The two year technical college system in New Hampshire has recently submitted a proposal to the Commission on National and Community Service for a Higher Education Innovative Project which spotlights the role of the seven two year colleges as local clearinghouses for community service opportunities via an electronic bulletin board network. The project also provides for the integration of community service into regular curricula and pilot testing other models for involving students in service learning activities in cooperation with Phi Theta Kappa, the national two year student honor society.

As part of the overall project, the NH Technical College system would like to be selected as a pilot site to test and evaluate the concept of community service and student loan deferment. New Hampshire offers an ideal location to examine the particular special needs of students in two year colleges who are more typically part-time, older, working, and supporting families. Increasing numbers of the two year college population depend on student loans to finance their education. The option of community service as a means to repay loans for the two year college student, who is frequently a non-traditional student, warrants special study as part of the overall public policy formulation.

Others in New Hampshire are also very interested in the community service -student loan connection including the NH Higher Education Assistance Foundation.
