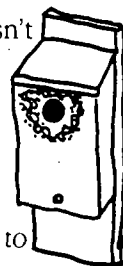
BLUEBIRD HOUSES

Two years ago we introduced our birdfeeder filled with cookies. This was featured on CNBC TV "Steals & Deals" program. It was such a success we are now offering another MNC exclusive! It is our cedar bluebird house, exclusively designed and handcrafted by Fred Tietse. The pride and care in his work is reflected in these quality nesting boxes. Julie Edgar, our artist extraordinaire has delicately painted a subdued floral design on the front around the entrance hole. This adds a charming touch but doesn't detract from the natural appearance. (The floor is removable and that's how we get our cookies in!) Instructions on placement are also included.

The bluebird population spiraled down as much as 90% only a decade ago due to the lack of nesting sites. The good news is that bluebirds adapt readily to nesting boxes that are made with the correct dimensions and are placed 4 to 7 feet off the ground. Open lawns, meadows, and lightly wooded areas are preferred.

These are excellent gifts for the holidays and can be put up right after Christmas as many bluebirds begin nesting as early as February. If these are sent as Christmas gifts we will decorate them with holiday bows.

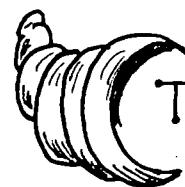

RE: Proposal to Fight AIDS

Dear Ms. Clinton:

During your husband's campaign, you told large, enthusiastic crowds that something was happening out there. You were right. I am one of the many people trying to make something happen concerning AIDS. As such, I am seeking your help.

I have developed a concept which I believe will assist in the fight against the spread of AIDS. With your help, and the help of everyone, through Jesus, my concept will come to be. This concept will simultaneously fight AIDS and give back much needed funds to the people. I have done much research on my proposal and believe that it will help. The U.S.A. is in the best position to say "yes" to my proposal. As such, I would expect assistance from the federal government and the American Medical Association. However, should I fail to hear from you, I will forward my proposal to other countries, including Korea, Japan, China and Argentina. However, you are the first person to whom I am sending this letter.

Before I disclose my proposal, I want to briefly set forth some of its benefits. As you will note in my paper, these benefits are great. The Korean economy has an estimated growth of 6% (one of the few industrialized rebounding, as sales pick up. Interest rates decline and inflation has been cut almost in half. Its deficit has decreased from 8 billion to 5 billion in a year. Wage demands are moderate, productivity gains pace wage growth and there is an anticipated stock market recovery of nearly 45%. This is the type of country that could take advantage of my proposal.

In Japan, Ryuzaburo Kaku, Canon Chairman, wants genuine globalization under the principal of harmony and prosperity with the entire world, not just Japan. Japan's present policies are based on an agenda from the mid-19th Century, when it began to catch up with and overtake more advanced Western Nations (something it can do with my proposal). Now they want to live and work together for the common good. The first step in creating an ethical Nation is to implement fundamental changes in its administrative, political and economic structures. (The tragedy of today is that they have no party candidate.) (Excerpt from Forbes article, by Ko Shiayo).

Ms. Clinton, it was also written in Forbes that "President Clinton's passionate belief in activist government has landed him a job in the White House". The Dunfey family established New England Circle, inspired by a wonderful legacy. During the 19th century Emerson, Hawthorne, Holmes, Longfellow and other great thinkers gathered at the historic Parker House Hotel in Boston for discussion. Their last discussion leader had been Booker T. Washington in 1902. The Dunfey family revived this tradition in 1974 but broadened greatly its diversity of participation.

Circles are timely and highly participatory discussions of important issues facing our communities, our cities, our nation and our world. Leaders from business, labor, civic and community organizations, academia, the clergy, the media and the arts are given a unique opportunity to tackle together the problems and promises of the day. What makes the Circle special is the environment of rich diversity where people of different races, nationalities, political beliefs, ages and economic sectors gather and interact.

A GREAT LEADER REMEMBERED

Nadine B. Hack, New York City Commissioner for the United Nations

Oliver Reginald Tambo, (often referred warmly to as O.R.) died of a stroke on April 23, 1993, in Johannesburg South Africa at the age of 75. For more than 25 years Tambo presided over the African National Congress while the organization was banned and many of its leaders jailed or exiled. A lifelong activist, he formed the A.N.C. Youth League with Nelson Mandela 50 years ago, and remained a driving force of the A.N.C. until his death.

President Clinton sent an 18 member official Presidential delegation to South Africa for Tambo's funeral on May 2nd. Included in the delegation were Circle members, Congresswoman Maxine Waters, Nadine Hack and Randall Robinson. Mr. Mandela gave the eulogy, reminding those who loved and admired Tambo, "O.R. cannot be consigned to the past." While he died before he could see the realization of the new South Africa, for which he fought all his life, we have his words to live up to. Tambo said he looked to the future with, "hope and encouragement because South Africa will have demonstrated that it is possible for people of different colors, races, and nationalities to live together in peace and friendship." Oliver Tambo was a Circle Discussion leader in 1985. He will be missed and remembered with reverence by the Dunfey family, Circle Members, and freedom fighters worldwide.

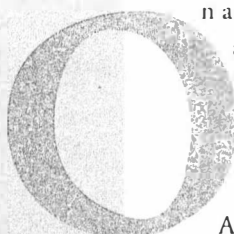
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TOBACCO INDUSTRY UNDER FIRE

In a balmy September evening Professor Laurence Tribe of the Harvard Law School and Marjorie Clapprood of WHDH led a spirited conversation about the tobacco industry & individual and social rights - in a decidedly smoke-free room at the Parker House. Professor Tribe had recently won a Supreme Court case in which three cigarette manufacturers were held liable for the death of a woman whose lung cancer was due, at least in part, to a lifetime of smoking.

Among the many questions raised, several were most pointed; how can U.S. politics overcome its addiction to tobacco money? Is meaningful regulation of deadly tobacco products possible in the present system? Should advertising companies and others who assist in the promotion of tobacco products be held liable too?



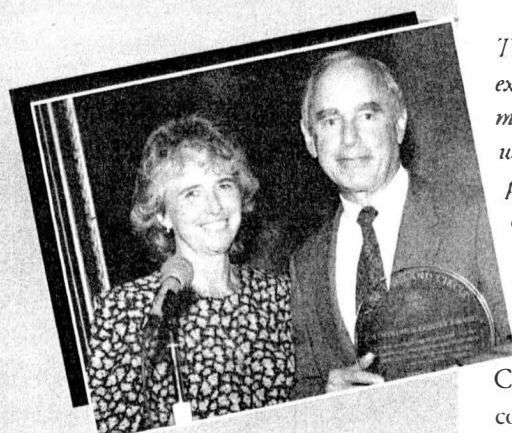

One of the ironies apparent in the conversation was the impending opposition of two "liberal" impulses. The move toward decriminalization of controlled substances generally seems to conflict with the move toward a far more stringent regulation of tobacco. It was clear to all who participated in this lively discussion that few issues engage the great question of individual rights versus common good more forcefully than those surrounding the need many have - and many have had - to puff the weed.

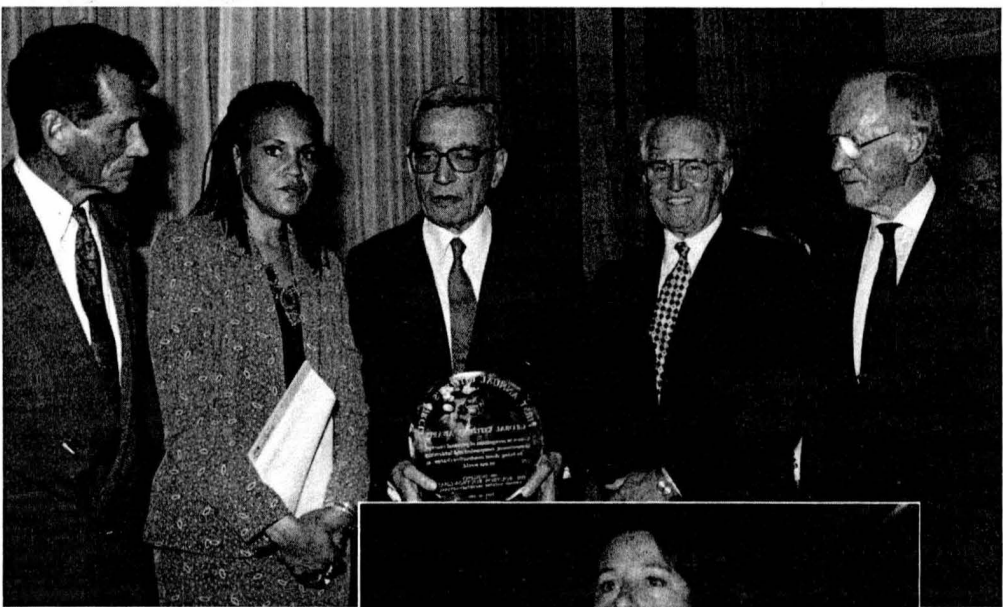
THE FIRST ANNUAL GLOBAL CITIZEN'S AWARD was presented to United Nations Secretary-General Dr. Boutros Boutros-Ghali on May 26th at the United Nations Plaza Annual Citizens Circle. The award was presented by Jack Dunfey, Vice Chairman of New England Council for the United Nations. Ms. Hack, Secretary-General's career saying he "has epitomized global citizenship throughout his lifetime." While presenting the award, Jack Dunfey evoked the memory of Bill Dunfey, former Public delegate to the United Nations during the 1960s. It was Bill's belief in the promise of the United Nations charter that inspired the Dunfey family to establish an annual Citizens Circle and the Dunfey Foundation. In the wake of the cold war, escalating regional conflicts and over the years relief efforts, the Secretary-General was praised for his leadership in assuming the global governance role the United Nations has been playing for the past three years.

After accepting the award, the Secretary-General presided over a discussion of the more than 100 guests in a highly interactive session moderated by MacNeil Lehrer correspondent Charlayne Hunter-Gault. Her discussion was particularly relaxed, candid and articulate. Former Council on Foreign Relations President Jennifer Casolo challenged the assemblage about the peace process. Jennifer Casolo implored all guests to not forget the violent tragedies of the recent coup in Guatemala and Bella Abzug asked how the United Nations could play the rising role of non-governmental grassroots organizations in strengthening democracy. Each question, answer and ensuing dialogue was a lesson in emergency response. Guests left the discussion staggered by the management of the United Nations vote entails. Most left buoyed by the strength of the original United Nations Charter, and a bit overwhelmed by its challenges to development and democracy in the world--in our lifetime.

Discussion overflowed into dinner and the evening ended with dinner questions from guests facilitated by Ms. Hunter-Gault. Ted Kennedy summarized the insights of the evening by discussing the Secretary-General's constituencies, the lack of funding for the United Nations and reminded the audience that it is the responsibility of citizenry to mobilize the political will and promised resources necessary to achieve the Charter's noble purpose. Following the Circle, Sorenson said, "The event sponsored by the Dunfey family and featuring United Nations Secretary-General Boutros-Ghali, was thought-provoking and informative for all who attended. The Secretary-General's talk, and the question and answer period and discussion that followed, provided the kind of thoughtful stimulation on international issues that is rare in the hectic lives of most." Citizen's Award

CITIZEN TRANSITION CIRCLE/BLEUPRINT FOR DEMOCRACY

On October 20, 1992, just two weeks before the Presidential election, 90 Circle members came together to ask, as Robert Kennedy did; "Why not?"

The evening's discussion was led by the executive committee of the Citizens Transition Project (CTP), a gathering of advocates, scholars and administrators from around the country who together authored Washington Post's Best Seller, *Changing America: Blueprints for a New Democracy*. Chair Mark Green, Executive Committee Members, Harvey Gantt and Governor Madeleine Kunin explained the group's project: crafting a blueprint to be used by the President-Elect in the transitional period between the election and inauguration.

One year earlier, when the CTP first summoned 78 national leaders to create a progressive vision for a new administration, the chances of its ever being implemented seemed remote, Green noted.

Transition was very much the mood and Participatory Democracy was very much the spirit as New Englanders challenged the Circle guests.

Much of the discussion focused on areas where there are compelling needs for radical change: health care, campaign financing, education, the national and global economies. And the deeper into the issues the group pressed, the larger the problems seemed to loom: impending commercial bank failures, racial disharmony, disenfranchised youth, and the plight of American cities.

Gantt, former mayor of Charlotte, N.C., who gained national attention in his remarkably close race against Senator Jesse Helms in 1990, said his own campaigning convinces him people are ready for changes that run deep and bring real renewal. "Whoever goes in has to understand the need for some major structural reforms," he said. "We may have the opportunity now to achieve such change, much as the Heritage Foundation did during the Reagan years."

Kunin, now Deputy Secretary of Education, said "this time of great ferment can also be a kind of 'dreaming time'." "You can begin to imagine what a government might look like that reflects your values, your sense of right and wrong," she said.

RESTRUCTURING EDUCATION CIRCLE

On December 7, 1992, James O. Freedman, President of Dartmouth College, Eugene M. Lang, founder of the "I Have a Dream" Foundation, and

Juanita Wade, President of Freedom House, drew a very large and interested audience, whose questions revealed deep concerns about the quality of our education today. It was uniformly agreed that public schools were not meeting the needs of the nineties. Many thundering problems were raised such as the increasing disinterest of students and the resulting high rate of drop outs, loss of serious attention to education by government, and rising costs and how we should pay them. The speakers said that business must be involved with combating these problems, because jobs are demanding an increasingly educated work force. But how we get American youth to aspire to high achievements and how we get teachers prepared to teach at these levels remained unanswered.

It was brought out that schools generally reflect their neighborhood and that John Silber's Chelsea program is the neighborhood to watch as an intermediate experiment while the politics of school choice get battled out by state legislators nationwide.

In the meantime "dreamers" continue to multiply under Eugene Lang's leadership and citizens aren't waiting for legislative reforms. They are "adopting" schools, kids and battling apathy classroom by classroom nationwide.

On May 12th, 1993, over 100 people gathered to hear two educators – one African-American theologian/activist scholar from Princeton and one Jewish middle school teacher turned activist from Brookline, talk about race and why it matters. Margot Strom, Executive Director of Facing History and Ourselves moderated an exquisite evening discussion with Professor Cornel West, noted activist and author of New York Times Best Seller, *Race Matters*.

The mood was somber, residue from a week of racially driven incidents at South Boston High. Both speakers called for prayer and reflections on the lessons of hatred, history and what they can teach us about ourselves. Both talked about the power of education and Professor West in particular called for an education that has a relationship with the larger community, where students and teachers learn from prisoners and children alike about matters of the heart. Linda Anfuso, a Native American artist was inspired to read a poem she had written about race and outlined ways in which "the Native community is about 30 years behind in our struggle for civil rights."

Dr. Alvin Pouissant shared some of his latest research on how the media influences the self-image of African American children. New England Circle board member Bill Batson, described his experience that same day, in jail with high school students in Boston who protested the closing of South Boston High due to racial provocation and reminded us of how spiritually starved young people are today – in search of truth, teachers that spark their moral imagination and leaders that rebuild communities. It was an evening of sharing and stirring pauses, more than a call for policy reforms. And I know I left my first New England Circle feeling like I had discovered a new family and the promise of community.

RUSSIA TODAY AND IN THE FUTURE

Who is Boris Yeltsin and how do the Russians perceive him?" asks former correspondent for the MOSCOW NEWS, Yelena Khanga and moderator of the New England Circle's evening with Olin Robison. Robison, now President of the Salzburg Seminar has been an advisor to Democratic and Republican administrations on what we then called "Soviet Relations."

"When a country disintegrates, there is an immediate need to establish authority and a sense of ownership," responded Robison. While no consensus emerged whether Boris Yeltsin could assume the mantle of leadership - i.e. "ownership" of authority with the confidence of the Russian peoples and the world, Robison reminded us that the test for Yeltsin and Russia is to "make up new guidelines" in the midst of scarcity and uncertainty. According to Robison, and Ms. Khanga, under Communism there was no real means of establishing ownership, worth or wealth; thus there was no accountability or responsibility -- no checks and balances of its citizenry and public servants and no leverage from marketplace or the non-profit sector to innovate and reform. Discussion on the challenges of building a civil society and the implications of that mandate on U.S. foreign policy and our defense allocations proved to be provocative stimulation that stirred everyone's appetite and imagination.

Dear Maggie,

I've been watching the health plan hearings on C-SPAN this week. Ms. Clinton has appeared sharp and articulate throughout. I'm the husband of a cancer survivor and the father of a son with congenital eye problems. I also run my own business. Finding a health plan has been a real hassle. I felt Ms. Clinton gave families like mine quite a boost. I know you and your staff worked hard preparing for this week. Congratulations to all of you.

I have an idea for generating funds for the health plan. There have been recent studies released showing that violence on TV and in movies and videos has a serious impact on the behavior of children who watch these shows. The 'violence content' of our entertainment industry appears to have a direct bearing on the level of violence in the society.

With the President already planning to use 'sin taxes' to fund part of the health program, why not extend the concept of sin to include murder, rape, etc. and slap a tax on violent forms of entertainment? After all, 'Thou Shalt Not Kill' is one of the Ten Commandments; the Bible doesn't forbid us from drinking or smoking.

I view purveyors of violent entertainment like environmental polluters who for years washed their hands of the consequences of their manufacturing and production processes -- even though these consequences bore real, measurable costs to society. Editors and producers issue violent shows, videos, books -- even the evening news -- to make money. If research clearly demonstrates the work they produce in turn stimulates violent behavior that raises the cost of America's health care then the entertainment industry should pay their fair share of health care's rising costs.

A 'Violence Content Tax' would of course stir debate about the definition of violence, about causes vs. effects, about government overstepping its bounds, etc. Fine, I say. Let's have a debate about this. The debate itself would be healthy for the country. I think parents around the country would back you overwhelmingly.

The entertainment industry already acknowledges the effects of violence by the use of a system that rates films and videos in part on the level of violence they contain. The government's evaluation of violence in entertainment could build from there.

Rather than having the government appear to be judging the violence content of each and every form of entertainment issued in the U.S., perhaps a 'Violence Content License' could be issued to networks, publishing houses or movie conglomerates that levied a flat annual fee in return for the right to air entertainment with violent content. This might protect the government from charges of censorship.

A 'Violence Content Tax' or a 'Violence Content License' could be quite a revenue generator and, with higher prices for violent entertainment, simultaneously make violence less attractive a form of entertainment. Perhaps some of the revenue generated could also be spent on promoting non-violent conflict resolution in schools and communities.

Keep up the good work on the health care issue. If I can be of further assistance, let me know.

This initiative is being addressed to you and numerous others perceived as having "Power: The ability to get things done." Do you share the growing sense of alarm that the media has become:

An industry not content to **REPORT** but driven to **CONCOCT**

An industry that long ago opted for profits over integrity

An industry that blatantly creates 'tempests du jour' to generate revenues

An industry populated by egocentric elitists with their own self serving agendas

An industry that *tramples individual rights in the name of 'freedom of the press'?*

Are you concerned that in a nation whose Constitution protects us against abuses by our Legislative, Executive, or Judicial governing bodies we are without effective protection against the 'guilty until proven innocent' impact of **MEDIA DISTORTION**? Isn't it troubling that now when technology offers unequalled ease in meeting the critical need for an informed public both **MEDIA OWNERSHIP** - with a primary agenda of profit generation - and **MEDIA MEMBERS** - driven by ego needs and compensation concerns - are callously diminishing our culture with their deceptions and distortions?

Those who seek out and disseminate information have opted to filter that information through their own prejudices, with a swaggering disregard for objectivity! **TRANSFORMING** instead of **TRANSPORTING** information has become the principal focus of media activity. The subsequent misinformation and disinformation *distorts our perceptions and warps our decisions*, both as individuals and as a nation.

Isn't it ironic that abuses by vested interests were formerly brought into the public consciousness by the media? Can we realistically expect them to indict themselves? Let us harness the electronic samizdat of phone, FAX, and copier to start the process of shielding our culture from continued media distortions. That can be achieved through the prompt enactment of a **MEDIA DISTORTION CORRECTION INITIATIVE**!

Modeled on such precedents as Truth in Advertising, Truth in Lending, Environmental Impact Statements, Surgeon General Disclosure Warnings, Legislator Financial Disclosures, and "sunshine" legislation, here are the six basic components of this Initiative:

- I. **DISTORTION ACKNOWLEDGEMENT DISCLOSURE**
- II. **FOUR HOUR ANALYSIS MORATORIUM**
- III. **INVASION OF PRIVACY REVENUE SHARING**
- IV. **'STALKING FOR PROFIT' REGISTRATION**
- V. **MEDIA MANIPULATION IMPACT STATEMENT**
- VI. **DISCLOSURE OF INDIVIDUAL BIASES**

I. DISTORTION ACKNOWLEDGEMENT DISCLOSURE

Compliance with this disclosure requirement would be by means of a 'crawler' across the television screen every two minutes for television, and by a suitably emphasized 'box' on every second print page.

" The information being disseminated here is not necessarily the truth. It is presented and prepared by individuals whose ego and financial interests tempt them to routinely induce false anxiety, and to distort, sensationalize, and/or exaggerate the relative impact of the events described. "

II. FOUR HOUR ANALYSIS MORATORIUM

The prevailing media conviction that their task " is to **interpret and not just to report** " events to the public is nowhere more evident than in their starting analysis **SECONDS** after an address is completed.

Their subjective analysis not infrequently distorts the intended message, creates artificial controversy, supports their own elitist agenda, and serves to infer on themselves a spurious intellectual prowess. (In all probability the 'analyst' is a graduate of the Ken & Barby 'J' School and possesses a waistline or bustline greater than their IQ.) *A four hour moratorium on commentary or analysis should be mandated. (OVER)*

III. INVASION OF PRIVACY REVENUE SHARING

Individuals at the scene of an event arbitrarily dubbed 'newsworthy' by the only entity profiting from that decree - the media itself! - receive no compensation for use of their image or voice. In this manner the media routinely *causes itself to profit WITHOUT COMPENSATION to those discomfited by unwarranted public scrutiny!* Why shouldn't all those **involuntarily co-opted** by the media share in the revenues generated? Royalty tracking firms already exist that have the capability of allocating these **involuntary appearance** funds.

Preset payment rates reflecting market size, national minimums, and degree of stress would be set by arbitrators. These **"ghoul rates"** would be tied to those factors that affect media circulation, such as emotional duress. Media favorites such as inconsolably sobbing parents of dead infants, for example, would be rated at the top end of the scale. Victims broadcast **live** in the act of being maimed, raped, assaulted, killed or otherwise brutalized would be eligible for bonuses based on ratings.

IV. 'STALKING FOR PROFIT' REGISTRATION

Real and purported media members now have unlimited access to harass and intimidate those they have arbitrarily endowed with the 'newsworthy' label. To restore privacy rights to media prey, all stalkers should be required to register, and simultaneously post bonds assuring that revenues gained from their efforts will indeed be shared with their victims. If the horde of predators plaguing a given target is menacing enough to require protection for that target, registration fees would be used to subsidize bodyguards. **As with animal hunting licenses some restrictions on total number of permits, frequency and duration of stalking, and how close victims can be approached would be established.** Our law enforcement officers are subject to reasonable restraints - why are the media free to engage in unrestrained feeding frenzies?

V. MEDIA MANIPULATION IMPACT STATEMENT

- Forty three media members record twelve Gulf War protestors before a 'crowd' of ten
- GM truck fuel ignited by media to 'enhance' newscast 'drama'
- More media members registered than delegates, 1992 Republican Convention

Media over-emphasis and "creativity" generated by pressures of too many people and too little news can be reduced by requiring media disclosures attesting to the proportion of media to participants; number of non-participant observers present; who alerted the media about the 'event,' etc. Whenever "informed" or "highly placed" sources are cited this disclosure would be mandatory:

" The Media Distortion Correction Initiative requires us to notify you that the sources cited may or may not actually exist, and that all such information is purely speculative and intended solely to inflate ratings and advertising revenue, without regard for truth."

VI. DISCLOSURE OF INDIVIDUAL BIASES

All individuals having input or influence on materials disseminated to the public would be required to periodically attest to the viewpoints through which they filter their observations! These include:

Residence address and telephone number disclosure would also be required, to assure equal access for those exposed to media scrutiny. Periodic broadcast or publication of this information would be mandated.

IF YOU CONCUR that these provisions of the **MEDIA DISTORTION CORRECTION INITIATIVE** have merit then contribute to the redressing of media abuses by making at least one phone call - sending at least one FAX - passing on at least one copy - to get this initiative enacted by Congress!!! Signal your support! You are undoubtedly often asked to use your influence on behalf of others - why not use it directly or indirectly **on your own behalf** to help curb media excesses?

OK, giving Hillary Rodham Clinton an official position in the administration was probably a bad idea. I hope everybody's happy.

The first lady has gotten stuck in one of those peculiar Washington tar pits that start out being about almost nothing, escalate into a matter of "character" or "the appearance of impropriety" and wind up in a debate about whether or not to hold a congressional investigation.

"Her moral compass is as strong as anybody's in this country," President Clinton said Monday, looking a little moist.

He was at a news conference with Eduard Shevardnadze, the head of the former Soviet republic of Georgia. His country is bankrupt, his people are starving and Mr. Shevardnadze has said that he expects to be assassinated.

None of the American reporters, naturally, wanted to hear about any of this. They wanted to know how Mr. Clinton felt about his wife being caught in the tar pit.

Mr. Clinton came racing to his wife's defense, full throttle. "I do not believe for a moment that she has done anything wrong. I have — I — I just — if the rest of the people in the country — if everybody in this country had a character as strong as hers, we wouldn't have half the problems we've got today." That was the moist part. Everybody is going to see this little piece of tape over and over on television, until the millenni-

um. Nobody is ever going to remember what it was Mr. Clinton didn't believe his wife did wrong.

The bottom line is that White-water is a really boring scandal. It was boring when it was about 10-year-old real estate deals in Arkansas. Now it is about an improper briefing by Treasury officials, and it is boring still. The only thing that keeps it in the news is Mrs. Clinton's involvement.

The sharks are circling in Washington. Newt Gingrich, the ranking Republican shark, announced that it would be disrespectful to treat her as a normal first lady and not in the position she truly holds, which is raw meat.

Everybody in Washington is going crazy. The White House aides walk around as if they were

undergoing Vulcan mind-melds.

Hillary Rodham Clinton is in the middle of it. If she were anybody else, the president would be making contingency plans to dump her if things got worse.

Mr. Clinton has a strong sense of self-preservation that allows him to turn his back on old friends and loyal allies when they get in the way of the agenda. Lani Guinier, whose wedding the president attended, says she has not heard from the Clintons since her nomination as assistant attorney general was deep-sixed.

"I'll make it up to you," Ms. Guinier remembers Mr. Clinton saying in their final phone call. Since then, the only communication has been "two identical machine-signed White House Christmas cards."

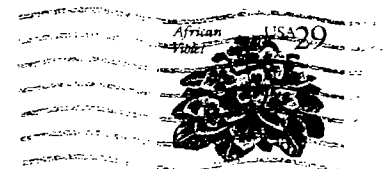

Unless, of course, *she* screwed up and had to be swept away with a phone call and double dippings on the Christmas card list.

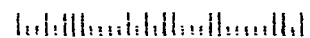

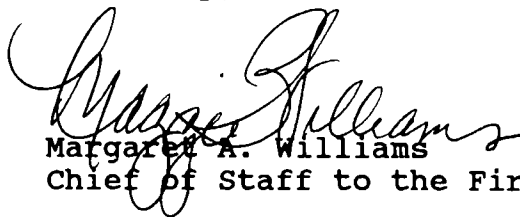
