Please join us October 24 in Rosebud, South Dakota, for the AmeriCorps/Team USDA Oath of Service Ceremony. This year, 15 individuals will dedicate 1,700 hours, or approximately 10 months, doing community service projects in our state.

One of the projects will be headquartered at Ft. Pierre, SD, where a 5-member team will be helping in the Bad River Watershed area, adjacent to the Missouri River. Their project focus is on range and water quality improvement, beautification, as well as youth and adult education projects.
