Enclosed is the information that you require in order to approve our selections for the AmeriCorps Environmental/Public Lands Project #17 on the Six Rivers National Forest. We received approximately 120 applications for our project. In conjunction with our AmeriCorps partner, interviews were conducted for all applicants. The majority of the interviews were face to face; telephonic interviews were conducted for those applicants that lived out of the area. The selections that we have made correspond with our approved recruitment plan. We are quite pleased with the response that our project generated. It is quite evident that our applicant pool and subsequent selections meet the goals of AmeriCorps and is reflective of the diversity of the nation.

Environmental/Public Lands objectives:

The natural resource crew program of work will be designed by selection of the "highest priority" projects on the forest. These projects range from fisheries (salmon and steelhead) restoration, wildlife habitat enhancement, riparian revegetation, trail access and maintenance, timber stand improvement, and recreation/visitor use facility rehabilitation. In concert with this work program, is an extensive college accredited "experiential" education program which includes fisheries restoration, trail construction & maintenance, chainsaw use and safety, principles of reforestation, first responder, writing skills (journal), career development, etc.

AmeriCorps members will gain a greater appreciation and understanding of the natural and cultural resource issues facing the local communities which Six Rivers National Forest serves. In addition to enhancing their work skills, members will develop citizenship, team building, outdoor living skills and experiences.

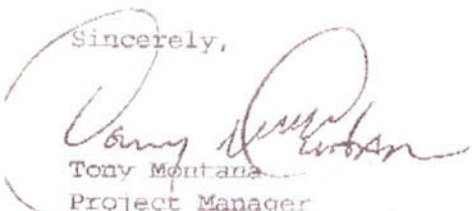
