By providing education, outreach, training, orientation and on-going evaluations, D.C. Cares provides a vital connection between volunteers and community service organizations throughout the greater Washington area.

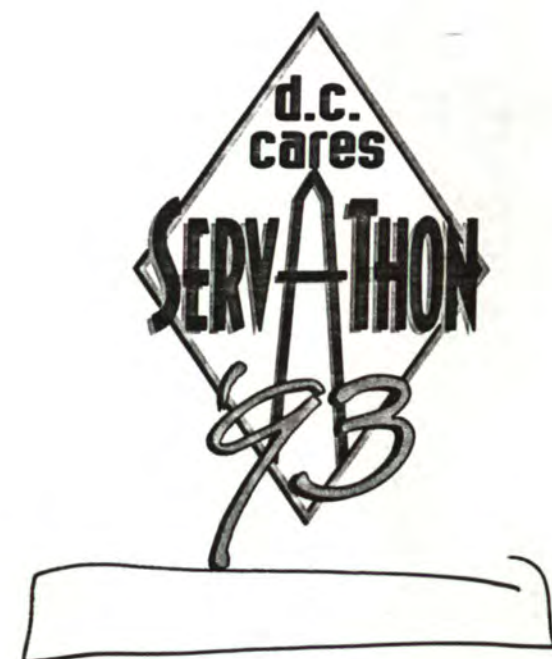
