AmeriCorps Fourth Quarter Report

15. Community Service Objectives:

P48A - 13 families obtained repairs for home health and safety hazards. 26 obtained running water/bathrooms for the first time. 2 families obtained new homes.

Through the four quarters we have exceeded our year's quantity target on home repairs and outreach on our different programs. We came close in the completion of 50% of the 306CWWD Grant program.

R48C - As part of the original objective concerning downtown revitalization, we have begun develop and implement plans for the renovation of a historic downtown building to house a petroleum and cultural heritage museum and a visitors center. This building will anchor the downtown visitor traffic and preserve the community's rich cultural heritage.

R48B - EN-R019A - The residents of Carrizo Hill have been trying to get water and sewer services since 1990. After six years of struggling and having to rely on other people who may or may not have had their best interest at heart; their effort paid off. The funding application for water and sewer services were submitted this quarter to the Texas Water Development Board, Economically Distressed Areas Program.

P48B - By providing outreach for home repair assistance, I have come across residents of Brooks county who are in great need of help, not only with home repairs but also with other items such as clothing, furniture, health aids, etc. Basically, these people need all around help. I have been able to help some of these people with clothing, cleaning supplies, groceries, and small toiletry items.

R48E - The accomplishments statistics may not look impressive. However, our community has brought about public awareness and support of the housing and economic development opportunities and we feel outstanding successes are right around the corner.

R48E-EN-R026 - The rehabilitation of housing program has had excessive paper administration. This program is in the final stage of verifying qualification of homeowners that have applied for housing rehabilitation. The City of Gonzales has achieved a grant of \$250,000.00 for rehabilitation of substandard housing and has applied for a second grant of the same type. The city did not receive the second round of housing rehabilitation grants. The criteria for participation has been clean up and maintenance by owners applying for rehabilitation money. Some ten homeowners will be recipients of this program. The work is expected to be completed by the end of the year.

R48E-EN-R027 Two model homes priced at \$73,000.00 will be started by private investors in conjunction with the Community Empowerment Zone Board project. The project is still on-line and should be kicked off any day now. The accomplishments should be market driven. There are plans in progress to build some 20 homes in the

\$40,000.00 price range. This will be private enterprise also. The problem is this will be slow because of lack of skilled laborers. This also opens opportunity for training and job development.

We applied for a Federal Home Loan grant to assist with down payment and closing costs for 12 housing loans for low/moderate income level.

The federal Home Loan grant could not be used because our median income is so low that if we tried to help the families 50% of median, their income became too low to afford the housing. If we raised the assistance to families at 60% of median, our scores dropped too low to be funded. Thus, we need to see new avenues of assistance.

R48E-EN-R067 - Due to continued public awareness we have reached two additional contractors totaling seven committed to working with new housing construction and housing rehabilitation.

P48D - I was engaged in the processing and outreach of 62 families. All 62 families received a loan or a grant or both. Outreach to the Zapata, and Webb county colonias is done on Tuesdays and Wednesday of every week leaving the rest of the week for planning and scheduling applicants for conferences. During the outreach process, the AmeriCorps member assisted the family with application completion as well as taking a general survey of the living conditions of the family being assisted by the CDM.

16. Community Building Objectives:

P48A - By using the borrower method for construction or rehab, the families will participate in the actual repairs/rehabilitation of their homes and will purchase the materials used for these repairs. These families will earn basic skills that will assist them to improve their lives.

R48C - Various community and citizens and groups have come together behind the museum project in an effort to preserve the cultural heritage of the community and to educate generations to come of that heritage. This project will provide a vital anchor point for visitor traffic for years to come.

R48B - The residents of the Carrizo Hill colonia have taken baby steps toward leadership. Very few of the residents were able to empower themselves to action. It is an accomplishment nonetheless for the few that have been able to do so (approximately 3% of the population).

P48B - This quarter members have worked on several community building projects with different groups such as members from 4-H clubs, members from Motivation, Education and Training, members of the Community Action Agency, Department of Human Services along with AmeriCorps members working with the Extension Service. At the present time, I am working on organizing a food pantry with different church groups and

community volunteers. Together we are working on trying to solve problems within our community. Once this food pantry project is organized and serving citizens in need, there is no doubt that it will continue to operate long after my AmeriCorps term of service.

P48D - I worked closely with La Gloria Corporation, a non-profit organization, engaged in assisting low income Colonia families with securing grants for standardizing water and waste disposal facilities and general rehabilitation of their homes. We were engaged in 8 home improvement projects financed through RD. I also worked with the South Texas Development Council in assisting low income families with potable water, water and waste disposal facilities to meet Section 8 standard codes for the Webb county area, and also the Tri-City area. This quarter, we engaged in five home improvement projects

R48E - Our meetings are held all over town in various neighborhoods to reach those in need in order to help them address their problem or needs. The houses are not built yet, but the structure base is now in place to continue toward success.

R48E - Gonzales Housing Initiative includes all bankers and Realtors; have pledged assistance from attorneys, appraiser, abstract company, architect, neighborhood association, City of Gonzales and building material suppliers.

The extent of private investment and pledged commitment demonstrated a desire to solve community challenges.

We produced a video with three neighborhood associations showing their commitment to neighborhoods and their individual success.

For the federal home loan grant we have pledged a tool library to aid in maintenance and upkeep, training in financial management, help to organize neighborhood cooperation i.e. -- baby-sitting cooperative and homework assistance programs.

Even though we cannot access this grant, the Community Empowerment Board remains committed to the financial education and maintenance pledged previously. We are currently working with contractors to train skilled workers for the local building industry.

The Ministerial Alliance has joined forces with us to help reach those in need to help them themselves.

17. AmeriCorps Member Development Objectives Narrative:

P48A - As AmeriCorps members we interact with different persons that live different lives and based on their needs we have learned what our community needs to have a better and decent housing conditions. As we see each problem, we help them with the different programs that RD has. We have gained experience by socializing with diverse people and we can call this experience an asset for college which will improve our

interaction skills. Thanks to the AmeriCorps program, we can continue with our education due to the financial support which can make up accomplish a future goal.

R48C - My experience with the AmeriCorps program has shown me the tremendous value and the great accomplishments that can be realized through community volunteerism. Through my work with AmeriCorps, I have realized that I would like to continue to seek a career in rural economic development.

R48B - By serving, I have increased my awareness of my community. No longer do I want to sit on the sidelines watching other people do, if it is to be, it's also up to me.

I have learned conflict management skills, public speaking skills and have developed some leadership abilities. I feel fortunate to have served my country through AmeriCorps.

P48B - I have been able to benefit not only from the living allowance, but also from the experiences I have gained. The education award will help me continue my education as I will be graduate this semester and begin work on my masters degree.

P48D - I improved in inspection techniques of family homes in establishing essential repairs needed and assisted families in deterring the cost of improvements. Also, I have learned construction methods of coloina housing.

R48E - I have benefited in many ways. This program presented me with the opportunity to reacquaint myself with the community and its needs. I was compensated with a living allowance and educational award that will allow me to continue my education.

During this year, I was able to work with and learn from members of various organizations how volunteering in the community is essential to its success.

18. Unique Successes or Great Stories:

P48A - The AmeriCorps members were able to work together and assist the Starr County Federal Programs Officer and the RD office to join funds to repairs 5 homes in the West Alto Bonito Colonia. The five homes were completely remodeled by using Federal and State funding. These homes were brought up to county code by using grant funds. The AmeriCorps members assisted the families in obtaining the funds by filling out the applications an doing site revisions to dwelling repairs required in the properties.

R48C - Our successful downtown revitalization project continues to generate media attention. The local chamber of commerce reports the number of inquiries about our city are up nearly 100 per cent from last year.

R48B - The township of Catarina, Dimmit County, Texas, received over one million dollars in funding from the TWDB, EDAP for their water system.

P48B - One of the successes we are proud to be part of was our summer elderly project. We were able to assist less fortunate elderly persons by giving them produce with help from the members from the gleaning project. We also helped by giving items such as detergent, toothbrushes, shampoo, kitchen items. We were also able to help two handicapped individuals with hand rails. On completion of this project, we had an awards presentation where we presented certificates of appreciation to all who participated and donated items.

P48D - One unique story is a rehabilitation project which took place in Hebbronville. We first got wind of the situation throughout AmeriCorps gleaning members. She came to the office one day from making her deliveries with an idea to help an elderly woman with some type of rehabilitation. Subsequently, it was the Hebbronville office turn to host our monthly cluster meeting. We took advantage of all of the help from the cluster members and also got help from a contractor from Laredo who donated some material and labor.

R48E - Local Internet Access and a copy of a video previously included.

19. Difficulties Faced by the Program:

P48A - The lack of 504 grant funds has reduced the actual number of families that could be assisted. The delay of funding in community program sewer and water facilities to the colonias has reduced the number of 306 grants that could have been made this fiscal year.

R48C - It is difficult to get too involved and committed to a new project, objective, or undertaking towards the end of the service year when it is uncertain that you will be able to see the project to completion. The ability to commit funding to sites by the end of the third quarter would help alleviate this problem.

P48B - No major challenges faced this quarter.

P48D - The lack of 504 loan and grant funds.

20. National Identity Activities:

P48A - AmeriCorps members got together in cluster groups and assisted in the summer of gleaning project. Group meetings were also held to assist in the repairs of a house of an elderly woman in Hebbronville.

R48C - Completed best practices report to share success story with other projects and rural developers.

R48B - None

P48B - Attended the CyberEd Exhibit and had a hands on session in using the Internet.

P48D - I attended a gleaning ceremony in Mercedes where awards were presented to all AmeriCorps members. State representative, Henry Cuellar, was also present to say a few good words about the AmeriCorps program.

R48E - Because we have Internet access, we are now able to access WWW for information retrieval and communication with other AmeriCorps projects/sites. Our E-mail address is mauldin@connecti.com.

21. Organizational Changes:

22. Organizational Improvements:

P48A - We could improve a success rate by increasing the number of AmeriCorps employees assigned to our office to three volunteers per fiscal year.

R48C - Allow educational award to be transferred to immediate family member or to be used as business start up capital.

R48B - I think that having clusters of members would be beneficial to all involved for the reason that the AmeriCorps member will not feel isolated and so alone.

P48B - More travel funds.

P48D - Funding for office equipment.

23. Primary Training and Technical Assistance Needs.

P48A - Provide construction training and reviews by state office and engineering staffs.

P48C - Need to conduct member training earlier in the year.

R48B - I find that this would be an individual need, what would be beneficial to me may not be beneficial to the next person.

P48B - Training in the area of construction, rehabilitating homes and inspections would really assist members.

P48D - More training on construction techniques.

R48E - A regular update and guidance in the benefits or availability of various programs. A little longer timeline for applying would also be good. Rural Development has been great to bring the programs to us while we have been designated a champion community. I would suggest this to be most beneficial to rural Texas.

John Carroll has sat in several times and took two windshield tours with us.

Sandra Mauldin has sat in several times and provided other support for us.

This committee has been an extremely hard working and conscientious group of people.

Since the last meeting of the Empowerment Board when we agreed to serve as a citizens committee, many meetings have been held with Phillip Ruiz, the grant writer and manager of this grant. The Committee devised a priority rating for people applying for Home Rehabilitation (the green sheet); took two windshield tours--one to become acquainted with what to expect and why we would not be able to help some people, and the other to assess the value to be scored for the way in which people had cared for their homes (23 houses); Bobbie Bullard scored 17 homes by himself. Using suggested guidelines from HUD, this Committee devised the pre-application to be given to people requesting it; the final application is simply a financial statement.

A meeting for contractors was advertised in the paper with very disappointing attendance, only one person came, a sub-contractor, Ronnie Voigt Plumbing. This Chairman was so disappointed that she wanted to write a letter to the Editor really laying into the contractors, but through Sandra's intervention (and good sense) it became such a watered-down version that it was printed on the front page as a news item without my name, which was just as well.

With the help of Jo Ann Leifeste and the Ministerial Alliance, a meeting was held with the ministers, asking for their help in reaching people about the Housing Rehabilitation. We had a very good attendance and Greg Hackett from First Methodist has been extremely helpful in getting applications out.

A contractor's booklet was devised and one contractor really liked the information and requested that he keep the booklet although he had turned in his certification material.

52 pre-applications sent

3 letters sent to residents out of the City limits

5 letters sent to applicants who live in mobile homes not houses

3 letters to people who make more money than HUD allowed

7 letters were sent about making arrangements to pay out their taxes on time payments so they would not be considered delinquent (6 made those arrangements.)

11 letters asking for one or more I.D. showing home address

If nothing else is counted with our work, there are 6 who are off the delinquent tax rolls and an uncounted number of homes that have been cleaned up around their homes making them and their city look better.

40 completed applications have been turned in
priority points ranged from a high of 80 out of a possible 100 to as low as 28 points.

A windshield tour was made by Phillip Ruiz grant manager, Samuel Lewis City building code and zone enforcer and Bobbie Bullard member of the committee. It was extremely heart breaking to find that many of those who need the help in the worst way cannot get that help because of the \$25,000 limit that has been set per house. This tour was made last Thursday, Sept. 12th. Of the 20 top point counts, there were only 6 that seemed to be possible and even those may be knocked out after they have been inside the homes. Those 6 totaled \$106,000 of the \$210,000 that we have money available for.

Some of those that fall in the range of \$25,000 or below will be knocked out if they do not have a clear title: for instance, one homeowner owns 1/10 of the land because it is in an estate, but the home is theirs. They pay taxes on a tenth of the value of the land and someone else pays the rest of the taxes, while they pay all the taxes on the home.

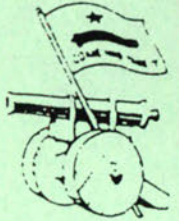
We still do not have a great number of building contractors, but at least we now have three who are willing to work with us, and one from Shiner.

There were some really good articles in the paper about the Rehabilitation of Homes, but it was all under the City's auspices, Empowerment Board was not mentioned. Do we really care very much who gets the credit as long as the work gets done?

PRIORITY RATING SYSTEM

All eligible applicants will be rated on a scoring system in order to establish the priority of funds. This rating process has been designed to incorporate both the family and dwelling characteristics of an applicant in order to establish a system which gives the most needy persons higher priority over others. It is intended that those characteristics which have traditionally created disadvantages among certain groups of people, or by their nature limit their financial resources, are given more emphasis, thereby allowing applicants with those characteristics to receive greater points. The maximum score is 100 points. Scoring shall be based on the following factors:

1. **Income**
 - If household income is between 0% and 60% of income limits 16 pts.
 - If household income is between 61% and 80% of income limits 12 pts.
 - If household income is between 81% and 100% of income limits 8 pts.
2. **Age of Head of Household**
 - If Head of Household is 62 years of age or older 16 pts.
3. **Disability Status**
 - If any member of household is fully disabled 16 pts.
 - If any member of household is partially disabled 12 pts.
4. **Single Head of Household**
 - If Single Head of Household 16 pts.
5. **Dependent Children**
 - If household has any dependent children under age of 5 12 pts.
 - If household has any dependent children under the age of 12 10 pts.
 - If household has any dependent children over the age of 12 but still in school or college. 8 pts.
6. **Family Size**
 - If five (5) or more family members live in the same household 10 pts.
7. **Demonstrated Efforts Toward Maintenance**
 - If applicant has attempted to make Some housing rehabilitation improvements and keeps neat outside yard and home appearance. 14 pts.
 - If applicant maintains a clean outside yard and house appearance, except minor maintenance improvements are needed. 7 pts.
 - If applicant has NOT attempted to keep up home and maintenance Improvements. (Characterized by a lack of maintenance and the presence of junk, trash, abandoned automobiles and/or tall grass/ weeds) 0 pts.

A group of city and community leaders received a visit from a federal official recently. Cliff Diehl, of the U.S. Governmental Accounting Office came to discuss Gonzales' status as a Designated Champion Community.

Diehl was accompanied by Lorraine Clements, State Rural Development Coordinator for the Rural Economic and Community Development Dept. of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (who coordinates AmeriCorps members in this region).

Gonzales became a Champion Community as a result of the city's application for a Federal Home Loan Grant. The city was not awarded the grant, but missed by only two points.

Taking part in the meeting were Cliff Diehl

Lorraine Clements, Sandra Mauldin, Dr. James Bird, Dan Rodriguez, Della Carroll, Bobby O'Neal, E.T. Gibson, Joanie Leland, and Peggy Parr.

Sandra Mauldin, Economic Development Coordinator and Main Street Manager for the city of Gonzales, said it was worth applying for the loan, although the city didn't receive it. The process itself was beneficial, she said. "As we went through the application process, it was a great eye opener. Even though we didn't get it, we went through the process or organizing."

Diehl was interested in learning what the community has done to improve the housing situation on its own.
