said his goal is to establish 1,000 grassroots peace sites in cities and towns across the country and overseas.

BALLOONS and children may be a familiar spring item, but on May 24 a new message was hovering in the air at the Glenfield Middle School in Montclair, where 100 helium balloons containing messages of peace written by sixth-, seventh- and eighth-graders celebrated the school's becoming an official Peace Site. (A Peace Site is a place — it might be a school, a church or a community organization — that has dedicated itself to the promotion and study of peace activities).

The children who weren't floating balloons took part in a walk for peace. They made a four-mile round trip to Edgemont Park to lay, at the base of a war memorial, a wreath they had fashioned of pine and baby's breath, to recite poems and sing songs about peace. The walkathon was sponsored by the children's families and friends, whose donations were earmarked to help finance a local food pantry.

"It was the feeling of a number of students and myself that what we needed to do at Glenfield was to focus on the concept of peace," said Daniel Gill, a social studies teacher. "A lot of students had been speaking of fears."

Together with a student committee, Mr. Gill originated the Peace Site project.

John Thomas Marinovich, known as "J.T.," a seventh-grader in charge of publicity for the walkathon, said:

"There's always the threat [of nuclear war]. And when you see the disagreements on the news, that's when you start to worry. Being involved is a lot of responsibility, but I got to miss some of my classes."

Peace activities are not new to the 600-student middle school. Last year, it sponsored a Peace Day, which included a number of speakers from peace organizations and student-run seminars. The decision to become the state's second public-school Peace Site (the first was Westfield High School) was an outgrowth of the renewal of the Peace Day commitment.

The project's goals, Mr. Gill said, "are to encourage other schools throughout New Jersey to declare themselves Peace Sites and to eventually build a network of Peace Sites throughout the world. It gives the kids a sense that they can do something about the issue of peace."

Added J.T.: "Peace begins with kids because that's the next generation."

According to Louis Kousin of Cranford, founder and coordinator of the Peace Site movement, there are now 99 sites worldwide, with 47 in New Jersey, including Ramapo College in Mahwah, Kean College in Union and Georgian Court College in Lakewood.

Dear Maggie Williams,

On November 2, 1993, I wrote to you at the suggestion of Mrs. Clinton. To date I have had no acknowledgement of your receiving it. Can I kindly request knowing if my letter was received?

The following is the text of my letter sent November 2, 1993:

At a reception for Mrs. Hillary Rodham Clinton yesterday I informed her that I am the mother of a ten year old boy with cerebral palsy. Ultimately my son Seth's triumphs are the consequence of pursuing health care outside the boundaries of orthodox medicine. Here I engaged doctors and therapists, facilitators who are not conventional, but who, nonetheless, are often bona fide health professionals. Their alternative approach and knowledge have enhanced the possibilities for my son and bettered his existence.

Two years ago I published an article in FAMILY CIRCLE magazine about one of the many methods I employed during Seth's rehabilitation. After my essay was published I was asked to appear on the Oprah Winfrey show. For two years I have been inundated by letters and phone calls from parents whose children have 'special needs.' I have made myself into an expert on 'alternative medical care' as suggested by cranial Osteopaths, Homeopaths, Feldenkrais practitioners, NDT and Bobath method trained therapists and physicians. My knowledge and experience with Alexander technique, Rolfing, Mind-Body Centering and Yoga is extensive.

Fully one-third of Americans have turned to 'Alternative Therapies' according to a study by Dr. David M. Eisenberg of Harvard Medical School. Alternative health care is concerned with the ongoing health of the entire person. Alternative health care is oriented to prevention. Consumer spending on unconventional therapy stood at \$13.7 billion in 1990, and 75% of these expenses were not reimbursed by insurance companies!

Baby Boomers are more likely to believe in preventative medical care which is the biggest part of alternative medicine. While alternative therapy users are more likely to be affluent and well educated, Seniors are also speaking out. Seniors who are interested in alternative medicine say that cost is a major factor.

NATURAL HEALTH reports there are two types of people who turn to alternative medicine: those who did not have success with conventional medicine and **those who are simply taking responsibility for their own health.** AMERICAN DEMOGRAPHICS also reports that another reason for the growth of alternative health care is the growing prevalence of chronic health problems. As America's median age creeps higher, chronic health problems are replacing acute conditions as the dominant focus of health care.

Imagine bona-fide alternative approaches to medicine, inexpensive, primarily drug free, oriented to promote our body's natural healing powers. This, for instance, is the reason 25 million Americans turn to osteopathic physicians for their complete health care. Osteopathic medicine is distinct from allopathic medicine.

Osteopaths are complete physicians. They practice in all branches of medicine and surgery, from psychiatry to obstetrics; from geriatrics to emergency medicine. However, D.O's are trained to be doctors first, and specialists second. The majority are family-oriented, primary care physicians. Osteopathic medicine is more than a century old. Its founder, Andrew Taylor Still, sought to help patients heal sooner by the use of hands and fingers as well as medication and surgery. Today's osteopathic physician typically practices in smaller towns and rural areas (66% do). Fifty-two percent are in general practice, internal medicine and pediatrics.

Patients with musculoskeletal problems, including neck and back pain, who visit a doctor of osteopathy who incorporates manipulative skills may well avoid making multiple visits to exclusively medical doctors, chiropractors and other health professionals. Patients should know about this medical option because many serious conditions, including cancer, can masquerade as neck and back pain or headaches. Will the Clinton health cost proposal embrace our attitude to this kind of health care? Will the proposed standardization of medical care compromise our efforts to be healthy? to rehabilitate my son and the children like him?

We practice homeopathy and are treated by a physician who is also a classic homeopath. My children have not had an aspirin or antibiotic in seven years. My children have excellent school attendance. Homeopathic remedies are so inexpensive, we have minimized the cost of medicine in our home.

As the costs of conventional medicine continues to rise, a growing number of people look for less expensive alternatives. While homeopathic companies are inconsequential compared with the major pharmaceutical companies, a look at the prevailing use of homeopathy in Europe indicates its potential use in our country. Forty-two percent of British physicians make referrals to homeopathic physicians. One-third of family physicians in France prescribe homeopathic remedies, as do more than 20 percent of German physicians. All French pharmacology schools teach courses on homeopathy, and some medical schools offer degree programs in it.

Presently one of the most conspicuous manifestations of my son's challenge is his speech. While we have engaged several mainstream speech therapists in our pursuit of neutralizing this anomaly, a voice coach in New York City has proven to be the most effective therapist in assisting my son learn to speak with clarity and with dignity. Known as "Dr. Breath", Carl Stough gained a reputation training olympic track stars to run and compete in varying altitudes. He also treated people with emphysema. I studied many years with Carola Speads, a 90 year old woman who has taught breath and physical reeducation in NYC for 55 years. With the learning Carola imparted to me, coupled with my being Seth's mother and applying my hands to him as only a mother can touch her own child, he has made strides that were once only dreams.

During the early expensive years of consultations and visits with neurologists, orthopedic surgeons, physical therapists and other conventional and sanctioned professionals, we never realized the gains that finally were accomplished. When we reoriented our access to the health community, Seth began to walk and to function ably. My son is a gorgeous, vital, intelligent young man growing into his maturity, not without frustration and struggle, but also with tolerance and purpose.

Will the Clinton health cost proposal be able to embrace the path that I developed? Will others like me find support and encouragement for a non-orthodox, non standardized approach to health care? These are the concerns I harbor as we progress in the evolution of your health plan. As it is, I have battled and advocated incessantly for what my son needed. Many others have done much more.

We supported the President's election bid and are happy that he won. We continue to support him even amidst actions that have sometimes disappointed us. We support universal health care coverage. To me that means health care in the broadest sense. What we accessed for our son worked to improve his life

dramatically. Now he will never have to depend on the Government. In fact, I expect he will bring a comprehensive, novel view of healing to others one day.

We appeal for open mindedness, innovation and vision for health alternatives. Resist the conventional. Let me serve you. There are choices outside the standard systems and prevailing options that currently exist. Let us implement them to full advantage.

My Dear Miss Attorney General,

My wife, Ruth, and I believe the above is true based on the facts
enclosed in this letter

Subsequent to August 25, 1985, Ruth and I obtained Federal Documents:
N.S.T.B. Aircraft Accident Report, and FAA History of Aircraft that we
did present to an attorney at a later date for civil action. In the
interim, we successfully resolved Disability and Compensation medical
claims within New York State by a medical claims attorney in 1986.

We paid an attorney, Carl M. Warboys, an advance fee of \$2,000.00
November 16, 1987, and lost the case March 16, 1990, see exhibit #1
attached. Exhibit #2, dated April 26, 1990, covers \$200.00 court cost
at our personal expense, see attached. Exhibit #3, dated February 15,
1991 denotes that the case was taken off the calendar, see attached.
Exhibit #4, date February 14, 1992, abandoned and dismissed the case,
see attached.

Having lost the case; having to pay court costs and affecting our
credit rating, we were upset. At that point we went to the expense
and time to gather documents in Oswego County and Albany, New York.
We then documented facts in writing to Mr. Warboys, but to no avail.

Justice must prevail. We turned to Judge Mordue with the facts (see
exhibit #5 attached, dated August 13, 1993, exhibit #6 attached,
urging me to seek legal council.

Ruth and I feel that you have a kindly understanding of people having
limited resources requiring legal assistance, especially where there
are Civil Rights Violations, suffered by us (the Plaintiff) and the
wilful deliberate intent of the parties being sued to deceive the
court, I believe.
