15. Community Service Objectives (optional).

TXR48C The community service objectives accomplished as reported in question 14 were additions to the overall downtown revitalization project.

TXP48B In the third quarter AmeriCorps member Albert Benavides has extended his outreach to another level. In coordination with the Natural Resource Conservation Service Agency we have added another objective to his yearly plan. R990 emergency response and prevention is the objective in which he assisted in the coordination with the local fire department and NRCS to build and install dry fire hydrants in rural Jim Hogg County. The purpose of these hydrants is to supplement the fire department with additional water tanks from near by ranchers in the event of a house, or grass fire in that area. Four hydrants were planned and four hydrants were installed with a 100% outcome.

TXR48E The rehabilitation of housing program has had excessive paper administration. This program is about ready to be implemented. The City of Gonzales has received a grant of \$250,000.00 for rehabilitation of substandard housing and upgrades to some 30-40 homes in this community.

Publicity and public awareness helped bring about a 41 unit apartment complex through private investment.

The organization of the program pre-application, application and criteria has been a lengthy process.

Two model homes priced at \$75,000.00 will be started by private investors in conjunction with the Community Empowerment Board Project. There is a need of at least 19 additional homes. Applied for Federal Home Loan grant to assist with down-payment and closing costs for 12 housing loans for low/moderate income level.

The housing survey has been a major undertaking and is nearing completion during this quarter. A database was created that corresponds with the Gonzales ownership records. This survey will identify lots available for infill housing intended to upgrade the neighborhoods.

Due to publicity and meeting with contractors we now have five committed to working with new home construction in Gonzales.

TXP48C - R017. We have assisted 67 families with proper running water to their homes for the first time. (R019). This agency with the help of AmeriCorps has been able to provide forty-seven 504 loans to families which will allow them to have septic systems approved by the County Health Department. This type of loan will allow for small repairs to homes. Out of 47 loans, 9 have been used for repairs to the roofs, subfloors and insulation on walls.

The outreach will continue to be provided through the AmeriCorps term, to help meet the expected outcome. We are working very hard to stay on schedule in order to assist the anticipated number applicants we have agreed upon.

16. Community Building Objectives Narrative (optional).

TXP48B During the third quarter AmeriCorps member worked closely with La Gloria corporation, a non-profit organization, engaged in assisting low income colonia families with securing grants for standardizing water and waste disposal facilities and general rehabilitation of their homes. This quarter we engaged in three home improvement projects.

TXP48B Approximately 50 volunteers from the community of Falfurrias participated in Brooks County Earth Day. There were representatives of various groups such as AmeriCorps, 4-H clubs, schools, local Fire Departments, law enforcement and citizens of the community of Falfurrias. Each volunteer received a T-shirt and lunch provided by local businesses.

TX R48E Gonzales Community Empowerment board is a 502C3 non-profit organization based on desires of the community for empowerment of citizens to address housing, recreation, economic development and education issues. This organization of volunteers has representatives from the community and is the educational base for our grant proposals such as creating neighborhood assistance in cooperative baby-sitting, homework assistance, property maintenance education and organization of an equipment library for lawnmowers etc. to assist in maintenance. Members have come together to write the grant proposals, develop a video presentation and plan for Gonzales's future.

The economic potential for local contractors and skilled workers is another plus factor of this program.

No word has been received about the grant for down payment and closing cost assistance to build 12 low-to-moderate income level houses. However, additional programs and opportunities are being investigated.

Gonzales Housing Initiative includes all bankers and Realtors, have pledged assistance from attorneys, appraisers, abstract companies, architects, neighborhood association, City of Gonzales and building material suppliers.

Extent of private investment and pledged commitments demonstrates a desire to solve community challenges.

For the Federal Home Loan grant we have pledged a tool library to aid in maintenance and upkeep, training in financial management, help to organize neighborhood cooperation ie..babysitting cooperative and homework assistance programs.

TXP48C - R074 AmeriCorps has taken the initiative to inform colonia residents not only about the programs that Rural Development offers but of many others. AmeriCorps has taught these residents how to go about seeking aid from various agencies.

Long Term Commitment: AmeriCorps has made colonia residents aware of the nutrition classes available to them through the Expanded Nutrition Programs. These residents have signed up for long term courses that will continue time after the AmeriCorps term is over.

TXR48D Webb County Housing rehabilitation program was able to install seven state approved on-site sewage disposal systems in Oilton and Bruni, Texas. I assisted the Laredo Health Department, Victor Lowe, President, in the design and approval of state disposal systems. Homeowners who have benefited from the housing rehabilitation program would be able to connect to this system with no further costs in the conversion of this system.

17. AmeriCorps Member Development Objectives Narrative (optional).

TXP48B AmeriCorps member has improved in inspection techniques of family homes in establishing essential repairs needed and assisting families in determining the cost of improvements. Also member has learned construction methods that specifically help colonia residents.

TXP48B I feel that serving as an AmeriCorps members has helped me become familiar with construction and home repairs. I have become knowledgeable in determining what repairs are needed to a home. I still have a more to learn about rehabilitating housing. I am glad I've had this opportunity to learn what I have with AmeriCorps.

TXR48E Being a participant in the AmeriCorps Program has given me the opportunity to experience this community and its needs. An experience that will assist me while living in and being US Veteran a wealth of this community. In addition to being a US Veteran a wealth of work experience has been gained that will prove essential in future employment opportunities. The program will provide funds for continued education/training which is a not so distant goal. During this program I was introduced to and am now a graduate of the Texas Rural Leadership Program.

P48C Throughout these 16 months AmeriCorps has given me the sense of responsibility, an open to suggestion sort of mind and more self confidence. I can see how people not only rely on the different programs, but also on the AmeriCorps's assistance and guidance. I as an AmeriCorps have learned to give people reinforcement . I give them the idea that if they do what is required of them by the agency and provide the proper document on time they will get assistance they seek.

18. Unique Successes or Great Stories:

TXR48C The downtown project continues to generate positive publicity for our town and its merchants. In conjunction with our annual Watermelon Thump festival, we were able to capitalize on both print and television media. All media focused on the downtown improvements that have been coordinated by the AmeriCorps program and how they have had a positive impact on the economy of our town.

TXP48B This quarter AmeriCorps members 2 from the Hebbronville unit, 1 from Laredo and two members from RioGrande City worked on two projects in the colonias of ElCenizo and Rio Bravo. We started our day off by doing some landscaping an the Centro Comunitario de El Cenizo. This is a multipurpose center used by such service providers such as the Rural Development agency, WIC nutrition classes, healthcare etc. This center is used by many people who will enjoy our landscaping. We then went on to the colonia of Rio Bravo to a resident to continue our project. After we were treated to a picnic lunch by Mr. Noel Guerra, Community Development Manager, we started a big task - painting the exterior of the house. I had no experience in painting at all but with the help of fellow AmeriCorps members and volunteers from the Motivational Educational Training Ser vice (METS), I learned a new skill. The projects were both a big success and we plan to continue more projects like these.

TX R48B The success that I have had this quarter has been publishing a community resource directory. It was doubtful that any one person/organization would be able to publish the directory. I was able to collaborate this effort by contacting various businesses and organizations who donated all the materials needed to publish the directory. Southwestern Bell, Central Power and Light, Middle Rio Grande Development Council and Wal-Mart each donated one box of paper. Community Service Agencies of Dimmit, LaSalle, Frio and Maverick Counties donated the binders and cardstock paper needed for the front and back covers. The media center at the Carrizo Springs Independent School district donated their machines and personnel to copy and bind the directories. Without their assistance, the directory would not have been completed.

TXP48B One unique story this quarter is a landscaping project which took place in El Cenizo, TX one of the Colonias serviced by the Hebbronville unit. Attached is a copy of a news release which was printed by the Laredo Times.

TXP48C I assisted a family that lives in a one bedroom home that had no electricity, no water and an outhouse. With my assistance I helped this family get assistance by assisting them in filling out all the documents needed.

TXR48D Mr. and Mrs. Feliciano Perex had lived in Larga Vista Subdivision for 2 1/2 years in a 25 foot long reconditioned bus as their home. Due to their financial situation, the Perez family has never been able to materialize their dream of owning and/or finishing their home. They turned to the Webb county Housing rehabilitation program for help. The Perez's application was processed in April of '95 and several attempts were made to approve their application. With the assistance of USDA-Rural Development and their commitment for a 306c WWD grant of \$3,900.00 Webb County was able to assist the Perez family. This joint venture and the commitment of \$13,900.00 in funds will bring the family into a standard living unit.

19. Difficulties Faced by the Program:

TX R48B The main obstacle that I have encountered is the lack of money to accomplish certain tasks, such as a parks project which I am currently working on. I realize that AmeriCorps members should not write proposals for funding, but I live in such an isolated, rural area where in 1991/1992 the per capital income was on \$8,213. It is extremely difficult to get money from this community. Perhaps proposal writing by AmeriCorps members are working on should be considered for approval by Washington. The parks project I began working on had to be scrapped. Initially, we planned to restore the county parks. I brought a group of people together to assist in long-term planning. We had scheduled dates to gather input from the community. We did this with the intent to apply for money from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department but since I could not write the proposal, we had to scrap the whole project. We do not have the funds to refurbish our county parks and our county government does not have the money either. So where do we go from here? I had a group of ten people who were ready and willing to commit to this project, with no money, what's the point?!

TXP48B I would like to see our AmeriCorps program have the same equipment and supplies as other AmeriCorps programs such as computers. We also need funds for supplies, materials, or whatever is needed to get the job done.

20. National Identity Activities:

TXR48B The One for All Day in Austin was a treat for me. Being in an isolated regions, I had not felt like I was part of the "big picture." Meeting other member and working side by side with them helped me identify with others serving in the AmeriCorps program.

TXR48E Participant in the One-For-All day in Austin. Assisted in activities at an outreach center that provides services and meals mostly to homeless and street people in the university campus area. Participant in cluster meeting and One For All Day in Weslaco, Texas. Have Internet access, can now surf the WWW. Member graduated from 1996 Caldwell-Gonzales Texas Rural Leadership program.

TXP48B This quarter I participated in a Earth Day community clean-up in Brooks County. This project was a success. I was able to represent AmeriCorps and work jointly with other AmeriCoprs members and members of the community.

TXP48C AmeriCorps members went to a national meeting in Mississippi. We met, via satellite with the Secretary of Agriculture, Dan Glickman. I had the opportunity to speak to him about our projects in the Rio Grande Valley.

We are getting attention from the media through the nutrition programs we having in Colonia Monte Alto. This should give AmeriCorps some exposure.

21. Organizational Improvements:

TXR48C We have now begun a more focused approach to implementing a museum project which will be the next component in our overall downtown revitalization plan.

TXR48B There have been no changes made during this third quarter at this site.

TXP48C Thirty five septic systems were to have been installed by the county in Colonia Muniz. After they installed the septic systems we would provide the families with a 306C-WWD grant but the county has been delaying the process for a couple of months now. Finally the project has come through, we will be closing out grants as soon as possible.

22. Organizational Improvements (optional).

TXR48E Supply required equipment. There is a need for a computer with software and printer to assist the AmeriCorps member in accomplishing required tasks of this program.

23. Primary Training and Technical Assistance Needs (optional)

TXR48B Grant writing seminars should be part of training offered to members to fund specific projects they are working on that cannot otherwise get funded.

TXP48B Since most of our assistance is for rehabilitation we would like more training in the areas of construction methods, techniques and inspections.

TXR48E Programs of benefit to financial management and property upkeep. Area technical training ie plumber and carpenter skills. Instruction carpenters and guilders ie business management and effective building techniques.

15. Community Service Objectives Narrative (optional):

Site R48C: Our second objective was for a group of 20 to 30 local citizens, businesses and building owners to organize into an association to address the issue of downtown revitalization. The association will meet regularly to receive training and organize to stem the deterioration of Main street and the downtown area. This effort will result in the creation of a working crew of volunteers who will renovate a significant portion of the downtown area.

Site P48C: During this second AmeriCorps term, I have referred approximately forty (40) families to different types of housing, health and nutrition programs. Almost all of these referrals have been assisted in one way or another, either through RECD or various different county programs. RECD/AmeriCorps is working in partnership with the Urban County Program to assist at least 35 different families, approximately 175 individuals in Colonia Muniz in Edinburg with septic systems, indoor plumbing, and hot and cold water lines to be hooked up to 40 gallon water heaters. RECD is also active with the 306-504 grant loan programs, that assist colonias and non-colonia residents in the form of a grant for a 6x8 bathroom (maximum of 48 square feet) and with the 504 loan program for housing repairs for the low or very low income families. This fiscal year 96, approximately 60 bathrooms have been constructed. Our goal for this year is to assist 600 individuals. Approximately 325 already received this type of assistance.

Site P48B: The landscaping and beautification of the Pioneer Park is just the first of several projects in the "face-lift" of Falfurrias. Additional community service projects will be performed in the near future.

Site P48A: Due to fund delays, we will continue with our anticipated goals from the 1st quarterly report. 504 Loan/Grants, 50, 306c WWD Grants, 200. Several 306c WWD grants what were approved this quarter were from the first quarter.

Site R48E: The rehabilitation of housing program has had excessive paper administration. This program is about ready to implement. The City of Gonzales has achieved a grant of \$250,000 for rehabilitation of substandard housing and has applied for a uupgrade to some 30 - 40 homes in this community. Publicity and public awareness helped bring about a 41 unit apartment complex through private investment.

Two model homes priced at \$73,000 will be started by private investors in conjunction with the Community Empowerment Board Project. There is a need for at least 18 additional homes. Applied for Federal Home Loan Grant to assist with down-payment and closing costs for 12 housing loans for low/moderate income level.

Due to publicity and meetings with contractors, we now have five committed to working with new home construction in Gonzales.

16. Community Building Objectives Narrative:

Site R48C: Twenty two merchants attended the organizational meeting of the Luling Retail Merchants Association. After a very constructive dialogue of problems facing the business community, this group decided to meet monthly to identify problems and target solutions. This group will continue to develop the business community after the AmeriCorps term of service.

Site P48D: During this quarter, we worked closely with the La Gloria Corporation, a non-profit group engaged in assisting low income colonia families with housing initiatives i.e. securing grants for standardizing water and waste disposal facilities and general rehabilitation of their homes. This quarter they were engaged in six home improvement projects financed through our agency.

17. AmeriCorps Member Development Objectives Narrative:

Site R48C: Results initiated by the AmeriCorps work program have shown me the value of community volunteerism both result oriented and personal satisfaction oriented.

Site P48D: The AmeriCorps members has improved in inspection techniques of family homes in establishing essential repairs needed and assisting families in determining the cost of improvements. Also, their experience in construction, as a result of the building of the bathroom facilities, has gained them considerable knowledge of construction methods to impact the housing of colonia residents.

Site P48C: I, as an AmeriCorp member have greatly benefited from the program in many different ways.; I have gained valuable experience, met with many intellectual people not to mention the good communication skills. I can honestly sit down with county planners, engineers and discuss the various streets paved within the last two years. And, about the newest colonias to the annexed to the nearest city.

Site P48B: I have benefited from serving in this program in many ways. I have been exposed to different ways of living such as the way people's lifestyles differ. Being able to see how people live in different colonia areas has opened my eyes to how life is less than 100 mile from where I live. I have also put my Spanish speaking skills to use which is very much different from any Spanish class or Spanish exam I have ever taken. This is real life and very different from the Spanish I've learned in school. I'm hoping I will become fluent in Spanish with different vocabulary for each area where we work.

Site R48A: Through AmeriCorps, I have learned lots of new work skills. I have learned how to write a grant application, how to communicate better with the public and government officials. Also, I have done surveys for future grant applications, attended important rural community meetings and got to travel to Mississippi for the first time. Overall, the Americorps program has provided me with lots of important job training and experience.

Site R48F: I have benefited from the AmeriCoprps program in my personal development. One of the most important skills I've learned is effective communication in groups. Conflict resolution skills have refined as I have undergone training. Working in this project has further expanded or increased my responsibility to community development. It hs drawn me closer to solving "real" issues that affect people every day.

18. Unique Success or Great Stories:

Site R48C: The continuing domino effect of our downtown enhancement and beautification project continues to overwhelm me. As street lamps and benches and downtown business renovations come to completion other businesses in the community have been sprucing up their facades. Also 20 out of 100 merchants responded to the organizational meeting of the merchants association. I feel this is a very good percentage of merchants wanting to work together to tackle common goals.

Site P48D: Our unique story this quarter was an elderly man in the Zapata county area is handicapped. He was almost removed from his home by the Health Department due to the extensive deterioration of his home. I was advised of the situation by an area contractor, and proceeded to look into the matter. After extensive waiting for the funds to be available, we were able to rehabilitate his home and he is now currently living in his newly rehabilitated home.

Site R48D: As previously mentioned in my last quarterly report, Mr. and Mrs. Cabriaes had applied for 306c WWD grant with RECD in Hebbbronville, Texas. Their application was approved. Construction on their home had been completed. The reason why I feel this is a great story is because we were able to coordinate and combine funding from two different agencies. It was difficult for both agencies to compromise because of their differences in policies and procedures. In conclusion, we were able to cut through the red tap barriers and successfully complete the housing rehab project. Thus, providing a better and safer living environment for the Cabriaes family.

Site P48B: This quarter, I participated in a beautification project of the downtown park which is called Pioneer Park. This project was organized by one of the Extension Service AmeriCorps members. The funds for the project were provided by AmeriCorps and the City of Falfurrias. We were able to recruit some community volunteers such as 4-H leaders and members of one junior school. We also had two volunteers from the lumber yard which was kind enough to donate some landscaping timers cut to the size we needed. The two young men were also kind enough to help us set up the timber. The project turned out to be successful. We planted approximately 65 plants. Included with this project was the restoration of a waterfall which had not been in operation for almost 20 years. This project is one of the first efforts in beautification and community development of the city of Falfurrias.

Site R48A: One unique story is planning and attending the Central North American Trade Corridor meeting in February. It provided me with lots of positive information about the Middle Rio Grande Region and its future. The Central North American Trade Corridor is Hwy 83 which runs from Canada to Mexico and it goes right through Uvalde. It mentioned the communities and tributaries along this route.

Another unique story which occurred in Uvalde is that first lady, Hillary Clinton, visited Uvalde as part of her husband's campaign in Texas. She spoke about the importance of AmeriCorps, Medicare and Medicaid, Education and Family Values.

Site R48F: AmeriCorps members have all experienced different things throughout the term. One of the most important things that has impacted my life was seeing a community filled with residents who had recently felt the chains of politics become empowered. Residents truly appreciate having an AmeriCorps member help them through difficult issues and bring them hope that was taken away at one time.

Site P48A: During our cluster meeting that was held March 13th, we and other AmeriCorps members conducted a survey at Garza Salinas subdivision. This survey was to gather information from the citizens that are living in that subdivision which is in the flooding area of the Los Olmos Creek. The empowerment zone has a project in trying to relocate most of the families that were affected by the flood.

19. Difficulties Faced by the Program:

Site R48C: AmeriCorps national training seminar was held during the week that I was putting together a dedication ceremony for our downtown revitalization. I had to cut my participation in the training session short by three days. I regret not being able to participate in the entire week training.

Site R48D: Lack of grant funds. Most of the 504 grants issued are for elderly and/or disabled citizens. The long length of time it takes to receive 1940-I's funded.

Site P48C: I feel that the lack of materials plays a large role in not providing the possible evidence to the national office of the projects we have got on hand. For example, I have not been able to take pictures of the hundreds of different community sites or projects that I have helped improve. I can not afford a camera there so I can not take pictures. It is very difficult to try to explain a situation in writing when it comes to working on my quarterly report. I have over 500 applications and over 700 residents in need of assistance. I have found myself working on these reports on Saturday and Sunday nights in order to meet my deadlines.

Site P48B: One of the difficulties we continue to face is the availability of funds and the lengthy process of waiting for these funds. Many of the applicants for assistance from the agency rely on public assistance and have extremely limited resources.

Site R48A: The AmeriCorps program has not really been a problem with me except the child care policy which I have still not received. Also the members need to communicate more with each other to share ideas.

Site R48B: Most members of the parks and recreation committee have not been attending the monthly meetings. There is no enthusiasm among the participants. I have decided to direct this group toward small, short-term projects while also planning for long term projects.

Although the resource directory is complete, we still need to publish and distribute it. A meeting will be scheduled between the County Judge, the Head Start Director, the Deputy Director of Administration of the local COG (MRGDC) and the AmeriCorps member, me. The Head Start program along with MRGDC will assist with copying and the binding of the directory. If an agreement can not be met, we will find alternate funding sources.

The Community Council of Southwest Texas has submitted a proposal with the hopes of expanding their transportation service to include intracounty transportation for Dimmit Count residents. The proposal was submitted on January 10, 1996 to the Texas Department of Transportation. We have not heard if we were selected for funding.

Site R48F: At times, people get discouraged when they are not seeing projects implemented. They become frustrated and then don't participate because they feel that it will take forever before they see anything done.

AmeriCorps members from other groups lack an interest in helping USDA/RECD projects. They feel burdened or that they are wasting their time in projects which are not theirs.

Communication between AmeriCorps members in cluster.

Lack of Equipment such as a camera.

Site P48A: We have problems in the implementation of the 504 loan/grant program due to the lack of funds. We have a backlog of application for the first quarter. If funds don't become available, then families will lose interest in the program.

20. National Identity Activities:

Site P48D: Attended a welcome meeting for the State Senator Kay Bailey Hutchison at the Hebbbronville First National Bank conference room where issues about colonia funding were discussed.

Site P48C: I attended the national AmeriCorp kickoff in Weslaco, Texas where Kika De La Garza was scheduled to speak. I had the opportunity to speak and give a brief overview of the successful fiscal year to the incoming AmeriCorp members. I was also invited to the National Border Coalition meeting that Blanca Juarez (AmeriCorp member) is working very closely with and helped pass the 1001 Bill for establishing the Self-Help centers in Colonias. In February, I was also invited by Delores Gomes to attend the guaranteed loan program training Brownsville, Texas. The training was very successful.

Site R48D: I attended a cluster meeting in Rio Grande City, Texas and performed site surveys to assist Starr County in gathering information from people who line in close proximity to Los Olvos Creek. Los Olvos reek has flooded twice in the past year. Starr County through the empowerment zone benefits wants to build a concrete channel to prevent such a flooding from occurring again. AmeriCorps members made approximately 15 surveys.

Site P48B: I participated in the beautification of city park, along with two other AmeriCorps members working with the Brooks County Extension service. The project was successful. We planted about 65 plants.

Site P48F: The RECD/USDA AmeriCorps members have worked with Texas A&M extension service members on community outreach. We have participated in guaranteed rural housing seminars where we have been able to share our work with others. We have also participated in organizing resident to gather for the presidents advisor for domestic policy reception. We have had an opportunity to share with USDA Secretary Glickman our project site activities through teleconference. We are represented at the South Texas AmeriCorps Coalition.

Site P48A: We attended a city counsel meeting in Roma, Texas. with the city mayor. In this meeting we informed the counsel about our loan and grant programs. This meeting was televised and several families have called for more information and application.

We attended an empowerment zone housing sub-committee meeting, February 6, 1996. The purpose was to insure the implementation of the objectives set forth in the Starr Zone strategic plan.

Site R48E: Have internet assess. However, administrative budget can not fund costs of communications with other sites. Our rural area has additional dial-up charges at this time.

Member attempted to be a part of the national tele-conference by Secretary Glickman, but due to technical difficulties was not able to take part.

21. Organizational Changes:

Site P48D: This quarter we are happy to announce that we have relocated to a new site and building and the first USDA service center in south Texas.

Site P48C: Monthly cluster meetings, have allowed us to schedule many community projects such as the cleanup and landscape of community centers, and flooded creeks in Rio Grande City, Texas.

Site P48B: This quarter we have been relocated to a new building. We now share our building with the Natural Resource and Conservation Service. We are the first USDA Service center in our area.

Site R48A: I have been doing surveys for the installation of a sewer line in a colonia. I am writing and filling out a grant application for a general needs planning study for the community of Camp Wood. I organized the Central North American Trade Corridor meeting. Original goal is to work on a revolving loan fund.

Site P48A We have to reduce our goals for program delivery because of lack of funds.

22. Organizational Improvements:

Site R48C: Allow education award to be passed on to a child; or the same amount of money be used for business start-up capital or home mortgage.

Site P48D: Second term members be extended one more year and a raise in salary.

Site P48A: The program can improve by having more meetings and communicating with each other. Also, it can improve by being recognized more for its time and effort in helping communities and people.

23. Primary Training and Technical Assistance Needs:

Site R48C: The national training seminar definitely needs to be held much earlier in the service year.

Site P48D: Would like more training in the areas of construction methods, techniques and inspections.

Site P48C: As a second year member, I would like some different kind of training. This would include housing seminars, leadership training, etiquette, customer service, and economic development training.

Site P48B: I would like to receive training in the areas of construction and inspections. I often can identify the problem but have problems with correct terminology. I feel that training in these areas would enable me to do a better job in the rehabilitation aspect of the program.

Site P48A: It can help by providing more meetings, and training or beneficial conferences for its members.

Site R48F: Need training in housing programs, leadership programs, customer service training, community and economic developments training and strategic planning.

Site R48E: Program of benefit to financial management and property upkeep. Area technical training i.e. plumber and carpenter skills. Instruction to carpenters and builder i.e. business management and effective building techniques.
