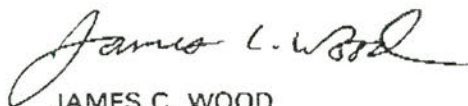

The metropolitan Indianapolis Americorps team will emphasize natural resource education. Two team members will be located at the Indianapolis field office, one member at the Hamilton County field office, one at the Hendricks field office and one at the Indianapolis NRCS state office. The team members would act as team leaders in providing natural resource education to students and adults. They would plan, develop, and gather resources (volunteers and financial) for local projects that apply the teaching of natural resource conservation. Such activities would include assisting 4-H clubs in providing soil and water conservation education, scouting organization activities, constructing outdoor environmental labs at elementary, junior and senior high schools, organizing local groups in cleaning parks, developing nature trails, or seeding roadbanks to prevent erosion. Other activities would include: gathering information related to local government contacts that deal with erosion problems and other natural resource concerns, note the steps each group takes in making decisions, and gathering data related to the land use within watersheds within the project area.

The emphasis is education in an highly urban area that does not normally recognize natural resource concerns in decision making. The youth will be introduced to a entire occupational field that they may direct future education. Youth as well as adults will become more cognizant of the impact decisions have on resources.
