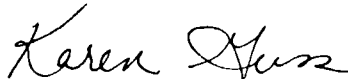

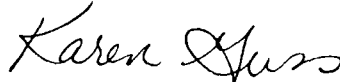

Dear Ms. Guss:

Thank you very much for providing us with the opportunity to review correspondence sent to Mrs. Clinton. We believe that there is a role for high dose chemotherapy in association with autologous bone marrow treatment. For certain women who are in a very high risk situation (e.g., primary breast cancer with 10 or more positive lymph nodes), these modalities may provide a benefit. In a minority of women with known metastatic disease, there may be a benefit, but the benefit is reserved primarily for those women who are induced to a state of minimal disease by standard chemotherapy first. However, there are a number of unanswered questions associated with the use of these therapies. We believe the best pathway is to continue a vigorous program of clinical research with appropriate, carefully controlled clinical trials to determine the precise value of these therapies. There are certainly side effects and substantial risks associated with these interventions. In addition, they provide a substantial cost factor. We believe it's a good idea to stick to National Cancer Institute (NCI) or Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved clinical trials as much as possible.

In her reply, I would perhaps recommend that the First Lady focus on the need for basic and clinical research. She may wish to point out that the President's budget has provided extremely important increases for the National Cancer Institute in several areas related to breast cancer, including bone marrow and stem cell therapy. We will certainly make substantial progress with this commitment.

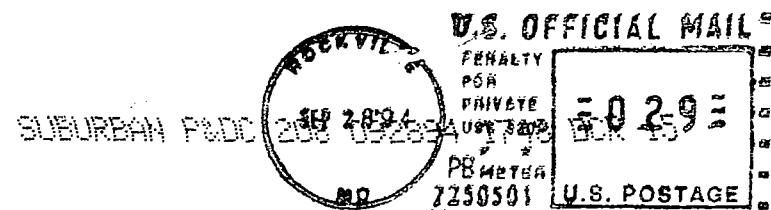
