Chicago, IL. — Much has been said about the parties and galas accompanying this weeks Democratic National Convention. One thing is for certain; where there are large gatherings of people being served large amounts of food, there may be extras. That is where the Greater Chicago Food Depository comes in. The Depository, with assistance from USDA/AmeriCorps workers will be available throughout this weeks festivities to "Glean" or "Rescue" salvageable food product which will then be delivered directly to Soup Kitchens and Homeless shelters throughout the Chicagoland community. The first pick-up is scheduled for Monday, August 26 and will be delivered directly to the Chicago Christian Industrial League between 6:00 and 6:30 PM. During the course of the week, there is potentially thousands of pounds of nutritious food that could be made available to hungry men, women and children.

The Depository and AmeriCorps are on the phone, following up on all potential food pick-ups. However, with the breadth of events planned, it is virtually impossible to identify all food sources. Therefore, the Food Depository is requesting that any restaurant, caterer, or hotel who has an event scheduled with a potential of overage, call our Food Rescue Director, Harold McCadd, at 312/247-3663. From there, arrangements can be made to provide this food to those people in our community who are in need.

The importance of "Gleaning" is gaining wide support from both local and national government representatives trying to find cost effective alternatives to addressing hunger issues in the face of a changing welfare system. Dan Glickman, Secretary of Agriculture, was emphatic in his support of "gleaning" programs during his speech this past spring at the FMI show at McCormick Place.

Michael Mulqueen, executive director of the Greater Chicago Food Depository, sees it this way: "The best way to adequately address the social needs facing our nation is through public/private partnerships. I see this type of food donation being a terrific step towards leveraging our available resources."

The Greater Chicago Food Depository, a member of the Second Harvest network, is a non-profit distribution center committed to providing nutritionally balanced food for hungry people in the metropolitan Chicago area. It is only with the help of the Chicago community that GCFD can continue to provide food for up to 50,000 meals daily.

**For National Food Recovery Week
(August 19-25)
By Agriculture Secretary Dan Glickman**

It's no secret that recent years have seen an explosive growth in private anti-hunger efforts. Boy scout troop, to church group, to rotary club -- more and more Americans are taking the war on hunger personally.

In increasing numbers, people across our country are enlisting in the food rescue movement -- fanning out into farmers' fields and hitting up grocery stores and restaurants for their leftovers. Hand in hand, we are working together toward the day when no good food goes to waste as long as any American goes hungry.

In 1995, the fruits of our 'food Samaritan' labor were enough to feed 183,000 hungry Americans every day for a year. That is a tremendous humanitarian achievement.

Some would say this boom in private activism means government can do less. But anyone who has worked in a soup kitchen or served a meal in a shelter knows we must do more.

We are not reaching everyone who needs our help. We are not even close.

If we are serious about ending hunger in America, we must keep our country's commitment to providing food stamps to struggling families, school lunches to hungry children, and healthy, nutritious meals to pregnant women and their infants. But we also need to think in new ways.

Government must embrace and support the expanding network of private efforts.

That is the story behind the 'Summer of Gleaning.'

It may sound like a B-movie, but it is a class-A program. The 'Summer of Gleaning' is a special project of the AmeriCorps national service program and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Our work to promote America's food recovery efforts epitomizes good government.

Armed only with their idealism and a pittance of government funds, a small corps of young community servants are earning money for college or paying off their student loans by organizing food rescue efforts in 20 states. Working with private groups like FoodChain and Second Harvest, they are taking America's war on hunger to new heights.

-- As tourists, athletes and coaches descended on Atlanta for the summer Olympics, local food vendors and caterers shifted into overdrive. So did our AmeriCorps team. They led volunteer efforts to rescue 174 **tons** of food that otherwise would have gone into a dumpster.

-- Food recovery efforts will go bipartisan at this month's Democratic and Republican conventions. The leftover fare from convention foodfests are being gathered up by our volunteers and distributed through food banks to the hungry of Chicago and San Diego.

Hunger draws no distinctions, political or otherwise. In developing creative solutions, we should stand united. After all, ending hunger within our borders is not a goal that is Democratic or Republican, it is simply American.

So is the guiding principle of the 'Summer of Gleaning.' Our work is not based on the premise that a heavy-handed government bureaucracy knows best. Nor do we believe that private charities and volunteerism alone can solve our nation's most pressing problems. The 'Summer of Gleaning' operates from the common-sense notion that it takes a little of both.

By the time fall brings an end to the 'Summer of Gleaning,' we will have turned a new leaf in America's war on hunger. We collected enough food to serve wholesome meals to more than 1 million hungry Americans. And we will leave behind *permanent* local efforts that will ensure an 'endless summer' as community volunteers carry on the work of feeding their fellow Americans.

The 'Summer of Gleaning' is just one way government can help boost private efforts to end hunger in America. USDA also has a national toll-free gleaning hotline -- 1-800-GLEAN-IT -- to link people with extra time or extra food to efforts in their community. It does not cost much to run, but it is another smart way we can help.

USDA has also declared this week the 'National Week of Food Recovery.' Through community events across the country, we aim to highlight the importance of food rescue, and spark a serious national discussion about what we have yet to accomplish.

It is a testament to our national spirit that so many Americans -- myself included -- have made food rescue a personal crusade.

Sadly, America is still a country where one in three of our children live in the shadow of hunger. At the same time, a full fifth of our food is left to rot in fields, dumpsters and trash heaps.

This paradox is inexcusable for the simple reason that it is so unnecessary.

Ours is the land of plenty. Why let it go to waste?
