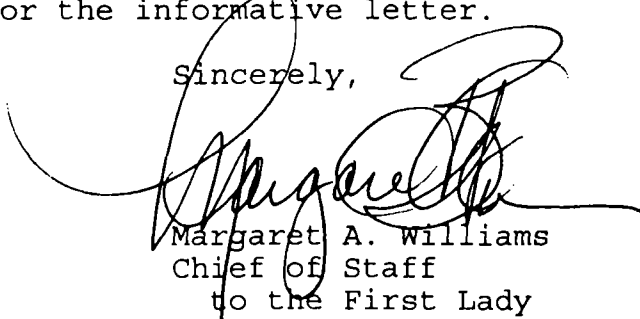

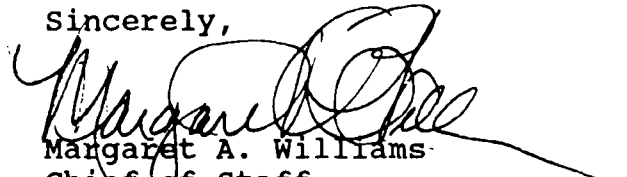

And who better to head his task force than Richard Scrushy, the top dog of HealthSouth? HealthSouth is

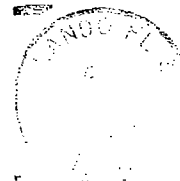
a chain of rehab centers that makes a billion a year by holding down what injured workers are allowed to get in the way of medical treatment.

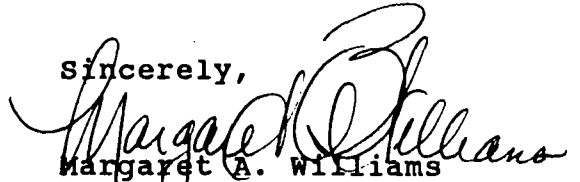

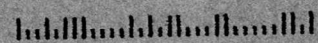

Dear Ms. Williams,

I have enclosed a copy of the letter I sent to Mrs. Clinton February 12th. One of her aides told me Mrs. Clinton couldn't intercede with Brooke Shearer and I told her that was unbelievable. She asked why and I told her that politics is the art of compromise and I had spent a great deal of time in the White House and never knew any such situation that could not be reversed. 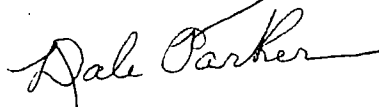

Dear Mrs. Clinton,

I worked with your people in Arkansas, during the campaign, including George Stephanopoulos and Amanda Crumley. I sent both of them a copy of the book I just wrote and published, "A Political Candidate's Guide For 1996" and responded to George's recent request for suggestions to assist the Administration.

Last November, I spoke with Amanda about my daughter Jackie wanting to become a White House Fellow. She said she was the right age and I felt, from our conversation, that Amanda thought Jackie was highly qualified to become a White House Fellow. At her request, I sent Amanda a copy of Jackie's application for the Fellowship the first week in December. Last summer, Jackie turned down an offer by Mr. Hunt, a friend of your husband, to ask your husband to put Jackie in the astronaut corps at NASA. She did not feel that was the right way to get in. I advised her that NASA was very political and she wouldn't make it any other way and she didn't.

Jackie has a number of 'firsts' for women and you presented her with the 'Ground Breaker' Award last June. Page 2 is a picture of that occasion.

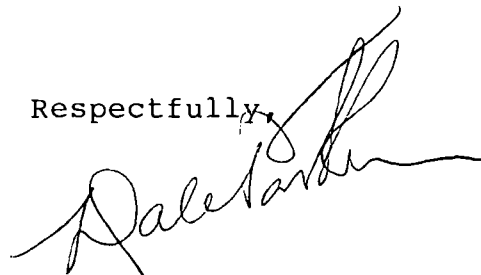
Last Saturday, February 11, 1995, Jackie received a rejection notice from Brooke Shearer, Presidential Commission on White House Fellowships.

WHY THE '1996 PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION' MAY BE THE MOST
CONFUSED AND INCREDIBLE ELECTION EXPERIENCE OF OUR LIFETIME

They don't like any President sending troops abroad without Congressional approval or the media influencing government to send troops to places like Somalia and the way the media distorts the truth. Why do we ignore Iran and pressure North Korea not to have nuclear capability? Foreign policy is an issue that won't go away. Voters have finally gotten the guts to tell everyone they are angry as hell and are going to throw out any and all elected officials who don't listen to the majority. This was once a country where the majority ruled and the voters are going to take the initiative to see that the majority rules again and NOW!

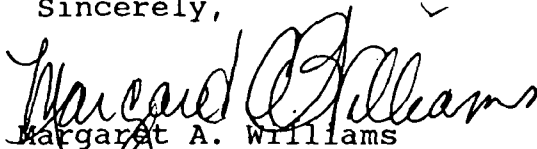

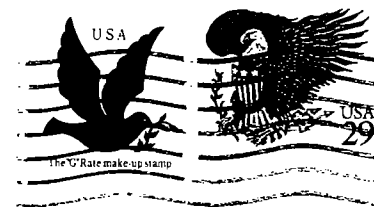

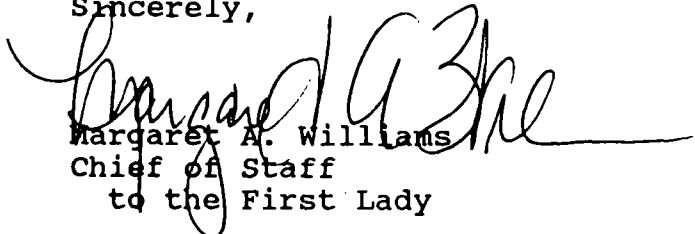

PROGRAM UPDATE
May 22, 1995

On January 21, 1995 Project Health in the 'Hood and the Youth Intervention Program presented their first annual leadership award. The ceremony was held at Horace Mann Middle School located in South Central, Los Angeles. Over 600 children from surrounding schools were in attendance. Awards were presented to Mr. Louis Gossett Jr., Ms. Cicely Tyson and Bishop H.H. Brookins.

To show state support, Ray Johnson (former Police Chief of Inglewood) and presently the Executive Director of the Governor's Office of Criminal Justice Planning served as our Master of Ceremonies.

During the ceremony Mr. Johnson read a letter from President Clinton commending Project Health in the 'Hood for it's accomplishments.

Project Health in the 'Hood worked with established grass roots community based organizations, Department of Children's Services, and Probation in the development of our program. We discovered to be effective we had to address this underserved population in an environment that was culturally sensitive and would not pose a threat to their safety.

Margo Wainwright, Executive Director of the Youth Intervention Program and presently head of the South Central Coalition which is comprised of thirteen community based organizations, is executing the pilot program which includes health care, skill training and job placement.

Youth Intervention Program presently serves approximately 250 families and 1,500 youths per year through their Family Preservation Program. The program also operates three group homes for children and an alternative high school program under the auspices of the Los Angeles Unified School District.

I have been working with youth at risk for two years, and witnessed terrible inequities in the system when addressing this population.

The lack of transportation makes it increasingly difficult for individuals to access clinics. The Medivan passes provided by Medical are inadequate to service an entire families needs. The mobile vans have proven to be an unacceptable form of health care to these communities, individuals feel they are receiving inferior care. In addition to the fact that the mobile vans have been known to be used in conjunction with local authorities to apprehend suspected felons and illegal immigrants. The most serious obstacle we have faced is fear.

Living in a community where gang activity is a pervasive force, traveling a short distance out of one's neighborhood can mean the difference between life and death.

I have volunteered with organizations and assisted them in obtaining food, clothing, medicine to include immunizations, medical and surgical supplies, which were sent overseas.

In our attempt to obtain immunizations that would be administered at various sites by our volunteer physicians and nurse practitioners in Southern California we were refused by the two leading vaccine manufacturers Lederle and Merck. We suggested they consider selling us the vaccines at a reduced cost. Unfortunately this did not fit within their guidelines due to the fact they contribute vaccines to government agencies who administer the immunizations at schools, clinics and the Department of Health Services.

Unfortunately neither the clinics nor the Department of Health Services would donate any of their vaccines to enable us to inoculate the children we service.

I contacted Dr. Paula Franklin at the Children's Defense Fund who referred me to Every Child by Two. Every Child by Two referred me to the Department of Health Services and the Children's Health Fund. Children's Health Fund referred me to the Department of Health Services and the local clinics and suggested I explore if their vans serviced the area in question. Further it was stated that individuals in need of these services were apathetic, thus the children were not being immunized.

The only apathy I have seen has been on the part of the establishment. It appears no one wishes to be held accountable for these actions.

I am presently in discussion with Molina Medical Centers to assist with the future development of our health care programs. Understanding the need for services in low income areas Molina Medical Centers have generously offered immunizations to Project Health in the 'Hood and the population which we serve. On Saturday June 24, 1995 we will initiate our immunization program at the Youth Intervention Program's Family Support Center located at 4625 Crenshaw Blvd.

Mission Statement

Project Health in the 'Hood does not accept any State, Local or Federal Government funding.

Project Health in the 'Hood is dedicated to the proposition that Corporate America, working with established community based organizations located in low income communities, together can provide comprehensive quality services. It is the goal of Project Health in the 'Hood to establish these services in low income communities across the country.

Under the medical direction of Gordon Goei, M.D., Ob-Gyn, we have developed a program that addresses the concerns of the community in the areas of health, education, counseling, alcohol and substance abuse treatment to include aftercare, and sexually transmitted diseases. An immunization program for pre-school children will be offered. Anonymous HIV I testing, Pap smear cultures, tests for sexually transmitted diseases, toxicology screens and tuberculosis scratch tests will also be available. Assistance will be offered to families whose children suffer from craniofacial damage.

This program will address the needs of youth at risk, teenage mothers and their children, the neglected and abused child, and gangs. In addition we will address the increasing number of HIV/AIDS cases among women, newborns, adolescents, adults and hard core drug users.

All services provided by Project Health in the 'Hood are available to everyone. We encourage participation from other community based organizations, schools and churches.

Project Health in the 'Hood has established a medical service center located in the Youth Intervention Program's Family Support Center, located in South Central Los Angeles. The medical service center will be staffed by physicians, nurse practitioners and phlebotomists who will volunteer a few hours of their time each week. Aramis Paronyan, M.D. (Health Line Clinical Laboratories) will provide free anonymous HIV I tests. Pamm Barragar Dunne, M.D., President of the National Association for Drama Therapy will provide services which will enable us to identify children with learning disabilities and behavioral problems due to early exposure to drugs and fetal alcohol syndrome.

Under the leadership of Ms. Margo Wainwright, Executive Director, Youth Intervention Program has been servicing the community of South Central Los Angeles since 1986. Ms. Wainwright is a 1992 Family Circle Award recipient and has received a 1994 United States Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Investigation Director Community Service Award.

Youth Intervention Program presently serves approximately 250 families and 1,500 youths per year through their Family Preservation Program. The program also operates three group homes for children and an alternative high school program under the auspices of the Los Angeles Unified School District.

Project Health in the 'Hood facilitated for Youth Intervention Program's existing certified drug counselors who are bilingual and trained in sign language to attend training provided by the County of Los Angeles Department of Health Services to become certified in HIV counseling services. Presently ten counselors have been certified.

As another collaborative effort in our dedication to serving the community of South Central Los Angeles Youth Intervention Program and Project Health in the 'Hood have developed "The Story Teller's Corner" and "Adopt a Grandparent Program," targeting children ages four to ten.

A computerized program has been developed that will enable us to obtain actual statistics by age, gender, race, current or former substance user, HIV positive or negative, and sexually transmitted diseases.

Program Development - 1995

Project Health in the 'Hood looks forward to expanding services to include medical and counseling services for a proposed Juvenile Drug Court to be located in the David V. Kenyon Juvenile Justice Center, as designated in the YSB.

Develop a skill center and job placement program.

Facilitate a dental care program.

With the assistance of the American Cancer Society, arrange for mobile mammogram testing vans on a monthly basis at designated community locations.
