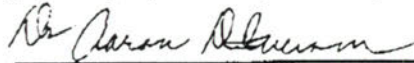

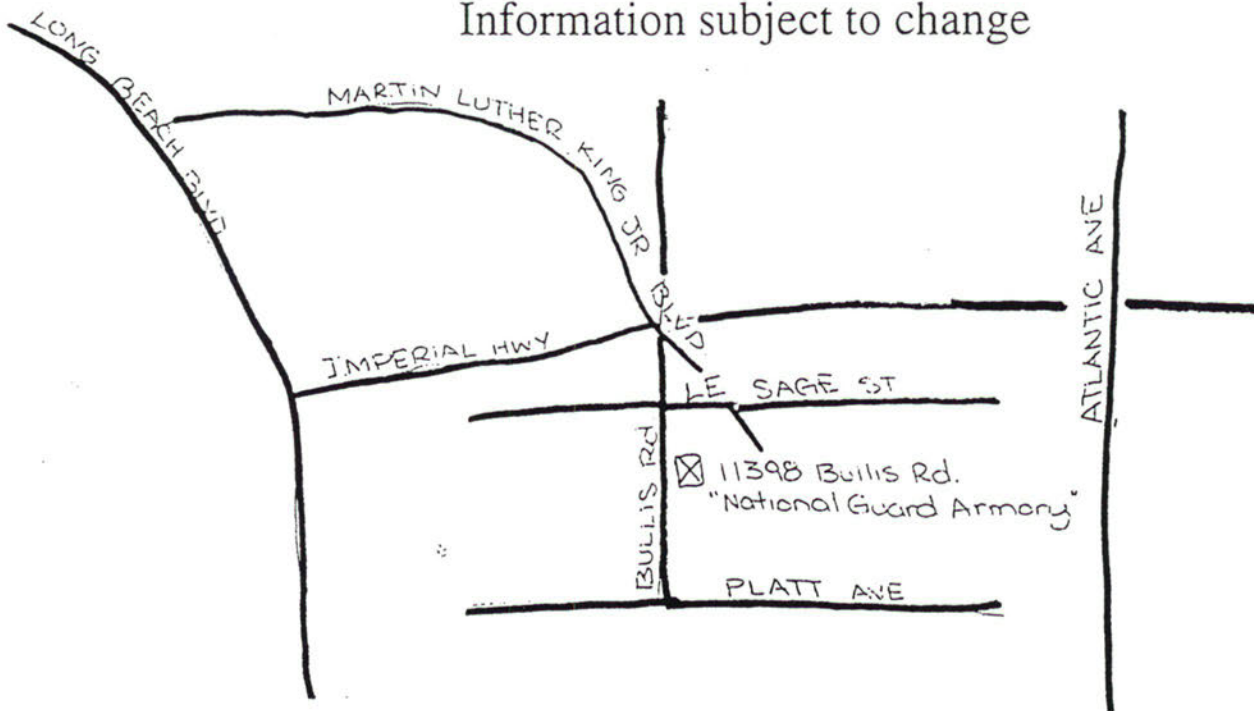

The AmeriCorps Child Nutrition Team launched its Summer Food Outreach campaign in October with an eye to bringing sites to areas previously not reached by summer food. Particularly these were Inglewood: Pico-Union: South Gate: and parts of Compton.

The results have been fantastic! Thanks to mailings done by the team in the fall many potential sponsors and sites in these areas were notified. Fifty two agencies in L.A. County responded to AmeriCorps outreach. Several went on to become sponsors or sites.

In addition to the mailings the team has done door-to-door flyering for many of the new sites and has distributed materials to old and new sponsors of the program.

The Team had a part in bringing on a total of five new sponsors and thirteen total new sites including:

- New Life Economic Development---Five new open sites in Inglewood including Centinela Park, Siminski Park, Lockhaven Community Center, New Mount Pleasant Baptist Church, and Paradise Baptist Church. AmeriCorps helped bring together the sponsor with the Inglewood Community Recreation Department which provided the sites for the program. AmeriCorps members also did outreach and helped get the new sites going.
- One Step Forward---One open site in Lynwood at the National Guard Armory . AmeriCorps has worked closely with One Step Forward in helping them decide where the underserved areas of town were.
- An open site sponsored by the I Have a Dream Foundation, which learned of summer food through AmeriCorps outreach.
- An enrolled site sponsored by the Korean Youth Community Center.
- An enrolled site sponsored by the First United Methodist Church at 1010 S. Flower in downtown Los Angeles.
- A site at the Angelica Lutheran Church sponsored by East Los Angeles Community College, the first site in the Pico-Union area. Interfaith Hunger Coalition's AmeriCorps workers collaborated with Build Up L.A. AmeriCorps workers at the church itself in helping to get the program going

In addition AmeriCorps has provided outreach materials to people interested in promoting summer food, including the Whittier Union High School District, the Southern California Indian Center, the National Office of Samoan Affairs, Infoline, the Los Angeles City Council and assorted State Assembly members, six of whom attended an outreach meeting for summer food conducted on May 25.

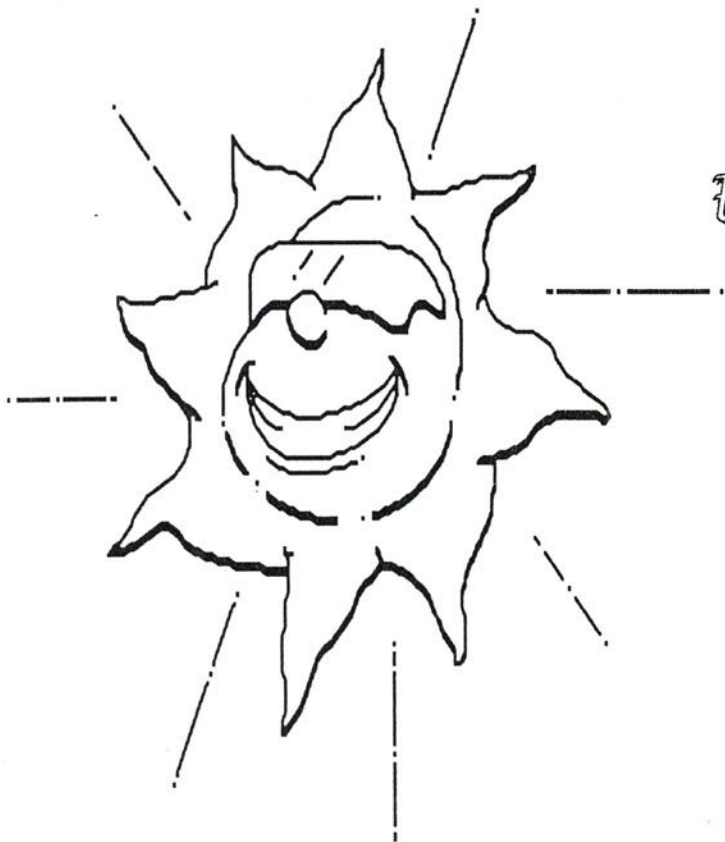
