

County-by-County Estimates of the Effects of the Republican Medicare Proposals

This analysis assesses the effects of the Medicare savings in the Republicans' Medicare proposal on states and counties. In both the House and Senate proposals, Medicare spending would be reduced by approximately \$270 billion between 1996 and 2002, \$71 billion in 2002 alone.

Number of Beneficiaries '94:

The number of Medicare beneficiaries in each state is from the Health Care Financing Administration data. The number of Medicare beneficiaries in each county is estimated by multiplying the 1994 state number of beneficiaries by the proportion of the state's beneficiaries in each county in 1992 (the actual number of beneficiaries in each county was not available).

Reduction in 2002:

The reduction in Medicare spending per state and county is based on the total reduction of \$71 billion in 2002. It is assumed that the cuts will be distributed across states and counties in proportion to the Medicare spending in states and counties. In other words, the more a county's health care providers receive from Medicare, the more the county will be affected by the cuts.

Reduction between 1996 - 2002:

The reduction in the Medicare spending per state and county for the seven year period is based on the total reduction of \$270 billion. Similarly, it is assumed that the cuts will be distributed across states and counties in proportion to the Medicare spending in states and counties.

Example: Mobile county, Alabama [substitute any county] would lose \$555 million in Medicare funding over seven years, and \$156 million in 2002 alone under the Republican Medicare proposal.

NOTE: Manassas Park City, Virginia

In the assessment of the effects of the Republican Budget Conference Agreement on Medicare, Manassas Park City, Virginia, was excluded due to problems with the data from that county.

The information available suggests that the effect on Manassas City is similar to that of Manassas Park. Each of Manassas Park City's Medicare beneficiaries who wants to stay in his or her current fee-for-service Medicare would face, over seven years, an average of \$1,550 in additional out-of-pocket costs and \$3,100 more per couple.
