

County-by-County Estimates of the Effects of the Medicare Cuts

This analysis assesses the effects of the Medicare savings in the Congressional majority's Budget Resolution Conference Agreement on counties and their Medicare beneficiaries. In the Conference Agreement, Medicare spending would be reduced by approximately \$270 billion between 1996 and 2002, \$71 billion in 2002 alone.

Number of Beneficiaries '94:

The number of Medicare beneficiaries in each state is from the Health Care Financing Administration data. The number of Medicare beneficiaries in each county is estimated by multiplying the 1994 state number of beneficiaries by the proportion of the state's beneficiaries in each county in 1992 (the actual number of beneficiaries in each county was not available).

Reduction in 2002:

The reduction in Medicare spending per state and county is based on the total reduction of \$71 billion in 2002. It is assumed that the cuts will be distributed across states and counties in proportion to the Medicare spending in states and counties. In other words, the more a county's health care providers receive from Medicare, the more the county will be affected by the cuts.

Reduction between 1996 - 2002:

The reduction in the Medicare spending per state and county for the seven year period is based on the total reduction of \$270 billion. Similarly, it is assumed that the cuts will be distributed across states and counties in proportion to the Medicare spending in states and counties.

Increased Out-of-Pocket Costs, 1996-2002:

The county-level analysis of the increase in average out-of-pocket costs for beneficiaries is related to two previous analysis: the aggregate effect of the Congressional majority's cuts on beneficiaries (\$625 in 2002, \$2,825 over the period), and the state-by-state estimates released on July 28. Both analyses assumes that half of the total cuts could affect beneficiaries.

To reflect local conditions that affect health care costs, an adjustment was made to the state estimates. Half of the state estimate is assumed to remain constant across counties, since policies like premium increases affect all beneficiaries equally. However, half is adjusted to reflect local Medicare cost variation, as reflected in HCFA's Adjusted Average Per Capita Costs (AAPCC), which are county-based rates used to pay Medicare HMOs.

1. Approximately half of this increase of \$625 per beneficiary in 2002 results from premium increases, that do not vary by area.
2. The other 50% of the increase results from increased cost sharing, and thus does vary by area.
3. The amount of the variation will be assumed to be the same as the amount of variation implicit in the AAPCC. Specifically, the ratio of the AAPCC to the USPCC in 1995 will be multiplied by \$313 (half of \$625) to estimate the variation in the cost sharing county by county.

State-by-State Estimates of the Effects of the Congressional Majority Conference Agreement

Medicare:

There are two sets of estimates for the effects of Medicare on states: the aggregate dollar loss by states, and the increase in the out-of-pocket costs for beneficiaries in states.

The amount that each state could lose under the proposal is based on the projected proportion of Medicare spending in each state. The proportion of spending by state is projected by first examining the 1994 distribution of Medicare spending by state. Second, the change in that distribution by state between 1989 and 1994 was calculated, to assess the trends in spending by state. The 1994 state share of Medicare spending was projected to 2002 using the 1988 to 1994 growth in the state share. The share of the total spending was multiplied by the total savings to yield an estimate of the reduction by state. For instance, in California, the projected state share of total Medicare spending is 13.9% in 2002. This is multiplied by the savings total of \$71 billion to estimate the loss of \$9.9 billion in Medicare spending in California in 2002.

The increase in out-of-pocket costs for beneficiaries in states was calculated in a similar way. First, the amount that each state could lose under the proposal was calculated (see previous paragraph). Second, the number of beneficiaries in each state was projected. This was done in the same way that the spending in each state was projected: multiplying the 1994 state share of beneficiaries by the change in that share between 1989 and 1994. Third, this projected number of beneficiaries in each state was divided into the 50% of the state share of the Medicare cuts (in the absence of specific proposals, it was assumed that 50% of the savings would affect beneficiaries). Fourth, an adjustment was made to each states' per beneficiary increase to account for the likely extension of the policy that the Part B premium is based on 25 percent of program costs (this is due to expire in 1998). All of the couple effects in the report are simply the per-beneficiary effects multiplied by two.

Medicaid:

The state-by-state effects of the Conference Agreement reductions for Medicaid were calculated by the Urban Institute. For a full discussion of their results, please see *The Impact of the Budget Resolution Conference Agreement on Medicaid Expenditures*, by John Holahan and David Liska, The Urban Institute, July 1995.

Other Estimates in the State-by-State Report:

The number of Medicare and Medicaid beneficiaries comes from the actual enrollment data from the Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA).

The national estimate of the effect on beneficiaries (\$2,825 over seven years) assumes that 50% of the cuts would affect beneficiaries, and is relative to a 25% Part B premium. The estimate of the \$1,700 average increase in the costs for a beneficiary using home health care in 2002 is a combination of premium and cost sharing increases. The premium increase is an estimated \$300 per beneficiary in 2002 -- based on Congressional Budget Office (CBO) estimates of premium increase to 33% from 25%. The home health cost sharing increase is based on CBO estimates of Medicare savings from a 20% coinsurance for all home health care (in its "Reducing the Deficit: Spending and Revenue Options"). Their 2000 estimate, extended to 2002, was divided by the projected number of users of home health to get an average of \$1,400 in 2002. This is consistent with the AARP's analysis of the same policy, which showed the increase cost of \$1,200 in the year 2000. The same methodology was used to estimate the \$1,400 increase in payments for the average beneficiary in a nursing home in 2002 (assuming 20% coinsurance for skilled nursing facilities).

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**The Republican Budget Resolution Conference Agreement:
County by County Analysis of Medicare Cuts**

Republicans are proposing to cut more than \$270 billion from Medicare between 1996 and 2002. Most of the \$270 billion in Medicare cuts would not be necessary without the Republicans' \$245 billion tax cut for well-off Americans. **A new study by the Department of Health and Human Services illustrates how these cuts would affect every county in the nation and the Medicare beneficiaries living in each county. The Republican Medicare cuts will specifically harm beneficiaries, hospitals and health care professionals in every county.**

County by County Analysis

If the Republican proposal was enacted, every county in the nation would face a dramatic loss of Medicare dollars. The new analysis provides the following detailed information:

- **Column 1: Name of county listed alphabetically**
- **Column 2: Number of beneficiaries in each county in 1994**
- **Column 3: Reduction of Medicare dollars in 2002**
- **Column 4: Reduction of Medicare dollars over 7 years (1996-2002); and**
- **Column 5: Increased out-of-pocket costs over 7 years for single beneficiaries and couples.**

For example, Mobile county, Alabama (substitute any county in a given state) would lose \$555 million in Medicare funding, over seven years and \$156 million in 2002 alone. Each of the 53,600 (substitute county figures) Medicare beneficiaries in the county who wanted to stay in their current fee-for-service plan would face over 7 years, on average, \$3,850 (insert specific county's number) in additional out-of-pocket costs and \$7,700 (insert county's figure) per couple.
