Subject: Leadership Summit

Harris, Michael Woo and I attended the second of three planning sessions for the Leadership Summit organized by Gregg Petersmeier. I am attaching, for your information and comments, the draft vision statement and draft short-term and longer-term outcomes of the Summit. These will be presented to members of our Board and the Points of Light Board at a joint meeting June 9.

Among the assumptions the planning group is making is that the Summit should allow for "sector" meetings -- such as business; nonprofits; religious; education; etc. -- and that there would be developed, prior to the Summit, draft "commitments" or something like that for individuals to sign onto. Start thinking about what we should propose.

There is also interest in having leaders from all walks of life attend (your suggestions welcome), including some who would use the Summit as their opportunity to announce their own organization's new commitment to service (for example, a governor might announce a new initiative using service as a strategy to achieve a priority goal; a college president might announce integration of service into each first year student's required courses; etc.). If you have ideas about individuals or organizations that might be approached about making such an announcement, let me know.

We will discuss this at a future senior staff or policy committee meeting.

Vision For The Summit

The central goal of the Summit is to usher in a new era of "citizenship" (citizen action and service) as the defining public philosophy for national and community problem solving.

Summit Outcomes by February 1997

1. The Summit demonstrates that the individual and collective power of people and organizations giving their gifts can restore a sense of community and make a positive difference in the quality of life.
2. The American people become aware of the Summit's central message that: every American believes that:
 - a. through service, people can enhance the lives of others;
 - b. by doing so, they enrich their own; and
 - c. it is their responsibility to do so.
3. People around the country engage in serious dialog about the Summit's message and discuss how to strengthen the assets in communities to solve problems.
4. Leaders of organizations and communities make commitments to create the conditions which would lead to more people involved effectively in their community.

Summit Outcomes in 3 Years

1. Agreements made at the Summit are implemented in communities nationwide.
2. Every American believes that:
 - a. through service, people can enhance the lives of others;
 - b. by doing so, they enrich their own; and
 - c. it is their responsibility to do so.
3. Through this new call to action, more people become more effectively involved in their community.
4. As a result of this increased action, we begin to see that problems are solved and communities rebuilt.

Re: Recruitment Week FY 96: May 8-15

Date: May 23, 1996

The following report on activities undertaken during the FY 96 recruitment week is based on evaluation forms submitted by 8 Corporation State Offices; 1 State Commission; 1 AmeriCorps State/National program; 3 Headquarters' Units - AmeriCorps VISTA, AmeriCorps NCCC, and Recruitment Unit; and 5 individual CNS staff members. The Recruitment Unit knows that many more people and units contributed to the overall effort of recruitment week and regret that we can't include those in this report.

Thanks to all of you who helped make this effort the best it could have been, and we greatly appreciate the feedback to improve it in the future.

Summary of Activities

- 63 + Colleges were contacted
- 400 High schools were contacted - 386 counselors by NCCC staff alone
- 293 newspapers were sent our press release - not including those to whom PA sent general releases
- 301 applications were distributed
- 110 + Vista inquiries received follow-up phone calls
- 4 conferences with a collective attendance of over 4,000 people were "tabled", e.g. Aspira conference in D.C., Career Expo in Vermont, one in California, and the Mid-Atlantic Association of College Employers' conference in Maryland
- 2 radio shows participated in by AmeriCorps representatives (Utah and North Carolina)
- 11 Community meetings held or contacts made, e.g. Community Resource Center in East Liverpool, Ohio; Associates for Renewal of Education, D.C.
- 80 VISTA interviews conducted and over 300 calls fielded by VISTA staff
- Numerous religious centers were contacted such as the St. Paul AME Zion Church in the D.C. area
- Employment agencies were contacted and posterred, e.g. DC employment agency, California JTPA agencies
- Special activities-
 - One CNS staffer helped us initiate a mailing to members of the Child Welfare League of America, Inc.
 - Another staffer linked us with the President's Advisory Commission on Educational Excellence for Hispanic Americans through which we will do a mailing to all of the colleges with 25% Hispanic populations
 - Connections with JTPAs in California

Suggestions For Next Time

- Personal contact with organizations the staff is already affiliated with

- More lead time, advanced notice and earlier receipt if materials
- A very brief description of what materials were and how they can best be utilized
- Hire more staff
- Have a week determined in advance where other parts of the corporation are not requesting work and in which the field is consulted prior to the week announced
- Too late for college students
- Ship materials earlier and provide summary list of national promo outlets
- Place ads with Peace Corps all year round
- Have materials throughout the year
- We realize the poster is for colleges but it appears to 18-22 year olds. How about complementing poster for older non-traditional students?

- Great job!
- Thanks for shipping materials to me on very short notice.
- Beautiful materials- Press release heading great!!!
- Ample supply of new brochures and applications

The Corporation for National Service is planning two national events to be held in Washington, D.C., this summer that will promote the role of senior volunteers in contributing to the well-being of their communities — the National Leadership Forum on Senior Service and the National Senior Service Corps Training Conference. Both events, planned concurrently, are designed to invigorate the Corporation's efforts to spread the word about the value of senior service, to expand volunteer service opportunities for older Americans, and to make service even more effective in helping to solve some of the critical problems of our communities.

These events are part of the Corporation's response to the challenge set forth by delegates to the 1995 White House Conference on Aging who charged the Corporation with taking the lead in efforts to double the number of senior volunteers by the year 2000.

THE LEADERSHIP FORUM, JULY 15, 1996

The National Leadership Forum on Senior Service is an inaugural event planned to provide an opportunity for influential leaders to lend their experience, expertise, and prestige to a renewed effort to promote and support volunteer service by older Americans.

Among the sectors represented at the Forum will be businesses, foundations, major charities, government, academia, unions, media, and civic organizations. The Forum is being organized as a working session for a select group of invitees who will identify key ways to increase opportunities for senior service in our nation. Its goal is to identify ways leaders in these various

sectors can work together and with the Corporation for National Service to expand their own commitments to senior service and to inspire others in the sectors they represent to promote and support senior service as well.

The National Leadership Forum on Senior Service is being held in cooperation with the Points of Light Foundation and will take place at the Old Executive Office Building of the White House on Monday afternoon, July 15, 1996.

THE NATIONAL CONFERENCE, JULY 14-17, 1996

The Corporation's first-ever National Senior Service Corps Training Conference will bring together the 1,200 project directors of the Senior Corps programs — Foster Grandparents, Senior Companions, and the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) — for training and skills building. Senior Corps projects enable more than 500,000 active senior citizen volunteers to serve their communities as Foster Grandparents to troubled youth, as Senior Companions to the frail homebound elderly, or as members of RSVP, meeting a variety of community needs. The conference theme is "Renewing America Through Senior Service."

The National Senior Service Corps Conference will be held at the Sheraton Washington Hotel July 14-17, 1996.

Participants in the National Leadership Forum on Senior Service are invited to the Monday morning opening Plenary Session of the Conference, to which President Clinton has been invited, and to the conference recognition dinner on Monday evening. Forum participants will be appropriately acknowledged at both events.
