1. REFTEL A PROVIDES THE MISSING EXPLANATION FOR THE UNOSOM REQUEST (REFTEL B) TO USE THE U.S.-DONATED VEHICLES CURRENTLY PARKED ON THE UNOSOM COMPOUND IN MOGADISHU. REPORTEDLY, UNOSOM IS SHIPPING THEIR TOYOTAS OUT TO BE USED IN OTHER MISSIONS, AND PLANNING TO DONATE THE NISSAN PICK-UPS THEY HAVE STORED IN MOGADISHU TO THE SOMALI POLICE.

2. IN A BRIEFING OF KEY CONGRESSIONAL STAFFERS ABOUT TWO MONTHS AGO, THE ISSUE OF THE ULTIMATE USE OF THE U.S.-DONATED POLICE EQUIPMENT WAS RAISED. STAFFERS EXPRESSED THEIR REAL CONCERN THAT THE DONATED WEAPONS AND VEHICLES WOULD END UP IN THE HANDS OF THE MILITIAS AND USED TO CONTINUE THE FIGHTING THAT HAS DESTROYED SO MUCH OF SOMALIA. OBVIOUSLY, WE SHARE THIS CONCERN, AND WE SUCCEEDED IN REMOVING THE WEAPONS AND AMMUNITION FROM SOMALIA. NOW, WE WANT TO GET THE VEHICLES OUT.

3. ACTION REQUESTED: DEPARTMENT REQUESTS THAT THE SOMALIA LIAISON OFFICE INFORM UNOSOM THAT THE U.S. GOVERNMENT IS NOT WILLING TO AGREE TO THIS REQUEST. THE FOLLOWING TALKING POINTS ARE PROVIDED:

-- WHEN THE U.S.-DONATED THESE VEHICLES TO UNOSOM, IT WAS UNDERSTOOD THAT THEIR ONLY USE WOULD BE TO EQUIP THE SOMALIA NATIONAL POLICE.

-- THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN INCLUSIVE INTERIM GOVERNMENT REMAINS ELUSIVE AND WE SEE NO EVIDENCE INDICATING THAT A CREDIBLE, NEUTRAL SOMALIA NATIONAL POLICE WILL BE ESTABLISHED IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

-- THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT IS TROUBLED BY REPORTS THAT A SIGNIFICANT NUMBER OF THE U.S.-DONATED VEHICLES ARE NOT SERVICEABLE, AND THAT THE THEFT OF VEHICLES FROM THE UNOSOM COMPOUND IS CONTINUING AND INCREASING.

-- WE ARE PARTICULARLY CONCERNED THAT THESE VEHICLES CAN BE EASILY CONVERTED INTO "TECHNICALS" BY SOMALI FACTIONS AND USED TO CONTINUE THE WARFARE THAT HAS DESTROYED SOMALIA.

-- WE URGE UNOSOM TO INSURE THAT THESE VEHICLES ARE SECURE, SERVICEABLE, AND SHIPPED OUT OF SOMALIA AT THE FIRST OPPORTUNITY.

THE SECURITY COUNCIL,

RECALLING ITS RESOLUTION 733 [1992] OF 23 JANUARY 1992 AND ALL OTHER RELEVANT RESOLUTIONS,

HAVING CONSIDERED THE REPORTS OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL DATED 17 SEPTEMBER 1994 [S/1994/1068] AND 14 OCTOBER 1994 [S/1994/1166], AND THE ORAL REPORT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL'S MISSION TO SOMALIA DATED 31 OCTOBER 1994,

PAYING TRIBUTE TO THE THOUSANDS OF UNITED NATIONS OPERATION IN SOMALIA [UNOSOM], UNIFIED TASK FORCE [UNITAF] AND HUMANITARIAN RELIEF PERSONNEL WHO HAVE SERVED IN SOMALIA, AND HONORING THOSE WHOSE SACRIFICE HAS BEEN THE GREATEST OF ALL, THE SACRIFICE OF THEIR LIVES,

NOTING THAT HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS OF HUMAN LIVES HAVE BEEN RESCUED FROM FAMINE IN SOMALIA THROUGH THE EFFORTS OF THE UNITED NATIONS,

COMMENDING THE EFFORTS OF THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL TO BRING SOMALI FACTIONS TOGETHER IN NATIONAL RECONCILIATION,

REAFFIRMING THAT THE PEOPLE OF SOMALIA BEAR THE ULTIMATE RESPONSIBILITY FOR BRINGING PEACE TO SOMALIA,

RECALLING THAT THE DATE ALREADY FORESEEN FOR TERMINATION OF THE UNITED NATIONS PEACE-KEEPING MISSION [UNOSOM] IS THE END OF MARCH 1995,

RECOGNIZING THAT THE LACK OF PROGRESS IN THE PEACE PROCESS AND ON NATIONAL RECONCILIATION AMONG SOMALIS, TAKEN TOGETHER WITH THE LACK OF SOMALI CO-OPERATION OVER SECURITY ISSUES, HAVE FUNDAMENTALLY UNDERMINED THE UN'S OBJECTIVES IN SOMALIA AND IN THESE CIRCUMSTANCES, CONTINUATION OF UNOSOM BEYOND MARCH 1995 CANNOT BE JUSTIFIED,

RECOGNIZING FURTHER THAT A MARCH 1995 TERMINATION OF UNOSOM IMPLIES A SECURE, ORDERLY AND EXPEDITIOUS PHASING OUT OF THE MILITARY COMPONENT OF UNOSOM IN ADVANCE OF THAT DATE,

WELCOMING THE ASSURANCES OF COOPERATION AND NON-INTERFERENCE WITH SUCH WITHDRAWAL RECEIVED FROM ALL SOMALI PARTIES DURING THE SECURITY COUNCIL'S MISSION TO SOMALIA,

RE-EMPHASIZING THE IMPORTANCE THE COUNCIL ATTACHES TO THE SAFETY AND SECURITY OF UNITED NATIONS AND OTHER PERSONNEL ENGAGED IN HUMANITARIAN RELIEF AND PEACEKEEPING THROUGHOUT SOMALIA,

EMPHASIZING THE UNITED NATIONS' WILLINGNESS TO SUSTAIN A FACILITATING OR MEDIATING POLITICAL ROLE FOR SOMALIA BEYOND MARCH 1995 IF THAT IS WHAT THE SOMALIS WANT AND IF THEY ARE WILLING TO COOPERATE WITH THE UNITED NATIONS,

STRESSING THAT THE UNITED NATIONS WILL CONTINUE TO WORK WITH REGIONAL ORGANIZATIONS, IN PARTICULAR THE OAU, AND WITH THE GOVERNMENTS OF NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES TO PROMOTE RECONCILIATION IN SOMALIA AND THE RE-EMERGENCE OF A CIVIL

NOTING THAT THE UNITED NATIONS WILL DO ITS BEST TO SUSTAIN HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES IN SOMALIA AND TO ENCOURAGE NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS TO DO LIKEWISE, BUT THAT THEIR ABILITY TO DO SO WILL DEPEND ALMOST ENTIRELY ON THE DEGREE OF CO-OPERATION AND SECURITY OFFERED BY SOMALIS,

EXPRESSING THE WILLINGNESS OF THE UNITED NATIONS TO REMAIN READY TO PROVIDE THROUGH ITS VARIOUS AGENCIES REHABILITATION AND RECONSTRUCTION ASSISTANCE IF THE SITUATION IN SOMALIA DEVELOPS IN SUCH A WAY AS TO MAKE THAT PRACTICABLE,

DETERMINING THAT THE SITUATION IN SOMALIA CONTINUES TO THREATEN PEACE AND SECURITY AND ACTING UNDER CHAPTER VII OF THE CHARTER OF THE UNITED NATIONS,

- 1. DECIDES TO EXTEND THE MANDATE OF UNOSOM, AS REVISED BY THIS RESOLUTION, FOR ONE FINAL PERIOD UNTIL 31 MARCH 1995;
- 2. AFFIRMS THAT THE PRIMARY PURPOSE OF UNOSOM UNTIL ITS TERMINATION IS POLITICAL RECONCILIATION IN SOMALIA;
- 3. CALLS UPON ALL SOMALI FACTIONS TO MEET UNDER UNOSOM AUSPICES AS SOON AS POSSIBLE TO NEGOTIATE AN EFFECTIVE CEASEFIRE AND THE FORMATION OF A TRANSITIONAL GOVERNMENT OF NATIONAL RECONCILIATION;
- 4. WELCOMES THE INTENTION OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL, EXPRESSED IN PARAGRAPH 23 OF HIS REPORT TO CONTINUE THROUGHOUT THE PERIOD OF UNOSOM'S MANDATE THE EFFORTS OF HIS SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE AND A SMALL POLITICAL STAFF TO HELP THE SOMALI LEADERS ACHIEVE NATIONAL RECONCILIATION;
- 5. DIRECTS THAT ALL UNOSOM MILITARY FORCES AND ASSETS SHALL BE WITHDRAWN FROM SOMALIA IN A SECURE AND ORDERLY MANNER AS SOON AS POSSIBLE WITH NINETY DAYS FROM THE PASSAGE OF THIS RESOLUTION AS THE GOAL FOR COMPLETING THE WITHDRAWAL;
- 6. AUTHORIZES UNOSOM'S MILITARY FORCES TO TAKE ONLY THOSE ACTIONS NECESSARY TO PROTECT THE UNOSOM MISSION AND TO PROTECT THE WITHDRAWAL OF UNOSOM PERSONNEL, AND, TO THE EXTENT THAT THE FORCE COMMANDER DEEMS IT PRACTICABLE AND CONSISTENT WITH THE ACCOMPLISHMENT OF THIS PRIMARY MISSION, TO PROTECT RELIEF ORGANIZATION PERSONNEL;
- 7. UNDERLINES THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE SOMALI PARTIES FOR THE SECURITY AND SAFETY OF UNOSOM II AND OTHER INTERNATIONAL PERSONNEL AND IN THIS CONTEXT EXPECTS THAT ALL PARTIES IN SOMALIA WILL REFRAIN FROM ANY ACTS OF INTIMIDATION OR VIOLENCE AGAINST SUCH PERSONNEL;
- 8. CALLS UPON MEMBER STATES TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE IN THE WITHDRAWAL OF ALL UNOSOM MILITARY FORCES AND ASSETS, INCLUDING ALL VEHICLES, WEAPONS, AND OTHER EQUIPMENT;
- 9. REQUESTS THAT THE SECRETARY-GENERAL COMPLETE BY 30 NOVEMBER 1994 A DETAILED WITHDRAWAL PLAN FOR UNOSOM MILITARY FORCES, AND REQUESTS THAT THE SECRETARY-GENERAL KEEP THE COUNCIL INFORMED ABOUT THE PROGRESS OF THE PLANNING AND THE WITHDRAWAL.

4. ~~(S)~~ FURTHER, BECAUSE THE PRESENT MANDATE EXPIRES ON 10/31/94 AND WE EXPECT DELAYS IN COUNCIL ACTION AS A RESULT OF THE MISSION'S TRIP, USUN IS INSTRUCTED TO SUPPORT A TECHNICAL EXTENSION OF THE CURRENT MANDATE THROUGH 11/4/94. THE MISSION SHOULD NOT/NOT SUPPORT ANY EXTENSIONS WHICH EXTEND THE CURRENT MANDATE BEYOND 11/4. INSTEAD, MISSION SHOULD PROPOSE REVISION OF THE UNOSOM MANDATE TO EMPHASIZE UNOSOM'S POLITICAL ROLE, WITH A DEFINITE TERMINATION DATE OF 31 MARCH 1995. IT IS UNLIKELY THAT THE REPORT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL'S MISSION TO SOMALIA WILL JUSTIFY A CONTINUATION OF UNOSOM'S MILITARY PRESENCE. THEREFORE, THE MISSION IS REQUESTED TO TABLE THE U.S. DRAFT RESOLUTION THIS WEEK AND TO INITIATE DISCUSSIONS WITH THE UN SECRETARIAT AND SC MEMBERS TO PASS A FINAL UNOSOM MANDATE UPON THE EXPIRATION OF THE TECHNICAL EXTENSION. TEXT OF THE U.S. DRAFT RESOLUTION FOLLOWS AT PARAGRAPH 5.

PAYING TRIBUTE TO THE THOUSANDS OF UNIFIED TASK FORCE (UNITAF) AND UNITED NATIONS OPERATION IN SOMALIA (UNOSOM) AND HUMANITARIAN RELIEF PERSONNEL WHO HAVE SERVED IN SOMALIA, AND HONORING THOSE WHOSE SACRIFICE HAS BEEN THE GREATEST OF ALL, THE SACRIFICE OF THEIR LIVES,

NOTING THAT HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS OF HUMAN LIVES HAVE BEEN RESCUED FROM FAMINE IN SOMALIA THROUGH THE EFFORTS OF THE UNITED NATIONS,

COMMENDING THE EFFORTS OF THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL TO BRING SOMALI FACTIONS TOGETHER IN NATIONAL RECONCILIATION,

REAFFIRMING THAT THE PEOPLE OF SOMALIA BEAR THE ULTIMATE RESPONSIBILITY FOR BRINGING PEACE TO SOMALIA,

1. DECIDES TO EXTEND THE MANDATE OF UNOSOM, AS REVISED BY THIS RESOLUTION, UNTIL 31 MARCH 1995;
 2. AFFIRMS THAT THE PRIMARY PURPOSE OF UNOSOM UNTIL ITS TERMINATION IS POLITICAL RECONCILIATION IN SOMALIA;
 3. CALLS UPON ALL SOMALI FACTIONS TO MEET UNDER UNOSOM AUSPICES AS SOON AS POSSIBLE TO NEGOTIATE AN EFFECTIVE CEASEFIRE AND THE FORMATION OF A TRANSITIONAL GOVERNMENT OF NATIONAL RECONCILIATION;

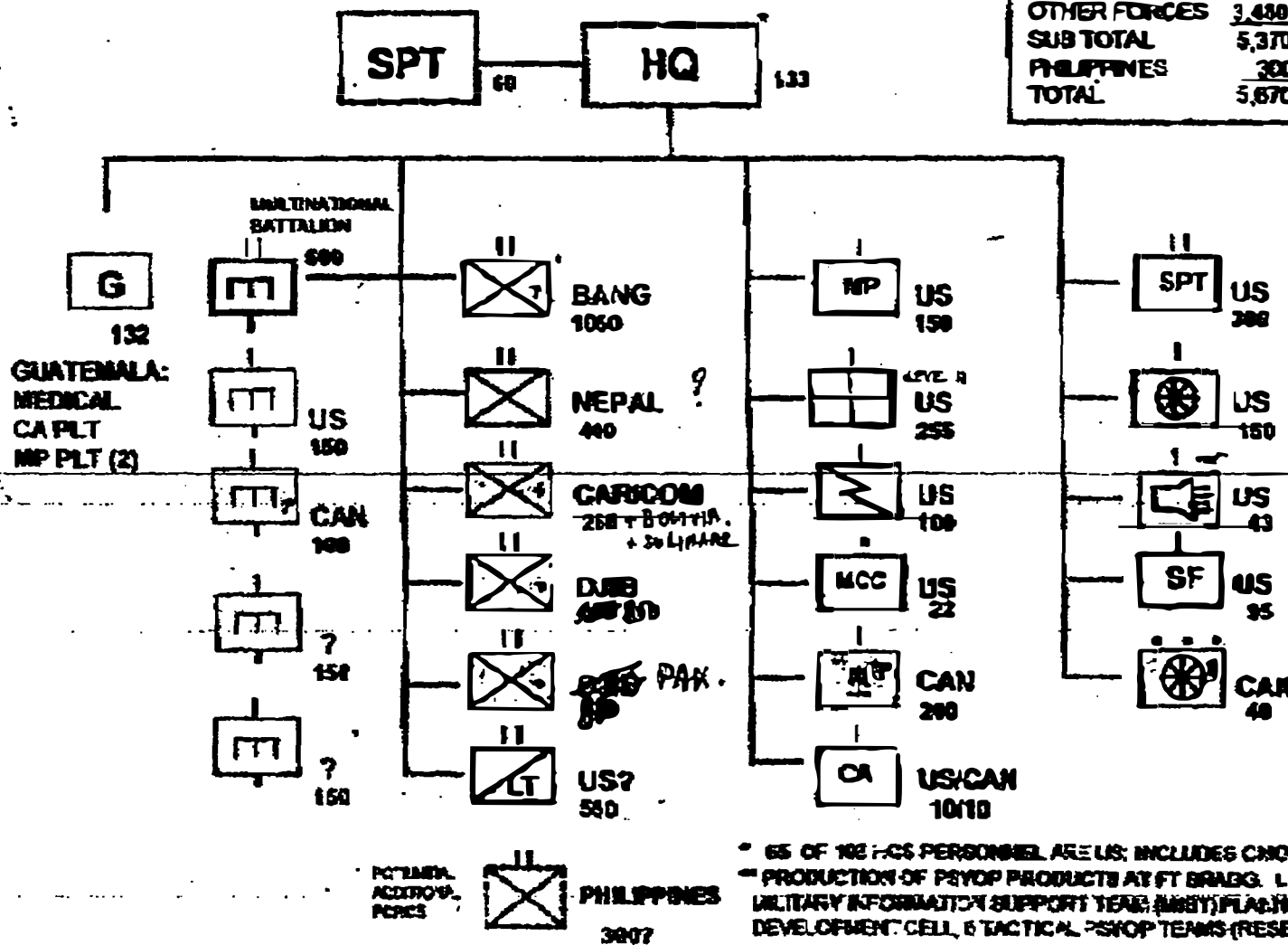

Dear John:

Thank you so much for your kind letter. I am glad you overcame your reluctance to write. It is always good to hear from an old friend. My interest in baseball is still strong, but I wish I had time to attend a few more games. I also miss the farm.

Although I cannot go into great detail to answer all your questions fully, there are a few things that I can say and a few documents that I can enclose that I hope will aid you in your efforts to analyze US policy toward Somalia.

We have learned a great deal from what went right and what went wrong in Somalia. Clearly we learned some hard lessons from the experience and would do some things differently if given the opportunity. However, ultimately US intervention into Somalia was a selfless act and it saved hundreds of thousands of lives. It was the right thing to do, but we have paid a high price for the good it has accomplished.

My experience has taught me that a humanitarian mission can not easily be divorced from the political problems associated with its accompanying crisis. Despite our best intentions to remain above the political fray, feed the hungry, fight disease and provide Somalia with a chance to get back on its feet, we became engaged in a political struggle. In June 1993, many of the same people who were responsible for chaos that led to US intervention, made an unprovoked attack against the Pakistani contingent, killing 24 soldiers. This act changed the calculus of US and UN policy toward Somalia.

I am enclosing the report we sent to the Congress on October 13, 1993 and the President's remarks of October 7, 1993. The report traces the Somalia operation from UNOSOM I through UNITAF to UNOSOM II and the speech sums up quite well my feelings toward the Somalia experience. I believe you will find both valuable to your research.
