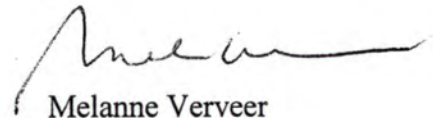

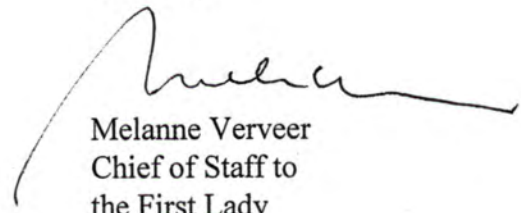

On behalf of the International Council of Sport Science and Physical Education, I have the pleasure of inviting you to participate in the closing panel discussion of the **World Summit on Physical Education** (Berlin, November 3-5, 1999).

ICSSPE convenes this first ever **World Summit on Physical Education** to bring together both government representatives and leading international experts as well as non-governmental organisations to state the facts on the positive benefits of physical education and to raise the level of awareness about the increasingly critical situation of school physical education in many countries of the world. To this end, we will collect scientific evidence and empirical data on several relevant aspects, and compile this evidence in a final action plan and strategy document. Additionally, a number of workshops will take place where relevant topics will be discussed. You will find more detailed information about this event enclosed herewith.

The **World Summit on Physical Education** has received official patronage from the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO), the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and the Standing Conference of the Ministers of Education and Cultural Affairs of the Länder in the Federal Republic of Germany. Furthermore, the **World Summit on Physical Education** is supported by several national and international organisations, including the Senate of Berlin, the Federal Ministry for Education and Research and the German Sports Confederation. The final document of this Summit, i.e. the keynote addresses and the workshop results, will serve as an official working document for the 3rd International Conference of Ministers and Senior Officials Responsible for Sport and Physical Activities (MINEPS III) organised by UNESCO in Punta del Este, Uruguay, on December 1-4, 1999. We are happy that Mrs. Christine Spain of the President's Council for Physical Fitness and Sports will take part as a workshop facilitator for the session on "Physical Education, Schools and Community".

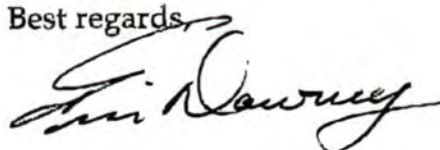
Thank you for sharing with us the book request from Libet Maloney, a World Health Organization Volunteer serving in the Caprivi Strip Region of Namibia.

As Tania Vitvitsky and I explained, we are coordinating a large Sabre Foundation book donation to a Peace Corps project in the Ovamboland Region of Northern Namibia. With gracious assistance from the US Embassy in Windhoek, and with Peace Corps funding, we will be able to ship a 20-foot container of books to Walvis Bay and then approximately seven hours north to near the site of the Oupumako Library in Ovamboland. A portion of this book shipment will be reserved for Libet Maloney and her community in the Caprivi Strip.

We have been presented a challenge by recent developments in the Caprivi Strip. Armed rebel factions who claim the Caprivi, forced the Peace Corps to evacuate all 15 of our volunteers serving in this area. In our opinion, it is not safe to enter the area. Ms. Maloney, who works for the World Health Organization, chose to remain in Caprivi. The Peace Corps staff in Namibia have explained to Ms. Maloney that due to safety risks and budget constraints, we cannot assist with delivering her portion of the Sabre book donation.

Since we are unable to deliver the books to Ms. Maloney, an appropriate portion of the donated books will be held for her to pick-up at a future date when the political situation has changed in the Caprivi Strip. Thank you in advance for sharing this information with Mrs. Clinton. We will let you know when the donated books are delivered to Namibia.

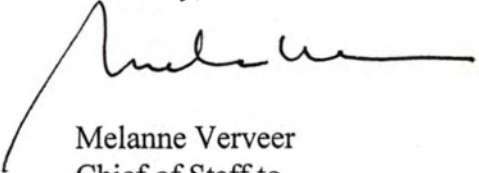

For the last couple of years, we have invited the First Lady to be our honored guest and speaker at our "Numbers Too Big To Ignore" luncheon, and would like to do so again. This year it will be on **November 2nd from 11:30 to 1:30 pm** at the Georgia World Congress Center. We also have Christiane Amanpour, international correspondent for CNN, scheduled to appear, and are anticipating an attendance of 1,600. Dr. Maya Angelou, Gloria Steinem and Jane Fonda have been our featured speakers in the past. This luncheon has become the most significant women's event in Atlanta.

I recently met with Lidia Soto-Harmon, deputy director of the President's Interagency Council on Women, to discuss the possibility of this luncheon being the kick-off event of a conference to take place that afternoon on Beijing Plus 5. Dear Mrs. Clinton,

When I met you last year to discuss the dramatic child health benefits of vitamin A in developing countries, I knew you would take on this cause as you have so many others affecting the health and well-being of poor children. Shortly thereafter, I left the Clinton Administration to become head of the Global Health Council, a leading public policy organization devoted to improving women's and children's health around the world. On behalf of our thousands of members, I would like to invite you again to help lead a renewal of America's commitment to healthy children.

In June of 2000 over 1,500 health activists from around the world will convene in Washington for the Global Health Council's 27th Annual Conference, *A Century of Health for the Children of 2000*. We hope you will accept our invitation to be our opening keynote speaker on the morning of June 14. With memorable speeches this year by Jimmy Carter and Gro Brundtland at our most recent conference, the stage is set for you to articulate your vision of America's role in meeting the needs of children here and around the world.

The conference will take place June 14-16, 2000. Attendees include front-line health professionals working around the world, policy-makers, program planners, and advocates for children. Since 2000 is the tenth anniversary of the World Summit for Children, many of the presenters will assess the progress made towards achieving the Summit's goals for child health and survival, and lay out an agenda for the future. We will use this forum to discuss major social and economic changes affecting children in the next century, and the impact of these changes on the health of children, families and their communities, and the importance these issues should have for all Americans.

We would be delighted if you could address our conference attendees from 8:30 to 10:00 am on Wednesday, June 14th, 2000. If this timing is not suitable, we would be happy to work with your staff about convenient times later that day or on June 15th or 16th. Your speech will be linked, via live satellite video, around the world, and we are working with Columbia University's Mailman School of Public Health to coordinate an off-site audience there as well. While 1999's speeches were video-conferenced to six countries and broadcast on C-SPAN, we are planning to expand our coalition and our outreach significantly further this year.

Mrs. Clinton, our membership and conference attendees have consistently applauded your leadership in promoting health and rights of children and women in all countries. 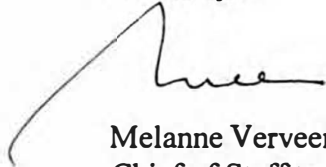

Amnesty International believes that the nature and extent of sexual abuse in US prisons and jails shows an urgent need for compliance with international standards protecting the rights of female prisoners. As a member of Amnesty International, I am particularly concerned at the practice in federal and state prisons in the USA. The use of male guards to supervise female inmates is inconsistent with international standards such as the Standard Minimum Rules for the Treatment of Prisoners and the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women.

Prisoners have just as much right as everyone else to be treated humanely. In the United States, women are often the victims of prison regimes, which show no regard for human dignity or for international human rights standards. If you're a woman prisoner, you may be guarded by male officers who are allowed to touch every part of your body during searches, and to view you while you are undressed. If you break disciplinary rules, you may have to spend 22 or more hours a day in your cell, denied all privacy from the male guards. Across the US, procedures for dealing with sexual assault by prison staff have often proved ineffective. And if you are abused, you may be too afraid to speak out if you've seen how guards treat women who stand up for themselves.

The UN Special Rapporteur on Violence against Women states recommendations regarding conditions for women in prison that are consistent with the recommendations made by Amnesty International. I urge the US government and all relevant federal and state agencies to adopt the recommendations.

Thank you for your efforts and concern on this matter.
