Now, 30 years after EDS was founded, they're still doing it that way. They do what the customer wants. Period. On an average day, 50,000 EDS employees are on or next door to customer premises.

And they still hire self-starters. They'd rather have a self-starting English major than someone who was in the top 2 percent in computer science at Harvard who needs a support staff of 25 to go to the bathroom.

# GM, union reach 3-year deal

## Labor relations improve amid carmaker's losses, job cuts

An Associated Press Report

DETROIT — General Motors Corp. and the United Auto Workers (UAW) tentatively agreed to a new contract Sunday without ever setting a strike deadline, strong evidence of improved labor relations at the world's largest automaker.

The three-year pact follows a pattern on wages and benefits set between the union and Ford Motor Co. last month. Some Wall Street analysts had said they believed the agreement was too expensive for financially ailing GM.

GM has lost \$17 billion making and selling vehicles in North America in the last three years. It is in the process of cutting 74,000 jobs and closing at least 21 plants — a fifth of its factory space — by 1995.

With that backdrop, the labor talks proved peaceful. Most telling was the lack of a strike deadline during negotiations, which began in June and intensified two weeks ago. Labor observers had expected a deadline to be set quickly.

After a 24-hour bargaining session last week, UAW president Owen Bleber asked 400 plant-level union leaders for more time, not a deadline.

"I think it reflects the improvement in the relationship," said John Casesa, an analyst with Wertheim Schroder & Co. "I don't think the sides love each other,

but they finally respect each other. They're not diametrically opposed forces anymore."

While more job cuts at GM are likely, the company and union expect early retirements to account for the bulk of them. The last such program at GM — again allowed under the new contract — coaxed 16,500 workers to leave early.

UAW local leaders are expected to meet later this week in Detroit to review the contract agreement.

Highlights of the contract, which also was adopted by Chrysler Corp., include:

- A 3 percent wage increase in the first year followed by 3 percent lump sum bonuses in the second and third years. Those are the same increases as in the 1990 contract.

- Continuation of fully paid health care benefits. The union had said it would strike if the automakers tried to introduce premiums or increase co-payment levels.

- Increased job and income security funds. At GM, the fund is expected to be about \$4 billion.

- Increased pension benefits. Workers who retire after 30 years would receive \$2,030 a month by the end of the new contract in 1996, up from \$1,800 a month now.

## A new theme: 'See you in court'

*More white-collar employees fight corporate dismissals*

At first glance, a National Football League referee, a Disneyland trumpeter, an American Airlines executive and a group of Kmart store managers would seem to have little in common.

But in fact they are all linked. They are among the growing number of white-collar professionals—executives, managers, performers, sports officials and diverse others—who are suing former or current bosses for age discrimination.

Invariably older than most employees and higher paid, they are seeking relief under the federal Age Discrimination in Employment Act. ADEA bars bosses from firing or demoting workers age 40 or over on the basis of age.

"We're seeing a lot of it, where people with high salaries are going out the door [while] young people are being retained," says Paul Tobias, a Cincinnati lawyer who specializes in employment law.

The phenomenon is by no means new. Many managers and executives have been laid off in recent years as recession-racked corporations moved to trim their employee ranks.

What is new is that some of the supervisors who did the laying off are now getting laid off themselves. And these officials, along with many other white-collar professionals, are starting to fight back.

Increasingly, they are filing com-

plaints with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC), which enforces ADEA, thereby swelling that agency's already-enormous caseload. And they are filing private lawsuits.

Some cases are small. A Disneyland trumpet player sued Walt Disney Co. alleging that each time musicians re-auditioned for their jobs, older players were dropped. Disney officials declined to discuss the charge.

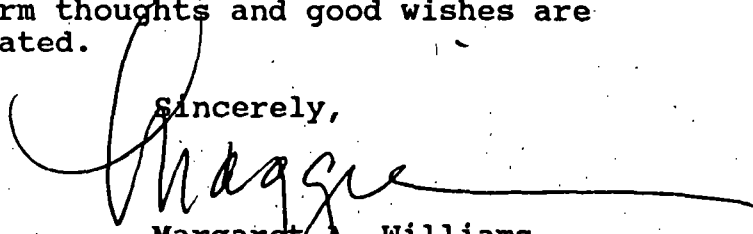

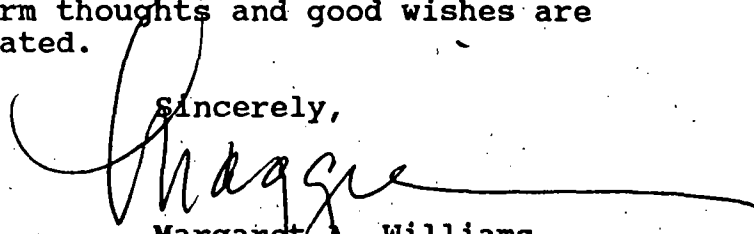

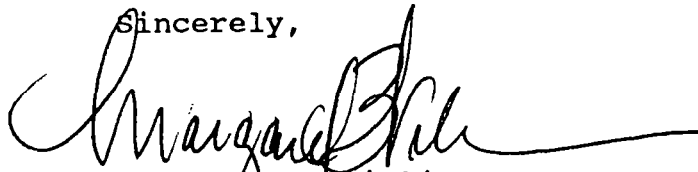

# Toward a co-presidency

*Clinton should let Gore do more*

For two years, during the presidential campaign and during his time in office, I supported Bill Clinton. I wrote many letters to Clinton and his staff with words of encouragement. I even sent ideas to Clinton's mother, Virginia Kelley.

For two years, I have been filled with hope — a new beginning for our country, more honesty, caring and intelligence in government, a better economy, more jobs, less crime, health care for all, peace around the world, happy days were here again — and all of a sudden ... Whitewater ... and the president's ship seems to be sinking.

I don't want to hear anymore about Whitewater. Day by day, I am feeling more and more depressed and alienated. Enough is enough. Who can rescue Clinton from Whitewater? Help, help!

Al Gore has many qualities which complement those of Bill Clinton. Gore graduated from Harvard. He served in Vietnam, worked as a journalist, businessman and farmer. He studied government, religion and law. He learned about government from his father, Sen. Albert Gore Sr. Al Gore Jr. served in Congress for 16 years. The vice president has experience and integrity.

After Gore's acceptance speech at the Democratic National Convention, Clinton stepped to the podium to accept the nomination and said, "I am so proud of Al Gore."

I like Bill Clinton, a lot. Don't get me wrong, it may be that the presidency is just too big a job for one person.

Many people don't trust Clinton. Whitewater is revealing Clinton's legal manipulating as a liability. We just don't trust lawyers anymore. Gore, on the other hand, isn't a lawyer. He studied law, but never got a law degree, never practiced law. Perhaps Gore can rescue Clinton from Whitewater.

got to be something like a co-presidency?”

“That’s something Gov. Reagan really ought to consider,” Ford said. Reagan was shocked by the co-presidency idea and picked George Bush to be his running mate. (according to *Crapshoot, Rolling the Dice on the Vice Presidency*,

by Jules Witcover).

Co-presidency doesn’t have to mean equal power. That would violate our Constitution. The president is still commander-in-chief. However, Bill Clinton can allow the vice president equal visibility on television. In 1973, Gore wrote his senior college thesis on *The Impact*

*of Television on the Conduct of the Presidency.*

Why not let Gore share more of the limelight with Clinton? Let them debate the issues together on TV. Let the vice president play the devil’s advocate. The Bill and Al Show on TV. There is no business like show business and this might keep the press happy. Clinton and Gore could allow some of their private differences to become public. That might focus more press attention on the issues rather than on scandals.

**WHITewater MAY** be a blessing in disguise, a golden opportunity to reshape government from the top down. Co-presidency could set an example for leadership in government and business. It might help to sell democracy in Russia and around the world. It could encourage partnerships at all levels: co-governors, co-mayors, co-managers, pilots and co-pilots, working together, winning

teams, etc.

Co-presidency would cost the taxpayers nothing. If it doesn’t work, we can go back to business as usual. We have nothing to lose and everything to gain. As Franklin D. Roosevelt put it, “the country demands bold, persistent experimentation.”

This is one man’s opinion, Mr. President: Whitewater will not go away. You must do something bold. Share the stage with Al Gore. And remember the words of Isaiah: “Come, and let us reason together. Though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow.”

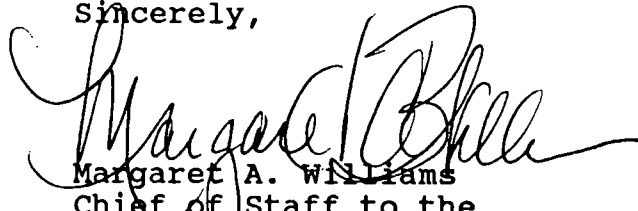

# Democrats hope Cuomo not gone

## Some see role for defeated governor

NEW YORK — Stunned by George Pataki's victory, Democrats clung to the hope yesterday that somehow it was not over for Gov. Mario Cuomo.

"He's a voice of civility, a voice of compassion," said Meyer "Sandy" Frucher, a top political adviser to Cuomo. "We just can't let him walk off the stage."

Frucher said Cuomo, who made no public appearances yesterday, lost because voters in Erie and Suffolk counties turned out in large numbers, and Cuomo picked up far fewer votes than he had in past elections in those two large counties.

Former State Tax Commissioner Roderick Chu, who resigned in 1988 to work as a management consultant, said he believed Cuomo would continue to be a public figure despite his defeat.

"The guy is quality, the guy is intelligence," Chu said. "I have to believe that a man of utmost integrity — both personal and intellectual integrity — a person who cares as much for the people of the country as well as New York, has got to have a future, for our own sakes."

Frucher said Cuomo would be needed to help the national Democratic Party get back on its feet.

"Mario Cuomo is going to be a

voice that's not going to be silenced," Frucher said. "There's a whole lot of rebuilding and reshaping that's got to be done with the Democratic Party, and we need his help."

State Comptroller H. Carl McCall, who was successful in his race, said Tuesday night he was "distressed and saddened" by Cuomo's loss.

McCall's victory and Cuomo's loss thrust McCall into the position of being the top Democrat in state government after only 18 months on the job.

Cuomo has made more than \$1 million giving speeches in the last

few years and his defeat might not significantly diminish his drawing power on the lecture circuit.

Cuomo has been mentioned as a candidate for many other jobs while serving as governor.

Besides declining a chance to run for president in 1992, Cuomo rejected a seat on the U.S. Supreme Court in 1993.

He's also been mentioned as the host of a political television talk show modeled after Rush Limbaugh's program.

Cuomo's concession speech Tuesday night gave no hint about his plans. He has served as governor since 1982. □
