Summary of Conclusions

It was agreed that:

- The USG should consult with close NATO allies and the ICRC on the possibility of deploying a ICRC convoy to deliver humanitarian relief to a designated location in Kosovo with NATO ceasing air strikes in the area of relief operations. If successful, similar operations could be carried out in other locations. (Action: State) ~~(S)~~
- State should arrange for a small team to meet with representatives of the Kosovo Liberation Army (KLA) to consider ways that the KLA could assist in delivering humanitarian assistance to internally displaced persons in Kosovo. (Action: State, DOD) ~~(S)~~
- State would provide a recommendation on whether and how to grant refuge for up to 20,000 refugees that the USG has committed to accept. (Action: State) (U)
- The USG should consider options for basing Task Force Thunder (MLRS/ATACMS) following the NATO Summit. (Action: NSC) ~~(S)~~
- The USG should retain the Serb prisoner of war (POW) currently in U.S. custody and stop its efforts to find another country to assume custody. (Action: State, DOD) ~~(S)~~
- The USG should develop options for NATO handling of any further POWs that avoid making the USG the sole recipient. (Action: OSD) ~~(S)~~
- The USG should develop a strategy to take advantage of Islamic support for NATO actions in Kosovo. (Action: State) ~~(S)~~

VFW BACKS FULL USE OF NATO MILITARY POWER AGAINST SERBIA

WASHINGTON, D.C., April 19, 1999 – The Veterans of Foreign Wars today, previously opposed to the deployment of U.S. forces to the former Yugoslavia, advised the president that the VFW would support the NATO alliance taking decisive action “to eject, remove, or otherwise force the withdrawal of Serbian military and paramilitary forces and to restore Kosovars to their homes.”

In a letter to President Clinton, VFW Commander in Chief Thomas A. Pouliot, of Helena, Mont., said, “In the past few weeks Serbian leaders have used their military and paramilitary forces to overrun Kosovo, destroy the social and economic fabric of the province and terrorized the populace into flight. Ignoring NATO diplomatic efforts to resolve the issue and instead waging war on Kosovo has changed the situation and raised the stakes in the conflict.

“NATO’s credibility and U. S. leadership have been directly challenged by Serbia. NATO will not continue as a credible, unified alliance if the Serbian challenge goes unmet and Serb aggression is not stopped,” Pouliot noted.

The Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States is resolved that in order to bring this conflict to a rapid and successful conclusion on terms favorable to NATO, we will support the United States acting as part of the NATO alliance, taking decisive action with the full range of overwhelming military power.”

The VFW leader said that careful consideration should be given to the formation of a NATO peacekeeping force to guarantee Kosovars’ freedom from further oppression and the right to its self-determination.

Pouliot also urged the president to ensure first, that the American people are behind this effort and then, to take this issue to the United States Congress for its advice and consent.

Dear Mr. President:

The Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States is gravely concerned about the worsening situation in the Balkans. As the combat veterans who for the last 100 years have fought all of our country's wars, we have until now opposed the deployment of U. S. forces to the former Yugoslavia. Our opposition was based on our concern for the safety of our servicemen and women in the midst of the Yugoslav civil war. Also, we have been uncertain what vital U. S. national security interests were at stake in that country's conflict.

Since we took that position, however, the situation has changed. In the past few weeks Serbian leaders have used their military and paramilitary forces to overrun Kosovo, destroy the social and economic fabric of the province and terrorize the populace into flight.

Despite, and in defiance of NATO's diplomatic efforts and its air campaign, Serbia now has achieved its objectives in Kosovo. By doing so it has raised the stakes in this conflict. Having waged unrestricted war on the people and province of Kosovo, NATO's credibility and U. S. leadership have been directly challenged by Serbia. NATO will neither continue as a credible, unified alliance, nor will the U. S. retain its world leadership role if the Serbian challenge goes unmet and Serb aggression is not stopped.

Many of our members are deeply troubled by the situation we face. Some realize the long history of this conflict, the skill of our adversaries, the inhospitable weather and terrain and the political difficulty of maintaining alliance unity are important factors that will affect our actions and their outcomes. Others are mindful of the lessons of past wars. The gradual applications of force that allow adversaries to seize their objectives before our power peaks and the limits placed on the use of our military power which can

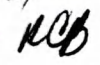

Chet Crocker and Dick Solomon wrote on Crocker's Georgetown letterhead forwarding the conclusions of a U.S. Institute for Peace study group on Kosovo policy options. Among those participating in the study were Mort Abramowitz, Zbig Breziznski, Max Kampelman, Brent Scowcroft, Helmut Sonnenfeldt and Stephen Solarz. The study concludes that nothing short of a ground troop deployment will achieve U.S. goals, as this will either force Milosevic to accept a negotiated solution or provide NATO the military assets to impose one. In reply, you thank Ambassador Crocker for writing and reiterate the confidence that our present military and diplomatic strategy will carry the day.

The U.S. Institute of Peace, for the past several years, has convened diverse experts and practitioners to consider critical issues within our mandate associated with Bosnia and the larger Balkans region in order to contribute to policy deliberations.

As a result of our deep concern about the current situation in Kosovo and its implications for the credibility and effectiveness of U.S. diplomacy and alliance relationships in the region, we recently invited a small group of our colleagues with high level experience in national security management to the Institute to consider some of the options now available to us and how we might be helpful to the President at this time.

The attached paper represents a consensus of this particular group, that we strongly urge for your consideration and that we would very much like the President to see. The paper represents the view of the participants and others who have seen it speaking in their individual capacities (as the Institute of Peace itself does not take specific positions on matters of policy).

The members of the group and others who wish to associate themselves with the attached paper include, in addition to ourselves: Mort Abramowitz, Zbigniew Brzezinski, Max Kampelman, Brent Scowcroft, Helmut Sonnenfeldt, Stephen Solarz. We put this consensus forward in the most constructive and supportive way possible. We would be happy to meet with the President to discuss this further or to convene a larger group of our peers whom we believe also concur with the ideas presented in the paper.

ON SECURING U.S. OBJECTIVES IN KOSOVO

The overall U.S. foreign policy goal in the Balkans is stability and preventing the current crisis from spilling over to neighboring countries.

The Administration has also identified the essential intermediate objectives for resolving the current crisis in and around the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia: removal of Serb security forces from Kosovo, deployment of an international ground force to secure Kosovo and surrounding countries, and the safe return of refugees. This will entail establishment of an international protectorate over Kosovo.

These objectives cannot be met by an air campaign alone. Preparation for the introduction of ground troops at an early date is an urgent necessity in order to secure the objectives for which the air campaign was begun. Nothing short of a ground troop deployment will achieve U.S. goals.

- NATO ground troops operating in coordination with air forces would drive out Yugoslav security forces from Kosovo and create a safe environment for refugees.
- Further delay in deploying ground troops while the air strikes continue will likely allow the Serbs to manipulate perceptions and erode Alliance solidarity and public support.

An end to the Kosovo crisis through a negotiation with Milosevic is not feasible at this time. Efforts to remove the Milosevic regime would be an uncertain and possibly lengthy exercise. A Kosovo settlement imposed by an international military presence, which would include NATO countries, is necessary.

- A settlement negotiated with Milosevic in current circumstances would require ceding some control over Kosovo to Belgrade in order to secure an agreement.
- Milosevic cannot negotiate a settlement on terms acceptable to NATO without risking his own political survival.
- Milosevic is not a reliable negotiating partner; he will neither negotiate in good faith nor abide by the terms of a settlement acceptable to NATO.
- He will use the negotiation process to wear down and divide the Alliance.

Preparing for a ground assault will either force Milosevic to accept a negotiated solution or give NATO the military assets to impose one.

A sustained international military and civilian presence in Kosovo will be required to implement an international protectorate over all of Kosovo that will not only end the current humanitarian crisis but also further the overall goal of regional stability, ensuring the territorial integrity of the neighboring states, and avoiding border changes that would endanger the Dayton accords. The issues of Kosovo independence and Serb sovereignty over Kosovo should not be addressed at this time.

In short, the current situation is not ripe for a negotiated solution. A more robust military intervention is required to create the necessary conditions for imposing a political settlement.

LETTER FOR THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE

Dear Mr. President:

I have today, pursuant to title 10, United States Code, section 12304, authorized the Secretary of Defense, and the Secretary of Transportation with respect to the Coast Guard when it is not operating as a Service in the Department of the Navy, under their respective jurisdictions, to order to active duty any units, and any individual members not assigned to a unit organized to serve as a unit, of the Selected Reserve or essential members of the Individual Ready Reserve. These Reserves will augment the active components in support of Kosovo operations in and around the former Yugoslavia.

I previously authorized Presidential Selected Reserve Callup (PSRC) on 8 December 1995 for the effective conduct of Bosnia peace operations in and around the former Yugoslavia in support of Operations JOINT ENDEAVOR and JOINT GUARD (Executive Order 12982). Additionally, on 24 February 1998, I approved PSRC for Operation DESERT THUNDER for the effective conduct of operations in and around Southwest Asia (Executive Order 13076). These PSRC authorities will remain in effect. However, because the Kosovo operation is distinct from the Bosnia peace operation, a separate PSRC authorization is appropriate.

A copy of the Executive Order implementing this action in support of Kosovo operations is attached.

The Secretary of Defense, and the Secretary of Transportation with respect to the Coast Guard, intend to use the provisions of Executive Order 12728 of August 22, 1990, as necessary, to suspend any provision of law relating to promotion, retirement, or separation. This will apply to any member of the Armed Forces determined to be essential to the national security of the United States. The Secretary of Defense intends to delegate this authority to the Secretaries of the Military Departments.

I have today, pursuant to title 10, United States Code, section 12304, authorized the Secretary of Defense, and the Secretary of Transportation with respect to the Coast Guard when it is not operating as a Service in the Department of the Navy, under their respective jurisdictions, to order to active duty any units, and any individual members not assigned to a unit organized to serve as a unit, of the Selected Reserve or essential members of the Individual Ready Reserve. These Reserves will augment the active components in support of Kosovo operations in and around the former Yugoslavia.

LETTER FOR THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Dear Mr. Speaker:

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A copy of the Executive Order implementing this action in support of Kosovo operations is attached.

The Secretary of Defense, and the Secretary of Transportation with respect to the Coast Guard, intend to use the provisions of Executive Order 12728 of August 22, 1990, as necessary, to suspend any provision of law relating to promotion, retirement, or separation. This will apply to any member of the Armed Forces determined to be essential to the national security of the United States. The Secretary of Defense intends to delegate this authority to the Secretaries of the Military Departments.

EXECUTIVE ORDER

ORDERING THE SELECTED RESERVE AND CERTAIN INDIVIDUAL READY
RESERVE MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES TO ACTIVE DUTY

By the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, including sections 121 and 12304 of title 10, United States Code, I hereby determine that it is necessary to augment the active armed forces of the United States for the effective conduct of Kosovo operations in and around the former Yugoslavia. Further, under the stated authority, I hereby authorize the Secretary of Defense, and the Secretary of Transportation with respect to the Coast Guard when it is not operating as a Service in the Department of the Navy, under their respective jurisdictions, to order to active duty any units, and any individual members not assigned to a unit organized to serve as a unit, of the Selected Reserve, or any member in the Individual Ready Reserve mobilization category and designated as essential under regulations prescribed by the Secretary concerned, and to terminate the service of those units and members ordered to active duty.

This order is intended only to improve the internal management of the executive branch, and is not intended to create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law by a party against the United States, its agencies, its officers, or any person.

This order shall be published in the Federal Register and transmitted promptly to the Congress.
