I am a Librarian at Harriet Tubman Elementary School in the District of Columbia. The invitation is for a very special class of wonderful children. They are twenty-five 6th graders at Harriet Tubman. What makes them special? First, they have an excellent teacher, Beverly Battle, who has loved, nurtured and taught them from the second grade to the present. Second, they are a diverse group of children (African, African-American, Hispanic and Vietnamese) who represent the future of our country. It is this diversity, within their classroom, that has developed and enhanced their global vision and respect for the community in which they live and learn. Third, our school is located in the inner city and has a strong principal who practices to the hilt what Mrs. Clinton preaches, "to raise a happy, healthy and hopeful child...it takes all of us." I could write for hours about them, they're tops. In fact, I am extending the invitation to you to please visit us and see for yourself.

I would like to give these children an opportunity to observe History, not sitting in front of the television, but as eye-witnesses. 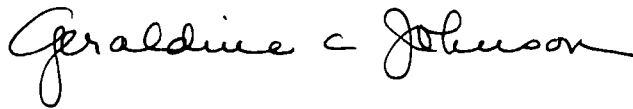
Dear Ms. Williams:
