Here is the information about the Highbridge Community Life Center in the Bronx. Depending on what time of day Eli is available, we will work with the project director to make sure that Eli sees VISTA Summer Associates in action and he gets a chance to meet with them.

Ten VISTA Summer Associates at Highbridge Community Life Center are working at four sites providing family support services. They are running day camps for children, forming family support groups for homeless people and providing child care for mothers while they are in the support groups. Associates also assist with a nurses aid training program.

Two Summer Associates chaperon twenty children to a free week-long camp in upstate New York.

The Summer Associates come from many different backgrounds:

- a women from Queens who attends Brown University
- a man who attends Dominican College in Rockland county
- 3 women who live in the area in which they serve
- 2 G.E.D. graduates who will attend college in the fall
- a former peace corps volunteer from the midwest

This project is the largest RSVP project in the United States, encompassing all five Boroughs of New York City. It has over 9,500 volunteers.

ACTION'S MISSION

To guarantee voluntary citizen participation in addressing the needs of American communities, particularly those of the poor, the disadvantaged and the elderly.

Examples of Project Components:

- In Manhattan, the RSVP/Caring about Neighbors Program provides assistance to the frail elderly continuing to live, independently, in their own homes. RSVP volunteers are trained on major health risks, nutrition, exercise and fitness, mental health and entitlements. This provides an opportunity for the active, well elderly to help the frail elderly develop mechanics to function better while living independently.
- On Staten Island, intergenerational relationships are developed in a program serving teenage mothers and their children. At the Good Counsel Home, young mothers participate in RSVP structured activities which enable them to learn necessary skills while, simultaneously, developing relationships with the older, caring population. Examples of activities are sewing groups, tutoring, cooking, nutrition classes, parenting and child care, etc.
- RSVP volunteers work with teenage runaways and drug abusers in a structured setting at The Safespace in Manhattan. This program has the cooperation of New York City's social services and the police department.
- In the Bronx and Brooklyn, RSVP volunteers are trained and serve as Nursing Home Ombudsmen Aids for nursing home residents.
- On Staten Island, about 30 RSVP volunteers work with Project Alert with the school system. Volunteers focus on cultural diversity, to diminish problems of racism, sexism, and ageism. This is an intergenerational program that takes a positive approach to cultural diversity.
- In the South Bronx, the RSVP Grandfriend Program works with five Head Start programs, providing mentors, tutors, and role models.
- Throughout the city, about 150 volunteers, working through area hospitals, have been specifically trained to assist seniors deal more efficiently with various entitlement programs. This component, Project ACES, provides screening for entitlements and referrals, matching individual client needs to specific agencies and organizations.

• The RSVP AIDS Services Project has about 50 volunteers in a comprehensive program designed to serve HIV affected families and babies, as well as babies affected from drug addicted parents. This Project has been separately funded from varied private grants -- \$10,000 from the Morgan Guaranteed Trust Bank, \$10,000 from Ronald McDonald Children's Charities, \$5,000 from the Rapport Foundation, and \$2,000 from the Gay Men's Health Alliance. The volunteers serve with a group home for HIV children and five municipal hospitals, primarily Harlem, Bronx Memorial and Lincoln Hospitals. RSVP provides respite care wherever the babies are placed. Volunteers work with Respite Care for HIV families, through various community-based programs and through a special program in conjunction with New York Hospital.

Attached is a brief overview of the eleven projects which ACTION has recently awarded to demonstrate a promising intergenerational volunteer strategy. These one-year projects are funded under the ACTION Special Volunteer Program authority (Title I, Part C of the Domestic Volunteer Service Act).

Each of these projects is managed by a local non-profit senior volunteer organization which has established partnerships with local youth-serving groups. The projects will create opportunities for senior volunteers to work side-by-side with youth volunteers to respond to specific community problems identified by the grantee. Projects all begin this month, and each will ensure that substantial volunteer activity occurs during the summer months.

Many of these children who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless are from area hotels, shelters, and transitional housing units in Newark and the vicinity.

Associates are working with children in areas that include recreation, drug prevention and mentoring. Ten (10) summer associates are working with four (4) full-year VISTA's at Project READ to expand literacy services in Newark and Essex County. Volunteers are providing one-on-one tutoring assistance, conducting surveys, designing promotional materials and creating a database.

Volunteers are teaching literacy skills to adults who have tested below a fifth grade reading level.

Associates are conducting surveys at churches to determine the literacy needs of the community. Volunteers are designing and producing new promotional materials, such as informational brochures for tutors, and flyers and door-hangers for potential students.

Volunteers are creating a database of potential underwriters of grants to which Project READ may apply. This will enable the staff to continue the grant process upon the completion of their service. Moreover, the results of research completed by associates on adults with learning disabilities will be included in a newsletter to tutors, many of whom are tutoring students with such disabilities.

VSA's are planning special events such as a celebrity dinner, a festival for literacy and a door-to-door campaign on literacy. The door-to-door campaign involves canvassing neighborhoods and distributing literature. Local Boys and Girls Scouts will participate in the effort.

Founded in 1975, Project READ is an adult literacy program that has trained over 1,500 volunteer tutors who have impacted the lives of over 1000 adult non and low-level readers. In 1987-88, with the help of VISTA Volunteers, they conducted an intensive tutoring program demonstrating that learning can be accelerated up to 3 to 6 times faster with daily tutoring.

More recent accomplishments of full-year VISTA Volunteers include the publishing of BILLY WARD, a book written by an adult literacy student with the assistance of VISTA Volunteers. Also in 1992, new Parent Literacy Awareness workshops were developed by VISTA Volunteers in order to support families with their children's literacy needs.

Highbridge Community Life Center Bronx, NY (Literacy/Nutrition)

Ten (10) summer associates are working with full-year VISTA's to address the issues of literacy and homelessness. Associates are recruiting community volunteers that will continue to volunteer after the associates have completed their service. Volunteers are conducting workshops in nutrition and exercise, serving as mentors and setting up training programs to provide overnight experiences for inner city youth. Younger children age 9-13 attend overnight camps from Monday to Friday in upstate New York. Teenagers age 13-17 participate in 3 to 4 night camping and hiking trips.

Associates have designed and distributed 5000 flyers to 16-21 year olds in the community who have dropped out of school. Volunteers have recruited 100 people who have expressed an interest in enrolling in September literacy classes.

Volunteers have recruited ten volunteers from the community to assist in the planning and implementing of three one-day workshops (9 a.m. to 3 p.m. for 50 people on nutrition, exercise, available services) and managing workshops for youth who are becoming independent of their families.

VSA's are mentoring and tutoring 125 youth (age 7 to 13), enrolled in the summer day camps, in basic communication and reading skills. They are also assisting in the distribution of USDA emergency food by identifying 125 eligible children.

Associates are enabling 40 recently homeless families to relocate to the Highbridge community by establishing: four support groups for parents, a child care program for youth; and a resource manual listing all community services.

Highbridge Center has been serving the low income community in the south Bronx for 10 years. The mission of the Center is to enable residents to take more complete control of their own lives and to use their new found strength to improve the life of their family and neighbors. The Center offers career counseling, training programs for recipients of public assistance, courses in job preparation, and job fairs.

Ten (10) summer associates are working with full-year VISTA's at Restoration Safe Haven, an education and drug prevention initiative designed to turn 200 youth (ages 6-14) away from drugs annually. Associates are working to expand the after school and Saturday programs into a summer day camp and lunch program. The summer program offers opportunities to at-risk youth in visual arts, drama, music, and summer tutorials. It also includes testing of youth to determine their academic needs. Summer Associates are establishing one-on-one relationships as mentors while fostering the involvement and support of parents.

Each associate is leading a group of 10-20 youths in planning, developing and implementing a community project. Black Veterans for Social Justice, Inc. Brooklyn, NY (Homeless)

Eight (8) summer associates are working with three (3) full year VISTA's identifying and providing services to over 50 homeless families who currently reside in city shelters or transitional housing units. Services include housing, health care, education and economic support gearing toward children who are at risk.

Every Tuesday and Wednesday the associates make site visits to 25 shelters around the area to their 50 families. The associates research where the families can go after they have left the shelters. Then they inform them about Public Housing, submitting Section 8 applications and the Emergency Apartment Rental Program (EARP) when they are ready to live on their own.

Two (2) of the associates identify youth who may be at risk of dropping out of school, violent activities, drug use or teen pregnancy in the shelter and recruit them to join their class which meets every Wednesday. 25 youths have signed up for the class, they are tutored, play games and take field trips.

Associates assist the families involved in negotiations with H.R.A. and other City, State and Federal agencies in regards to any and all entitlements in order to help them get out of the shelter.

This organization, founded in 1979, was formed to be the center for the veteran community services by assisting veterans and their families in the areas of housing, employment, self-appraisal and goal development. They have purchased a 20 unit building to house homeless veterans, established a HIV/AIDS outreach program and drug and alcohol abuse referral.

YMCA of Metropolitan Atlanta, Inc. Atlanta, GA (Literacy)

Ten (10) summer associates are working with full-year VISTA'S to recruit community volunteers to assist in coordinating summer programs aimed at improving reading skills of 300 high risk youth between the ages of 7-17. The program operates at five YMCA Summer Day Camp sites and is designed to offer participants violence prevention and employment training.

Traditional YMCA programs such as sports, swimming, camping and teen/peer leadership groups are woven into the literacy Program. Emphasis is placed on involving the family in supportive learning and recreation, emphasizing the need for a strong family nucleus.

Each associate is recruiting community volunteers to continue their work when his/her service is completed at the end of the summer. Ten community volunteers are being recruited to conduct two sessions each month on conflict resolution techniques; five volunteers to assist in providing and coordinating services for 100 low-income and at-risk youth identified as reading disabled; and ten volunteers to conduct a monthly session on job interviewing techniques. Each associate is also making five job referrals/placements per week.

Associates have tested the reading levels of 149 children so far. Each volunteer is tutoring five reading disabled youth per week.

The YMCA seeks to develop self-esteem through youth programs, strengthen families and encourage a strong sense of community in neighborhoods.

Dear Senator Graham:

As the anniversary of Hurricane Andrew approaches we have had the opportunity to look back at our accomplishments in rebuilding South Dade. One of the most significant components of the United Way's recovery program has been carried out by fifteen Volunteers In Service To America (VISTAs). Last September, United Way of Dade County received a one year \$230,000 grant from ACTION for the VISTA Program. This grant represents a new approach to volunteer disaster response; fifteen volunteers were assigned directly to United Way to mobilize community volunteers, rather than working with agencies.

The VISTA Program was designed to draw on the strength of the existing United Way Volunteer Center and benefit by added support from ACTION. Working in concert with the Volunteer Center, the VISTAs have mobilized thousands of volunteers from the community and around the world to meet the needs of hurricane victims. Volunteers have put on numerous temporary roofs, rebuilt churches and day care centers, and served as catalysts in bringing services to low-income neighborhoods.

The initial funding period was one year, but the needs of hurricane victims are still not met. We hope that the cooperative effort between ACTION and the United Way will be extended. As shown in the enclosed evaluation report, the VISTA Project is needed because it works and is cost effective. VISTA Volunteers are also featured in the enclosed 1992-93 United Way Annual Report. A copy of our grant renewal application will be sent to you shortly.

The need to extend the VISTA Project can be seen through the experience of VISTAs working with children at the FEMA Royal Colonial trailer park. Legacies of the hurricane are abundant. Kids visibly cower during afternoon thunderstorms. When one child drew a picture of his house it was barely recognizable; it looked like burnt sticks. He laughed sadly as he took scissors, cut his picture, and said, "Look! My house broke." This child's sense of security and well being was


