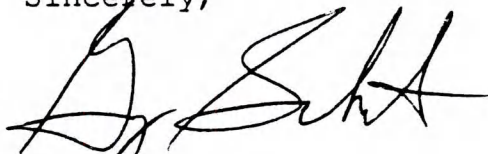
The President asked me to reply to your letter forwarding questions from your constituent James Burdette about NATO's air campaign in Kosovo.

As you know, Secretary General Javier Solana heads NATO and Mr. Jamie Shea acts as spokesperson. With U.S. agreement, the North Atlantic Council gave Secretary General Solana power to authorize the air strikes which began in late March. In accordance with the guidance from the North Atlantic Council, it was also Secretary General Solana who suspended then terminated the air strikes upon Mr. Milosevic's capitulation to NATO conditions. Throughout this period, Secretary General Solana consulted closely with the United States and other Allies and the President maintained national command over U.S. forces.

In Kosovo today, American servicemen and women have been greeted by the local populace with gratitude for restoring stability to their lives, which were very much under threat until our involvement. We believe the affection they feel for the United States and the West is a credit to our actions and will prove decisive in realizing the President's vision of a Europe undivided, democratic, and at peace in the next century. I would welcome your support as we move forward to realize this vision.

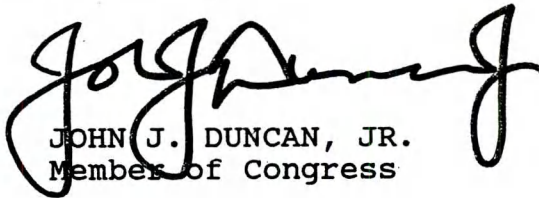

Dear Congressman Duncan:

First, let me say that I supported your efforts (and several other Congressmen) to question the authority of the President to involve the U.S. in military action without previous authorization by the U.S. Congress. I am aware that a Federal Judge denied the request, but would hope that the issue will come up again.

Secondly, my thanks to Mr. Burt Robinson in your office for the detailed information on the structure of N.A.T.O. I must admit that I (as well as others with whom I talk) was naive about the current purpose and structure of N.A.T.O. I have learned something.

However, I am still puzzled about how Mr. Clinton became the spokesperson for N.A.T.O., rather than Secretary-General Solano?

I am also curious about when the 16 members of N.A.T.O. met and voted to start bombing Serbia.

I will appreciate any information your office can provide.

I have been my belief that the civil war between the Serbs and the KLA was a religious war and it is not our responsibility to try to settle religious disagreements. There is no question that Mr. Milosevic is a tyrant, but unfortunately there are others in this world.

I feel that the repeated comments of both Mr. Clinton and Ms. Albright that the U.S.A. is "the world's greatest power" is unwise. I agree with the recent comment of Ex. Secretary of State Eagleberger that the smaller nations will increasingly think of us as "the big bully"!

I will appreciate any information you can provide about the two questions above. Thank you very much in advance for your assistance.
