The following list includes the members who have left our AmeriCorps program early, their reason for leaving, and whether or not they were recommended for the pro-rated educational award:

Marilyn Ceaser, SSN: [REDACTED] - Mutual decision to terminate the program early due to lack of attendance and participation. She **was not** determined eligible for a pro-rated educational award.

Olivia Alcaire, SSN: [REDACTED] - Left due to an opportunity to fill an archaeological position in Mexico and advance her career. She **was not** determined eligible for a pro-rated educational award.

Cassondra Rutherford, SSN: [REDACTED] - Left to pursue her opera career, which required travelling, attendance at conferences, and opera performances. Her commitments required complete concentration and extensive use of her time. She **was not** determined eligible for a pro-rated educational award.

Grayson Hashida, SSN: [REDACTED] - His mother in Hawaii became extremely ill and required daily care. He quit school and EnviroCorps and moved to Hawaii to care for her. He **was** determined eligible for the pro-rated educational award.

EnviroCorps is concerned about ensuring that all of our members, and in the broader sense as well that all AmeriCorps members, are being treated fairly and equally. Any further guidance you can provide as a result of this survey would be helpful for us with the following situation:

One of our current members, Avis Dunas, SSN: [REDACTED] will be unable to complete the 900 service hours required by part time members this year. Several reasons account for her lack of hours, including illness and inability to work long hours due to her age (she is 66). She has also lost hours due to a variety of other reasons, some of which are not clearly excusable. Existing policies regarding eligibility for pro-rated awards have **been** explained to her. I have asked her to write a letter to the EnviroCorps Management Team **explaining** why she feels her situation would fall under the "compelling personal circumstances" clause for receiving a pro-rated award. At this time, we are awaiting the letter.

Rogue River AmeriCorps has 3 Members that are requesting a pro-rated education award based on compelling personal circumstances. Please review and advise of your decision.

DAVE KATELEY

(b)(6)

Dave completed 1580 hours of service. He hurt his back on the job. He performed light duty for 2 weeks. He attempted to return to work several times. His condition did not improve and his doctor recommended that he not finish the program. Dave is an exceptional Member and a hard worker.

RECOMMENDATION: Grant a pro-rated award for the full 1580 hours of service.

JUSTIN WILLS

Justin has completed 1613 hours of service. He has had a difficult time with poison oak this season. He missed several days of work in addition to his 40 hours of excused leave. This case is a difficult one. Rogue River AmeriCorps has provided numerous opportunities for Justin to make up his hours. We have provided work on the weekends. We have given him the opportunity to volunteer for the local city and county parks. He would sign up for the projects and then he would not show up. He has made no real effort to make up the hours that he has missed. On numerous occasions, I personally reminded him of the hours that he needed in order to successfully complete the program. He was aware that I could not justify a partial award if he did not make an effort to complete the hours. Two days before graduation, he provided me with the attached letter. He had made no previous efforts to advise me of his reasons for missing work or his intentions to make up the work. I feel that he has counted on the fact that his award would be pro-rated, even though I have told him on numerous occasions that a pro-rated award was not possible in his case. On the job site, Justin is a very hard worker. He is respected by his peers for his abilities and persistence.

RECOMMENDATION: Grant a part-time award of \$2362.50. I would not be comfortable with giving him a pro-rated award because I do not feel that he attempted to make up the hours. Other Members had more hours than he did to make up, and they ALL have successfully completed the program requirements.

LAUREL ALEXANIAN

Laurel has completed 899 hours of service. By the end of this fiscal year, she will have completed 1019 hours of service. She was in a very serious automobile accident. She suffered multiple injuries. She has had 3 surgeries on her leg. Laurel is currently recovering, and is expected to have full use of her leg in 6-12 months. 8 weeks ago, she asked if she could return to the program. She volunteered to perform light duty in whatever capacity possible. She is currently working with the public and assisting in interpretive services on the forest. Laurel is an outstanding individual and is highly respected by all who have had the opportunity to work with her.

RECOMMENDATION: Grant a pro-rated award for the total number of hours completed. (Laurel has not yet completed her End of Service form.)

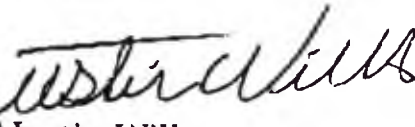

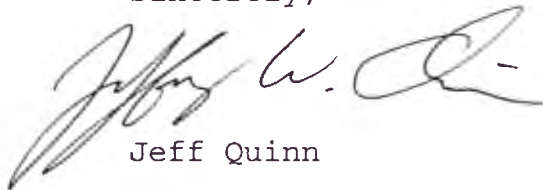

I regretfully inform you that as of 1 July 1995 I resign my position with AmeriCorps. Compelling circumstances will force me to leave the AmeriCorps program early. Therefore, I wish to be considered for a pro-rated educational award. Flooding on the White River, Arkansas, necessitates that I begin graduate research early on 1 July, 1995. To choose not to do so at this time would jeopardize the integrity of my research, and thus obtaining a master's degree. To complicate matters, I began the Americorps program 6-7 weeks late. Originally, I was not to start graduate school until August 15, 1995. In order to do so with my late start, I worked most of my days off and numerous Saturdays. In other words, I have already put forth extraordinary effort to complete my tour of duty. For these three compelling personal reasons: my inability to control flooding, my beginning the program late, and the extraordinary measures I have already taken to complete the program, I believe I should be considered for such an adjusted educational award.

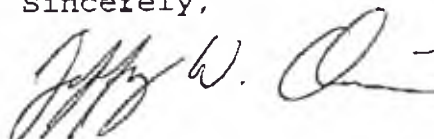
Dear Joyce,

In our past discussions, you stated that the "new" Americorps manual lists that "returning to school" is not a compelling circumstance to allow me to obtain a stipend. I wish to state that I am not leaving for schooling, but due to a change in schedule of my graduate research. School does not start until late August, so there is a definite difference. It is the schedule of my research which is causing me to resign early. There is a distinct difference between leaving for schooling and graduate research. I hope you will bring up that aspect to other Americorps authorities.

I question whether the authors of the manuals have taken into account the details of graduate school admittance when making their "returning to school" rule. In fact, I believe the rule was made because most individuals may return to school at any time. Undergraduates, once admitted may return anytime to complete schooling, whereas funded graduate students terms are fixed. In other words, to obtain admittance to a graduate program in Biology a student must be funded, and funding is invariably fixed in term according to research. What that means is that if I refused my present graduate research opportunity that I probably will not be readmitted to school at a later date because of funding circumstances. In fact, I was not funded for graduate school this past school year, thus I joined Americorps. Please make higher Americorps officials aware that if I declined my present offer that I would be unable to attend graduate school unless I secured funding at another institution, and that is not very probable.

It is important to point out that I am aware the rules of admittance into graduate school are different between various departments. Many graduate programs, like education, are flexible, and often allow students to exit a program and later gain reentry. Biology programs are not flexible, they do not allow individuals to exit a program and gain reentry later, unless funding is available.

The purpose of this letter is to fully explain the circumstances which will force me to leave the Americorps program early, and to express that I be considered for a pro-rated stipend.

I began the Americorps program Tuesday, November 4, 1995. I began the program 6-7 weeks later than the rest of the individuals at my project site. At the time of my hiring, I told my supervisors, Merle Kost and Tom Schumacher, that I planned on attending graduate school in the fall. I informed them that because of variable times of entry into differing graduate programs that complications may arise in finishing my tour of duty, but I would do everything in my power to finish.

Immediately after beginning the program, I read the Americorps manual given to my supervisors and it read that members may still be awarded a stipend if forced to resign under compelling personal circumstances. No further explanation was given in the manual of what constituted a compelling personal circumstance, so I understood that to be subjective. If at that time it would have listed that graduate school was not a compelling personal reason, I would not have continued in the program. However, I accepted the Americorps position because I wanted to be able to serve my country, and I thought I could work hard to ensure I would finish my tour of duty. In the worst case scenario, my thoughts were that the Americorps program was about advancing opportunity. Thus, I would most likely still be given a pro-rated educational stipend.

After applying to graduate school, I was offered two positions: a research assistantship at Michigan Technological University, and a teaching assistantship at the University of Arkansas. Research assistantships are generally regarded as better; however, I still choose to attend the University of Arkansas. I choose Arkansas, in part, because I would most likely not have to begin until 15 August, 1995, whereas at Michigan I would start June 1, 1995.

I accepted the position at Arkansas May 15, 1995. On May 20, 1995, I computed that I would be unable to finish my tour of duty by 15 August 1995 without working Saturdays. I was approximately 54 hours short in time worked, and I needed to take off a minimum of 2 week days to find housing at Arkansas. I discussed my situation with my supervisors and we came to the conclusion that I would be at a minimum 9

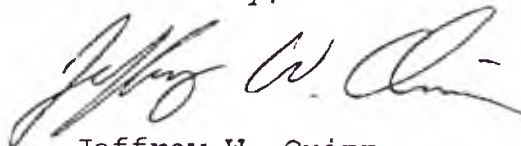
hours short, and most likely near 30 hours short. Knowing I would not be able to finish Americorps really was a topic of anxiety for myself. I still progressed on and did not give up in the hopes that the person in charge of making such decisions would be reasonable to my circumstances. My supervisors said that my work was excellent and they were positive about the chances I would still receive an educational award. At that time I did not give up, I instead worked every hour possible, including Saturdays.

Approximately the second week of June, I received a phone call from Dr. Kwak my advisor. He informed me that the study site I was to be working on the White River was flooding, and he wanted me to begin research there early on 1 July 1995. He explained to me the extreme importance of my starting research at Arkansas early, and to choose not to do so would jeopardize the integrity of my research. In addition, he explained how the quality of my research will influence how my graduate committee, which he is a part of, will judge my qualifications when I am to be considered for my master's degree. I explained to him my involvement in the Americorps program, and he understood. Dr. Kwak informed me that technically I cannot force you to be here until August; however, to not do so would be taking a extreme risk. Since my graduate education will influence my future significantly, whereas Americops will not. I have to place the importance of my graduate studies above Americorps. The opportunity of graduate school is a privilege I cannot ignore. Therefore, I informed my supervisors that I will be forced to resign my position as of 1 July 1995.

My supervisors at work have praised my performance. I believe I have completely fulfilled the Americorps oath to serve America well, and to get things done. I am involved in a map compilation project. The process is very tedious. My supervisor told me that he doubts any other person involved in such a project has been more productive than I have been. The objective of our project site was to map a single county. That goal was achieved long ago, and it may be possible for us to finish a second. To put it bluntly, I've gotten things done.

For these compelling circumstances: my inability to control flooding and thus the start date of my beginning graduate research, my beginning the program late, the high quality and quantity of work I have completed, and the extraordinary measures I have already taken to complete the program, I believe I have earned to right to an adjusted educational award.

My name is Jason Kleinsasser and I'm resigning from AmeriCorps in Huron, South Dakota. The reason I'm resigning is my living expenses are getting higher.

When I first heard about AmeriCorps, I was told that I would work 1700 hours and get enough money to pay for my living expenses and also get over \$4000 towards my education. I thought \$4000 would help me out greatly towards my Vo-tech. In the next couple of years I was hoping that I would get to go to Vo-tech for a construction supervisor. I've already got three years experience in construction. I was working construction and a part-time job while living in Fargo, North Dakota. I grew up in Huron, so I knew it was not as expensive to live there. After I found out what we were going to get for a monthly pay, I estimated my living expenses and other bills, and I came up short. So I got another job to help pay the bills. I was doing alright until my car quit and I had to get a loan to pay for another one. Then child support hit me. The house that I rent, which seemed like a cheap deal, ends up having large utility bills.

So I went as far as I could go in AmeriCorps, and now I'm starting to go in debt. I would like to go back to Fargo, ND before I get too far in debt. I would really like to get to Fargo as soon as I can. I've got jobs waiting for me, and my son is there. I haven't seen him for three months. Alex is his name and he's only 15 months old, and I would love to be with him. I came to AmeriCorps because of the education benefit or cash so I could start a decent life with my son. If I would have known about what we would actually get paid, I would have never come to Huron for it. I'm getting behind in child support because I can't come up with the money. I'm still trying to pay as much as I can even though I only get to see my son once every three months. It's kind of hard to see him when we're four hours apart and it's winter. I promised him I would spend this summer with him, no matter what. Well, money or no money, I'm going to spend time with him because I'm not going to break my promise.

I guess if you think I don't deserve the money that I actually worked for and need, then I guess I'm wrong. I know the program manager is suppose to make the decision, but she says my reason for leaving is not a compelling personal reason.

I look at it this way. I've worked as long as I could and did the job I was told to do and learned a lot. You can ask my immediate supervisor about the quality of my work, if you want. I took a step in life and tried something new and look what happened. I look like a person that is unable to fulfill a duty. Well, I don't feel like getting kicked out of my house and end up with bad credit. Then I won't be able to get a loan to buy a house or car or even go to school. I like to keep my bills paid and look for a brighter future for me and my son. I am hoping one day to have a family, but if I keep going the way I am, I don't see a family.

So I decided to make another step in life and hope it's a good one. If I get the education award I'll use it in a couple of years. If I get cash, I can get caught up on child support and loans paid off and also get back to Fargo so I can go to the Vo-tech.

This letter is in regards to Carissa Hayes, Americorps Member, the completion of her work term and its subsequent effect on her education award. As of Pay Period 15, Carissa had completed 1,363 hours of her 1,700 service hours. This leaves a balance of 337 hours for her to complete by October 1. Carissa is planning to complete these 337 hours by October 1, 1995, and should be able to barring any unforeseen obstacles.

In the event she cannot finish, I request that Carissa receive a prorated educational award based on the number of hours completed. I base my request on the following reasons and circumstances.

1. Due to our difficulties in recruitment in this area (documented) Carissa was recruited with the understanding she would be allowed to attend college during her service. Carissa has carried a course load of 12 hours and 9 hours, respectively, for two semesters.
2. During our orientation, on Page 3 of the original Americorps Manual, and under Common Questions and Answers "What is the amount of the award I will receive?", it was stated that if you complete a reduced part-time term of service, you will receive the amount that is in proportion to the amount of service completed. Also on Page 103 of the new Americorps Manual, the last paragraph states - if a member completes the program but fails to earn 1,700 hours by the end of the program because she/he had too many unexplained absences, then if the program is certified successful completion, then the member may get a part-time education award for at least 900 hours of service.

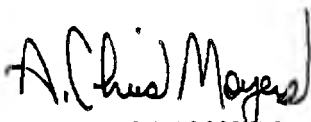
3. A previous Americorps Member within our work unit resigned due to her husband's relocation. According to the Americorps Manual - moving is not a compelling reason.

Based on the listed circumstances, we presumed that a prorated educational award was available.

I am writing to inform you of the recent resignation of an AmeriCorps member from the Utah portion of the USDA Four Corners Rural Development Project.

(b)(6) resigned from the program effective July 26, 1995. In my opinion, (b)(6) left the program due to compelling personal circumstances, thus I am recommending that he receive a pro-rated portion of his educational award. (b)(6) joined AmeriCorps in mid November, 1994 and performed at an outstanding level until late June, 1994 when he began experiencing significant difficulties in his life. (b)(6) became extremely stressed due to a combination of factors in his personal and work lives and felt he was unable to remain focused on his AmeriCorps activities. (b)(6) appeared to be close to an emotional breakdown and felt he needed to return to his home in (b)(6) to rest and be with his family.

(b)(6) completed 1325 hours of service (not including personal or holiday hours). I am enclosing a copy of the National Service Trust End of Term of Service Form. I have indicated on the form that he is eligible for a partial education award.

VAHC Members who have left, and are recommended for pro-rated education awards.

1 (9)(9) left the program 6/29/95, after completing 1,088 hours of service. I am recommending that she receive a pro-rated award.

(9)(9) had been an exemplary VAHC Member, assuming leadership, working hard, and demonstrating her sincere commitment to National Service, hunger work, and the VAHC. I became aware that she had been living in a team residence where she had been experiencing personal and sexual harassment caused by another member of her team also residing in the team house. She had been attempting to resolve the situation with her Team Leader, although not representing clearly, the seriousness and on-going nature of the problems caused by this Member, and their powerful affect on her and her ability to perform her service commitments. When I, the Director, was told about the situation by her and the Team Leader, I immediately met with each household Member and the offending Member to find out what had been going on, what was the affect on the other Members and (9)(9) I also called the Counsel for the Corporation to find out legally what I could and couldn't do as Director. Based on all that, immediate action was taken, which resulted in my suspending the offending Member, at his agreement, pending his successful completion of residential alcohol treatment, an apology to (9)(9) and a responsible follow-up plan. He was also told to move out of the house immediately.

Because this had been going on a long time, and was a very serious issue for (9)(9) she felt that she needed to leave and seek further assistance to deal with this and some other issues, even after action was taken. I felt that the quality of her service, the external nature of the situation, and the fact that it was not in her control to make the offender stop, constituted a compelling circumstance warranting her receiving a pro-rated educational award.

2 (b)(6) left the program 8/18/95, after completing 1,285 hours of service. I am recommending that she receive a pro-rated education award.

(b)(6) came to the VAHC highly recommended, with a history of service and volunteerism, the experience of having overcome personal adversity, and a sincere willingness and courage to take on the new challenges that Membership would present. She also came as the only African-American Corps Member, to this very rural state and service area from inner city Cincinnati, was in the process of attempting to complete her GED after 5 close attempts, and was a recovering alcoholic and drug user. We had several conversations about the difficulties and adjustments she would face that we knew of (both with her, and with her Mentor/teacher/recommender) and she insisted that she felt she could handle it and welcomed the opportunity.

During her service year she developed and worked on several important projects, pursued classes and tutoring in preparation for taking the GED test (she took a trial test and passed!) and struggled with her personal demons, and the difficulties that the program provided for her. She was a Member of (b)(6) household, and found the offending Member's drinking very difficult to be around. Over a period of time during which I was not aware, she began to drink heavily, became depressed, and chose to surround herself with people who were heavily involved in substance abuse, sometimes bringing them to the team house. When the situation became critical and came to my attention, we met immediately, and she was suspended and asked to leave the team house. She decided to go into residential treatment, and upon completion decided that she needed to devote her full-time efforts to recovering. We agreed that in the program she had made some important accomplishments for which she should be rewarded, and that many circumstances contributed to her having to leave to continue her recovery. Based on her accomplishments, the barriers she attempted to face, and her working towards health, I am recommending that she receive a pro-rated education award for the service she has accrued based on what I define as compelling circumstances.

3. Darrin Apichell, ss# (b)(6) will leave the program 9/8/95, after completing 1500+ [to be calculated when completed] hours of service. I am recommending that he receive a pro-rated education award.

Darrin has been a Member who has struggled to focus his tremendous energy and concern into responsible service. He has grown tremendously during his period of service in the VAHC, and has been responsible for the implementation of several significant community partnerships and projects. During this time, he became aware of significant problems occurring with the Mother of his son and her ability to care for him. After a court action, Darrin, who had never lived with his son or spent significant time with him, was given full custody of the three-year old child. Throughout his term of service Darrin has been living in his team's household, so with this new and significant change, he has had to consider the impact of his son coming to live with him, on his ability to perform full-time service (can he get enough childcare, who is available to do childcare, etc...), on his team Members, and on their house and household.

While we attempted to identify resources for him and the team, and to define what needed to happen to facilitate a healthy transition, it became clear that full custody for him involved more than making arrangements. It was going to require him to learn about how to be a parent,

etc. clearly a more than full-time commitment. He and I came to a mutual agreement that he needed to concentrate full-time on his new role of full-time father. We agree that the circumstances and timing resulting in the custody of his son, occurred out of his control, and were compelling enough to warrant his receiving a pro-rated education award.

VAHC MEMBER WHO WAS RELEASED FOR CAUSE, NOT BEING RECOMMENDED FOR A PRO-RATED AWARD

1 [REDACTED] (b)(6) was asked to leave the program on 7/27/95 because he chose to violate several program policies, and in so doing put the program, and the Team reputation at risk.

On Sunday, [REDACTED] took the program-leased van without authorization [violation #1], invited a neighborhood child along [violation #2] and announced to the child and his parents that he was taking him to a swimming area where there would be marijuana smoking [violation#3]. At the swimming area, which was adjacent to the home of a community Advisory Board Member's home [risk factor#1] [REDACTED] joined a group of drug using party goers, and when he returned to the van [which has Vermont Anti-Hunger Corps, AmeriCorps and a phone # in very large letters, risk factor #2] told the child that he had smoked pot [violation#4.] He then drove the frightened child home. The biggest issue was the fact that [REDACTED] stated that he didn't think that he done anything wrong.

During his year of service, [REDACTED] accrued 1302 hours. Because of the severity and volume of his violations, he was asked to leave, resulting in his not being recommended for an education award.

This is written in reference to the September 6, AmeriCorps Members partial education award committee meeting. The following materials pertain to former AmeriCorps Members in the Vermont, Green Mountain National Forest, USDA Public Lands and Environment AmeriCorps program.

Per our conversation, I am providing you with information on two former AmeriCorps Members, Richard Thierren and Maurice Cloutier.

Richard Thierren was an AmeriCorps Member in good standing through July 24, 1995. On July 25, 1995, Richard resigned from the program and left the National Service Academy residential center. Richard resigned without communicating his intentions with anyone on the program staff and without fulfilling some administrative and crew responsibilities. However, immediately prior to his departure, Richard explained his reasoning for leaving the program to a couple of fellow AmeriCorps Members. It appears he left as a result of building frustrations with the program and interpersonal crew dynamics. Richard was frustrated pretty much throughout the program year and apparently he just did not want to deal with it anymore. Furthermore, Richard was concerned that he put himself in a difficult position in regards to meeting his 1700 hour AmeriCorps commitment within the scheduled program year. The program has tried on numerous occasions to contact Richard since his departure without any recorded success. Richard has not contacted the program staff.

In my opinion, Richard Thierren's resignation was carried out inappropriately and unprofessionally. However, despite this, I do feel Richard is a strong candidate for a 900 hours part-time educational award. He completed 1,111 community service hours and was an AmeriCorps Member for approximately seven months.

Maurice Cloutier was an AmeriCorps Member in good standing through July 27, 1995. On July 28, 1995, Maurice resigned from the program. Maurice expressed his intentions to resign with me via the telephone approximately four days prior to his departure. Maurice completed his weekly work responsibilities, wrote a letter of resignation, and then left the program.

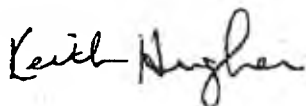
Maurice resigned from the program for reasons that concentrated around being frustrated with the direct service work projects, frustrated with fellow crew members, and a program schedule that conflicted with his personal schedule - he decided to return to college for the fall 1995 semester. In addition, Maurice secured another employment opportunity that he felt better suited his needs prior to returning to school.

In my opinion, Maurice Cloutier is a strong candidate for a 900 hours part-time educational award. He completed 1,205 hours and was an AmeriCorps Member for approximately seven months.

This response has been completed at a moments notice. I first heard about this policy consideration this morning, September 5, 1995. Moreover, this report is completed in support of the above mentioned AmeriCorps Members receiving a 900 earned hours post-service benefit. However, this policy amendment contradicts the principles of this program. I have been clear to corps members throughout the service term that there would not be prorated benefits unless corps members depart for compelling personal circumstances. This program year was based on a commitment to a full-time term of National Service, not a commitment to I can leave anytime after 900 hours if I so choose and still earn an educational award. Please inform me on the outcome of the committee meeting, and if possible provide me with a copy of the meeting minutes.

I welcome your comments and look forward to hearing the results of the review committee. Please inform me of the decisions regarding Richard and Maurice as soon as possible.
