Dear Attorney General Reno:

I understand from the recent OMB-NSC budget review of Justice agencies that you are currently brainstorming on how best to reorganize the Department of Justice to manage international affairs.

Such a reorganization could go a long to help us address the next generation of threats to our national security. It would be enthusiastically received by the NSC and by other members of the foreign policy team. We have all been increasingly struck by the important, often critical role that your department plays in our foreign policy, whether managing the investigation of terrorist bombings, helping bring war criminals to justice, or building strategies to combat international organized crime in vital regions of the world. Such issues will only increase in importance in the twenty-first century as the effects of globalization become more widespread and national security threats become more unconventional.

From my perspective, the most preferable reorganization would be to create a new Assistant Attorney General for International Affairs. I understand, however, that it might be difficult to persuade the Congress to do so.

I would like to suggest another course that you might take in the meantime. You could forego another Assistant Attorney General for now, and instead create a new bureau headed by an "Assistant to the Attorney General" who is given the rank of Assistant Attorney General. In the past, other departments confronted by similar Congressional attitudes have found that their existing authorities allow such an action. In several instances, Congress has eventually come around and agreed to institutionalize this arrangement by authorizing an additional Assistant Secretary position.

During the budget review, Jim Robinson reported that there are thirteen separate Justice divisions and subordinate agencies involved in international crime programs. I asked him who is responsible for tracking all DoJ activities regarding Russia. There was no clear answer beyond a brief reference to EONS. A

"Assistant to the Attorney General for International Affairs" would provide a clear answer to that question. Such a person could have a staff organized along regional lines to parallel the organization of State, Defense and CIA. Existing DoJ components such as those that manage foreign intelligence, treaties and extradition issues could be folded into such a staff. The Assistant to the Attorney General could provide "one-stop shopping" for the foreign policy community and have the authority to help develop and implement interagency strategies to combat unconventional threats such as international organized crime and terrorism.

Such an arrangement, although not as good as a Congressionally-mandated Assistant Attorney General for International Affairs, is clearly superior to other options that may be under consideration, such as simply expanding EONS or putting international issues under the Office of Justice Programs.

I hope you don't mind my two cents on this subject. If there is anything I can do to help you with this initiative, please give a call.

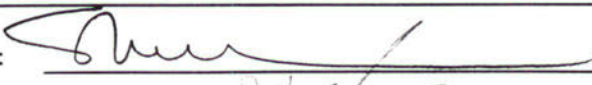

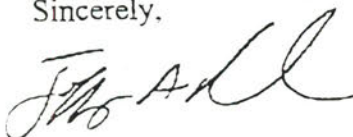
Dear Mr. Simon:

Dear Congressman Chabot:

The "Controlled Substances Trafficking Prohibition Act" (HR 3633) is scheduled for consideration this week. As the Congress prepares to deliberate on the bill, we in the Administration would like to voice our support for this legislation.

Illegal trafficking of prescription drugs exploits a serious loophole in U.S. policy regarding the importation of controlled substances. For example, research conducted by the Texas Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse verifies that several controlled substances are being brought into the U.S. via Mexico in large quantities. Although current regulations limit the personal importation of approved prescription medication to 'personal use amounts,' they do not specify exact amounts which determine personal use quantities. As a result, individuals are importing large quantities of prescription drugs without a valid U.S. prescription or convincing medical purpose. The "Controlled Substances Trafficking Prohibition Act" legislation attempts to clarify the issue.

This legislation would limit the amount of controlled substances an individual may bring into the United States without a prescription or documentation that the medicine was prescribed by a U.S. physician. Because the Act does not change Federal laws that relate to the importation of non-controlled prescription drugs, it would not affect the ability of people to obtain drugs to treat heart disease, cancer or other serious illnesses.

Thank you for your leadership and commitment to the national drug control effort. We look forward to working with you on this and other important drug control proposals.

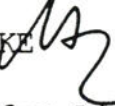
