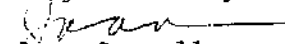

The daughter I adopted in Connecticut and I live not far from Park Ridge - in Glenview. Small world! Although child mental health practice is an old and enduring part of my life, I have learned about the other side as my daughter is seriously emotionally disturbed. Biological predisposition, alcohol exposure in utero, and four homes in her first eight months (not to mention life with me) have left serious scars despite extensive services. Her problems may be chronic. I have looked at mental health from both sides now and learned more than I ever wanted to know!

For several years, I proposed that we invite you to Chapin Hall for a colloquium before you got too busy for such things. "Hillary who?" they asked! I knew when you moved to Little Rock that Bill was worth betting on and only wondered when his political star would rise and propel you into scheduling gridlock. I was pleased that Marge Benton, President of our Board, was aware of the Clintons long before most folks took notice.

I wish you well with whitewater's turbulence. I loved Barry Goldwater's public statement which I took to be repayment of his debt for your youthful loyalty to him. Maybe we shall meet again when we are old ladies. Until then, know that I am extremely grateful to you and to Bill for putting basic human needs at the top of the domestic agenda. Thanks for being so real and so gutsy.

Dear Mrs. Clinton:

The extensive media coverage of Whitewater has prompted me to write this letter.

It seems that in this time of your strong and positive leadership that the media (and the Republicans) should be addressing your accomplishments and efforts on behalf of the people of this country. The preoccupation with Whitewater is indicative of the negativism of past administrations. It is as if people would like for there to be something wrong. The reality is your administration has achieved incredible accomplishments for our nation during the past year. I, for one, offer my support and encouragement to you both.

I would like to add two observations. First, the attacks directed at you, I believe, grow out of a deep seated antagonism toward strong women in politics. Similar viciousness was apparent in the efforts to destroy Geraldine Ferraro, Pat Schroeder and Anita Hill. The passion of these attacks is really scary. I do not believe the male Washington establishment can cope with your intelligence, analytic abilities, wisdom and creativity. As other professional women, I am afraid you are viewed by the male establishment as pushy, arrogant and aggressive rather than focused, dedicated, and assertive (qualities attributed to men). If I can offer my reaction - don't be discouraged, don't give up, don't change. Continue to be yourself. You are doing great!

My second observation is really more of a concern - a concern that, because of these negative attacks and treatment by the media and Washington establishment, you and the President will be reluctant to continue to provide the strong, positive and visionary leadership that this nation desperately needs (and has not had for the years of Republican rule). Your leadership serves this nation well. We need your example in Washington and in our state and communities. I extend my support and hope you will keep your course and not be diverted.

I have to admit that although I have been provoked by other national and local matters and have been active in national campaigns and local government, I have never in my forty-seven years written such a letter. I feel a little silly but I also feel very strongly about these issues. Just perhaps I am following your example. Just imagine if this assertiveness spread!

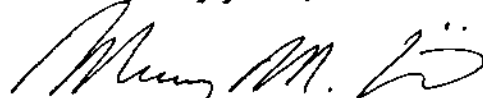
Dear Ms. Clinton:

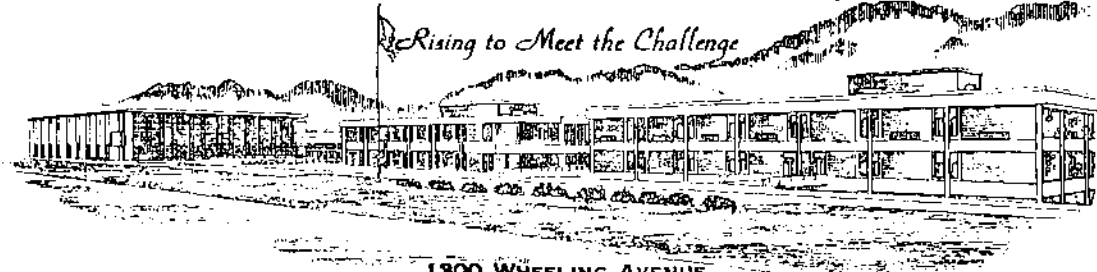

All this pounding you're getting can be very discouraging, but you have guts and brains, so hang in there.

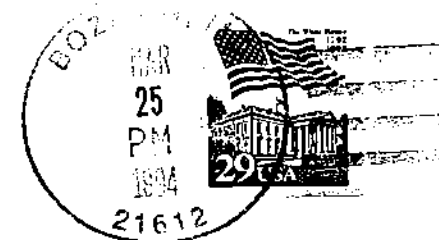

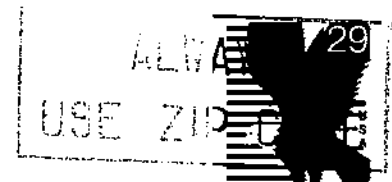

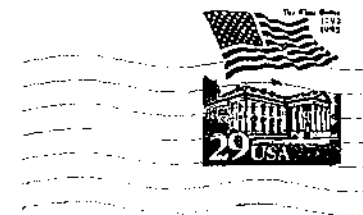

And the photos of you in Time! You're a beauty along with all the other qualities that are very appropriate for the First Lady.

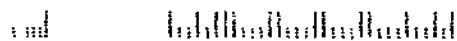

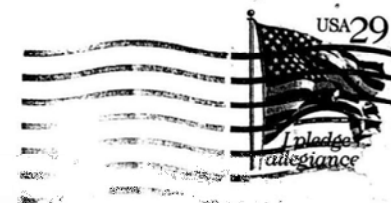
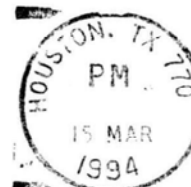

Whitewater just tree in the forest

AUSTIN — I am working womanfully on the Whitewater Scandal. One of my secret vanities as a journalist is that I'm non-partisan about ethical lapses, a veritable Ahab in relentless pursuit of do-badders of any persuasion.

I pride myself on the roster of Democrats and/or liberals I have roasted, toasted and basted on matters fiscal and moral: Lyndon Johnson, former House Speaker Jim Wright, Lt. Gov. Bob Bullock, former Attorney General Jim Mattox, former Texas House Speaker Gib Lewis, etc., etc.

It's just that every time I see Sen. Al D'Amato waxing indignant about Whitewater, I start laughing. I used to work for The New York Times, where I covered D'Amato, one of the most awful weasels I ever ran across.

Nevertheless, I have been studying Whitewater. Here's the deal:

Sixteen years ago — possibly on a cold, dark night — Bill and Hillary Clinton invested in a real estate deal

and failed to take a deduction for the loss on their income taxes. So far, I fail to ignite. I am not amused by politicians who make money while holding public office, but I've never had to take a stand on a politician who lost money and failed to take a deduction before.

More of the usual

There follows the usual tangled tale of how the Clintons' partner in the real estate deal, James McDougal, owns this savings and loan called Madison Guaranty what gets into the usual S&L trouble.

At which point there's the usual conflict of interest because Hillary Clinton has been hired to represent Madison Guaranty for the usual \$2K-a-month retainer, and among other legal work, she represents McDougal before a state bank regulator appointed by her husband. Further conflict charges loom on account of Hillary Clinton's being a partner in the Rose Law Firm in Little Rock, which represented several banks and S&Ls and then later, as per usual, also represented the government in the liquidation of banks and S&Ls.

At the Washington end, we get a big flap-de-do because some Treasury officials briefed some White House officials on how the Resolution Trust Corp.'s examination of Madison Guaranty was coming along, and this is a big no-no because it might look like political pressure is being put on the RTC. Gee, no one there ever would have guessed that the White House had any interest in Madison Guaranty; it's only been on the front pages for two years now.

The only truly distinguishing feature of the Madison Guaranty saga is how absolutely average it is. The RTC should have been questioned, grilled and bastinadoed years ago.

Mrs. Clinton Due Better Handling from News Media

President Clinton's wife, Hillary, surely is one of the most charming, intelligent, toughest and strongest First Ladys ever to live in the White House.

There was nothing in the Clinton campaign to give the impression that she would be only a casual observer of governmental activities like the late Pat Nixon or Barbara Bush. She is an accomplished lawyer, one capable of addressing congress as well as grassroots citizens. And she shines equally at the forefront of foreign diplomatic missions of the most occasions.

Through it all, she's a mother who seems to allot the time needed for a daughter whose age is of the most trying time. She'll probably be recorded in history as the first "superwoman" of the White House.

Her achievement in generating in record time a very complex program for solving the critical health care problem is a feat few seasoned career government officials could match. Though the program is overloaded with too much big governmentitis, the effort has focused the problem of inadequate health care into the public area. For that she earns our thanks.

Getting a Bum Rap

Through all of this she is getting a bum rap from the Washington scene. Unlike Little Rock, every breath of a president is shoved under a microscope. And when the politicians and news media find nothing wrong, they seek another item to exploit. The Whitewater issue, a controversy more than five years old, has been shifted into the judicial area where it belongs until a determination is made about its facts — did Mr. Clinton do anything illegal?

A few meager facts that have been revealed so far indicate that nothing has been found to show that the President benefitted illegally from the demise of a savings and loan in which he and Mrs. Clinton were barely involved.

Mr. Clinton's release last week of their income tax returns back to 1977 seems to show little more than the fact that Mrs. Clinton had become adept at making more money than her

husband's public office jobs produced. Surely such personal matters would seem to be unnecessarily embarrassing to them while contributing nothing useful to their critics.

This Whitewater affair has brought some concern and dismissal of some of the President's appointees when their actions have proven too awkward politically. But there is no similar out for Mrs. Clinton. For the moment, she is the heavy political baggage residue that should and will remain.

Issue in Capable Hands

Most of Mrs. Clinton's ordeal is unnecessary now that the Whitewater matter is in the capable hands of a special prosecutor. We recall an excerpt from Stephen Ambrose's book about former President Richard Nixon and his final days in the White House.

Mrs. Nixon is regarded as one of the most gracious First Ladys and a most supportive wife of a president. While her husband and the family were going through the agony of planning Mr. Nixon's historical resignation, she kept up her spirits and retained her sense of humor.

Commenting on her feelings when reporters had asked her about Watergate, she replied, "I just pretend I don't hear them. The next thing I know there will be a report that I am getting deaf."

She commented again: "No matter what I do I can't win. If I give the press all the tidbits about people and issues, they would say I was talking too much. And if I give them nothing, they accuse me of having no opinions or being capable of only small talk."

Her complaints rarely were directed at the politicians who were trying to impeach her husband.

Like Pat Nixon Mrs. Clinton deserves more than the rough treatment she is getting in the media. Her husband needs support and counsel in his job. When the special prosecutor's job is finished — without a congressional sideshow — that will be the time for a clearer perspective. This respect Mrs. Clinton deserves.

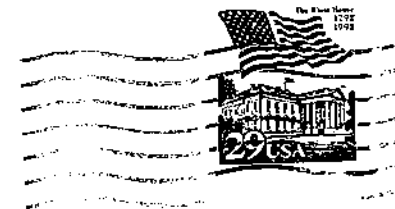
This is a fan letter, my first. However I hope you are getting lots of them these days.

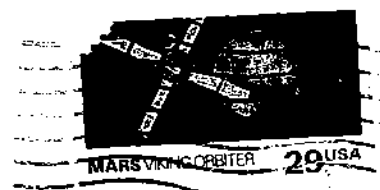

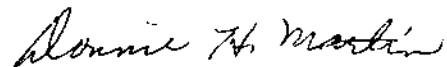
