Dear Clinton Dinner Co-Chairs,

We are the Steering Committee of OUT THERE, the first entertainment industry-wide group of out gay and lesbian activists. On May 21st of this year, we were among Hollywood's most committed and enthusiastic supporters of President Clinton's re-election campaign. We had met with the White House, the DNC and the Clinton campaign and had proudly made his reelection our organization's #1 priority for 1996.

But on May 22nd, we were face to face with a political nightmare. President Clinton announced that he would sign the misnamed "Defense of Marriage Act," a federal anti-gay marriage bill co-sponsored by Ex-Senator Bob Dole. The reaction from the gay community was fast and furious.

Elizabeth Birch, executive director of the Human Rights Campaign, the largest national lesbian and gay political organization, spoke for many of us when she said, "Even though the president has long opposed same-sex marriage, there is absolutely no need for him to sign this cynically timed and mean spirited bill, which is aimed at outlawing something that does not even exist. It is deeply disappointing that the president has chosen the politically expedient course of action rather than standing up to gratuitous gaybaiting."

And for proof that gratuitous gaybaiting is EXACTLY what this bill is, one need look no further than the New York Times on May 29th, where Ralph Reed, executive director of the Christian Coalition, could barely contain his glee at his anticipated result of putting this bill on Mr. Clinton's desk-- "The organized gay lobby will go into orbit."

We have no intention of going into orbit, but we cannot afford to sit silently by as if none of this is actually happening. In the interest of engaging our community in open debate, we are holding a town meeting and inviting all of gay and lesbian Hollywood to participate. It is our hope that by addressing our community's anger head-on, we can avert a potentially disastrous scenario in which gay people stay at home on election day in large numbers as they did in 1994.



We have chosen Monday June 10th for our event because we want to reach the President when he is in Los Angeles for fundraising purposes. We need him to understand that there is a moral, political and financial cost to supporting a hate-driven bill that was designed to drive a wedge between Clinton and the gay community.

While we are gathering in West Hollywood, you will be dining with President of the United States. Many of us were invited to this dinner and would have been honored to attend, had Clinton not jumped the gun on an issue which affects us so deeply. If we may be so bold, it is our heartfelt hope that you convey our concerns to the President. We wish you a very successful evening and we're glad that you'll be there, even though we cannot be.

Dear Mr. President:

"JUST SAY NO TO THE BOSNIAN ELECTIONS"

With the Bosnian elections fast approaching, I would like to appeal to you (one more time) to cancel them. The tragedy that you helped to compound in Bosnia will become reaffirmed and irrevocable with the conduct of those elections. All the well informed people (from both the U.S. and of Bosnia) know that Dayton agreement was nothing but a stalling tactic on your part until after the November elections (your elections) are over. You had no concern for the future of Bosnians or for the punishment of those guilty. You never cared that the little that is left of Bosnia will be no different and fare no better than an American Indian reservation. The part of Bosnia that is left to the Bosnian government is neither defensible nor economically viable. The fact that most of Bosnians will not be able to return to their homes or that Bosnia will forever stay surrounded by hostile forces doesn't seem to concern you very much.

What you have in fact done in Dayton is no different than if in 1943 someone "forced" the Germans to keep "only" half of France, half of Russia, and so on. Since you are one of those responsible for the fact that the Bosnians never had real opportunity to defend themselves and to liberate all of their lands, you should have had the decency to at least make sure that Bosnians have a chance at a better future. Thanks to your Dayton agreement, the future for Bosnians is not much brighter than that of the Kurds or the Chechen's.

It is true that the Bosnian (Muslims) people lacked the proper leadership, but that shouldn't have been the reason to punish all of them. You abused the trust and the faith that the Bosnian people had in America and in America's sense of right and fair play. Just as you made many promises that you never intended to keep during the 1992 campaign, you are doing it again. To take advantage of people who have lost everything and to use them for your own political games is very insensitive and very heartless.

As unfair and as pro-Serbian the Dayton agreement is, it at least should be completely implemented first before the people of Bosnia are forced to approve it. But as a matter of fact, since the Serbs didn't honor most of their "Dayton" commitments (they NEVER do), the Dayton agreement should be nullified, and the Bosnian government should be allowed to liberate the rest of Bosnia, or at least create a state that will have some future. The fact that you Mr. Clinton didn't do anything to stop the war in Bosnia until the Serbs started losing territory only proves that your intentions in Bosnia were not honorable.

Dear Mr. President:

Ernie and I have purchased the old First Baptist Church on 12 th. and Louisiana with the intent of establishing a museum of the history of black Arkansans, EMOBA, and a performing arts theater, which will also house The Arkansas Black Hall Of Fame. We are currently negotiating with Sales Mart to obtain what used to be the Human Services Department at the same location, giving us a total space of 41,000 square feet.

We will require approximately \$ 4,000,000 to achieve this goal. We have only yesterday learned that Governor Tucker, through the Economic Development Of Arkansas Fund Commission, has considerable discretionary funds to disperse. My application will be available for the 6/26/96 deadline. However, given the tremendous impact this project will exert in continuing downtown redevelopment, tourism, education, community service, historic preservation and Arkansas national image, it is imperative that I communicate personally with the Governor and that all avenues of influence be brought to bear.

I have been unsuccessful in obtaining an audience with the Governor and time is pressing. hopefully you have received and had an opportunity to review the information I forwarded to you in the

care of Ms. Lottie Shackelford on 5/10/96. If not, I have included a small portion of our plans and mission .

If you agree that this is a worth while endeavor, please contact GovernorTucker to express your interest and persuade him to grant us an audience with him before the commission finalizes it's decision on 6/27/96.

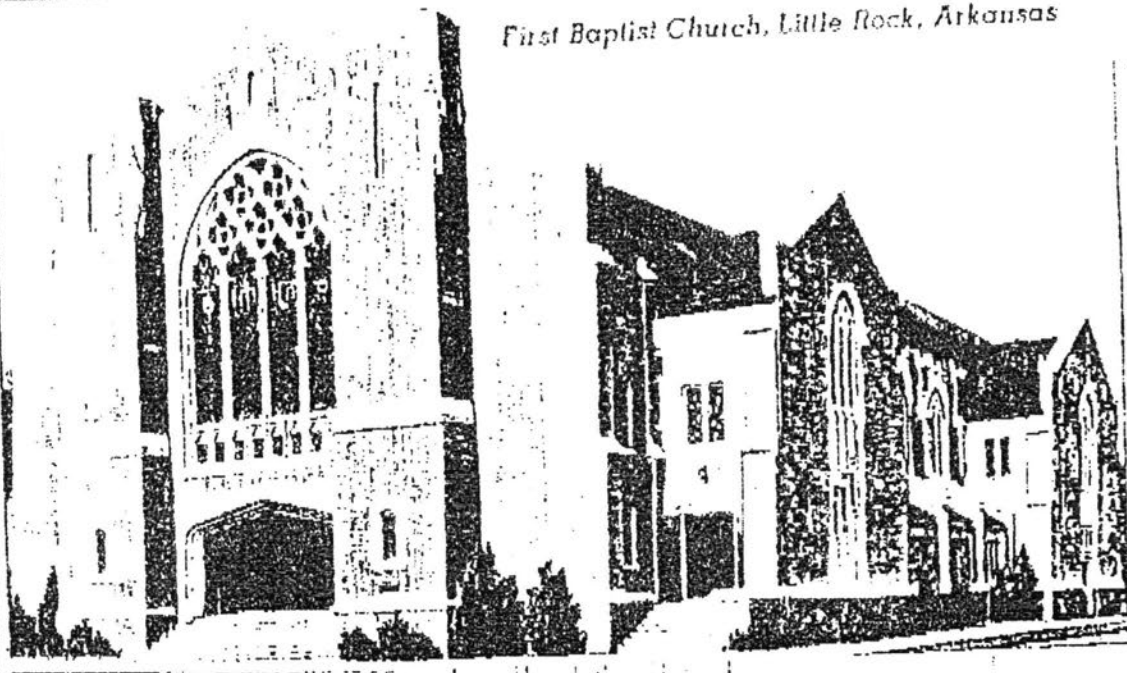

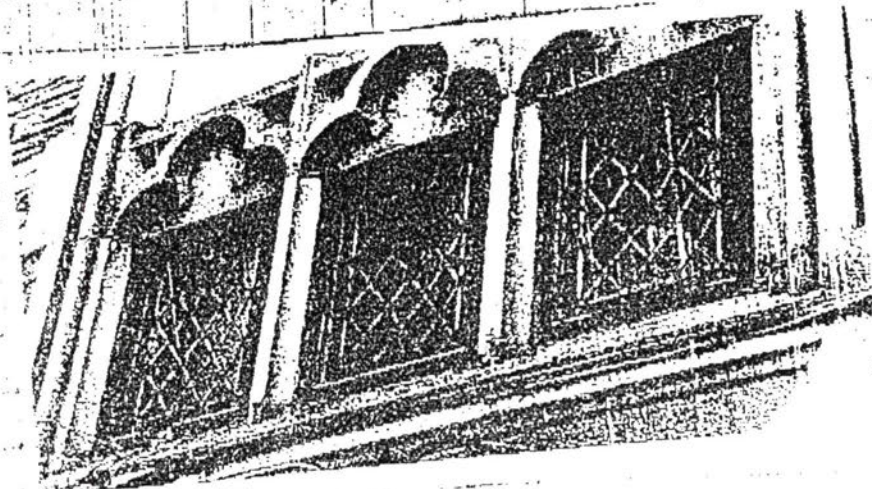
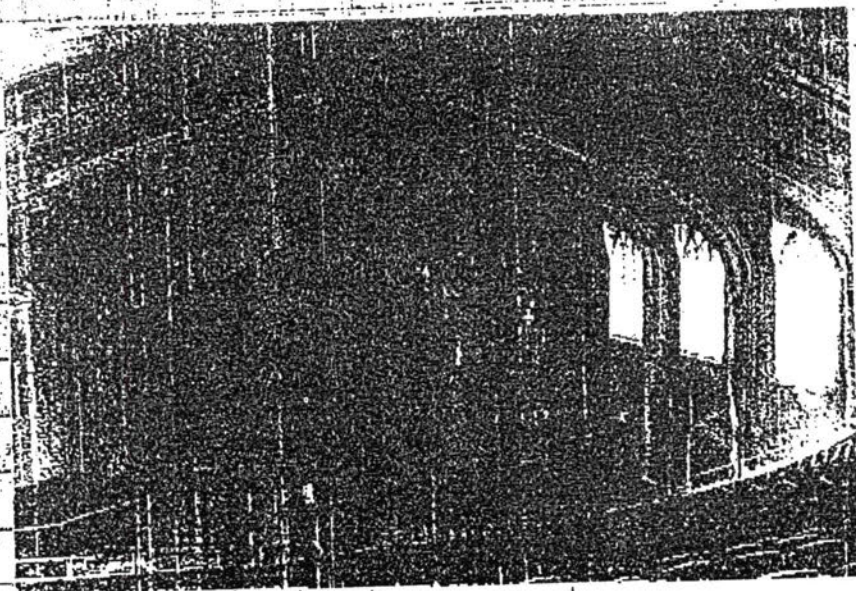

The structure, illustrated on the cover, was constructed in the mid to late 1890's as the second home of the ~~the~~ First Baptist Church in Little Rock, Arkansas. Located at 12th Street and Louisiana, it commands an impressive connection with downtown Little Rock and easy accessibility off I 476. It represents a classic example of Neo-Gothic architecture with towering interior arches and beautiful stained glass through out.



The building was vacated approximately 20 years ago, with it and the surrounding area falling into significant decline since. The primary structure has, on several occasions, been scheduled for demolition or conversion to other uses.

In September of 1993, this significant piece of historical Little Rock was purchased by Ernie Wodrich and ~~dedicated~~ dedicated to EMORBA as the primary site for the development of the museum and performing arts center.

will serve as a vehicle to preserve and expose the rich and astounding heritage of black Arkansians and their contributions to the development of our remarkable state.

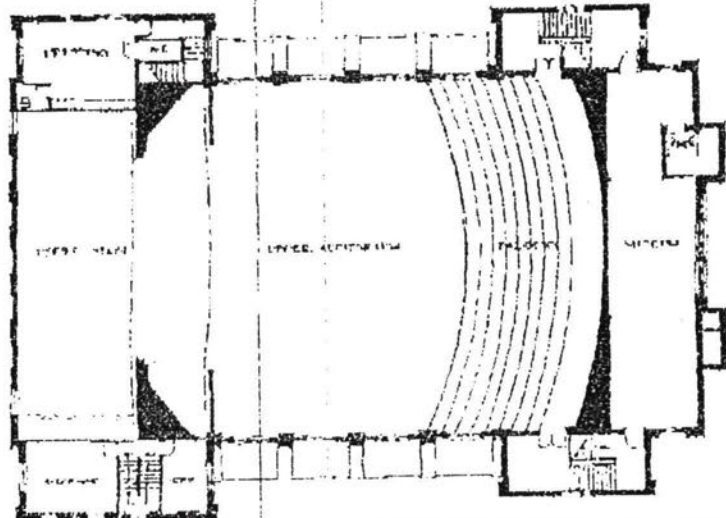

On behalf of Governor Mike Lowry, I am delighted to be able to forward a copy of a letter signed by 40 governors urging the congressional leadership to support unconditional MFN for China. This bipartisan effort on behalf of MFN for China was organized by Governors Lowry and Jim Edgar, the same two "trade governors" who two years ago created a coalition of 40 governors who sent you a letter endorsing the ratification of the WTO agreement.

We very much enjoyed having the First Lady in Seattle on the 24th for two great functions: an extremely well received luncheon speech before 1100 people who had gathered to honor the launching of MAVIA (Mothers Against Violence in America) where Hillary challenged, and motivated, us to create a healthier, safer society for our children to grow up in; and a fabulously successful dinner gathering of the faithful at the home of my friend, Stan Barer, where she cogently spelled out the reasons why we need four more years to get the job done.

I was extremely honored to be seated next to Hillary at dinner, and to have the opportunity to talk with her about the enormous stake that we all have in a peaceful Chinese transition from doctrinaire Marxist-Leninism to a democratic, free market society. The 20th century is in many ways the story of the world's failure to manage the quest of Germany and Japan for great power status. That catastrophic failure resulted in the emergence of the twin tyrannies of bolshevism and fascism, and the waging of two world wars characterized by unrivaled carnage and destruction. We must resolve to avoid the mistakes of the past when dealing with China.

I am looking forward to having coffee with you the morning of July 8th, along with Stan Barer who was instrumental in the opening of China during the late 70s and early 80s.

Dear Mr. Speaker, Majority and Minority Leaders of the House and the Senate:

We write to urge unconditional renewal of Most Favored Nation (MFN) status for the People's Republic of China ("China"). At the outset, let us point out that granting MFN status does not mean preferential treatment for Chinese exporters; in fact, MFN means only that China will be the beneficiary of normal treatment in its trading relationship with the United States, and its exporters will operate on equal footing with exporters from the 147 other countries who have MFN status with the United States. As you know, only a handful of countries, such as North Korea and Cuba do not have MFN status.

There are important economic and national security reasons for renewing China's MFN status. First, China represents the world's largest consumer market, and bilateral free trade with China has been good for the United States. United States exports to China totaled \$11.7 billion in 1995 alone. If China's MFN status is not renewed, China will retaliate by imposing barriers to American imports which will, in turn, cause the loss of the thousands of jobs that those exports support.

Second, although opponents of MFN argue that China's less than exemplary human rights record does not justify renewal, we believe that MFN status will help to better the lot of the Chinese people. Increased trade and communication between the United States and China will increase the standard of living of the Chinese people and will expose them to other ways of organizing political and civil society. There is already more openness and freedom of communication in China, via telephones, fax machines, the internet, and CNN, than ever before precisely because we did not cut off all trade and commercial contacts with China after Tiananmen Square.

The U.S. will continue to have trade disputes with China on matters such as intellectual property rights, piracy and market access, just as we continue to have disputes with Japan, the European Union countries, and our neighbors in Latin America. But trade disputes

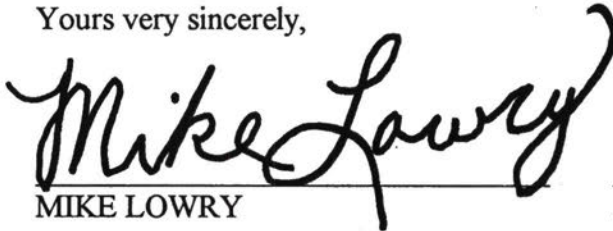

with China, as with other countries, should be dealt with on a case-by-case basis. The right approach, as we have done with IPR enforcement, is narrowly tailor sanctions to achieve a mutually agreed resolution of a specific issue, rather than using the prospect of MFN non-renewal as a tactic to coerce our trading partners into submission. The United States-China trade relationship is too broad and too complex to make progress in a single industry, such as wheat or IPR, a precondition for MFN renewal.

MFN for China is not a partisan political issue. Both President Clinton and Senator Dole, the presumptive presidential candidates of their respective parties, agree that the United States must continue to expand its trade relations with China via unconditional renewal of MFN. For all the reasons advanced above, we urge you to support President Clinton's and Senator Dole's bipartisan efforts to secure unconditional renewal of MFN for China.

Subject: Ozark National Forest

First of all, Percy Malone suggested that I try to contact the President through your office. I am sure you have no idea who I am. For almost thirty years, I taught chemistry at Ouachita University and did my research on the rivers and lakes of Arkansas. I worked with the Governors office in Arkansas on many environmentally related issues. Mr. Clinton knows my background.

I am sure that you are aware of the problems that have been developing in the Ozark National Forest with regard to opposition to the harvest of timber in the watershed of the Buffalo National River. The Democrat Gazette carried a major article about the controversy in last Sunday's issue. As I understand it, some of the Sierra Club people have approached President Clinton and asked that he intervene in the controversy. The article in Sunday's paper as well as other sources indicate that at a White House conference, Secretary Glickman was asked to look into the matter. It is also my understanding (not confirmed) that the Council on Environmental Quality is meeting today and will probably issue a recommendation to the Secretary soon.

I was one of the persons who worked very hard to get the Buffalo into the National Park system. But I was also the first scientist to do a comprehensive water quality survey of the river system. I am also aware of much of the scientific work which has been done in the area of the relationship of water quality and forest practices.

It appears to me that the people from Arkansas who have been briefing the President on this matter may not be aware that there is little or no scientific evidence which support their position of asking that timber cutting activities in the Ozark National Forest be stopped. To be honest, I am not a big supporter of the National Forest Service but I do believe that in this case, there is some middle ground. It is possible for the timber people to have what they want and at the same time, protect the Buffalo National River. This issue is really getting people worked up and I fear that if Secretary Glickman should take some action to stop timber activities in this area, the whole movement will spread throughout the National Forest area of Arkansas.

Dear Mr. President:

Greetings from the hills of Arkansas.

The controversy associated with timber cutting activities in the watershed of the Buffalo National River is, in my opinion, completely unnecessary. I understand that Secretary Glickman has become personally involved in this situation and may consider stopping all timber harvest in the Ozark National Forest until the matter can be resolved.

Most of the objection to the harvest of timber in the headwaters of the Buffalo River seem to be centered around the idea that the harvest of timber will result in water quality degradation of the river. Opponents to the harvest operations focus on the possibility that silt will be introduced into the river system.

The preponderance of the scientific evidence indicate that the main source of silt into similar streams is from gravel roads, not from the actual timber harvest. For roads which have to be constructed to access the timber, immediate reclamation and closure could eliminate the possibility that this activity could impact the river. I fear that the opponents of the harvest operations are not relying on good science as the basis for their objection. The implementation of some reasonable guidelines in the upper Buffalo River watershed could easily make it possible for harvest to continue as well as insure the protection of the water quality of the river.

Shortly after the Buffalo River was included into the National Park system, I conducted a very detailed water quality study of the river from its headwaters to its confluence with the White River. I have yet to see any scientific information which clearly indicates that the types of harvest designated in the Buffalo River watershed portion Ozark National Forest have the potential to damage the river.

Arkansas needs your help to convince people that a forest can produce a reasonable yield of products without damaging the rivers of our state. The polarization on this issue has become extreme in Newton County and could easily spread throughout the National Forest of Arkansas. This would be terribly unfortunate since in reality there is no scientific basis for such actions.
