This is in response to your memo of March 30. We are in the process of planning activities for National Volunteer Week, including a possible departmental observance here at the Humphrey Building where the Secretary would present awards to outstanding employee volunteers. The event is tentatively scheduled for April 21. We will keep you posted on this.

Also, we are looking at an idea in the D.C. area on April 22 which would be a bridge between National Volunteer Week and immunization week, which is the following week. This would be a visit to some type of child health-related site which would be the basis for dramatizing the use of national service participants and other volunteers in the immunization process.

On the other question in your memo, the Secretary would be glad to serve as a surrogate speaker in conjunction with the introduction of the President's legislative package on national service. She has one event scheduled now -- a speech at the investiture of the new President of Tufts University on April 25 -- which she plans to use to discuss national service regardless of the timing of the legislation. If the legislation is coming out then, the timing will be precisely right. She would of course be pleased to consider other places to speak as well, particularly if the April 25 date is not the right timing for the legislative package.

The DC Service Corps, a spin-off of City Year, employs 100 diverse youth for a year to engage in service to the DC community.

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of the event is to recognize National Youth Service Day (which occurs annually during National Volunteer Week), and to honor 118 young D.C.-area community service leaders who have been selected to be "Tomorrow's Leaders Today" by Public Allies.

II. BACKGROUND

As you remember, you attended the Public Allies' "Tomorrow's Leaders Today" event last year during the campaign on National Youth Service Day. In your remarks before that event audience, you told Vanessa Kirsch (Public Allies president) that you would hold her event this year at the White House.

Public Allies is a young public interest organization based in Washington D.C. (founded with the assistance of Bob Boorstin and Peter Hart). The organization recruits and places diverse young people with leadership potential in full-time, year-long apprenticeships with community-based organizations, public interest groups, citizen groups, and government agencies.

The other organization, Youth Service America (YSA), is the public information arm of an umbrella group of national service organizations. YSA founded and sponsors National Youth Service Day (part of National Volunteer Week) in conjunction with the U.S. Conference of Mayors, the Commission on National and Community Service, and others.

At one point, serious consideration was given to expanding this event to include the President introducing his National Service legislation. The legislative launch has been moved back a week - possibly as the focus of the 100th day.

In addition to this event, other service hits during the week include the President attending a Rose Garden ceremony on Thursday honoring "The President's National Volunteer Action Award Winners" (previously the "Points of Light" awards); and several Cabinet members doing service or honoring volunteers throughout the week in the D.C. area. Eli Segal hopes to use these hits to preview the messages of the upcoming legislation.

VI. REMARKS

Remarks might include the following: 1) recognize the local young people being honored who have demonstrated a remarkable commitment to their community; 2) provide examples of young people doing service on National Youth Service Day throughout the country; and 3) briefly discuss the key messages of the upcoming National Service legislation which will probably be introduced next week. Attached is information on the honorees; the examples of service; and the legislation.

TALKING POINTS FOR THE PUBLIC ALLIES/YOUTH SERVICE AMERICA EVENT

NATIONAL YOUTH SERVICE DAY:

o On National Youth Service Day, Public Allies, Youth Service America, and the White House are honoring more than 100 outstanding young people from the District of Columbia who have been leaders in bringing about change in their community.

(See attached information on the six young community leaders who have been selected by Public Allies to speak briefly at the event.)

EXAMPLES OF SERVICE EVENTS NATIONWIDE ON YOUTH SERVICE DAY:

o This year, there are half a million young leaders like those being honored by Public Allies who will be celebrating National Youth Service Day in big cities and small towns nationwide.

o More than 3,000 organizations, municipalities, and communities -- representing every state -- are recognizing the vital contributions of young people who are committed to community service as a way of getting things done.

- * In Miami, Florida -- young people from around the country, including members of the D.C. Service Corps, are working to reconstruct Homestead, Florida -- one of the areas hardest hit by Hurricane Andrew.
- * In Los Angeles, California -- over 100 seventh-graders from South Central Los Angeles are planting, painting, landscaping and gardening at area grade schools.
- * In Scranton Pennsylvania -- the city has organized a city-wide day of service by young people and others who will refurbish a house with Habitat for Humanity,
- * In New York City -- 150 community youth will fan out across the city planting community gardens, restoring nature trails, and distributing food to people who are hungry and homeless.

THE PRESIDENT'S UPCOMING NATIONAL SERVICE LEGISLATION

o The President's national service legislation will be introduced by the President shortly.

o The President's program will expand **educational opportunity**, reward **individual responsibility**, and **build the American community** by bringing citizens together to tackle common problems.

* **Opportunity:** We are going to make it easier for everyone to go to college by making it simpler to both get a college loan and to pay it back.

* **Responsibility:** We will be offering our young people more, but when your country gives you something -- we want you to give something back.

* **Community:** Together we will tackle our country's problems. Young people will be able to pay for college by serving their country for a year or two, doing the work our country needs. Young people will keep schools open late to keep kids off the street. They will take care of older Americans who want to stay in their homes. They will work with police officers to root out those who would give drugs to our children. And they will restore our parks to protect our fragile environment.

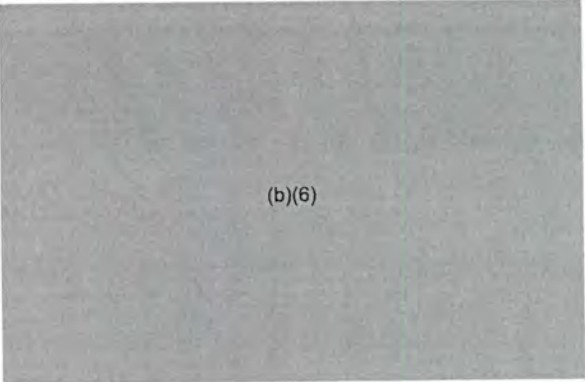
