It has long been a theory of mine that there is a reason why each of us are here: Was it a coincidence that Betty Friedan, Germaine Greer, and Gloria Steinem were living at the right place and time to participate in the women's movement, or did the women's movement draw them out, and they rose to the occasion? Whatever the reason for their involvement, perhaps destiny brought them together and it was their presence at that time that created the history! It would be interesting to know what some of these people did as children, where they came from, what motivated them and drove them to that place and time.

I believe that all of us are here at specific times for a reason, why were we born in this generation and not in the 1800s or whatever? And I want to know what you and other women like you have experienced during this time? what you have learned? what you want to be known for? and most importantly what do you want to leave behind for the next generation? Please take the time to share a story with all of us about: careers, relationships, illness, death, taxes, and other mid-life crises...or a poem, a story that has touched you that you would like to share.

Famous people from actresses to singers to ex-Presidents' wives will be contacted for this collection, and whoever responds will have their own Chapter, only their words will be used, no editing on the part of the author, nothing out of context, just a chance to share a life story to be part of what I hope will be a wonderful "Collection of Women's Stories". Thank you again for your steadfastness and I hope you will have a Merry Christmas and will be able to forget some of the recent unpleasantness, at least for the time being.

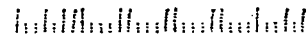

Response on Behalf of the First Lady to "Women for Israel's Tomorrow"

Ruth and Nadia Matar have written the First Lady to urge that she meet with them to discuss what they describe as abusive treatment at the hands of Israeli authorities. The Matars are associated with the "Women for Israel's Tomorrow," a group opposed to current Israel-Palestinian negotiations. The group is closely associated with the extremist settler movement and has been involved in recent protests against the policies of Prime Minister Rabin. During these protests, which included the "occupation" of hilltops slated to be turned over to Palestinian control, Israeli military and police forces were used to physically remove the demonstrators.

In view of the circumstances and our strong support for implementation of the Israel-Palestinian Declaration of Principles and the just-signed Interim Agreement, we recommend that the First Lady regret the meeting invitation. A draft response on behalf of the First Lady is attached at Tab A.

Dear First Lady,

We have just read your inspiring statement made recently at the United Nation's Fourth World Conference on Women.

As leaders of a leading women's activist group here in Israel, we completely agree with the views you expressed. Unfortunately, we have been victims of repeated police brutality here in Israel in connection with our efforts to express our views at our peaceful and legal demonstrations. (Nadla has had her ribs broken, and Ruth a brain concussion.) Nadla has been arrested on eight separate protests, and is now facing 3 separate criminal indictments for daring to be a protest leader. In contrast to this, we have just been advised that Nadla has been selected by a radio station here in Israel, as "The Woman of the Year." The Rabin Government will not tolerate dissent. Recent polls show that as many as 73% of the populace here do not want to go on to stage 2 of the Oslo Accord without a referendum. They do not trust Arafat, and with good reason. His PLO covenant to destroy Israel has not been repealed as promised, and his recorded video talks to his People show that he is not seeking peace.

No other nation in history has ever had its historical land given away by its leaders. Here it is being done without the People involved being consulted. The platform on which the present regime was elected, did not include any such plank. Disposing of Israel's ancient and Biblical Land without its People being consulted is incredulous. No American Government could survive such anti-democratic behavior, yet in Israel, a "pretend democracy," it is happening. And it is happening because America is supporting such Rabin-Peres behavior.

We would like to meet with you and show you the tapes we have of police brutality towards our women and children. We are prepared to fly over for such purpose, if you grant our request. As an exemplary woman who understands the role women can play in shaping a new era, you will understand our desire to insure Israel's future. We have thousands of American citizens who are members of our organization both here and in the States. We will not be intimidated by police beatings, but insist we receive answers on the merits. Can we hear from you personally as to our request to meet with you.

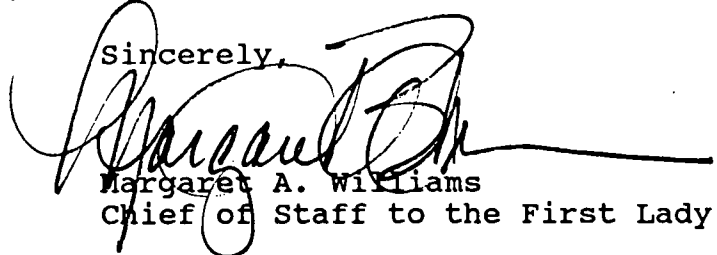

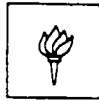

Dear Ms. Williams:

On October 12-15, the 1995-96 freshman class of New York University's Martin Luther King, Jr. Scholars Program will travel to Washington, DC for their Freshman Seminar experience.

For the past three years, freshman students in our program have met with legislators and other important figures in Washington's political scene. I would like to elicit your support for this year's seminar.

Specifically, I am requesting a brief audience with Mrs. Clinton and members of her staff. We hope that this would provide an opportunity for our students to dialogue with The First Lady on the various quality of life issues she has supported during her tenure. 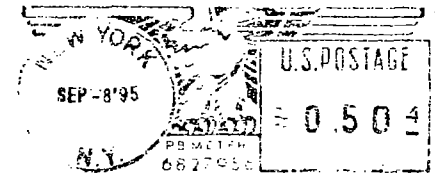
