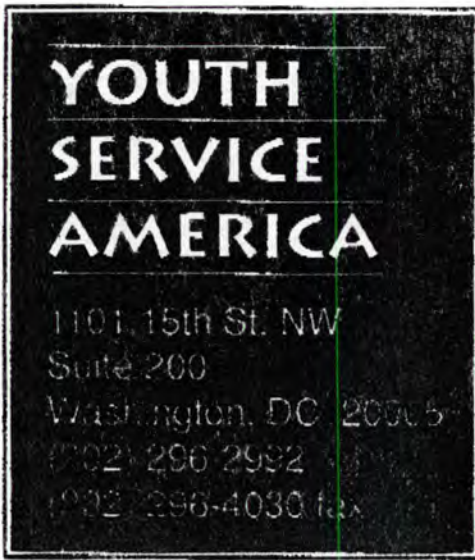

MEMORANDUM

5 March 1993

TO: Rick, Jack Gloria
FROM: Susan
RE: meetings with constituents

We need a plan for meeting with various constituency groups to discuss the outline of the legislation.
