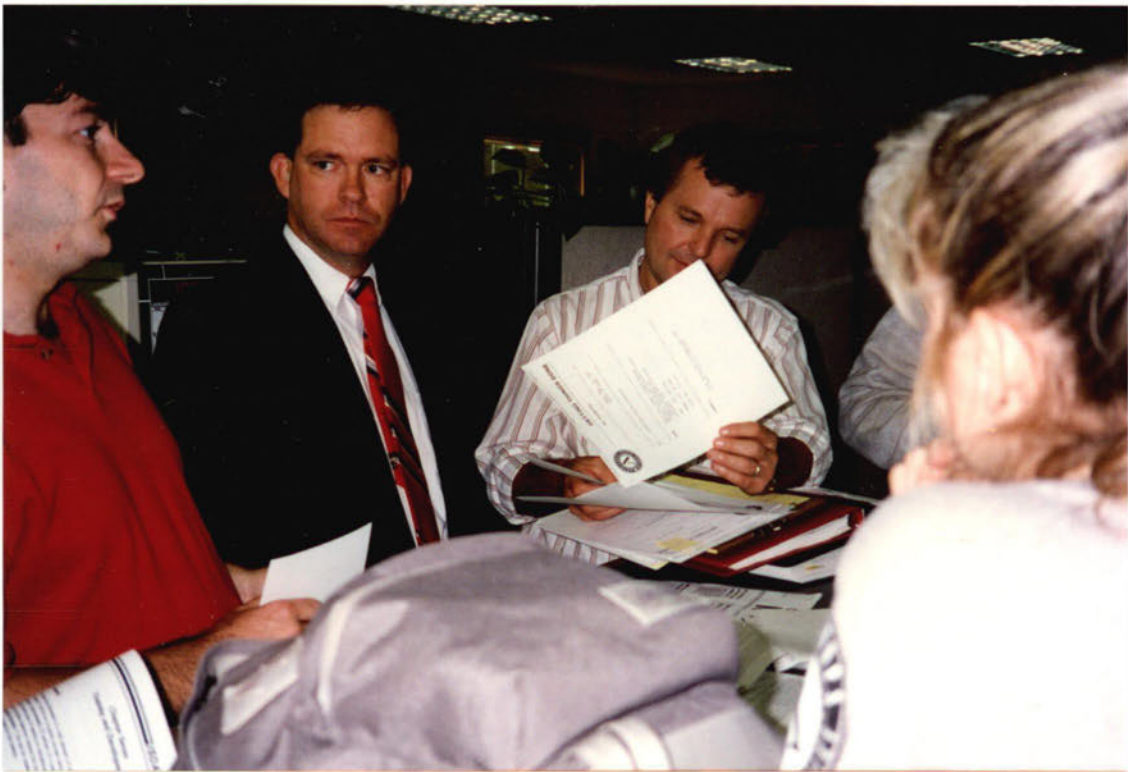

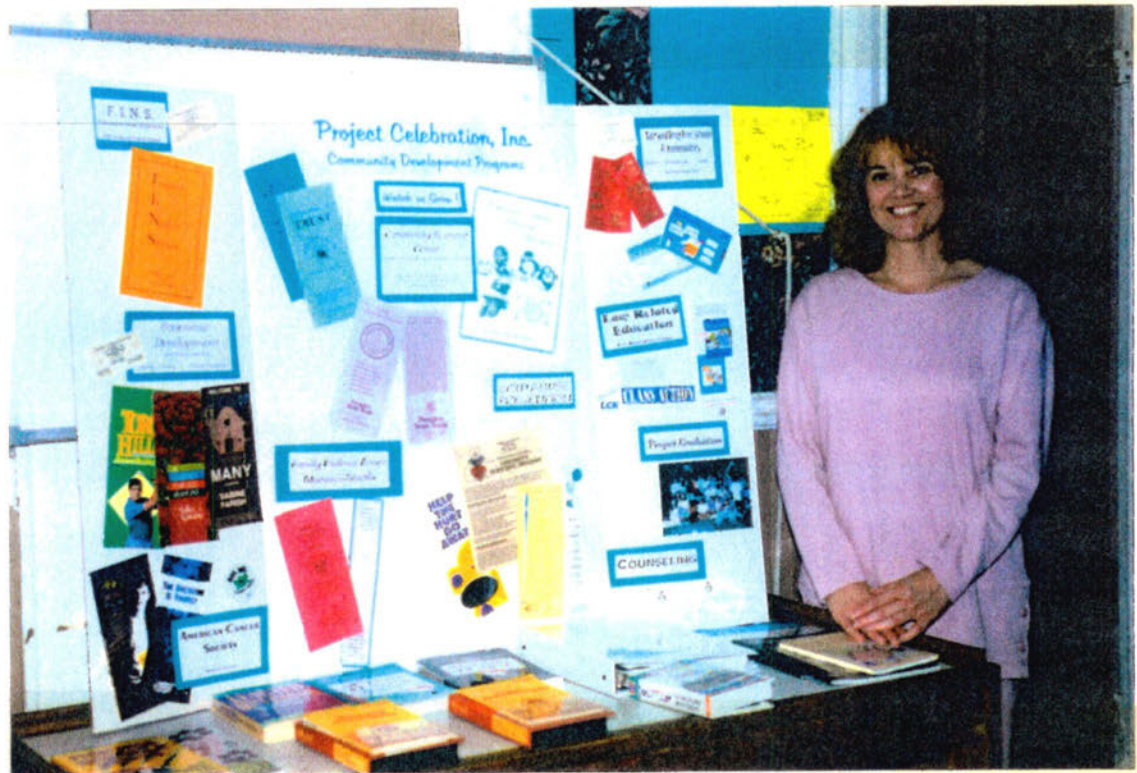

The truck is blowing food into the ponds and the fish are jumping to the top to eat it. Most all the ponds are 4 to 5ft deep and hold about 5,000 fish a pond.

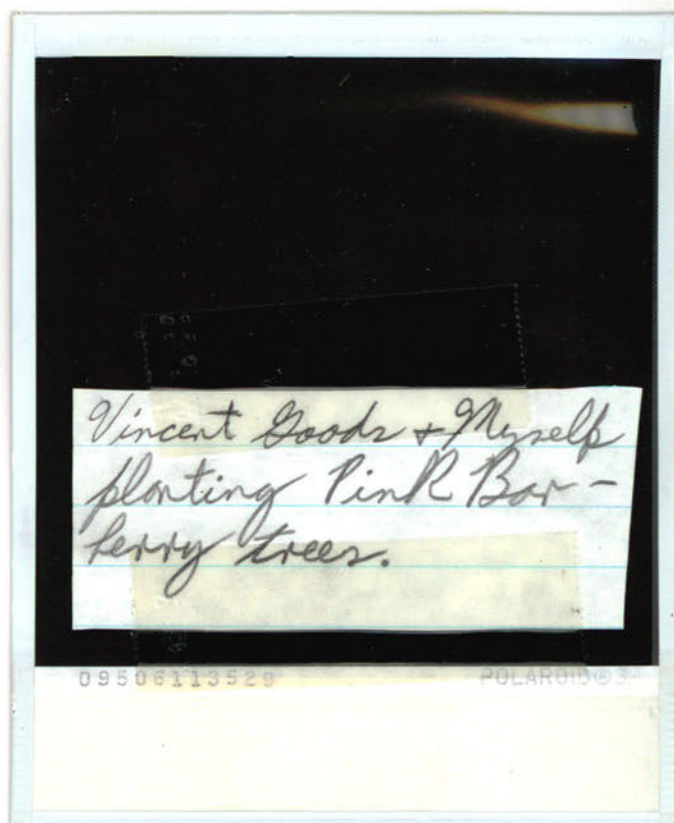
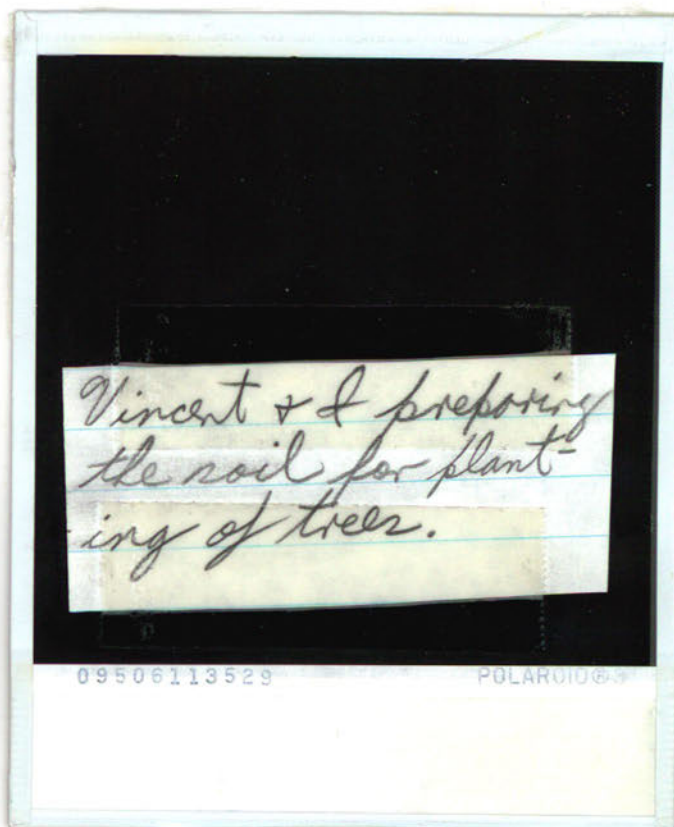
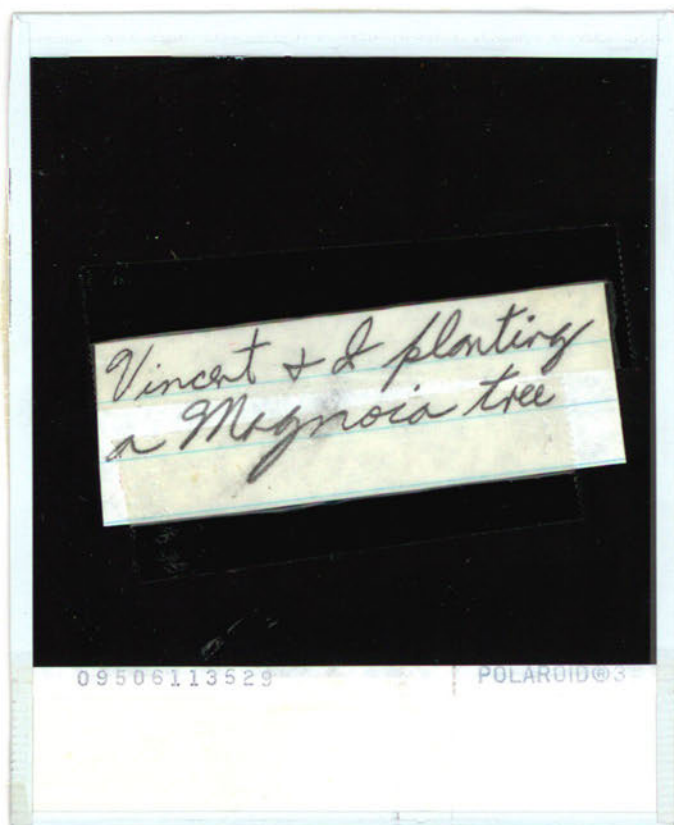
