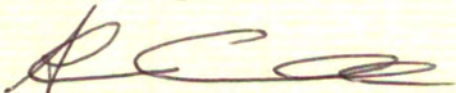
Dear Ms. Stroud,

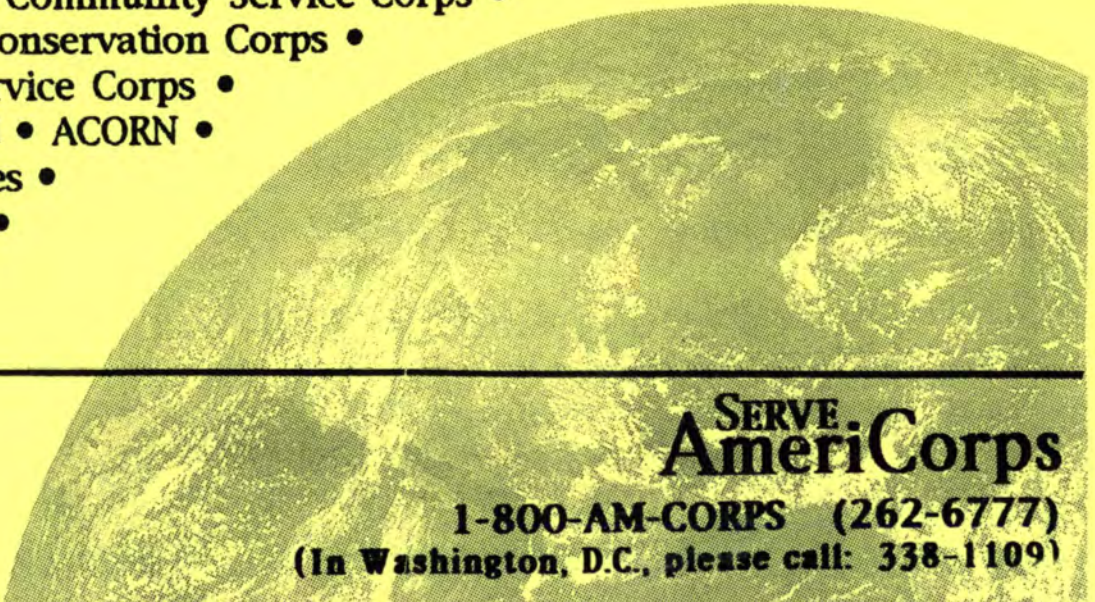
