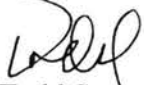

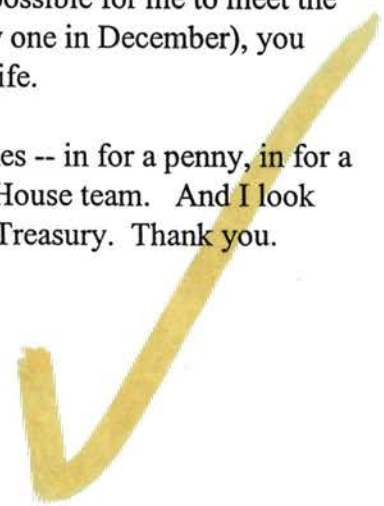

National Safe Schools Rally For Healing

Dear Mr. President,

My name is Michael J. Cashman, Jr. and I am the Executive Director of Safety and Firearms Education, The Safe Schools Program (SAFE).

I conceived and developed SAFE in reaction to a personal, life altering experience.

The morning of March 29, 1992 began as most others. However, for me, the day ended was significantly different from any previously experienced. It found me lying in a hospital bed nursing a gunshot wound, and developing quite a different perspective on life. I had been shot by a sixteen year old boy in West Virginia.

While this experience changed me in ways I cannot even articulate, I felt I could effect more significant, widespread and meaningful change by taking action. When I became aware of the ease with which children are able to acquire guns, and how prevalent child related gun incidents are, I deliberated over the best way for me to address this issue.

A little research revealed that there are active antigun lobbying groups, but it did not seem that much of what was available was directed at children.

It seemed that if our children are growing up in a society where laws are weak enough to allow children easy access to guns, then it is our responsibility to educate those children regarding gun awareness and safety...and SAFE was born.



SAFE is committed to keeping our schools and children free from harm due to firearms and dangerous weapons. We have developed a variety of programs, including age appropriate education programs for all schools (K-12). The purpose of all of our programs is to educate children, parents and teachers about gun facts and the dangerous realities of guns and other weapons.

Some of the current SAFE programs are:

- 1) Class Clown Program (K-6)- provides educational information regarding the dangers of guns & weapons in an entertaining, informative, yet age appropriate manner.
- 2) Assembly Program- educational student assembly regarding the dangers of guns & weapons, including graphic information concerning the realities of violence. Often involves celebrity guest speaker. Some past speakers have been Brian Jordan (Atlanta Braves), Tony Twist (St. Louis Blues Hockey), and Jerome Bettis (Pittsburgh Steelers).
- 3) In-Service Programs- educational program designed to help teachers recognize the early warning signs of violence and how to best intervene.
- 4) Grant Program- aid educational institutions in securing grants for the purpose of teacher/student safety education programs. (most recently obtained \$100,000 grant from Department of Education for Gary, Indiana Schools to send their teachers to the University of Oklahoma for a program in conflict resolution.)
- 5) National SAFE Schools Rally for Healing: the first rally will take place in Long Island, New York, on September 18, 1999. This will be an educational, yet entertaining event. We anticipate an audience of over 10,000 children and parents.

Speakers committed to speaking at the rally thus far are:

- 1) Senator Charles Schumer
- 2) Congresswoman Carolyn McCarthy
- 3) Richard Pennington - Superintendent of the New Orleans Police Dept.
- 4) Johnny Johnson - State of Alabama Parole Board
- 5) Honorable Judge Joe Brown - Memphis Criminal Court
- 6) T. Graham Brown - Country Music Singer

T. Graham Brown will also be among the many performers that have given their time freely to support our Organization.

We will also be holding a Celebrity Auction at this event. With donations from many different types of performers, entertainers and sports figures, this such be a most successful activity.



We are hoping to have Rosie O'Donnell Co-Host the Rally along with myself.

Recent child related gun tragedies, such as that in Littleton, gave us a chance to rethink our position on how to better educate our children and their parents, along with their teachers.

Some Programs we intend to implement in the future are:

- 1) Town Hall Meetings: these meetings will bring parents and children together to share their thoughts, fears and hopes regarding gun and weapons safety in the schools as well as their community at large.
- 2) Nationwide Toll Free Hot Line: This number will be widely publicized so anyone who is aware of the illegal possession and/or use of any weapons, potential planned violence, or threats can have a place to anonymously report it. The Hot Line Number is 888-382-2002.

I will be at the White House on June 25, 1999 for your radio address. I would like to respectfully request a meeting with you, on that day, if possible.

We are a well intended, but Nonprofit Organization. We have a focus and goals but need the support of high profile, well respected, informed people.

We would be honored if you would consider supporting our efforts by participating in the first National SAFE Rally on September 18, 1999. I am requesting a meeting with Mrs. Clinton, to more thoroughly share the specifics of the SAFE Program, and to invite her to be a keynote speaker at the Rally as well as yourself.

Keep this eagle out of school

UNLESS GOV. PATAKI vetoes a bill that has passed both houses of the Legislature, New York State is about to open the doors of its elementary schools to the propaganda of the National Rifle Association.

Disguised as legislation promoting gun safety, the Eddie Eagle bill would authorize the state to purchase and distribute the NRA's curriculum on guns — comic books, posters, videos and even playing cards that feature the rifle association's feathered cartoon mascot — to every school that requests material on gun safety.

The NRA has gotten Eddie Eagle into classrooms in more than a dozen states through stealth and deceit, and its campaign in New York is no exception. On March 15, a bill innocently titled the Firearm Accident Prevention Program Act passed the Assembly with no debate and virtually no notice.

It was only after Eddie Eagle came before the state Senate Committee on Environmental Conservation that gun-control advocates and legislators focused on the bill's insidious purpose.

On its face, the Eddie Eagle program purports to teach a simple lesson on gun safety: "Don't touch guns, and if you find one, tell an adult." However there are serious problems with this apparently benign program.

First, the Eddie Eagle curriculum does not work. A recent report on ABC's "20/20" graphically demonstrated that Eddie Eagle does not

prevent children from touching guns. A hidden camera revealed that shortly after being taught the Eddie Eagle lesson about avoiding guns, 17 out of 20 children picked up and attempted to use unloaded guns when left unsupervised.

Second, the NRA uses Eddie Eagle for a lot more than lessons on gun safety. In fact, Eddie

Eagle was created as part of a 1988 NRA campaign to prevent Florida from enacting a law that would have held adults liable for failing to keep guns locked away from children.

Eddie Eagle has been used repeatedly since then in NRA campaigns against trigger locks and other child-access-prevention laws.

Eddie Eagle is the centerpiece of the NRA's national effort to dupe people into thinking that teaching kids not to touch guns is better than requiring adults to keep them away from kids.

Finally, Eddie Eagle is also a critical part of the NRA's recruit-



ment drive for the next generation of gun owners. The NRA uses Eddie Eagle in advertisements for gun shows. Grownups are encouraged to bring their kids to NRA programs to "meet Eddie Eagle."

Tragically, New York State may be about to endorse the NRA's feathered propagandist. At a time when hundreds of children are killed or injured by handguns every month, the last thing we need is Eddie Eagle in New York's schools.

The governor should veto this bill immediately. Eddie Eagle should not be allowed to fly in the Empire State.

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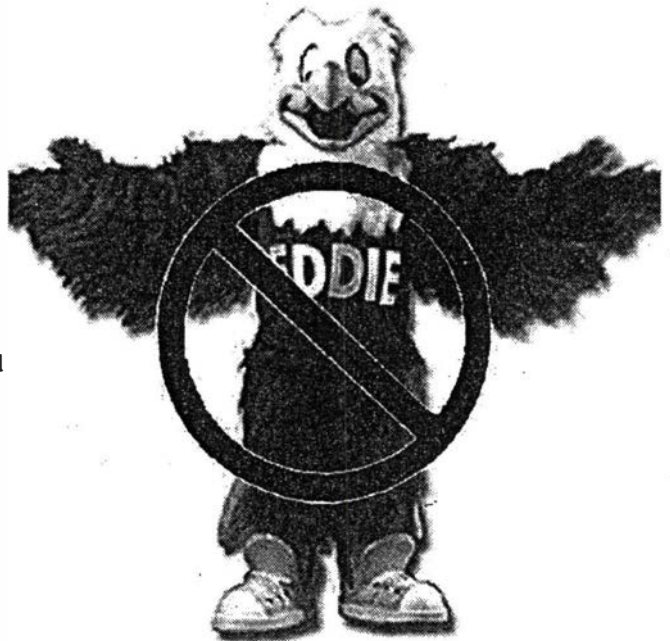
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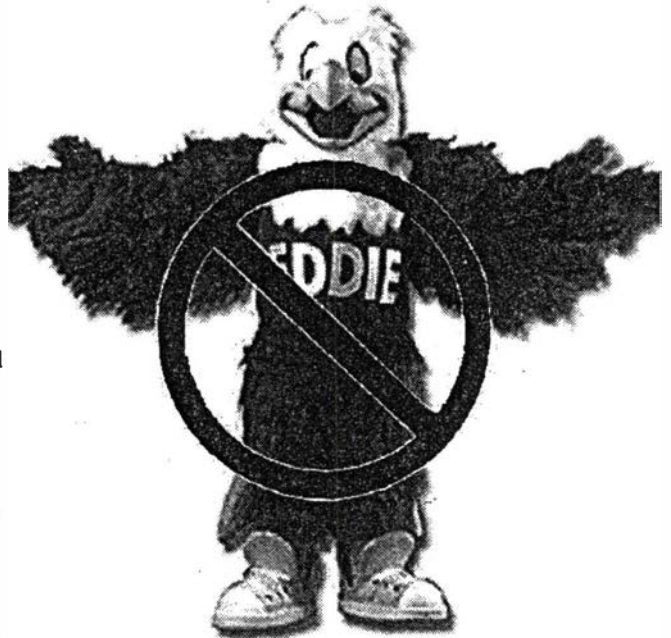

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Senators Fault White House Clinton to Offer For Handling of Spy Reports Plan to Guard Pension Surplus

Senators reacted sharply to a report yesterday that the Clinton White House knew of Chinese nuclear espionage earlier than it has acknowledged.

"That really shouldn't go on," said Sen. Orrin G. Hatch (R-Utah), who plans to run for president. Sen. John McCain (R-Ariz.), another GOP presidential aspirant, accused the administration of covering up and "misconduct."

Even a Clinton supporter, Sen. Joseph I. Lieberman (D-Conn.)—who appeared with McCain and Hatch on "Fox News Sunday"—accused officials of ineptitude because they apparently knew of security problems in nuclear weapons laboratories two years before President Clinton was told.

The White House said yesterday that it was alerted to suspicions of Chinese espionage in 1995 but did not learn about details until 1996, as the administration has said.

Chinese spying in U.S. weapons laboratories began in the mid-1980s during the Reagan administration, but it was not until 1995

that U.S. intelligence agencies began to suspect that China had gained access to the most advanced U.S. nuclear warhead.

In July 1995, Hazel R. O'Leary, then energy secretary, told then-White House Chief of Staff Leon E. Panetta and other officials about evidence that China may have stolen nuclear secrets, the New York Times reported yesterday, and word filtered out to other officials in ensuing months.

National security adviser Samuel R. "Sandy" Berger, the deputy in 1995, has said he did not tell Clinton until Berger was briefed thoroughly in July 1997.

The White House said yesterday that there was no formal interagency contact over the issue before April 1996, when the Energy Department first briefed Berger.

Counsel Jim Kennedy said prior discussions of the matter—such as the July 1995 contact—were preliminary and informal. O'Leary's talk with Panetta, Kennedy said, was "simply an informal heads-up to the White House."

President Clinton plans to offer his own version of a plan to guard surplus Social Security funds for the nation's retirees, a senior White House aide said yesterday.

The House has already passed a "lock box" for Social Security funds, which would prevent them from being tapped for uses other than for the retirement system, except in an emergency and only after a special vote of Congress. The Senate has been considering an even more stringent lock box to prevent the government from spending excess Social Security funds.

"Shortly, the president will put forward a strengthened Social Security lock box proposal that we think will be stronger than anything that has been proposed so far," Gene Sperling, director of the White House National Economic Council, said on CNN's "Late Edition."

The White House and Republicans in Congress are in a contest to demonstrate their commitment to protecting Social Security, which is running surpluses that are expected to disappear in about 10 years as the baby boom generation begins to retire.

Sperling did not offer any details of Clinton's proposal but said the White House hoped it would garner support from both Republicans and Democrats. Some congressional Democrats have criticized the lock box idea, saying it would not do much to address the long-term problems facing Social Security.

"We are very hopeful that the new presidential proposal—that new Social Security lock box—will be a way of bringing together both Democrats and Republicans," he said.

On Tuesday, Clinton plans to unveil a proposal for overhauling another large and popular program for the elderly: Medicare.

He intends to propose adding a prescription-drug benefit to Medicare, something that is not now offered.

U.S. suspects stolen data key to China missile

China is making final preparations to test fire a new mobile intercontinental ballistic missile that the CIA believes will incorporate stolen U.S. missile and warhead secrets, The Washington Times has learned.

Preparations for the launch of the road-mobile DF-31 — which could take place as early as next week — were spotted by U.S. spy satellites at Wuzhai in central China and reported in classified U.S. intelligence reports earlier this month, said U.S. intelligence officials familiar with the reports.

"They are getting ready for a launch," one official said.

The official said one U.S. intelligence agency assessed the DF-31 test missile to be capable of carrying a 2½-megaton warhead. A megaton is the equivalent of a million tons of TNT.

Other intelligence estimates have said the DF-31 warhead size will be smaller, closer to the 100- to 200-kiloton range that is similar to compact U.S. nuclear warheads.

China's two dozen CSS-4 long-range ICBMs each carry a five-

megaton warhead and the CIA reported last year that at least 13 of those missiles were targeted on U.S. cities.

Officials said they were viewing the signs of an impending missile test with caution because an earlier test firing set for December was scrapped, possibly to wait for warmer weather.

The 5,000-mile-range missile will be able to hit targets in parts of the western United States.

According to a report released last month by a special House panel investigating Chinese espionage, the DF-31 is likely to be the first missile in the People's Liberation Army (PLA) arsenal to incorporate stolen U.S. warhead design technology, including either the advanced W-88 warhead, or the older W-70 warhead used on short-range Lance missiles.

"The DF-31 ICBM and the PRC's other new generation mobile ICBMs will require smaller, more compact warheads," said the

report by a committee headed by Rep. Christopher Cox, California Republican. "The stolen U.S. information on the W-70 or W-88 Trident D-5 will be useful for this purpose." The D-5 is the most advanced U.S. submarine-launched ballistic missile.

The report said the DF-31 could be ready for operational deployment by 2002 if tests are successful. It said the DF-31, one of three new mobile ICBMs the Chinese are developing, could be tested this year.

The CIA also stated in a damage assessment produced earlier this year on Chinese nuclear spying that Beijing's nuclear espionage helped advance China's strategic nuclear missile program. The stolen design information is expected to appear in the next generation of strategic weapons, like the DF-31 and a longer-range version, the DF-41, in a few years, the agency stated.

Regarding the impending flight test, U.S. intelligence agencies are closely monitoring the Wuzhai Missile and Space Test Center, about 400 miles southwest of Beijing, where the DF-31 is being built. The missile was photo-

graphed there by a spy satellite in October 1996, when silos related to tests were also spotted.

Intelligence monitors, including satellites and reconnaissance aircraft, are watching the Wuzhai site for the test and officials said they will be looking out for whether China makes the jump from a large single warhead to small, multiple warheads. The first flight test of the DF-31 took place in May 1995

and other missile tests showed China's use of "penetration aids" — dummy warheads designed to fool missile defenses.

China has been working slowly on the new DF-31 and last tested its rocket motor during President Clinton's visit to China a year ago. The July 1 test, according to some Pentagon officials, was an "ejection test" of the DF-31 missile. Its timing was viewed as a political

signal to the United States, coming as it did during the summit, these officials said.

A White House spokesman at the time sought to play down the significance of the test as simply part of China's nuclear modernization program, which the Clinton administration does not appear to oppose.

A classified 1996 report by the Air Force's National Air Intelligence Center (NAIC), states that the DF-31 is a single-warhead missile with a range of more than 4,500 miles that was in the "late stages" of development.

The missile, only the second road-mobile ICBM in the world after Russia's SS-25s and SS-27s, uses solid-fuel propulsion that will be a major improvement over China's liquid-fuel CSS-4 missiles, the current mainstay of the Chinese ICBM force.

"The DF-31 ICBM will give China a major strike capability that will be difficult to counterattack at any stage of its operation," states the Air Force report, labeled "secret." "It will be a significant threat not only to U.S. forces deployed in the Pacific theater, but to portions of the continental United

States and to many of our allies."

The Air Force report contained a map showing the range of DF-31 to be sufficient for it to hit targets throughout the western United States along a line running southwest from Wisconsin through California.

According to the Air Force, the DF-31 will provide a boost to China's strategic missile design "similar to those of current generation Russian missiles." The report also said the missile will probably be fitted with decoys and chaff to defeat missile defenses.

A longer-range version of the DF-31, known as the DF-41, will have a 7,000-mile range, enough to hit targets throughout the United States. The DF-41 is expected to be deployed soon after the DF-31.

The Chinese are developing a submarine-launched version of the DF-31 known as the JL-2 with an even longer range that will be deployed on China's Type 094-class nuclear missile submarines. The JL-2 will have a range of 7,500 miles that "will allow it to be launched from the PRC's territorial waters and to strike targets throughout the United States," the Cox committee report said.
