SUBJECT: Management Consulting Team for UNOSOM

As Mr. Lake discussed with Secretary Christopher and Mr. Berger discussed with you, we believe that we need to make good on the promises of USG support that were made to Jonathan Howe after the President asked that he head the UN Operation in Somalia (UNOSOM).

The USG has a commitment to the UN to help to make UNOSOM work; and we have a commitment to Admiral Howe personally to assist him to set up a functioning organization. Fulfilling those commitments requires more direct action than the normal bureaucratic procedures. It is in that spirit that we hope that you can cause your departments to respond in a cooperative "can do" fashion.

Jon has requested that the US send out a management consulting advisory group (a "tiger team") to examine the structure of the UN civilian headquarters and field operation in Somalia and recommend changes necessary. The Tiger Team would be a USG unit that would be in Somalia for two weeks in April. On the basis of its recommendations, Admiral Howe would institute those changes that he could effect himself and request UN Headquarters to provide him the necessary support where the recommendations exceeded his authority or resources.

The Request: Specifically, we are requesting two types of support. First, we are asking the departments provide high quality personnel with specific skills. In some cases we have identified "By Name Requests" to provide a better idea of the type of people envisioned. I hope that you will personally do what you can to convince the organizations involved to free up indispensable people. (This request is distinct from separate actions soliciting US personnel to be assigned on a reimbursable basis to the UN for longer assignments with UNOSOM.)

Second, we are requesting that the departments fund the travel/TDY costs. Doing so may require that you create a central account, because the offices in which these personnel now serve may not be able to fund their travel.

Attached is a draft table of organization for the Tiger Team, with sources of personnel identified. Please appoint an appropriately "empowered" official to work with me on staffing and dispatching such a team.

Subject: Strategy for Somalia

FOR OFFICIAL USE ONLY

1. Purpose. To readdress USG overarching strategy for Somalia
2. Key Points

- Our purpose in Somalia must be clearly defined.
- The UN and the international community, including the US, must work toward a realistic objective in Somalia: the creation of a viable, relatively democratic, Somali state.
- The UN and the international community must outline the actions to be taken for Somalia to reach this goal.
- Any strategy to resolve the Somalia situation must combine three inextricably linked components of military/ security operations, humanitarian/ rehabilitation actions, and political/ diplomatic efforts.
- The USG must energize the UN to take necessary action. The USG has neither the resources, nor vital interests at stake, to justify taking unilateral action.

3. Discussion

- Our purpose in Somalia is to avert further humanitarian catastrophe, make the UN peacekeeping effort successful, and facilitate regional stability in the Horn.
- The goal at the end of three years should be a decentralized and relatively democratic Somalia, which enjoys relative stability with limited outside humanitarian and economic intervention.
- UNITAF has provided a secure environment for the delivery of humanitarian relief in south central Somalia, and mass starvation has subsided. Yet, security is fragile, humanitarian needs are great, and faction leaders, who crave personal power, continue to vie for political roles.
- Progress in security and humanitarian relief is changing the Somali environment, but the political "leg" is lagging behind. A "bottom-up" approach has worked reasonably well to improve local security conditions and to provide emergency relief to those most at risk in Somalia. However, continued progress is contingent upon reaching a degree of political consensus at the local, regional, and national levels. All three levels must be worked simultaneously, while focusing in the short term on local and regional political organization.

The overall security situation in Somalia has significantly improved, particularly in the cities of south central Somalia, where UNITAF forces have been operating since December 1992. This has greatly facilitated the delivery of humanitarian relief and has reduced the power of the warlords, who have relied on military might for their authority. Much remains to be done.

• **SHORT-TERM (MARCH-JUNE 1993).** Transition from UNITAF to UNOSOM II should begin in March 1993 with passage of a UNSC resolution authorizing UNOSOM II. The UN Secretary General has recommended up to 28,000 troops for UNOSOM II, and sufficient troops have been promised to the UN for this mission. UNOSOM II should assume full responsibility from UNITAF by June 1993.

UNITAF has encouraged the formation of Somali local auxiliary police forces to relieve UNITAF troops of non-military responsibilities and to start transferring some responsibility for Somali security back to native Somalis. This program has been reasonably successful. By April 1993 the UN must begin to (1) staff its police training and force development organization (UNCIVPOL), (2) reconstruct police training facilities, (3) begin refresher training for ex-policemen, and (4) identify the trainees for the first police academy class. By May 1993 supervision of the auxiliary local police forces should be transferred fully to UNOSOM.

• **MID-TERM (JULY 1993-JUNE 1994).** The UNOSOM II military forces will consolidate and expand security throughout the country. They should move into border areas and northern Somalia between July and November 1993, which will facilitate the repatriation of refugees. While the US land-based quick reaction force will likely withdraw during this period, the US will continue to provide a quick reaction capability for an undefined period. US support forces in UNOSOM II will gradually decrease as the UN hires civilian contractors to perform support functions. UNOSOM II should begin to transfer security responsibilities to civilian institutions. Regional police force organizations should be developed as administrative structures are established on the regional level. By September 1993 formal training should begin at the police academy, producing its first graduates in June 1994.

• **LONG-TERM (JULY 1994-DECEMBER 1995).** The full transfer of security responsibility to civilian institutions will be the final UN security role in Somalia. Reduction and redeployment of UNOSOM II military forces should commence by July 1994. This drawdown will depend on UNOSOM's success in disarmament, reducing factional violence, and establishing an effective Somali police force. An appropriately armed Somali Border Patrol should assume responsibility for its borders. The rule of law and its enforcement will require civilian bodies to make and approve laws, and to man, train, and pay a police force deployed throughout the country to enforce the laws. This will then allow the Somalis to provide for their own security, phasing UNOSOM II military forces out of Somalia by December 1995.

While the worst of the humanitarian emergency is over, many Somalis remain at risk. Food and medical supplies are needed in the rural areas. Economic reconstruction is needed to revitalize livestock and agricultural production. Land and assets must be redistributed. Subsistence and commercial farming must be rejuvenated. Farmers must return to their fields with seeds, fertilizer, and implements to produce a good harvest. The unemployed need jobs, refugees must be repatriated, and international trade promoted.

• **SHORT-TERM (MARCH-JUNE 1993).** Airlift of emergency supplies phase out, as major road repairs are completed and security is adequate to move supplies by ground transportation. Seeds, fertilizers, and tools are distributed for planting during primary rainy season. Vaccination programs and veterinary services are introduced to build livestock. Monetization programs expand to replace free distribution of food. Private importers gain increased access to secure port areas, as UNOSOM operated authorities establish control of the ports. Guidelines are established on tariffs and taxes. UNOSOM II officials work in close coordination with NGOs in relief and rehabilitation activities. Health delivery programs and efforts to open schools expand.

• **MID-TERM (JULY 1993-JUNE 1994).** Relief programs end during this period, as the rehabilitation phase picks up speed. Monetary authorities are established to stabilize currency and facilitate foreign exchange transactions. Technical councils are formed to address health, education, livestock, agriculture, commerce, tariffs and taxation rules. UNOSOM passes port management and control to local/regional port authorities. Locally managed livestock inspection and certification facilities are established at major ports. Schools and orphanages open. Emergency health care transitions to preventive programs. Supplementary feeding centers are phased out. A major effort is launched to bring back skilled Somalis. Jobs are created for the demobilized militias. Demining programs expand throughout the country. The internally displaced and refugees return home. Major irrigation systems and wells are repaired. An International Reconstruction Consortium for Somalia is formed by the end of the year under World Bank leadership.

• **LONG-TERM (JULY 1994-DECEMBER 1995).** Food distribution and other emergency programs are reduced to small pockets. UNOSOM II works more with local and regional authorities than with NGOs in providing assistance for public works. Private enterprise takes over functions earlier performed by international NGOs. Domestic production and trade return to near average levels from mid-80s, and reduce the need for donated food assistance to one third of the total national need.

Prospects for a new Somali political order are limited, but an approach that initially emphasizes the rebuilding of local and regional administrative structures has the best chance of succeeding. This strategy does not preclude the reconstitution of "national" administrative entities, such as a judicial system, telecommunications, and a postal system. It must also recognize that the current factional leaders will continue to play a role in Somalia and we should be prepared to work with them in the short term. UNOSOM II must continue to neutralize the warlords and permit legitimate political leaders and organizations to assert themselves.

- **SHORT TERM (MARCH-JUNE 1993).** The UN establishes credibility in the staffing and initial actions of UNOSOM II. The Addis Ababa (II) political reconciliation conference does not result in a comprehensive settlement between the warring clans. Permanent Working Groups are established to sort out political, security and rehabilitation issues. Local leaders and community groups persuade some of the factions to support initiatives on local and regional reconciliation and rehabilitation programs. Addis II yields further commitment from Somali factions to finalize implementation of ceasefire and disarmament provisions of Addis I accords. UNOSOM II enforces these provisions, as local broad-based committees marginalize the authority of local warlords.
- **MID-TERM (JULY 1993-JUNE 1994).** All UNOSOM II regional and subregional offices are in place. Active outreach brings Somalis into the political process. Somali leadership is visible in local and regional political process. A drafting committee is selected to draw up a new Somali constitution. A National reconciliation Conference is held (including Somaliland, if only as observers), bringing together representatives of regional administrations. Working groups are established to outline formation of a national administration.
- **LONG-TERM (JULY 1994-DECEMBER 1995).** Factions agree on specifics for the formation of an interim national administration. UN and international community provide technical assistance to draw up governing instruments for interim government. OAU and/or Arab League accept responsibility for monitoring its implementation. Extensive civic education program is undertaken to prepare populace for national elections. Elections are held under auspices of UN and regional organizations. An interim government is formed. UNOSOM II support staff shrinks, as Somalis manage their own communities. UNOSOM II mandate expires, but assistance agencies remain with NGO counterparts in Somalia.

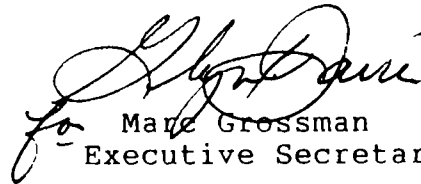

7 APRIL 1993

1. You have asked us to examine the potential shortfall between the logistics capabilities the US currently intends to retain in Somalia to support UNOSOM II and our own assessment of our requirements.

2. A progress report passed to New York about a week ago reached the following conclusion, "what they are proposing to leave in place is a limited divisional logistic capability with a 25% divisional engineering strength. In our view, this structure will only be able to support fully second line capable self sufficient brigades in the south, with insufficient space capacity to fill missing brigade support elements and no realistic capacity to support the center and north". We are still in the process of validating the concerns expressed in the above assessment, but I want to flag the following issues based on two meetings I have held in the last 24 hours with UNITAF and UNOSOM personnel.

A. Capability in South (Current UNITAF Area). While the US is leaving behind a capability (2300 in number) which they have calculated will support a divisional strength force (10000). This calculation was based on an assumption by UNITAF that the remaining brigades would be complete with their logistic support elements and that the ration support would be field rations (MRE) only.

B. Capability to Expand (Center, North and Kenyan Borders South). In view of the capability gaps in the current UNITAF area it is likely that expansion on the mission can only take place once the southern position has been consolidated. As additional forces arrive, we will only be able to deploy them North if the requisite support elements are available (e.g. engineering).

C. Engineers. Of all the capability gaps, the most acute is in engineering. Early assessment suggests that what UNITAF plans to leave would be barely capable of maintaining the status quo in the current UNITAF area. With the Monsoon imminent even this is questionable. I understand your military staff has already made a request to re-configure the German contribution to a mix of engineers and logistic support companies. This will be essential if UNOSOM it is to be in a position to expand beyond UNITAF confines.

D. Medical. In view of the apparent intention of the Swedish field hospital to withdraw by early July, the Mogadishu area may well have inadequate medical capability. Until the capability of the medical units being contributed by Argentina, Greece, Hungary and Oman is confirmed, there may be some gaps. In addition, we are concerned about restraining adequate Medevac helicopters.

3. The fundamental problem we have is that we are still several weeks away from identifying specifically what we need. At the same time, in the absence of more specificity, UNITAF has taken a "bare bones" approach to our anticipated needs. In view of the limited (in scope and mission) though capable support being left by the US, we should leave open the channels with the US and ask for an option to request assistance to fill any critical gaps which remain once our situation is clearer. The need for more US engineer support is likely.

4. We will work this problem hard and let you know as soon as possible what specific shortfalls must be filled. We also will be assessing other support areas -- communications, special forces, psychological operations, air surveillance, and helo and fixed wing lift.
