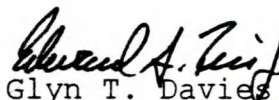

1.5 (B) AND (D).

1. ~~(C) THE SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION THE NATO ACTUALLY HAVE DRAMATICALLY QUICKENED THE PACE OF WHAT COULD WELL BE THE BEGINNING OF THE ENDGAME IN KOSOVO.~~
AS WE ENTER THIS CRUCIAL PHASE, I WANTED TO PROVIDE SOME THOUGHTS ON THE SITUATION ON THE GROUND, INCLUDING VIOLENCE AND DISPLACED PEOPLE, THE STATE OF THE KLA, AND THE NEGOTIATING TRACK -- ESPECIALLY WHERE WE CAN ANTICIPATE ENCOUNTERING SOME DIFFICULT DECISION POINTS IN THE COMING WEEKS.
2. ~~(C) IN MY LAST MEETING WITH MILOSEVIC ON MONDAY (SEPTEMBER 21) HE HAD CLEARLY BEGUN TO UNDERSTAND THE MESSAGE COMING FROM NEW YORK AND ELSEWHERE THAT OUR COLLECTIVE ANGER WITH HIS BEHAVIOR HAD REACHED THE POINT WHERE THE USE OF FORCE WAS BECOMING A PUNITIVE MATTER AGAINST HIM, NOT TO BE ASSUAGED BY HALF MEASURES ON THE GROUND. BECAUSE OF THE CREDIBILITY OF THE THREAT AGAINST HIM, I EXPECT IN THE COMING DAYS TO SEE THE LAST OFFENSIVE IN THE DRENICA AREA TO BE COMPLETED AND -XAS MILOSEVIC (SIGNIFICANTLY) INDICATED IN HIS PUBLIC STATEMENT AFTER MY MEETING WITH HIM - "VICTORY" DECLARED OVER THE KLA.~~
3. ~~(C) WE HAVE LONG WANTED MILOSEVIC TO DECLARE AN END TO HIS OFFENSIVE AGAINST THE KLA, BUT THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN NOW AND THE SPRING IS THAT THIS TIME HE WILL BE ABLE TO DECLARE THE END THROUGH A VICTORY ACHIEVED BY BRUTE FORCE. THIS IS NOT TO SAY THAT THE KLA IS FOREVER DEFEATED. MILITARILY IT~~

COULD WELL BE BACK IN SOME FORM IN THE SPRING. BUT PSYCHOLOGICALLY, THE KLA, AND ESPECIALLY ITS SWISS-BASED CORE ORGANIZATION, HAS BEEN DEALT A HUGE BLOW. IT HAS BEEN HUMILIATED IN THE EYES OF THE ALBANIAN PUBLIC AS BEING RECKLESS AND LACKING ANY CONCEPT OF WHAT IT WAS TRYING TO ACHIEVE APART FROM "LIBERATING KOSOVO." TO BE SURE, THE PRISTINA PRESS WILL CONTINUE TO SUPPORT THE KLA. KOHA DITORE, FOR EXAMPLE, REGULARLY ISSUES STATEMENTS AND APPEALS ON THE PART OF THE KLA CALLING FOR RECRUITS WHILE AT THE SAME TIME BLASTING RUGOVA AND ANY EFFORTS (INCLUDING OUR OWN) TO ACHIEVE A PEACEFUL SETTLEMENT. MANY ALBANIANS, HOWEVER, INCLUDING ONES I RECENTLY ENCOUNTERED LIVING UNDER PLASTIC TENTS IN A MUDDY CLEARING EAST OF MALISEVO (I DIDN'T SEE ANYONE THERE FROM KOHA DITORE) HAVE NO PATIENCE FOR THESE COFFEE HOUSE HEROES AND JUST WANT TO GET BACK TO WHAT IS LEFT OF THEIR HOMES IN SAFETY.

4. (C) AS FOR THE KLA ITSELF, IN MANY CASES (MALISEVO, DECANI, ISTINIC) IT DEPARTED THE BATTLEFIELD EVEN AHEAD OF THE POPULATION IT WAS SUPPOSED TO DEFEND. IN JUNIK, THE KLA DROPPED WEAPONS ON THE GROUND, INCLUDING 82 MM MORTARS, AND LEFT BEHIND 75 MM RECOILESS RIFLES WHICH HAD BEEN DRAGGED OVER CRAGGY PEAKS FROM ALBANIA AT GREAT COST AND DIRE RISK. THE RESULT OF THIS HUMILIATION IS A KLA THAT IS ITSELF FRACTURED (THERE HAS NEVER BEEN MUCH EVIDENCE THAT THE "DRENICA COMMAND" EVER HAD MUCH CONNECTION TO THE "DECANI COMMAND," ETC., ETC.) AND TEMPERIS ARE CONSEQUENTLY RISING. THE RECENT KIDNAPPING OF 13 LDK LEADERS IN DRENICA (WHO WERE THERE ASSESSING THE HUMANITARIAN SITUATION), THE MURDER OF THE "SHADOW GOVERNMENT" DEFENSE MINISTER IN TIRANA (A MURDER WHICH, BY THE WAY, WILL PROBABLY BE AVENGED), AND THE BIZARRE "RESIGNATION" OF KLA "POLITICAL LEADER" ADEM DEMACI ALL POINT TO AN ORGANIZATION WHICH HAS SOME SERIOUS RESTRUCTURING AHEAD.

5. (C) MEANWHILE, THE SERBS WILL ALSO SEEK TO ASSUAGE WORLD OPINION WITH A MASSIVE EFFORT TO FORCE PEOPLE BACK TO THEIR VILLAGES. WHETHER RETURNEES FEEL SECURE IN THOSE VILLAGES OR NOT. THIS PROCESS, ACCORDING TO MOST RECENT KDOM OBSERVATIONS, IS ALRDY WELL UNDERWAY IN THE DECANI, DJAKOVICA, AND JUNIK AREAS, AND I SUSPECT THAT WHEN THE ORDER IS GIVEN, THE NOW EMPTY CORRIDAR BETWEEN KOMORANE AND MALISEVO WILL SOON FILL UP WITH FRIGHTENED VILLAGERS STRETCHING THEIR UNHCR PLASTIC WRAP BETWEEN THE REMAINING STANDING WALLS OF THEIR BURNED-OUT HOUSES. IT WILL NOT BE A PRETTY SIGHT - THE SERBS HAVE CONSISTENTLY DEMONSTRATED THAT THEY COULD CARE LESS ABOUT THESE ALLEGED VICTIMS OF KLA "TERRORISM" - BUT THE SERBS WILL BE ABLE TO SAY THAT PEOPLE ARE BACK IN THEIR "HOMES" AND "WHAT IS ALL THE FUSS?"

6. (S) THOUGH THE SERBS' MOTIVATION WILL CONTINUE TO FALL BELOW THE LEVEL OF INSPIRATION, I ALSO EXPECT WE WILL SHORTLY BEGIN TO SEE SOME KIND OF "WITHDRAWAL OF FORCES." I TOOK SEVERAL RUNS AT MILOSEVIC OVER THIS ISSUE LAST MONDAY AND IT WAS CLEAR THEN THAT HE WAS NOT YET READY TO BEGIN THE PROCESS. BUT A COMBINATION OF THE TIME GAINED DURING THE INTERVENING DAYS AND THE DEVELOPMENTS FROM NEW YORK AND PORTUGAL SHOULD BE ENOUGH TO GET HIM MOVING. AND SO, ASSUMING THAT THE HUMANITARIAN SITUATION -- HOWEVER UGLY -- WILL SHOW IMPROVEMENT AND THAT THE LEVEL OF VIOLENCE WILL ALSO DIE DOWN SOON, WE WILL NEED TO CONSIDER SOME TOUGH QUESTIONS WITH REGARD TO THE NEGOTIATION TRACK.

7. (S) WE ARE CURRENTLY WAITING FOR SERB COMMENTS ON OUR DRAFT. WHEN WE GET THESE - AND WE EXPECT THEM TO BE NEGATIVE AS THOSE OF THE ALBANIANS - WE WILL INCORPORATE BOTH SETS INTO THE DOCUMENT AND SEE HOW FAR APART THE TWO PARTS CAN GET. DEPENDING ON THE SERB COMMENTS, WE MAY WANT TO TAKE THE DOCUMENT TO THE CONTACT GROUP IN THE NEXT WEEK OR TWO, OR WE MAY TAKE ANOTHER STAB AT REDUCING THE DIFFERENCES. OUR GOAL IS TO HAVE THE CONTACT GROUP ENDORSE THE PLAN AS ITS OWN AND PRESENT IT TO BOTH SIDES AS A FINAL COMPROMISE WHICH WOULD THEREFORE PROVIDE COVER TO BOTH SETS OF NEGOTIATORS.

8. (S) ON THE SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES WHICH DIVIDE THE PARTS, THE MOST IMPORTANT WILL BE THE QUESTION OF KOSOVO'S RELATIONSHIP TO SERBIA. KNOWING THAT THE SERBS WILL NOT ACCEPT LOSING KOSOVO, AND KNOWING THAT THE ALBANIANS CANNOT ACCEPT TO BE FOREVER IN SERBIA, WE CAME UP WITH THE IDEA OF A SO-CALLED "INTERIM ACCORD" WHOSE PURPOSE WAS TO ALLOW THE ALBANIAN NEGOTIATORS TO NEGOTIATE THE RECLAIMING OF KOSOVO'S SELF-GOVERNMENT AND INSTITUTIONS, WHILE NOT SUBJECTING THEM TO ACCUSATIONS THAT THEY SIGNED AWAY THE AGE-OLD DEMAND FOR INDEPENDENCE. WE ALSO BELIEVE THAT WHILE SERBIA IS OBVIOUSLY NOT A DEMOCRACY (RAISING THE MORAL QUESTION OF FORCING THE ALBANIANS TO LIVE UNDER THE SERBIAN REGIME, A QUESTION THE NGO COMMUNITY AND ALBANIAN AMERICANS WILL CONTINUE TO PRESS), THE KOSOVARS THEMSELVES COULD DO WITH A LITTLE REMEDIAL EDUCATION IN DEVELOPING DEMOCRATIC INSTITUTIONS. "MOREOVER, IN OUR VIEW, THERE ARE FEW SIGNS INDEED THAT KOSOVARS HAVE THE WHEREWITHAL TO RUN THEIR OWN AFFAIRS OR TO BECOME A SECOND ALBANIAN STATE IN THE BALKANS, WITH ALL THE FRIGHTENING PROSPECTS THIS CONJURES UP FOR THE BROADER NEIGHBORHOOD GIVEN THE CONTINUED MELTDOWN OF STATE AUTHORITY IN ALBANIA.

9. (S) ANOTHER APPROACH TO THE PROBLEM OF KOSOVO'S STATUS HAS BEEN THE SUGGESTION THAT KOSOVO LEAVE SERBIA BUT STAY A PART OF YUGOSLAVIA. THIS SEEMS PERSUASIVE IN THEORY, BUT EVERYONE - SERBS AND ALBANIANS ALIKE - AGREES THAT THE FRY IS A CARTOON STATE WITH A VERY UNCERTAIN FUTURE. THEREFORE, THE ALBANIANS' WILLINGNESS TO CONSIDER A FEDERAL STATUS OUTSIDE SERBIA, OR A "THIRD REPUBLIC" STATUS FOR AN INTERIM PERIOD CANNOT BE CONSIDERED MUCH OF AN EFFORT TO MEET THE SERBS HALF WAY. IN ESSENCE, THE ALBANIANS SEE FEDERAL STATUS WITH NO RESIDUAL CONNECTIONS TO SERBIA AS AKIN TO INDEPENDENCE AND DEMAND THAT -- EVEN DURING THE INTERIM PERIOD -- THEY

BE FREE FROM ANY CONNECTION WITH SERBIA. THE SERBS REJECT THIS TOTALLY. THEY UNDERSTAND VERY WELL THAT FEDERAL INSTITUTIONS PROVIDE NO REAL LEVERS OF POWER -- WITNESS THEIR TROUBLES WITH THE MONTENEGRINS -- AND THE REMAINING SERBS IN KOSOVO WOULD GET THE MESSAGE AND PROMPTLY LEAVE. THE SERBS WILL NOT --AT LEAST FOR NOW -- SIGN ON TO A STATUS FOR KOSOVO OUTSIDE SERBIA PEACEFULLY.

10. (S) SO THE ESSENTIAL QUESTION REMAINS KOSOVO'S RELATIONSHIP TO SERBIA. OUR NEGOTIATION HAS BEEN DESIGNED TO PUT THE STATUS QUESTION OFF FOR AT LEAST THREE YEARS, IN EFFECT NOT TAKING KOSOVO OUT OF SERBIA BUT TO THE EXTENT POSSIBLE TAKING SERBIA OUT OF KOSOVO. BOTH THE ALBANIANS AND THE SERBS -- BUT PARTICULARLY THE ALBANIANS - INSIST THAT WE ADDRESS THE STATUS ISSUE NOW, PROVIDED, OF COURSE, WE CONFIRM THEIR PARTISAN VIEW. IN MY JUDGMENT, THIS MEANS THAT THE CONTACT GROUP, IN ENDORSING OUR DRAFT AGREEMENT, WILL HAVE TO STAND FIRM IN DENYING BOTH SIDES THEIR MOST CHERISHED ASPIRATIONS OF CONFIRMING ONCE AND FOR

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SUBJECT: KOSOVO: WHERE WE STAND

ALL THAT KOSOVO IS (FOR THE SERBS), OR IS NOT (FOR THE ALBANIANS) A PART OF SERBIA.

11. (S) IF WE CAN HOLD FIRM ON THIS CRUCIAL ISSUE OF PUTTING ASIDE THE STATUS QUESTION (IN EFFECT, MAINTAINING THE STATUS QUO WITH REGARD TO KOSOVO'S POSITION IN SERBIA) AND WORKING ON A THREE YEAR PROGRAM OF DEVELOPING BROAD SELF-GOVERNMENT AND DEMOCRATIC INSTITUTIONS. I BELIEVE THE SERBS AND THE ALBANIANS WILL ACCEPT OUR PLAN, ALBEIT RELUCTANTLY. (IN POINT OF FACT, BY "IMPOSING" THE PLAN WE WOULD BE PROVIDING MUCH NEEDED POLITICAL COVER TO BOTH SIDES IN ORDER TO SELL THE AGREEMENT WITH THEIR RESPECTIVE PUBLICS.) IF, ON THE OTHER HAND, THE CONTACT GROUP SIDES WITH THE ALBANIANS AND ATTEMPTS TO TAKE KOSOVO OUT OF SERBIA UNDER THIS AGREEMENT, THE SERBS WILL REJECT THE PLAN AND DARE US TO ENTER A SCENARIO OF USING FORCE TO ACHIEVE THEIR COMPLIANCE.

12. (S) WE ALSO NEED TO COME TO TERMS WITH THE VERY DIFFICULT ISSUE OF THE "INTERNATIONAL GUARANTEES" THAT THE ALBANIANS REQUIRE AND THE SERBS REJECT. NATO IS IDEALLY SUITED FOR SOME OF THE TASKS ASSOCIATED WITH POST-SETTLEMENT, BUT WE WILL HAVE TO BE TOUGH WITH THE SERBS (AND PROBABLY THE RUSSIANS) TO GET THEM TO ACCEPT SOME KIND OF NATO ROLE. OTHER INSTITUTIONAL LINKAGES, SUCH AS WITH THE OSCE, WILL PROBABLY BE AN EASIER SELL.

13. (C) AS WE HAVE IN THE PAST, WE WILL PROBABLY WANT TO WORK WITH THE EU TO PROVIDE SOME ECONOMIC SWEETENERS. ECONOMICALLY, KOSOVO IS NOT A LOT WORSE OFF THAN OTHER PARTS OF YUGOSLAVIA, BUT ONE CAN

IMAGINE WITH ITS THIRD WORLD POPULATION GROWTHRATE AND ITS CRUMBLING INDUSTRIAL INFRASTRUCTURE, IT WILL NEED CONSIDERABLE HELP EVEN APART FROM WAR DAMAGE. 14. ~~(C)~~ FINALLY, AS WE ALL ARE AWARE, ALBANIA'S CHAOS IS LIKELY TO POSE THEREATEST CHALLENGE TO STABILITY IN KOSOVO AND THAT SITUATION WILL HAVE TO BE MANAGED IF WE ARE TO HAVE ANY HOPE OF SUCCESS IN KOSOVO.

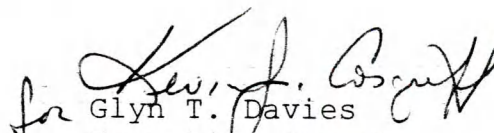

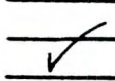
