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Agency Liaison Report for the First Lady

1. Reverend Edmund Orosz of Florida: A 57-year-old Hungarian who immigrated eleven years ago to the United States and who has terminal lung cancer wrote to you for help. Saying he could no longer speak, lacked health insurance, and "very soon I have to die," Reverend Edmund Orosz asked for money to enable him to survive the few months he had left. He is a U.S. citizen, living in Hollywood, Florida.

Although we couldn't give Reverend Orosz any money, we worked closely with a local social services agency in Florida. An agency caseworker went to his home to learn more about his situation and subsequently arranged for him to receive Food Stamps and home-delivered meals. The caseworker will seek home health care services and hospice care, if necessary, upon completion of his chemotherapy.

We telephoned Reverend Orosz to thank him for writing you. In broken, heavily accented English he expressed his gratitude to you saying, "I believe that Mrs. Clinton help."

Reverend Orosz's letter and the agency's memo to this office are attached.

2. [REDACTED] (b)(6) of Alabama: Still haunted by a gang rape that occurred in a small country town eight years ago, a 26-year-old black woman from Birmingham, Alabama, poured out her story to you and asked how she could obtain counseling and justice. According to the writer, [REDACTED] (b)(6) the attack occurred in 1986 when she was two months pregnant and still in high school. She said that she reported the rape to the sheriff's office, but was not allowed to press charges and her four attackers were never tried or punished. She wrote of the memories that haunted her and suicidal thoughts, and continued:

[0012]

Unaware of my rights, I joined the U.S. Navy and served four years during peacetime and the Gulf War. It was through serving my country and seeing the world that I knew I had rights and those rights was violated [sic].

As you are aware, allegations of rape do not fall under federal jurisdiction. However, the Department of Justice's Office for Victims of Crime is charged with providing information and assistance to victims of sexual assault. In its response, the head of that office provided sympathy and local legal and counseling contacts. The response urged her to follow up with these organizations and wished her, "strength and courage as you move forward with your life."

[REDACTED] (b)(6) letter, along with the response she received from the Office for Victims of Crime, are attached.

3. Theresa Pinto of New Jersey: Abandoned by her father and raised by a single mother, 17-year-old Laura Ann Rice of Wildwood, New Jersey is an honor student at her high school. Her 80-year-old grandmother, Theresa Pinto, wrote to you with pride about Laura Ann's academic achievements and to ask for your help in locating sources of financial assistance so her granddaughter could attend a local college:

Forgive me if I sound imposing, since you are so smart you can understand why I am asking you to help -- by the way the President is lucky to have you for his wife.

We referred Mrs. Pinto's letter to the Department of Education and the Corporation for National and Community Service, both of which provided extensive information to her. Elated, Mrs. Pinto, sent you a follow-up thank you note to you, saying, "Dear First Lady: I am very grateful!"

Although this case was handled earlier this year, her thank you letter is so full of heartfelt gratitude that I include it, along with her incoming letter and response from the Department of Education.

On March 7, Senior Connection received a referral from your office for Rev. Edmund Orosz, a Broward County resident. Rev. Orosz had written a letter to Mrs. Clinton, concerning his financial situation. On March 8, Senior Connection provided your office with an update on the case.

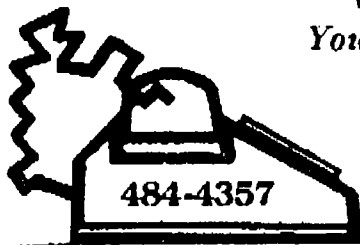
Since our initial update, a case manager from the Broward Homebound Program has made a home visit to Rev. Orosz's residence. The Broward Homebound Program administers the Community Care for Disabled Adults Program in Broward County, and had arranged for emergency home delivered meals to be provided the client. During the home visit, Rev. Orosz declined the homemaker and personal care services offered by the case manager.

Arnold Deward, a Senior Connection Information and Referral Specialist, contacted the client's physician to pursue a possible referral for Hospice. The physician explained that Rev. Orosz is undergoing aggressive treatment for cancer, and therefore, is ineligible for hospice care. While Rev. Orosz has refused in-home assistance, he may later decide to accept home health care services through his Medicaid coverage.

Rev. Orosz expressed concern about his food stamps, which had not been received for the month of February and March. Mr. Deward made numerous contacts with the Florida Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services/Economic Services Program Office, to follow the client's food stamp distribution process. Rev. Orosz now has received food stamps for both months, and we do not anticipate a recurrence of this problem.

This morning, Rev. Orosz telephoned Mr. Deward to express his appreciation. Rev. Orosz was encouraged to call Senior Connection, should he require our assistance in the future.

As Broward County's Elder Helpline, Senior Connection welcomes information on area seniors, who may benefit from our information and referral services. Please feel free to call our office, anytime.

Senior Connection, Broward County's Elder Helpline, is in receipt of a fax transmittal from your office, regarding the above senior. In his letter to Mrs. Clinton, Rev. Orosz expressed concern about his financial circumstances.

Upon receipt of this referral, Arnold Deward, an Information and Referral Specialist, called Rev. Orosz to discuss his situation. Rev. Orosz stated that he has not received his food stamp allotment for the past two months. In addition, he lives alone and must rely on friends and neighbors for food and other assistance in his home.

This morning, Rev. Orosz has been referred to Community Care for Disabled Adults, a program that may be able to provide home delivered meals and homemaker services to the client. A case manager will visit the client, within a few days.

Mr. Deward secured contact information for Rev. Orosz's physicians. Today, he will contact these professionals, to determine whether a referral for Hospice or other home health services would be appropriate.

In addition, Mr. Deward has called the Economic Services Program Office, to discuss the client's food stamp problem. Personnel from that office have agreed to investigate, and to update Mr. Deward as soon as possible.

Senior Connection, funded under the Older Americans Act, is not permitted to open a formal case record on Rev. Orosz, for his age is 57. However, our project often provides assistance for those under the age of sixty, by linking them to available community resources. We will continue to conduct follow up activities on the referrals we have made for Rev. Orosz. Senior Connection will update your office, as progress occurs.

I have to pay for rent 375 dollar, I unable to live from 91 dollars a month. I know I have no long time to live, but I want to live in normal condition. I did chemo-therapy and radiation, doesn't help me. I lost my voice, I can't talk, and I can't resolve any problems what I have.

I that time when was the election I was so happy for you, because you are a very good president. I organised over that 2000 hungarian people for your success. I can't enjoy for long time your presidency because very soon I have to die.

— This is a lost hope, what I thing help me. I want to refuse my Social Security and the SS1 and I want to go next to my mother and my father to die.

— What I want and I hope from you to have 10,000 - 15,000 dollars to be able to live that sort time what I have.

Please do something, becous I feel I have no long life. Only you can help me, and I belive in your help. I love you.

Dear (b)(6):

Thank you for your letter to Mrs. Hillary Clinton describing the trauma you have suffered. Your letter has been referred to the Office for Victims of Crime. Our Office is the Federal focal point for matters regarding the Nation's victims of violent crimes including sexual assault. The enclosed brochure explains our role and responsibilities.

First, I want to assure you that the First Lady and I are very concerned about the suffering and distress that you have experienced. Compounding your suffering is the belief that the perpetrators of this terrible crime have not atoned for their violent acts. Please know that the feelings you have are very understandable and are not uncommon for victims of rape. Sexual assault victims often have deep emotional wounds, which may take years to heal. Many times counseling and professional support efforts can appreciably help to relieve the pain, horror, and trauma associated with the victimization.

Unfortunately, the crime you described falls under State and local jurisdiction and so, the Federal Government cannot intervene. However, we have contacted an organization near you that can offer direct support and assistance to you. The name of that organization is the Crisis Center Inc., and they are located at 3600 8th Avenue South, Suite 501, in Birmingham, Alabama 35222. Their telephone number is (205) 323-7782. I urge you to call this organization and seek assistance and support for learning to cope with this terrible event.

Since you expressed concern about the investigation of the crime, you may wish to speak with an attorney concerning the events surrounding your victimization. If you cannot afford the services of an attorney, you may want to consult your community legal aid office. The name and address of the nearest legal aid office is Legal Services of Metro Birmingham Inc., 1820 Seventh Avenue North, Post Office Box 11765, Birmingham, Alabama 35202-1765. Their telephone number is (205) 328-3540.

Although we cannot be of direct assistance to you, I do hope the above information is helpful. On behalf of Mrs. Clinton, we wish you strength and courage as you move forward with your life.

Please Help me I am going to loose my sanity. I am a 26 year old black woman just out of the U.S. Navy. Since I was 18 years old I have been trying to deal with a rape. I was rape September of 1986. by 4 guys. Its getting harder and harder to deal with everyday. I am try not to lose my sanity. There were no bruises to my knowledge. I was just held down and repeatedly rape for hours by four guys. I am from a small town where its still the good ole boy system Andalusia, AL (Covington County) I tried to press charges, local police at the Sheriff office wouldnt let me. My mother was uneducated she has a 11th grade education. There was no one to speak up for me. Im still dealing with the demons of hurt. There was no counseling given to me. In all actuality there were no acknowledgement of a crime being committed. I dont even know what my rights are /or were. Till this day I cant understand why anyone in their right mind would think an 18 year old young lady still in high school would voluntarily have sex with four guys? What is the reasoning of the police, and as a victim then and now. What are my rights? I was never allowed to press any charges. All I was told by the Sheriff office was that the guys that raped me told the police

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that I asked them for money.⁽¹⁾ There was never an investigation to my knowledge.

⁽²⁾ The Sheriff name was Don Harold (maybe different spelling).⁽³⁾ There was also a rape kit done at Andalusia Hospital. I was never given the results of it, I need and want professional help and I want the City of Andalusia to acknowledge me and that a crime has taken place. I want justice

I have been asked to respond to your letter to Mrs. Clinton about help with paying for your granddaughter's college education. Your letter was referred to the U.S. Department of Education, which has the primary responsibility for administering and interpreting federal laws that apply to education.

The U.S. Department of Education administers programs that, in general, provide financial aid to students based on financial need, rather than on scholastic ability. However, some postsecondary institutions, state and local governments, and private organizations do award scholarships based on academic ability. For advice on scholarships available at a particular institution, Laura should contact the financial aid administrator at the school(s) she is considering.

Several major financial aid programs at the U.S. Department of Education help students meet the costs of postsecondary education. In general, a student must show financial need, be enrolled as a regular student in an eligible program at an eligible school, be a U.S. citizen or eligible noncitizen, and be making satisfactory academic progress. A student must be registered with the Selective Service if required to register.

Federal Pell Grants and Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants, unlike loans, do not have to be repaid. The Federal Work-Study Program provides funding for part-time jobs so that students can earn part of their education expenses. Federal Perkins Loans and Federal Stafford Loans enable students to borrow money to help meet their education costs. Federal PLUS loans are available to parents of dependent students. Funds received from any of these federal programs must be used solely for education expenses.

Generally, the first step in applying for aid from any of these programs in the 1994-95 academic year is to complete the "Free Application for Federal Student Aid" (FAFSA). The FAFSA is available at all postsecondary schools that participate in the federal student aid programs and is also available at many high schools and libraries. The FAFSA must be signed on or after January 1, 1994. Approximately four weeks after a student files the FAFSA, he or she will receive a Student Aid Report (SAR). This report will tell the student whether he or she is eligible for a Federal Pell Grant. The financial aid administrator at the school the student plans to attend may also use the SAR to determine whether the student is eligible for aid from the other grant, loan, and work-study programs listed previously (except for Federal PLUS, which is for parent borrowers of dependent students).

The enclosed booklet, "The Student Guide, 1993-94," describes the U.S. Department of Education's major student aid programs. Revisions are issued at the beginning of each calendar year. To receive the 1994-95 version, Laura should write in January 1994 to--

If Laura has further questions about aid, application procedures, eligibility formulas, or other student aid topics, she may contact our Federal Student Aid Information Center at 1-800-4-FED-AID (1-800/433-3243). One of our counselors will be glad to assist her.

Laura also may wish to contact the New Jersey state agency for postsecondary education because she may be eligible for aid from state postsecondary student aid programs; in addition, she may be eligible for aid from the State Student Incentive Grant Program, which is jointly sponsored by the federal and state governments. This program provides grants and work-study aid to students who need money to pay for postsecondary education. The address and telephone number of the New Jersey state agency are--
