It is a pleasure to have this opportunity to tell you about my youth service involvement in Washington State and to express my enthusiasm and interest in your national youth service program.

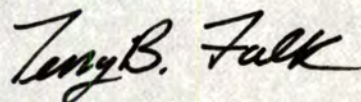
The Washington Service Corps assignment I am performing is with the Cowlitz Substance Abuse Coalition. This is a community mobilization against substance abuse effort which addresses all facets of substance abuse prevention and education. My particular assignment has allowed me to work with young people in the community, especially those at-risk.

Some of the activities I have planned and implemented include a child safety and crime prevention program with free fingerprinting of children, conducting a risk assessment of our county using data related to crime and social service uses, and coordinating numerous events for teens and other community members to promote awareness about substance abuse and enhance the community's protective factors against the abuse of alcohol and other drugs.

Youth service on a national level could well be patterned after the Washington Service Corps model. The Corps members give meaningful service to the community and at the same time learn how to be productive members of society. The educational funding component of our program makes it possible for many Corps members to gain access to higher education, which they may not have otherwise been able to do. I plan to pursue a career in secondary education, particularly working with youth at-risk.

I would feel very privileged to have the opportunity to participate in the Summer of Service program. I look forward to hearing from you.
